Hollywood

HOLLYWOOD, Sept. 2—(AP)—Dear Bob Thomas: If you happen to run into Aunt Minnie or Joe Zeb on your vacation, I wish you'd ask them what they really think, if anything, about Hollywood history. They're supposed to know nothing, and care less, about history as long as they get Yvonne DeCarlo.

Documentary honesty about what happened in New England five years ago is demonstrably more audience-interesting than cliches about what didn't happen at any time. An so I'm wondering why documentary honesty, as applied to what happened in the west while this country was being built, might not be more audience-interesting than the same old formula interminably re-used.

The word is out that the market is overvalued with "westerns." Maybe, instead, too many of our "westerns" are overvalued with stuff that hasn't happened in the West.

I'm wondering, too, if it isn't time we realized in Hollywood that when we use real names of notable western characters in

pictures we do as we please with persons who are still very real to many in our audiences.

I discovered when I was writing "The Kid From Texas" about William Donney alias Billy The Kid, that the Billy The Kid in pictures of the past made a lot of people awfully mad.

Sometimes, I read recently a script in which the principal characters were Billy The Kid (killed in New Mexico in 1881), Jesse James (killed when killed in Mexico in 1882), Cole Younger (in a Minnesota prison for murder from 1870 to 1903), Frank Dalton (killed during outlaws in 1899), John Wesley Hardin (imprisoned in Texas at 25, until 1894) and Bill Doolin (killed, naked and unarmed, in an Arkansas bathroom in 1894).

But in the picture they're all made together in the outlaw business in a part of the country that didn't exist politically until 1840.

Documentary honesty is coming up in a corner of the box-office as Jim Bogdan, in the picture "The Handcuff King," government agent who distributed the "Red" in the "Red" of the story, Jim Bogdan was 62 and had been a squawking with more than one squaw for nearly 10 years.

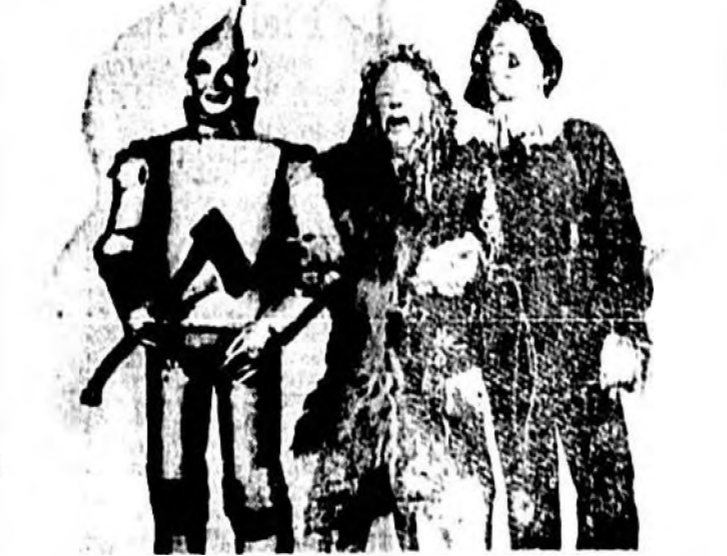

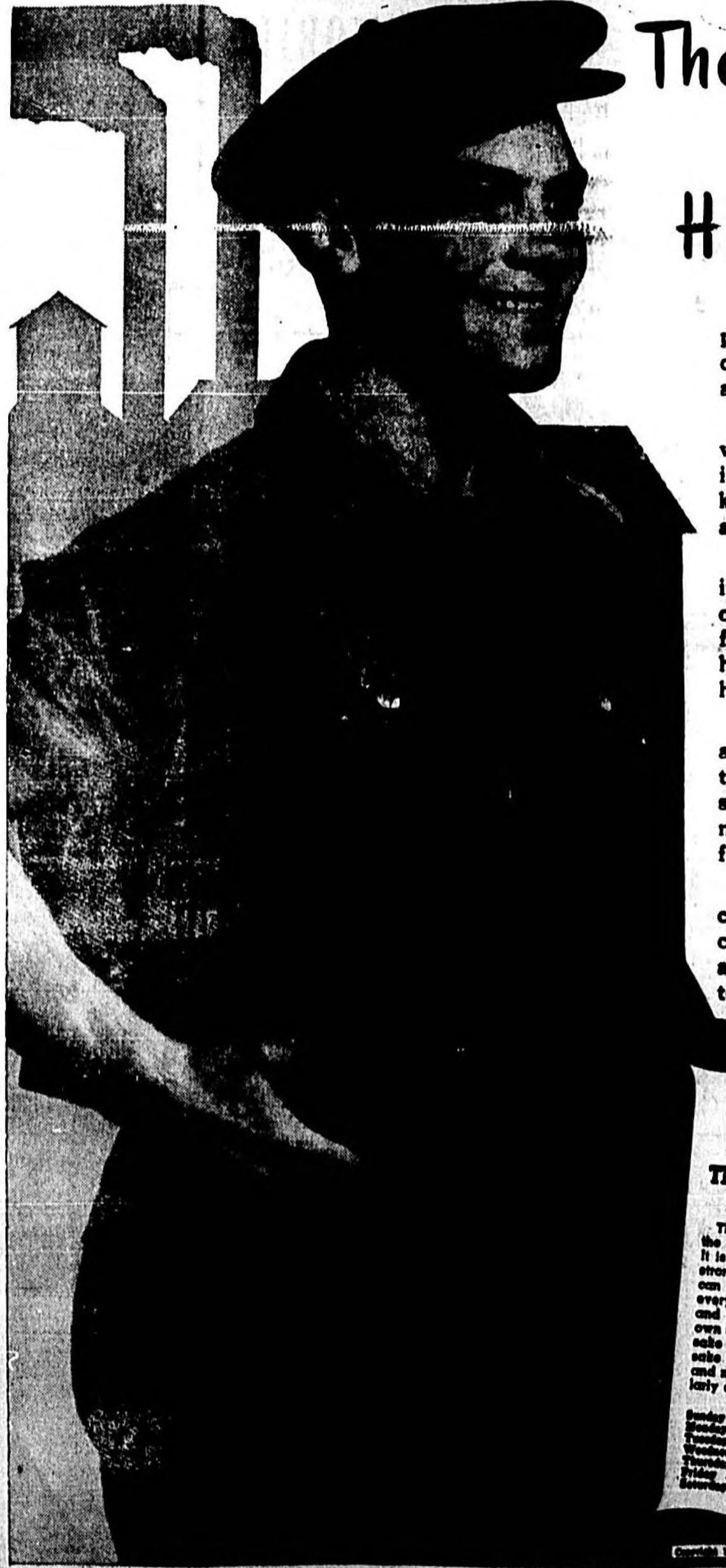
