# Senate Rebuffs McNamara

WASHINGTON (UPI)—The Senate was ready today to override Defense Secretary Robert S. McNamara's veto of the first step toward deploying an anti-missile missile system.

The Senate voted 71-20 to override McNamara's veto of the \$1.7 billion defense bill authorizing purchases of a variety of military equipment, including \$1.7 billion for "production activities" in connection with deployment of the anti-missile missile defense system.

McNamara, who vetoed the bill, said it would divert resources from the Vietnam war effort and that it would increase the national debt.

# Gl Take Red Supply Dump

SAIGON (UPI)—A battalion of the 1st Infantry Division sweeping the Communist "new zone" C along the Cambodian border found enough food, livestock, and uniforms to outfit about 300 Communist guerrillas.

The soldiers also found thousands of pounds of explosives on a pile in a raid Tuesday.

"This is it. This is where those babies got most of their supplies," said the U.S. Army major commanding the battalion which located the complex of bamboo warehouses containing a treasure trove of supplies near the Cambodian border.

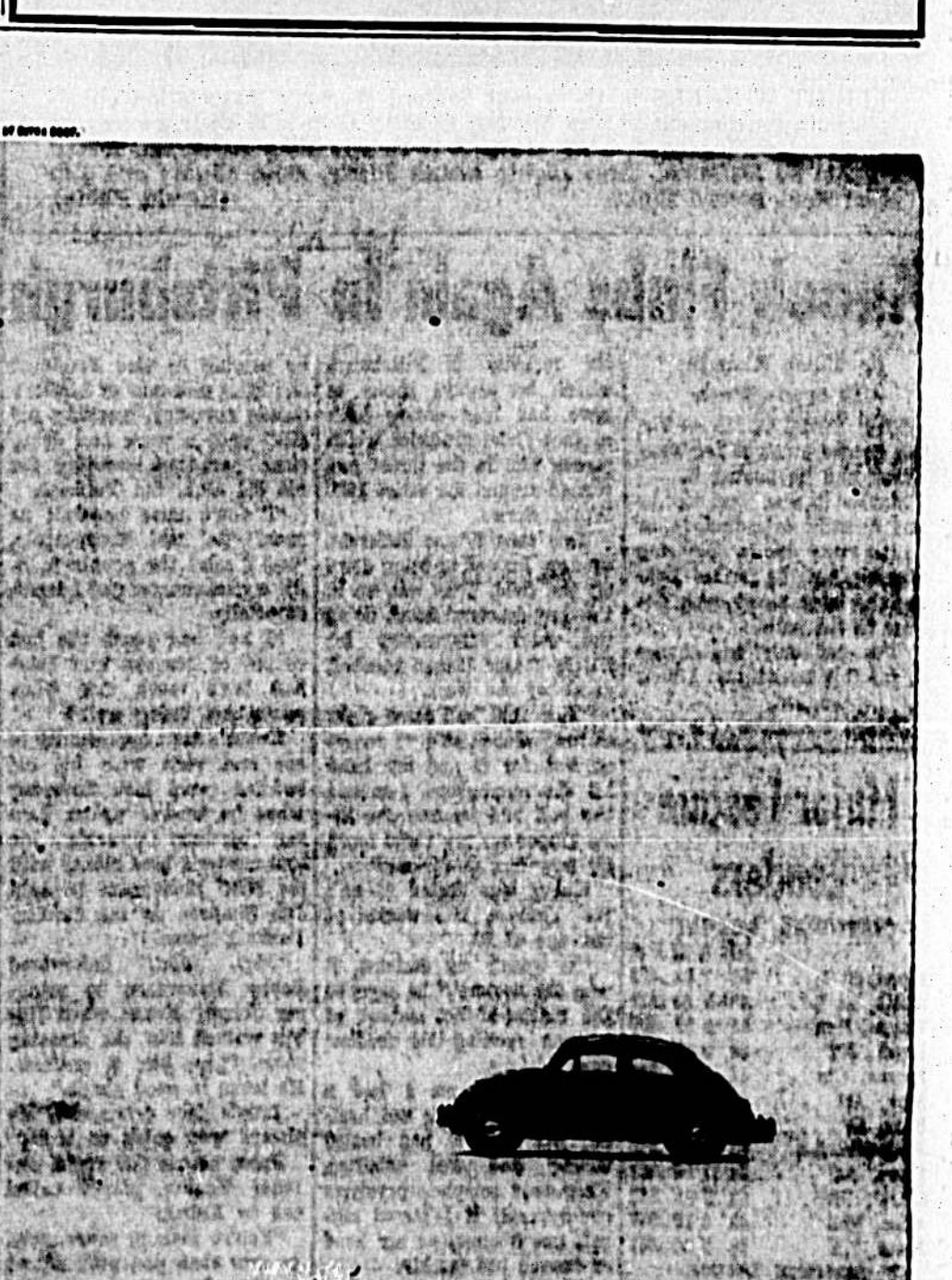

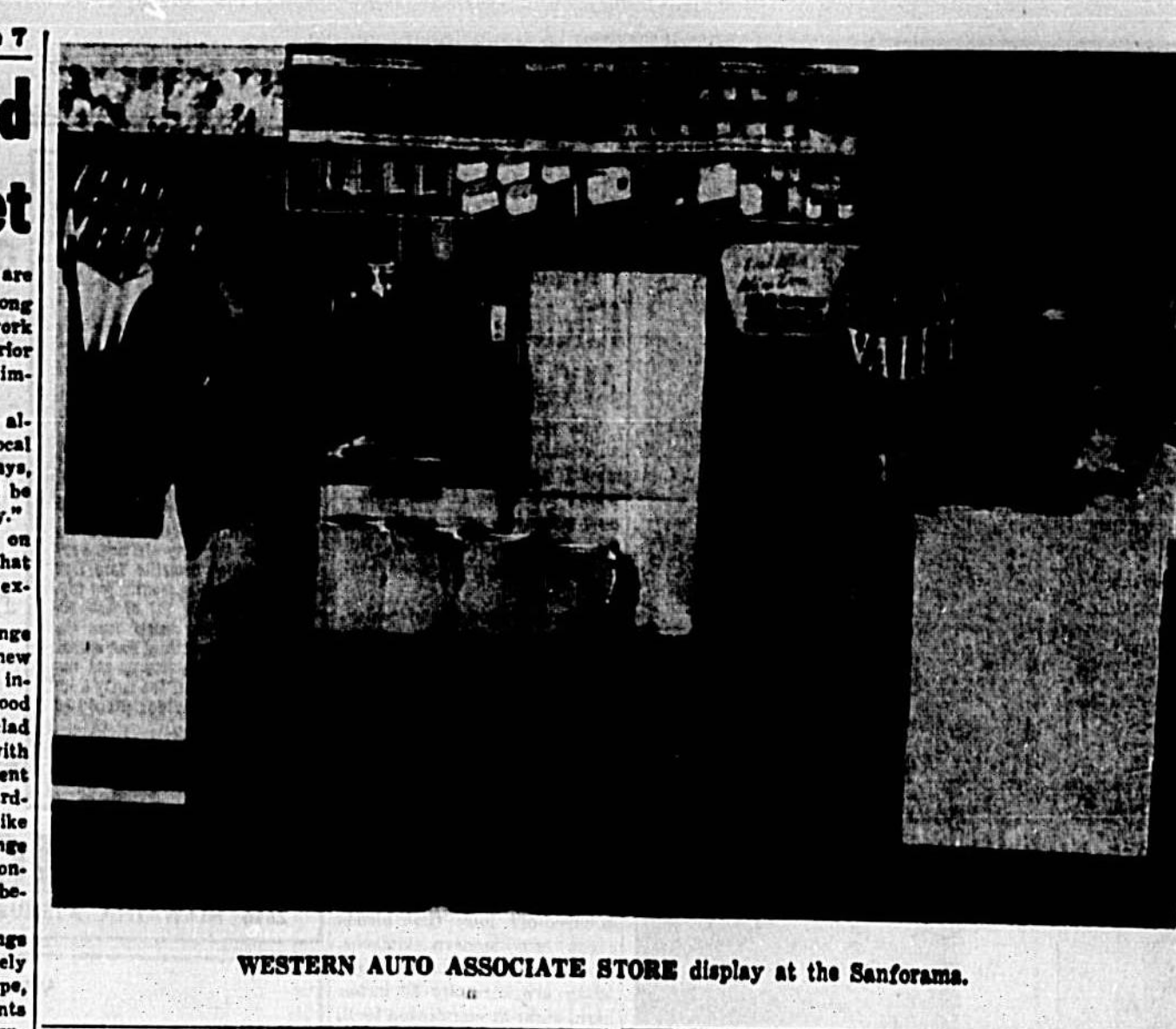

How about trying prunes this week in recipes? Their rich, fruity goodness adds a wonderful flavor to cakes, cookies, hot breads, sandwiches, puddings and dressings. Here are some tips on how to prepare prunes.

To pit and chop prunes: Just cut the stem away from the pits with scissors and then cut into pieces of the desired size.

To "plump" prunes: Cover with water (about 1 qt. to a lb.), cover and cook for one hour. Drain and soak in cold water for 24 hours. Refrigerate until ready to use.

How to cook prunes for breakfast: New varieties of prunes require little cooking to bring out all their plump, natural goodness. Slice prunes in saute pan, cover with cold water and bring to a boil and simmer gently 10 to 20 minutes. Add a slice of cinnamon, lemon or orange slices for extra flavor.

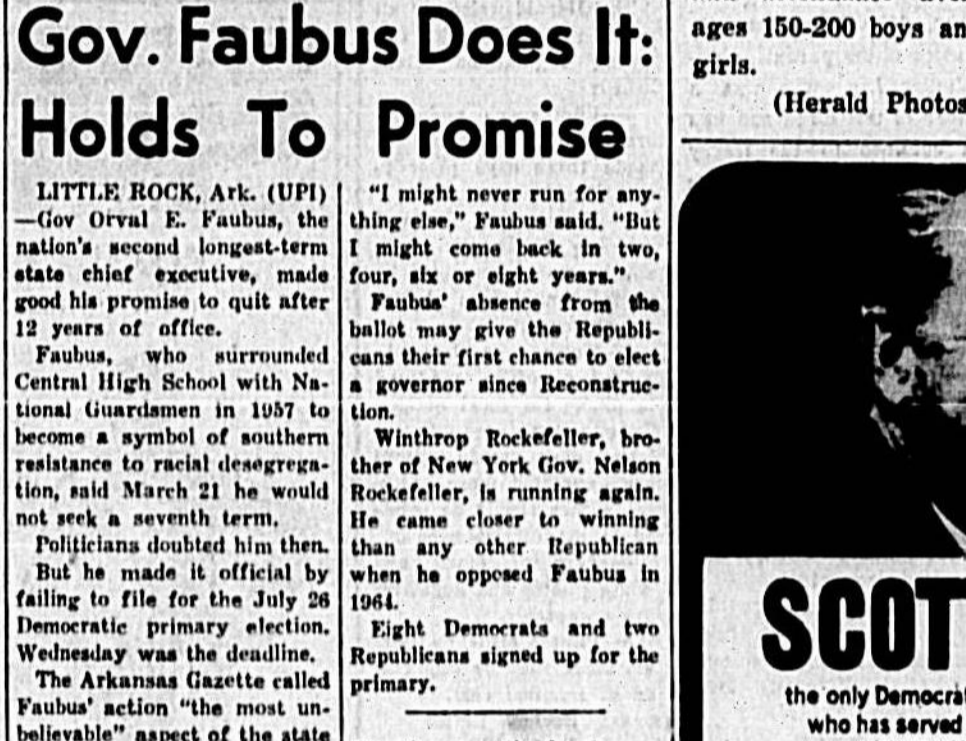
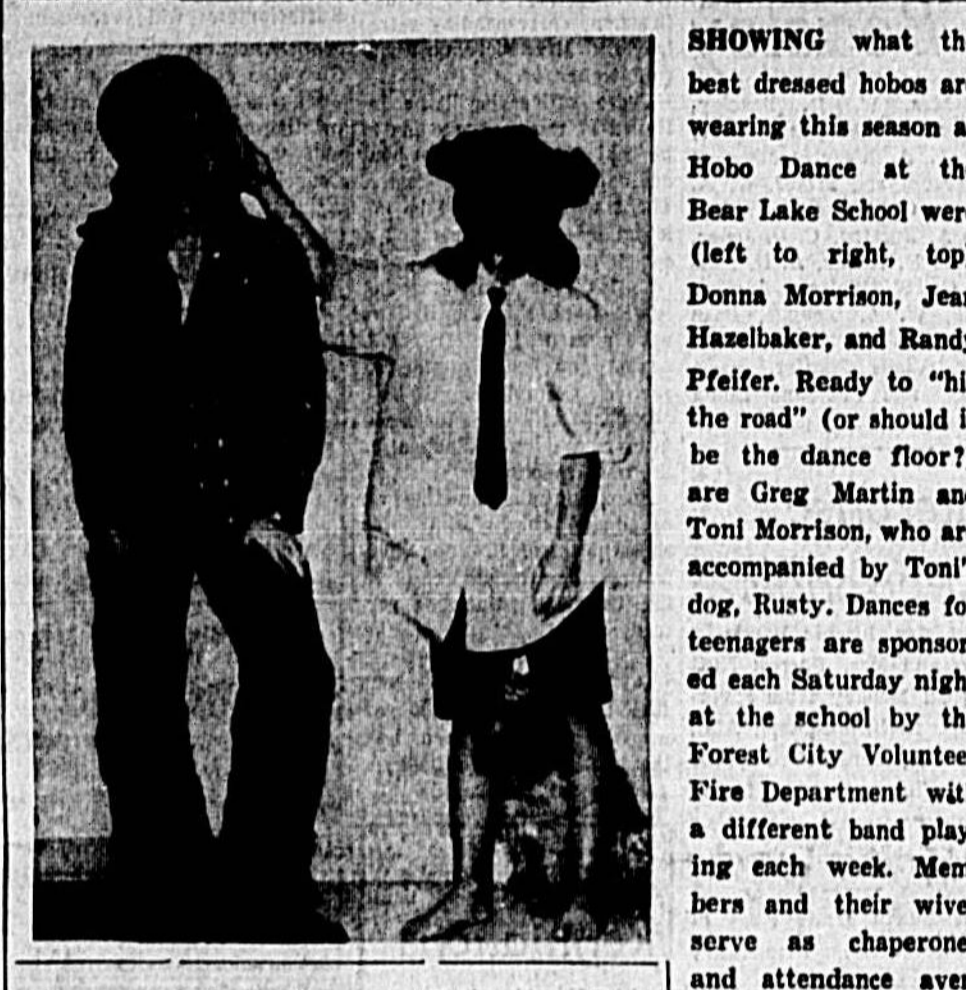
### Gov. Faubus Does It: Holds To Promise

### 'Gator Poaching Million-A-Year Racket—Charge

WASHINGTON (UPI)—The Interior Department plans a \$1 million-a-year alligator poaching racket, wants Congress to strengthen the law to provide more protection for wildlife.

The department said it had asked for legislation to extend coverage of the federal criminal code to every section of the nation, and to give game wardens authority to make arrests and seize property used illegally.

Alligator hides are in great demand for shoes and purses, the department noted, with hides of 6-8 feet selling for \$9 a foot.

These prices spur poachers to violate state laws aimed at protecting 'catfish, now on the department's list of "endangered species."
