Saudis Raise Price Of Oil By \$2 In Deal For 'Freeze'

VIENNA, Austria (UPI) - In a last-minute compromise to salvage OPEC unity, Saudi Arabia raised its oil price by \$2 a barrel in return for a price freeze from other oil producers. The increase will cost U.S. consumers almost one cent a gallon.

The abrupt yielding of the Saudis to hike their price to \$30 a barrel, from an OPEC low of \$28, came after the special OPEC meeting on approving a long-term Saudi pricing plan collapsed, with the Saudis leading the moderates against hard-line Libya, Algeria and

The meeting was one of the biggest failures in the history of the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries. There were hints OPEC might soon adopt the long-term pricing plan - which would tie oil prices to inflation - without Libya, Iran and Algeria, in effect, dumping the three hardliners.

Somoza Killers 'Foreigners'

ASUNCTION, Paraguay (UPI) - Six commandos

who assassinated former Nicaraguan dictator Anastasio Somoza in a fiery bazooka ambush obliterating his white Mercedes were "foreign extremits," including a woman soldier in an Argentine guerrilla army, Paraguayan authorities say. Somoza's Mercedes was riddled with 25 machine-gun bullets and then blown apart by a bazooka shell in broad daylight Wednesday morning a few blocks from his home, in an attack that also killed a companion and

"It is almost completely sure that a foreign extremist group" assassinated the 54-year-old Somoza the Paraguayan Interior Ministry said.

China U.S. Sign 4 Pacts

WASHINGTON (UPI) - With the signing of four new trade and diplomatic agreements, President Carter says the establishment of normal relations between the United States and China "is at last complete." Under one of the four pacts, signed Wednesday by Carter and Chinese Vice Premier Bo Yibo, both countries agreed to limit the growth of Chinese textile imports to this country over the next three years. Textile imports will rise no higher than about 4 percent above quotas now unilaterally set by the United States. China now is the fifth largest supplier of textile products to the United States, accounting for about 8 percent by volume of U.S. textile imports. It is the No. 2 supplier to the United States of cotton textile

As part of the new agreements, the two countries each will designate an airline to begin scheduled service between New York, San Francisco, Los Angeles, Honolulu, Japan, Shanghai and Peking.

Black To Go Into Space

MOSCOW (UPI) - The Soviet Union today readied the launch of the world's first black cosmonaut, a Cuban from Guantanamo, in a planned linkup with the manned Salyut-6 space laboratory, Soviet sources say The sources said Wednesday night Arnaldo Tamayo Mendez, 38, will be launched aboard the Soyuz-38 space capsule along with Soviet commander, Yuri

2 Men Sentenced In Casselberry Rapes

Two men who committed separate rapes in Casselberry in January were sentenced to prison Wednesday. Dennis E. Joines, 28, of Longwood, was ordered to prison for 10 years plus five years on probation by Circuit Judge Volie

Joines kidnapped a woman Jan. 12 from the Casselberry ABC Lounge parking lot, U.S. Highway 17-92, raped her near the intersection of Dog Track Road and State Road 427, then dropped her back at the lounge. Joines, who had moved to Florida from Philidelphia late in

1979, also faces extradition back to that city to face similar sexual battery charges, police say. A 17-year-old youth who pleaded no contest to a charge of raping a woman at knifepoint, attacking her as she jogged through a Casselberry apartment complex, was sentenced to

Homesick Cuban Hijackers **Unaware Of Castro Rulina?**

MIAMI (UPI) - Just a day after Fidel Castro's government warned that hijackers faced "drastic penal actions" on landing in Cuba, two homesick refugees splashed a liquid they said was gasoline around the cabin of a Delta Airlines jetliner and joined the illegal airlift home.

The plane stopped an hour in Columbia, S.C., to take on fuel and lighten its load of baggage, flew to Havana (where the hijackers were handcuffed and taken away by Cuban authorities), returned to Miami and then completed its trip to Charleston, S.C. and Columbia. None of the passengers was injured.

Builders Staging Comeback

WASHINGTON (UPI) - The home-building industry is digging itself out from the recession with housing starts rising for the third straight month in August. But private analysts say rising mortgage rates may soon choke off the recovery.

Housing starts rose 12 percent in August to a seasonally adjusted annual rate of 1,399,000, the Commerce Department said Wednesday. Starts were up 2.1 percent in July and 35 percent in June. This represents the highest point housing starts have reached since last January, a month before the recession took hold.



Moscow's Growing

Credibility Gap

What is happening in China may be as portentous for the Communist world as what happened in Poland. The Polish strikers proved they could force their government and Moscow into concessions more liberal than any ever granted in the Soviet bloc. In Peking, it is the Communist leadership itself which is engineering a sharp break with the past.

The National People's Congress - the rubberstamp parliament now meeting in Peking - is approving new laws and adopting economic reforms which are redefining Chinese communism. They reflect an embrace of capitalistic ideas that would have outraged the idealogues of Mao Tse-tung's revolution.

Events are showing that Mao failed dismally to mplant doctrines that would flourish after his death. His "thoughts" are no longer enshrined as gospel. His widow is going on trial for treason with others in the "Gang of Four." The government has declared that 266,000 people were imprisoned illegally during Mao's Cultural Revolution - part of an official confession of error under the Maoist

The next step is a surrender of government leadership to younger technocrats. The two most powerful figures in Peking, Hua Guofeng and Deng Xiaping, are retiring as premier and vice premier. Although they will remain in the Politburo with high posts in the Communist Party, turn 72. the management of the government will be in the hands of those more concerned with getting things done than with the fine points of party doctrine. The new premier will be Zhao Ziyang, who rose to prominence as a provincial party leader em-

ploying capitalist-style incentives to boost production by farmers and factory workers. His approaches are reflected in the new economic policies being approved by the People's Congress. Plans call for production to be geared to market demand, not a preconceived state plan. Factories

will be able to bid against each other for contracts, and they will be able to retain some of their profits for reinvestment. Some enterprises will be free to trade directly with foreign firms. What the Chinese seem to have in mind is a

more' competitive, consumer-oriented economy, freed of central planning and bureaucratic control. Their reforms would attack the failings so obvious in the Soviet economic system, which was adopted as a model for China in the early days of the Maoist regime. WASHINGTON (NEA) - Two members of the U.S. Supreme Court celebrate their birthdays this month - and behind those seemingly inconsequential rituals lies the tale of one of the most important issues of the current presidential campaign.

Although the stakes are exceptionally high, none of the candidates is likely publicly discuss the issue because it involves a pair of especially delicate subjects — the failing nealth and advancing age of five of the court's

Chief Justice Warren E. Burger willbecome 73 on Sept. 17 and Justice Lewis F. Powell Jr. will reach the same age two days later, on Sept. 19. Less than two months later, on Nov. 12, Justice Harry A. Blackmun will

His lengthy research showed that patients

fresh from a medical consultation will remember only about half of it. "Often patients tend not to follow the advice they've given because they either don't understand what they have been told, or they don't remember it.

"I've found," Ley said, "that people remember what they're told first. So a practitioner should decide what is the most important advice that should be remembered by the patient and put it first." The former Liverpool University psychologist pleaded with physicians to be more specific with their patients.

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Henry Ford II once asked ABC-TV to remove voluble sportscaster Howard Cosell from the network's popular "Monday Night Football" program so he could better watch the game. Leonard Goldenson, chairman of the board of American Broadcasting Companies Inc., related the incident Wednesday at a National Press Club luncheon when asked whether he ever got complaints about the controversial commentator.

"Howard Cosell is the most discussed person I know," said

Goldenson. "A great many people say they don't like him. A great many people say they do like him. But it seems to me everybody talks about him." Then, he told this story: The morning after Cosell first appeared on Monday Night Football, Ford, then the head of Ford Motor Co. and a major advertiser, called Goldenson and said: "Leonard, take the fella Cosell off the air. It's impossible to watch the game." Goldenson said he called in Elton Rule, president of ABC

Inc., and Roone Arledge, president of ABC Sports, and asked what they thought. He said Arledge asked for five or six weeks to give Cosell a "I'll watch him closely on the monitor," Goldenson quoted Arledge as saying. "If he tries to hog the mike, I'll pull in the string on him. Give me a chance." Goldenson said Ford called back four weeks later to say he







Blast Rocks Missile

DAMASCUS, Ark. (UPI) - An exolosion at a Titan II missile silo early today jarred the Arkansas countryside for miles, sent a huge mushroom cloud into the sky and injured 10 Air Force personnel.

Gov. Bill Clinton said he was told there had been no nuclear explosion, and other officials said no radiation had been

detected in the area. The Air Force would neither confirm nor deny the presence of a nuclear warhead on the missile but the explosion sent a huge column of toxic smoke hundreds of feet into the air, forcing the evacuation of an estimated 1,000 people. "I don't know if it had a nuclear operations supervisor of the state Office of Emergency Services. "The Air Force won't tell you because that's classified but I assume it did."

The injured Air Force maintenance men, suffering burns and inhalation of toxic fumes, were hospitalized in Little Rock and Conway. At Conway, six were admitted but two were released after treatment.
