The House-approved bill has been modified in several ways not to President Truman's liking.

The provision which permits county, city or town governments to abandon rent control after finding that the necessity for control no longer exists does not affect state rent control laws.

In addition, the House measure permits landlords to increase rents 15 percent in return for a two year lease.

Telephone Strike

(Continued from Page One) is said the wage increase recommended would be smaller than the \$6 demanded by the union. The company has made no cash offer, demanding arbitration. Manno and Margolis announced their plan to submit a formula after bargaining sessions ended early this morning in deadlock.

This dispute is just one part of the nationwide strike of more than 300,000 American Telephone and Telegraph workers, long lines representing only about 20,000, but it is regarded as highly important, and a settlement would influence the disputes in other branches of the A T and T.

As for the compromise proposal to be offered today, neither the union nor management was making any predictions. Both said they have no idea what may be proposed. The union still says it will not take less than \$6. A week ago, the two government conciliators told newsmen that a combination of a wage offer and arbitration might eventually prove a pattern for settling the strike.

Meanwhile, there was no sign of a settlement in a new telephone strike threatened in Florida. Negotiations have broken down between the Florida Independent Telephone Workers Union and the Inter-County Telephone and Telegraph Company.

The union said a strike will begin next Thursday, affecting 12 counties in southwest Florida. Complications, meanwhile, continued to multiply in New York's telephone strike where a settlement had been reached. But 47,000 workers, members of the independent, United Telephone Organizations, have refused to return to work as provided in the terms of the agreement.

In other cross-country labor developments, the Allis-Chalmers Manufacturing Plant announced that it has granted a wage of 11 1/2 cents an hour plus pay for six holidays a year to its 15,000 workers in the West Allis, Wis., plant.

New labor trouble flared at the Goodyear Aircraft Corporation plant in Akron, O. Nineteen hundred CIO auto-workers left their jobs last night because their contract had expired.

Rep. McKenlie of Levy County and Williams of Holmes introduced a resolution which would abolish the State Game and Fresh Water Commission. The two representatives proposed repeal of the section of the Constitution which established the agency. If the repeal resolution passes both Houses, it would be submitted to the voters.

Meanwhile a final decision on a bill to tighten regulations governing Florida real estate dealers was expected in the House today. The bill struck a barrier yesterday as opponents objected to a provision which they said would give the State Real Estate Commission final jurisdiction in suspension or revocation of real estate dealers' licenses.

branded the bill as one of the most dangerous before the House. He offered a motion to strike out the enacting clause thus automatically killing the measure, but the motion was defeated 44 to 39.

While awaiting the Senate's action on the school bill, the House defeated a measure to make incurable insanity a grounds for divorce in Florida.

About 40 University of Florida architecture students have launched a concentrated fight to obtain legislative passage of a bill that would give them licenses to practice with two years of apprenticeship after graduation.

The bill has been approved by the House, but the students say opposition is forming to fight it in the Senate.

State Health Board Will Use 9 Buildings At Naval Air Station

JACKSONVILLE, May 2—(Special)—Final approval has been granted to the Florida State Board of Health by War Assets Administration, to occupy nine buildings at the Melbourne Naval Air Station, for use as a rapid treatment center. Dr. Wilson T. Sower, state health officer, announced today.

It is expected that the new treatment facility will be ready to accept patients by July 1. Work of converting the building and moving in equipment and supplies is now in progress.

When completed, the hospital will contain 600 beds and will permit the treatment of at least 1000 patients a month.

The new hospital will be known as the Florida State Board of Health Treatment Center and will be one of the largest and most modern in the county, said Dr. Sower.

The new center will offer many advantages over previous centers in that it is ideally located and will provide the very latest equipment, treatment and comfort.

Traffic Policeman Is Killed In Four Car Crash At Intersection

NEW YORK, May 2—A traffic policeman was killed and three persons injured today in a crash at a busy New York City intersection. The four-vehicle crash occurred when a fire engine's path was blocked by a truck operated by Kenneth Jervis of Johnson City, Tenn.

The fire engine smashed into the truck which in turn hit a taxicab. The cab then struck a bus. Patrolman William O'Brien was pinned beneath the taxi and died at a hospital.

Police said the truck was owned by the Morristown, Tenn. Pontiac and Egg Company. According to the police, Jervis failed to give the right-of-way to a fire engine. The driver has been summoned to appear in traffic court on Monday. He is charged with failing to obey a policeman's signal and failing to give the right-of-way to a fire apparatus.
