#### Suggs to leave ICU today

LAKE MARY — Chuck Suggs is to leave the intensive care unit of London's Harefield Hospital today, according to Suggs Foundation fundraiser Debbie Black.

Last week, the 16-year-old Suggs underwent a heart and lung transplant after waiting 10 months for a donor.

Black said Suggs' lung infection was minor and has cleared since receiving antibiotics. However, he is still on the critical list and will remain so for 30 days.

"He can just whisper a little now," she said. "But he whistles for the nurses." Suggs should be able to speak clearly in two or three days, at which time he wants to make telephone calls to his friends in the states.

Suggs' parents take turns sitting with their son so that he has someone with him 24-hours-a-day. "Chuck probably insisted on that," Black said. "He's been giving his doctors heck all along. He wanted to sit up after his surgery, and the doctors have had to struggle to keep him quiet and still."

If Suggs' recovery continues in this manner, he plans to participate in the hospital's September 11 walk-a-thon.

#### Quayle takes the spotlight

NEW ORLEANS — Touted for youth, conservatism and good looks, Sen. Dan Quayle of Indiana today faced the formidable challenge of parlaying those qualities into a winning combination for George Bush as the No. 2 member of the GOP ticket.

In a gamble with generational politics, Quayle, 41, found himself thrust from relative political obscurity to worldwide attention overnight as the man who will team up with Bush to battle the Democrats for control of the White House.

With that, the last blank of the 1988 presidential race was filled. Youth, charisma, ideology and geography propelled Quayle ahead of others considered for the nod.

#### Kimball seeks Olympic spot

INDIANAPOLIS — Bruce Kimball, who faces up to 45 years in prison for his role in the deaths of two Florida teens, said Tuesday he will compete in the U.S. Olympic diving trials.

"I don't give up. I won't give up. I'm not sure I can live with myself if I do," a distraught Kimball said. "I've come to Indianapolis with the feeling I will compete in the Olympic trials and do the best I can under the circumstances."

Kimball, 25, spoke one day before the trials begin at Indiana University Natatorium. Kimball has qualified to compete in the 3-meter springboard and 10-meter platform events. But his status was uncertain since a car he was driving struck a group of teenagers Aug. 1 near Brandon, Fla., leaving two dead and six hurt.

## Union seeks recognition

LONGWOOD — The city's fire fighters, the first group of Longwood employees to attempt unionization, have requested voluntary recognition of their organization by the city in an Aug. 12 letter signed by Local President Roy S. Clelland.

But Jerry Polk, Professional Fire Fighters of Florida Third District vice president, is not optimistic that this will take place, given City Administrator Gene DeMarie's statement that he plans to challenge inclusion of the rank of lieutenant in the bargaining unit.

The fire fighters who voted to organize on July 26, joined the International Association of Fire Fighters and are chartered as the Longwood Professional Fire Fighters Association Local 3163.

DeMarie said the lieutenants are managerial employees and should not be included, but Polk, a lieutenant with the Orange County Fire Department, disagrees.

"He has to have some basis. I think Florida Public Employees Relations Commission (PERC) looks at it in a different light. The lieutenants will be in the union and are in the union," Polk said, "because their prime occupation is firefighter. In fire departments such as Orlando, Winter Park, Reedy Creek and Mount Dora, not only lieutenants, but all the way up to captain, who is a supervisor in a first line position, is included. PERC has the final determination."

"A challenge would be costly to the citizens," Polk said. "It cost Orange County \$162,000 for a labor attorney to challenge the union and the outcome was a strong union."

Polk said a staff representative from IAFF has been assigned to Longwood and will be in town this week to begin the final paperwork. According to state law, if the city is satisfied with the majority status of the employee organization and the appropriateness of the proposed bargaining unit, it can recognize the union as the collective bargaining representative for employees in the designated unit.

Upon recognition, the union can then petition

PERC for certification if it rules it is the appropriate bargaining unit, or, dismiss it if inappropriate.

If the city refuses to recognize the union, the local can petition PERC for certification as the bargaining agent, submitting statements signed by at least 30 percent of eligible employees. The commission will investigate the petition before providing a hearing, which would probably take place in Longwood City Hall.

If the commission finds the petition sufficient, an election by secret ballot will be ordered by PERC. If the majority of the employees vote to select the specified union, the commission will certify it as the exclusive bargaining unit. The city will be required to bargain "in good faith" with the bargaining unit.

An issue which Polk said has "destroyed a little of the confidence the firefighters had in the city" is "knee jerk reaction" the city officials had after the issue of unionizing arose. Polk said the commission's asking DeMarie to look into the feasibility of turning the city's fire department

## Marina fee totals could fall short of projected goal

SANFORD — If collection of marina fees for use of the Lake Monroe harbor boat ramps continues at its present rate, the city will fall nearly \$35,000 short of its projected goal for a year.

The collection of the \$5 daily fees on weekends and holidays for non-residents has raised \$3,640 since the ordinance went into effect six weeks ago.

The six two-day weekends have averaged \$645 in fee revenue for both days, according to Jim Jernigan, director of the Parks and Recreation Department, which oversees the operation.

At the current average weekend income of \$600, the city would raise \$31,512 in a year, far short of its projected \$66,400 goal.

In fact, the \$31,512 would scarcely pay for the two full-time employees at the marina, who collect fees and direct parking on weekends. The cost of the employees for one year is \$27,014.40.

At \$5 each, the \$606 means approximately 120 non-residents are using the boat ramps during a typical weekend, or 60 per day.

Original city projections for weekend use by non-residents were 65 per day.

However, the city has fallen considerably short in its projected sale of the \$100 annual sticker for non-residents, creating most of the revenue disparity.

The original proposal estimated that 300 annual stickers would be sold the first year for an income of \$30,000. To date, four have been sold.


The proposal, presented by City Manager Frank Faison, originally made April 27 and revised May 5, also stated: "This estimate [fees] is very preliminary, and is based on opinion and casual observation rather than any actual data sampling."

"I think it [annual fee estimates] was out there," admitted Jernigan. "I think it was a guess. They had no track record to go on. We will probably fall short, though we don't know how much at this time."

The proposal also earmarked more than \$36,000 up to the projected revenue raised by the fees for a facility maintenance sinking fund with the remainder going for clean-up, vehicle rental and signs.

The marina ordinance itself states under the section covering its intent and purpose: "To promote efficiency and funds for the maintenance

## New Goldsboro students take a look at facilities

SANFORD — Nine-year-old Shaun Harris will enter the fourth grade at Goldsboro Elementary this fall, and he's not one bit apprehensive. In fact, he can't wait. Even his father says the straight-A Harris has been bored most of the summer.

Harris is one of 4,000 Seminole County students who will attend new schools this fall, as a result of rezoning.

Last night Harris, his parents and younger sister Shannon met with other Lake Mary Elementary parents and children rezoned to Goldsboro Elementary.

According to Ken Boyce, director of elementary education, of the 26 elementary schools in the county, 20 underwent rezoning, and Lake Mary Elementary was one of the schools most affected. Last year Lake Mary's enrollment topped at 1,200. In one week, school doors will open to welcome 725 students. The other 475 students will attend Wilson, Idyllwild, Longwood and Goldsboro elementaries.

Nancy Boyce, assistant principal at Goldsboro and former Lake Mary fifth grade teacher, wanted to welcome those 90 students new to the

school because of rezoning. The regular school open house will be held August 23.

Approximately 40 people, including students, parents, aunts, uncles, friends, and siblings filled the school's spacious new music room. They sat in crayola-colored chairs, some with small children in their laps; some came alone to ask questions. They wanted to see what the school was really like. They'd heard the rumors — the Goldsboro neighborhood is unsafe, children will receive an inferior education — there was apprehension. But, both Boyce and principal Lorraine Offer were determined to change that image. It will take time, but last night was a good beginning.

"Any time you make a change there is a lot of fear and wondering," Boyce told families. "But this is my first year at Goldsboro too, and I want you to know that since I arrived I have received nothing but warmth, love and caring."

Parents were told that curriculum is developed countywide, so that students in all 26 elementary schools receive the same course material. Boyce said the Goldsboro community has been severely underrated, that it is a community of

### Repair team ready for rocket leak

CAPE CANAVERAL — On the eve of a crucial shuttle booster test firing in Utah, engineers at the Kennedy Space Center today were finally ready to start cutting through a bulkhead in Discovery's cargo bay to fix a tiny fuel leak.

Other engineers, meanwhile, are studying the potential impact of a different leak in another part of Discovery that was detected after successful main engine test firing on Aug. 10.

Test data indicated the presence of trace amounts of explosive hydrogen gas in a housing around the 17-inch pipe that carries supercold liquid hydrogen rocket fuel from the shuttle's external tank into its engine compartment.

As of late Tuesday, engineers had been unable to pinpoint the source of the leak or to precisely determine its severity.

But engineers were optimistic that the leak rate would be found to be within acceptable safety limits and that it would have no impact on plans to launch Discovery on the first post-Challenger flight in late September or early October.

### Tainted oysters prompt bay closing

TALLAHASSEE — The Department of Natural Resources has halted all oyster harvesting in Apalachicola Bay because of an outbreak of hepatitis pollution and the spectre of violence, a DNR spokesman said Tuesday.

"When rainfall comes in certain amounts, it causes pollution to come into the water," DNR spokesman Randy Lewis said in announcing a decision by DNR director Tom Gardner to halt all harvesting in winter oysters beds.

Lewis said harvesting in public and privately leased summer beds was halted Monday after DNR officials received word of a hepatitis outbreak in Florida's western Panhandle.

The closing order is the latest in a series of controversies that has pitted oystermen who harvest their crop with hand-held tongs in public areas against those hold private leases.

Some of the bay was leased by DNR to operators who use mechanical dredges and the action initially was approved by Gov. Bob Martinez and the Cabinet.

But stiff opposition forced Cabinet members to reverse their vote and ban mechanical harvesting in the ecologically fragile bay.

### Utility struggles with spill

MIAMI — A spill of radioactive water that poses no threat to the public hits Florida Power & Light Co. as the utility attempts to revamp its Turkey Point nuclear operation and avoid future problems.

Several workers, perhaps as many as 15, stepped in the water during the Tuesday cleanup, contaminating their shoes and clothing, but utility and federal officials said the low-level radiation posed no health risk to workers or the public.

Most of the water ran out of the building, adjacent to the main reactor, and into a storm sewer that flows into a "cooling canal."

"It does not pose a health threat to the workers, and certainly not to anyone off the site," said Ken Clark, a Nuclear Regulatory Commission spokesman in the Atlanta office.

### Former pitcher gets trial delay

TAMPA — The retrial of former major league pitcher Denny McLain on racketeering charges, which had been scheduled to begin next month, has been postponed until at least sometime in October.

U.S. District Judge Elizabeth A. Kovachevich granted the delay Monday at the request of Thomas J. Hanlon, McLain's court-appointed attorney.

McLain filed a motion in July asking that Kovachevich, who presided over the original trial, step aside and assign the case to another judge, and Hanlon said he cannot adequately prepare for trial until that issue is ruled upon.

Kovachevich announced the postponement after a private conference at the bench. She said she will set an exact date for the trial later.

### Hillsborough to pay sewage fine

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Hillsborough County officials have agreed to build additions to the county's sewage treatment system and to pay a \$195,000 penalty for violations of the Clean Water Act, the Justice Department announced Tuesday.

The civil penalty, to be paid in three equal annual installments, stems from Clean Water violations at the county's Dale Mabry Sewage Treatment Plant, the department said in a statement.

A civil complaint filed in U.S. District Court in Tampa charged that the county violated terms of an Environmental Protection Agency permit regulating the discharge of pollutants, including an excessive number of discharges. A proposed consent decree that resolved the complaint was filed simultaneously, the department said.

# Martinez praises GOP governors

NEW ORLEANS — Gov. Bob Martinez says Republican governors have achieved better results dealing with tough problems than Democratic presidential nominee Michael Dukakis has obtained in his home state of Massachusetts.

"At the state level, a growing team of Republican governors has been extending the principles of conservative government beyond the White House and into our state houses," Martinez said Tuesday night in a speech at the Republican National Convention.

Martinez used his introduction of keynote speaker Gov. Tom Kean of New Jersey to elicit cheers from conventioners about GOP statehouse performances and to criticize Dukakis for his actions as Massachusetts' chief executive.

"Let's take a minute to compare some of these Republican governors to a newly prominent Democrat governor," Martinez said.

He said Gov. Guy Hunt of Alabama, a Republican, "is working hard to enforce his state's death penalty" while Dukakis opposes capital punishment "and furloughs killers."

Martinez praised Gov. Carroll Campbell for sending South Carolina's National Guard to Central America "and help the freedom-loving people of that key strategic region."

He noted that Dukakis went to court to stop overseas deployment of the Massachusetts National Guard.

Martinez said Kean cut taxes in New

prime-time television appearance was important to the GOP in reaching Hispanic voters across the nation.

"It's obvious, though, that I have 'E-Z' at the end of my name and that communicates to Hispanics across the nation that someone of Hispanic descent has a speaking slot in prime time," he said.

"I'm sure that's not to be unnoticed."

He said Florida, now the country's fourth most populous state, is need for a GOP victory in November.

He also said he thought "whoever's governor of the state of Florida — whichever party that governor's a member of — Florida will continue to play a role in conventions" because of its "raw size."

Martinez, elected mayor of Tampa as a Democrat in 1978, converted to the GOP in 1983. He made a brief speech on urban affairs at the 1984 GOP convention in Dallas and after his 1986 election as governor became a strong advocate for Vice President Bush in the South.

Throughout the convention, Martinez has doubled up his interviews, repeating them in Spanish for Cuban-oriented stations in his state.

Martinez said he would travel to other states for Bush this fall, speaking to Hispanic groups for the ticket. He said he had no ambition for a cabinet appointment or other job in a Bush administration.

Martinez said large industrial states in the North had always been "the power states" in national conventions before the Reagan era.

### Mother arrested on welfare fraud charge

TAMPA — A woman who won the right last week to have her AIDS-infected, mentally-retarded 6-year-old adoptive daughter admitted to public school, now faces a charge of welfare fraud dating back to 1986.

Rose E. Martinez, who has been in a lengthy legal struggle with Hillsborough County school officials to have her daughter Eliana taught in a public classroom, was arrested Monday on a warrant accusing her of welfare fraud by improperly ob-

taining \$200 or more in government assistance.

Martinez, 36, was released from jail on her own recognizance shortly after her arrest on the third-degree felony.

Her attorney, Stephen Hanlon, said a prosecutor wants Martinez to participate in a program for first-time offenders in which prosecutors agree not to press charges if the defendant successfully completes probation.

Martinez did not comment on the charge after her arrest Monday.

### Lotto millionaires ready to play again

TALLAHASSEE — Marvin and Emily Davidheiser say a \$40 investment that turned into a state record \$26 million Lotto jackpot was such a good deal they plan to keep buying lottery tickets.

"We probably will play the lottery again," he said at a news conference Tuesday where he and his wife sipped champagne and discussed their sudden wealth.

Lottery Secretary Rebecca Paul said the Davidheisers will receive an annual check of \$1.3 million for the next 20 years. Marvin Davidheiser said that would mean a net of about \$990,000 after federal taxes were withheld.

"We probably will play the lottery again," he said at a news conference Tuesday where he and his wife sipped champagne and discussed their sudden wealth.

### Death defense agency defended

TALLAHASSEE — A state commission investigating the agency that defends death row inmates was told Tuesday that bitter infighting among agency staff damaged its effectiveness in handling life-or-death appeals.

Former employees of the agency blamed weak and vacillating management by Larry Spalding, head of the office of Capital Collateral Representative, for an "exodus" of disgruntled employees this spring.

"I cannot honestly say there was effective management of anything," said Mary Charlotte McCall, brought in briefly early this year to help organize the office but fired within a few months.

"I think that affected the ability of the staff to do good representation."

Spalding said much of the blame belongs to the highly

stressful atmosphere in the office since Gov. Bob Martinez took office and began signing death warrants at about twice the rate of his predecessor, Bob Graham.

He also faulted a former employee, Scharlette Holdman, whose firing last winter led to mass resignations by disgruntled agency staff and weakened his support in the legal community.

He said Holdman, who organized volunteer lawyers for death row inmates before CCR was created, grew abusive with some staff members because of a drinking problem and once threw a typewriter at a door before he was forced to dismiss her.

"A real schism had developed in the office. There wasn't any bringing that back together," Spalding said.

"I did everything I know to try to keep the two sides together, and I couldn't pull it off. Maybe somebody else can," he told reporters later.

The governor's commission, headed by Public Defender James Russo of Titusville, is looking into the way Spalding managed the office. Besides his staff problems, Spalding is accused of filing frivolous appeals.

The commission report is due in September.

The Florida Department of Law Enforcement also is conducting a criminal investigation of CCR on numerous charges, including inducing witnesses to give false testimony.

Reporters and the public were barred from hearing testimony by Greg Marr, the FDLE investigator handling the criminal probe. A 1974 attorney general's advisory opinion and a 1976 appeal court ruling suggest closing the meeting violated state law requiring open meetings by government panels.

Reporters and former CCR staff were admitted when Marr left. Holdman, who supervised

investigations for CCR, was among them, and she sat a few feet away as Spalding defended himself and attacked her.

She denied she had a drinking problem or was abusive with staff.

"I was surprised at the venom, the intimate nature of his characterization of me as being something (being) a way out for him," Holdman said.

Spalding maintained Holdman is viewed with special reverence by many in the legal community for her work against the death penalty, saying he was told his office would lose credibility with prospective volunteer lawyers without her.

But, Spalding said, "There came a time when I just couldn't trust her."

Holdman left in October. Numerous key staff, including chief litigator Mark Olive, left in mid-March after Spalding refused to reinstate her.

### Two onlookers arrested at fight scene

**SANFORD** — A 16-year-old girl stabbed her boyfriend with a kitchen knife in a dispute which resulted in the arrest of two onlookers Wednesday night.

Police responded to a disturbance at 2450 Poinsettia Ave. at approximately 9:30 p.m. and found Pierre Labranche, 22, with a knife wound to his hand and a stab wound to the abdomen, inflicted by his 16-year-old girlfriend.

According to the police report, the juvenile stabbed Labranche after he forced his way into the residence and hit her in the face.

Labranche and the juvenile refused to press charges against each other.

While police were investigating the incident, two men were arrested for interfering with law enforcement officers in the course of their duty.

Both men were transported to Seminole County Jail and later released on bond.

Labranche was transported to Central Florida Regional Hospital by Rural/Metro ambulance service where he was treated and released.

### Inmate cited for arson

**SANFORD** — A Seminole County jail inmate accused of setting a fire in his cell in isolation, reportedly so he wouldn't be moved back into the prisoner population where he owed gambling debts, has been charged with first degree arson.

Bond in that case is set at \$8,000. Robert John McIntyre, 22, of 238 Riversend Drive, Altamonte Springs, was arrested on the arson complaint at 2 p.m. Tuesday.

He is accused by Seminole County sheriff's deputies of setting after a pile of papers in the center of the floor of his cell at about 12:15 a.m., Aug. 12. Guards found the fire and smothered it with a blanket. McIntyre and two neighboring inmates were moved from the smoke-filled area, a sheriff's report said.

### Woman reports rape

## Recreation programs successful

**SANFORD** — The city's summer recreation programs entertained nearly 3,000 citizens from May through early August, according to figures released by Jim Jernigan, Parks and Recreation Department director.

Jernigan said 2,915 people participated in 10 summer recreation programs, which represent more than 10 per cent of the city's population. The national average for recreational program participation is between five and seven percent for metropolitan areas, he said.

Jernigan was not surprised by

the percentage of participation. "I think it is probably a normal figure for us," he said. "Some of our programs are traditional and that gives us credibility, so parents are not adverse to letting their children participate."

The biggest increase in participation over last summer was in the summer playground programs which took place at the city's Youth Wing, Westside Recreation Center and Lee P. Moore Park, according to Jernigan.

More than 390 youngsters 12 years and under took part in the city's supervised day-care playground programs, which distributed about 7,500 box lunches to the children, according to Jernigan's report.

Youth Center registrations for children not in any other programs at the same three locations totaled 1,200, which included four dances for teenagers during the summer.

In team sports Little Major League baseball registered the most teams with 10, followed by women's softball with eight, Junior League baseball with six, men's softball with five and Pee Wee baseball with four.

The city also had more than 120 register for swimming and tennis lessons.

The figures released by Jernigan did not include the department's Latch Key after school program for students, or registration for the adult volleyball leagues.

## Bell customers will get refund

**SANFORD** — Southern Bell's customers in Sanford will pay lower telephone bills in August as the company refunds \$21 million of its 1987 earnings to Bell's Florida customers.

In accordance with an order of the Florida Public Service Commission (PSC), telephone customers with the Sanford exchange will receive a one-time credit of \$3.46 per residential line and \$8.74 per commercial line, according to Larry Strickler, Southern Bell spokesman.

Southern Bell customers in other parts of Seminole County will also receive the refunds. The amount of the credits range from about \$2 for a local residential line in a small exchange to about \$22 for a major business line in a large exchange, Strickler said. The credits vary depending on

the type of line and size of exchange. "In effect, the more a customer pays monthly for the line, the larger the one-time credit," he said.

All telephone lines will receive this credit, included are residential and commercial basic lines, PBX trunks, message and measured lines, where available, and business lines in rotary.

"We are able to make this refund because we have been able to efficiently manage Southern Bell's restructured Florida operations," said Strickler. "Our efforts to consolidate and streamline our operations as well as the PSC's review of our 1987 earning resulted in this refund to our customers."

The last time refunds were made in Seminole County was in April, 1981.

## New policy for county building department

**SANFORD** — Seminole County Building Director Bill Culbertson will amend the county policy for building department employees, requiring them to notify him of every job they work outside the county.

Culbertson said the change is in response to the discovery two weeks ago that the county's chief electrical inspector, Donna Larson, had pulled permits for a job in Altamonte Springs in March without his knowledge.

Larson apparently had county permission to do the outside work, Culbertson said.

"When any member of the public comes to me and asks me 'What about this person?' I want to know about it first and be able to give an intelligent answer," Culbertson said.

In March 1983, Larson received approval from the department director, then John Percy, and building official D.W. Flippin to work on her own time.

"It appears she had a blanket approval to work outside the county," Culbertson said. "She appears to be OK."

Culbertson was unaware of Larson's outside work until two weeks ago when the Sanford Herald asked him if he knew Larson had obtained Altamonte Springs electrical permits to work on a restaurant, the La Scala. Culbertson said she apparently never did the work, which was done by another licensed electrical contractor.

Another county building

employee, plumbing and mechanical inspector Emile Georgi, was admonished by state professional licensing investigators for performing general contracting work on the restaurant without a state license to do so. Georgi subsequently resigned his county job of nearly 16 years because he failed to notify county building officials of his outside work.

Georgi said he never actually worked at the restaurant, but simply arranged to have several workmen to do the work when the original contractor could not complete the job in a timely manner to satisfy restaurant owners.

## Woman shot by her mother's boyfriend

### Answers needed in school probe

Stories of inefficiency and extravagance in government are all too frequent occurrences. Extremes such as the \$475 screwdrivers and \$4,000 toilet seats purchased by the Pentagon cause tears for the waste but laughter at the silliness. Sen. William Proxmire originated the "Golden Fleece" awards to spotlight such governmental waste.

Citizens are appalled at such waste but easily become complacent since it's happening far away.

But now it's happening here and, though a surprise to readers in Seminole County, the revelations seemingly are old news to officials at the school board. Auditors have criticized the school system for its purchasing and warehousing policies since 1986.

What was even more astounding was a statement by Superintendent Robert Hughes that he had directed changes be made back in 1986 but his instructions were ignored or else never implemented.

The summary of the auditors was harsh — waste, overbuying, overpayments, spoilage. Though the focus of criticism was on a former employee, the reflections are on all in financial supervisory positions.

The purchasing and bidding from a triple-dealing individual involving three firms casts a shadow over all of the transactions.

Whereas the facts and incidents enumerated in the audit and subsequent news story are disconcerting, the apparent complacency of school officials is astonishing. This is not to suggest a "tip of the iceberg" scenario but the taxpayers of Seminole County deserve better than a casual "this is what happened but the person is gone now" rejoinder.

There is an indication that responsibilities are now divided in a manner that was recommended in 1986. Changes are being affected in the accounting system and a complete physical inventory is being conducted, but the question lingers: Will all of Mr. Hughes' directives now be carried out?

The school system affects the lives of most of the citizens of this county, directly or indirectly. It has the support of the people and the superintendent enjoys wide popularity. We hope we will not encounter some type of cover-up in this instance but that the school officials will act wisely in seeking all of the answers, then offer a full explanation to the public as expeditiously as possible.

### Pioneer flies on

It is strange and exhilarating to consider the fact that something man-made, scientifically delicate and purposeful, is 4 billion miles from Earth.

The Pioneer 10 space probe seems almost to be trespassing in the vast spaces of the Milky Way. What was once nature's exclusive preserve now contains a man-made "star," an instrument of human intelligence that continues on its breathtaking trajectory.

The 570-pound spacecraft left Earth March 2, 1972, headed for a rendezvous with the vast and colorful planet Jupiter. It passed close to Jupiter in December 1973 and sent back exciting photos of the planet and its moons. The craft then became the first man-made object to escape the solar system.

Scientists expect Pioneer 10 to gather and send data for four more years. Even after it falls into silence, the space probe is expected to continue its journey indefinitely. This scientific post card to outer space is a tribute to the ingenuity and imagination of human beings. With the solar winds at its back, Pioneer 10 still has work to do and distances to travel.

### GOP delegates are not picked fairly

NEW ORLEANS (NEA) — The Democratic Party's penchant for ceaselessly revising the rules governing the selection of its presidential nominees often engenders disparaging comments about the perils of excessive tinkering.

On the other hand, derogatory remarks are seldom heard about the Republican Party's formula for selecting delegates to its presidential nominating conventions — even though the GOP system is archaic, unrepresentative and discriminatory.

The Republicans avoid criticism by almost never openly discussing or debating their distorted method of picking delegates, thus keeping it out of the public forum.

But the subject cannot be suppressed at quadrennial conventions, and once again a party reform group is attempting to embarrass the GOP into changing a formula that produces outrageous disparities in the representation of various states on the convention floor.

Among the states most grossly overrepresented are those in the northern reaches of the Great Plains, Rocky Mountains and New England — North and South Dakota, Montana, Wyoming, Idaho, Maine, Vermont and New Hampshire. The typical delegate from each of those states represents fewer than 9,000 Republi-

cans. Among the states most seriously underrepresented are those in the Northeast and Midwest — New York, Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, Wisconsin and Michigan. The typical delegate from each of those states represents almost 25,000 Republicans.

The states in the former category are able to exercise disproportionate power at the convention here because of a delegate-selection formula that begins logically enough by giving each state a base vote equal to three ...

... Electoral College vote. The states then can earn a variety of bonus votes, awarded without any regard for population. For example, both big and small states are awarded a bonus vote for each Republican victory in senatorial and gubernatorial contests.

Another bonus vote is awarded if Republicans control the state's delegation in the U.S. House of Representatives. That means North and South Dakota, Vermont, Wyoming and other rural states can earn the bonus by merely electing a lone Republican to their sole at-large seat.

But California, with 45 congressional districts, is denied the bonus even if it elects 23 Republicans. Only after 23 victories is it entitled to the bonus.

States in which the party's nominee won in the last presidential election receive two bonuses — 4½ delegates and 60 percent of their electoral college vote. Again the system is biased against heavily populated, industrialized states and in favor of sparsely settled, agricultural states.

Pennsylvania has 98 delegate votes compared with 19 for Delaware, a ratio of slightly more than 5-to-1. But Pennsylvania has a population of more than 11.8 million, compared with fewer than 600,000 in Delaware — a ratio of almost 20-to-1.

The Pennsylvania-Delaware example is hardly unique. Similar comparisons can be made among numerous other states — but party officials resolutely refuse to either recognize or remedy the glaring inequity.

### NRC probing cover-up

WASHINGTON — The Davis-Besse nuclear power plant near Toledo, Ohio was pushing a deadline to go to full power on New Year's Eve 1986, when the plant manager stormed into the control room. Smelling of alcohol, he threw a temper tantrum and shouted obscenities, according to employees who were on duty that night. The incident was serious because a nuclear disaster can be sparked by actions in the control room — the nerve center of any nuclear power plant.

But, the Toledo Edison power company covered up details of that night so the Nuclear Regulatory Commission would drop the issue.

The NRC shelved the matter until new allegations surfaced last year. Now our associate, Stewart Harris, has obtained the NRC's investigative report that concludes that Toledo Edison's vice president for nuclear power, Donald Shelton, "concealed" information.

The episode is just the latest example of what happens when the NRC, the federal watchdog over the nuclear industry, leaves power companies to police themselves.

Shelton made the original inquiry into the incident in January 1987 at the request of the NRC. In his report, Shelton wrote that plant manager, Louis Storz, arrived at work after drinking alcohol. But Shelton concluded that "the allegation that his behavior was a distraction is subjective and is not substantiated."

That might have been the end of the story, had not the NRC been prodded into launching an investigation later in 1987, when one of its own inspectors alleged that the plant manager ordered the plant to go to full power before it was safe, an allegation that was later disproved.

During the NRC probe, completed last month, Shelton admitted that he stopped his investigation after a senior vice president at Toledo Edison told him that Storz did not seem drunk when he talked to him by telephone that New Year's Eve. As Shelton told the NRC investigators: "If the senior V.P. says that the wall is brown, why should I ask the cleaning lady what color the wall is?"

Shelton probably should have asked anyway. Four workers who were on duty in the control room that night told the NRC that Storz had alcohol on his breath when he arrived at about 10 p.m. Storz himself told the NRC that he had shared a bottle of wine with his wife over dinner. And a witness said Storz had two drinks at a party after dinner.

Another witness said he did not smell liquor, but suspected Storz had been drinking because his speech and movements were impaired.

NRC investigators could not determine if Storz was drunk. But nine people in the control room said he was disruptive. One of them told investigators Storz yelled obscenities when he got into the control room.

Storz was upset when he was called to the control room because the plant was having trouble meeting its deadline to go to full power that night, after nearly 18 months of repairs, according to the NRC's investigation.

One worker told NRC investigators that he wondered why Storz was "in the control room in the condition he was in." Another said Storz, usually a quick study, failed to understand the technical problems that night.

### Circle K hits bullseye

WASHINGTON — Sometimes seems that accident insurance covers only improbable eventualities. You get arguments from the insurance company about fender benders but, as a wit has said, indemnity is instantaneous if your car kicks a hole in your neighbor's Maserati.

However, health insurance covers many "volitional illnesses," damage people do to themselves by behavior they should know is harmful. Now the Circle K Corporation, the second largest chain of convenience stores, wants to do something about that.

Circle K, which operates 4,000 stores in 27 states, notified approximately 8,000 of its employees that health-insurance benefits will be denied to employees who require care because of ailments resulting from certain "personal lifestyle decisions." Circle K specifies drug and alcohol abuse, self-inflicted wounds and AIDS proven not to have been contracted from blood transfusions.

The purpose of insurance is to socialize risk. This can be done over an entire society by means of government programs. (A conservative Bismarck pioneered such plans in the 1880s, providing workers with sickness, accident, disability and old-age insurance.) Or insurance can be devised for a voluntary community of people contracting with a private company. In either case, insurance presupposes some consensus about which of life's risks deserve to be socialized. Many diseases and other misfortunes are covered by today's consensus.

However, the consensus is becoming frayed because of increasing knowledge about the behavioral causes of many ailments. Such knowledge is constantly and often effectively disseminated by public and private agencies. The public's responsiveness to the information is attested by such changes as increased automobile safety belt use, decreased smoking and changed eating habits concerning, for example, cholesterol. So there is a moral as well as financial reason for refusing to socialize the cost of risky behavior that is, in the face of so much information, clearly willful.

Few would argue that someone whose hobby is Russian roulette has a right, let alone a "civil right," to insurance against the risk. Circle K is saying, correctly, that certain illnesses more closely resemble injuries resulting from Russian roulette than illnesses deriving from the unavoidable lottery of life-illnesses unrelated to risky habits.

There has been insurance for almost as long as there has been commerce. Merchants with

have paid others to share their risks. However,

as historian Daniel Boorstin notes, insurance first became a democratic product when Americans began insuring against something that is not a risk but a certainty: death. Like much of modern America, the growth of the insurance industry was accelerated by the Civil War, which put death on men's minds and caused the business of New York insurance companies to double between 1861 and 1862.

In an extensive nation of highly mobile citizens who could not rely on community care of widows and orphans, insurance became, as Boorstin says, a substitute for family, neighborhood, community. But as Circle K's action attest, insurance draws us into particular communities with a stake in other people's behavior.

Today, insurance is a large item in the average family's budget—larger than most people imagine. The cost of auto-workers' health insurance adds \$250 to the cost of an average car. Employees' health insurance is part of the cost of operating and hence of shopping at convenience stores.

Circle K is acting on this fact. A huge component of the nation's soaring staggering medical bill derives from behavior clearly identified as risky. Such behavior includes smoking, drinking excessively, exercising too little, eating unwisely, abusing drugs, driving recklessly.

Because AIDS is on the list of non-covered ailments, some homosexual groups have denounced Circle K for violating "civil rights." But that debased phrase is today a classification that barely classifies. Civil rights, properly understood, are those central to civic life. They do not include the right to insurance coverage for all of one's behaviorally based ailments.

However, let us not go too far. For the sake of Circle K Corp., as well as those of us who buy the snack foods that convenience stores sell in vast quantities, we should stop short of linking insurance to diets that are severely sensible.

In earlier trading in the Far East, the dollar rose slightly against the Japanese yen in moderate trading, closing up 0.07 at 133.15 yen.

A trust dealer said Tuesday's announcement of worse-than-expected U.S. trade figures for June depressed overseas markets, but by the time Tokyo opened other factors came into play to boost the dollar.

In Europe, the dollar opened in Frankfurt at 1,088 West German

# Christians, Moslems clash

**BEIRUT, Lebanon** — Fighting broke out between rival Christian and Moslem militias in southern Beirut hours after an announcement by pro-Syrian politician Suleiman Franjeh that he intended to succeed Amin Gemayel as president.

Franjeh's announcement Tuesday raised fears that Christian militias opposed to Syria's presence and role in Lebanon would try to stop Parliament from convening Thursday to elect a successor to Gemayel, whose six-year term ends Sept. 23.

The leading Christian militia group in Lebanon likened the announcement to a Syrian-condoned declaration of war.

Hours after Franjeh declared his candidacy, Christian and Syrian-backed Moslem militiamen, dug in along a 13-year-old confrontation line in the hilltop area of Kharshina in southern Beirut, traded rocket artillery and machine-gun fire, security officials said.

As flares lit up the night sky, several mortars strayed from the demarcation line and hit nearby residential areas, causing some damage. There were no immediate reports of casualties.

Officials said the violence lasted less than 30 minutes, but it fueled fears that a failure by parliamentarians Thursday to

choose a compromise leader could lead to a new round of Christian-Moslem bloodshed.

Franjeh, a 78-year-old Christian Maronite, served as president from 1970 to 1976 and is Syria's main Christian supporter in Lebanon.

Syria maintains some 30,000 troops in eastern and northern Lebanon and in Moslem west Beirut.

Franjeh made the announce-

ment during a news conference at his summer residence in the village of Elden, 37 miles northeast of Beirut.

"I have decided to take part in bearing the burden and responsibilities in securing the country's freedom and independence and in building a new Lebanon," said Franjeh, stressing the need for Moslem-Christian reconciliation.

Also, the school's cafeteria and kitchen have been remodeled and an air conditioning unit added.

Tuesday afternoon, workmen hustled to ensure that all chores will be complete in time for the nearly 800 children who will be attending.

What Goldsboro has very little of is grass. Boyer says the grass may seem sparse but one month

## NATIONAL BRIEFS

### City of Yonkers appeals fines

**NEW YORK** — The embattled city of Yonkers turned to a federal appeals court today in an attempt to avoid bankrupting fines imposed because officials refuse to obey a judge's order to desegregate housing.

The Yonkers City Council, recalcitrant despite the crippling fines, voted 4-3 early Tuesday against building 800 units of low- and middle-income housing in predominantly white neighborhoods.

The vote, at a boisterous meeting that began Monday night and lasted past midnight, was the same as that of Aug. 1 when the seven-member council first rejected the desegregation plan ordered by U.S. District Judge Leonard Sand.

### Church officials investigating visions

**LUBBOCK, Texas** — A Roman Catholic monk said it may take years for church officials to investigate reported visions of the Virgin Mary and Jesus at a huge outdoor mass, but he said the delay will eliminate chances of the event being clouded by a "circus" atmosphere.

An estimated 15,000 people attended Monday evening's mass, drawn by reports that Mary had been speaking to three members of St. John Neumann Catholic Church since February.

Many in the crowd shrieked, wept and pointed to the sky at images they said they saw in the clouds. Several people said their rosaries had turned to gold in the twilight, then returned to silver.

A group of priests interviewed people Tuesday about what they saw at the mass and searched for photographs or other proof of the reported visions and messages.

### Soviets to witness U.S. nuclear test

**PAHUTE MESA, Nev.** — For the first time in the 43-year history of the Atomic Age, Soviet scientists had a front-row seat at the Nevada Test Site to record and monitor the detonation of a U.S. nuclear weapon.

Government weather experts said conditions appeared favorable for the Joint Verification Experiment, code-named "Kearns," for the underground detonation today of a nuclear bomb a dozen times more powerful than the one that leveled Hiroshima on Aug. 6, 1945.

Forty-five Soviets have been in Nevada since April preparing for the unprecedented event. U.S. scientists also are in the Soviet Union getting ready for a similar test next month at the Semipalatinsk test facility in Soviet Central Asia.

### Some nurses strike settled

Tentative agreement has been reached to end a 5-week-old strike by 1,100 Kaiser Permanente nurses in Oregon and Washington, and a walkout by 2,200 nurses in San Francisco edged nearer to settlement, officials said.

In Portland, Ore., a federal mediator announced a settlement agreement on Tuesday to end the 5-week-old strike by nurses against two Kaiser Permanente hospitals and 13 clinics.

**WESTERLY, R.I.** — Dunes Beach visitors found no medical garbage along their private beach — only a healthy cash flow that had them plucking \$1,000 in singles, 10-spots and \$100 bills from the swirling surf.

The waters were flecked with cold, wet cash last Wednesday, and by Sunday, word of the bonanza had spread up and down the beach, about 3 miles from Misquamicut State Beach, beachgoers said Monday.

"I saw a girl in front of me pick out a twenty and a guy beside me was finding tens and twenties," said Leonard Francois of Springfield, Mass., who was one of many drawn to the beach on Sunday.

Francois reported finding \$23 in a little over an hour, and dried it off in his microwave. He said others were finding "tenties and hundreds" in the surf.

No one knows where the money came from, but unlike with the medical waste that has fouled many East Coast beaches this summer, no one is demanding a probe for its source. Some bathers speculated the cash was drug money that had to be dumped.



## Bush nomination comes tonight

### United Press International

**NEW ORLEANS** — George Bush will be nominated for president tonight by Republicans to carry on the legacy of Ronald Reagan — a goal reinforced with the choice of conservative Indiana Sen. Dan Quayle as his running mate.

This is Bush's big day at the 34th Republican National Convention, and he and Quayle called a joint morning news conference to discuss the vice presidential selection and their plans for the campaign.

With most of the GOP faithful already praising his choice, the roll call of state delegations set to begin at 9:30 p.m. CDT, will give the 64-year-old Bush the top spot he first sought — and lost to Reagan — eight years ago.

Reagan's loyal vice president will be handed the nomination on prime-time television by acclamation, having collected enough delegates in the primary elections months ago to make Reagan briefly at a military airport before the president departed in a symbolic changing of the guard.

Bush, attending various receptions and luncheons throughout town, will not appear before the convention in the huge Superdome until Thursday night, when he and Quayle deliver their acceptance speeches.

Still, the two-term vice president took command of the convention the moment he arrived in New Orleans Monday morning at the airport before the president departed in a symbolic changing of the guard.

Reaction to the selection of Quayle was favorable among Republicans, though some delegates acknowledged they were

unfamiliar with the little-known junior senator from Indiana.

Former President Gerald Ford, evangelist and former presidential candidate Pat Robertson, former U.N. Ambassador Jeane Kirkpatrick and New Jersey Gov. Thomas Kean took turns attacking the Democrats before 30,000 appreciative partisans in the Superdome.

Robertson released his few delegates to Bush and ridiculed Democrats for their stand on the Superdome.

Ford gave the Republican reply to Kennedy's refrain of "Where was George?" that ignited the Democratic convention in July.

"So where was George?" Ford asked. "For 45 years, George Bush has been at the center of the action in the service of this great Republic."

"I'll be damned if I'll stand by and let anyone, with a smirk and a sneer, discredit the honor, service, accountability and competence of George Bush."

## Dukakis backers sneer at Bush's VP selection

**BOSTON** — Democrat Michael Dukakis's campaign is attacking the choice of Dan Quayle to be George Bush's running mate, with a spokesman saying the Indiana senator "doesn't understand the economic reality facing the American working family."

The announcement caught the Republican National Convention by surprise, but gave Quayle a head start in explaining to the American people exactly who he is, what he stands for and why they should vote Republican on Nov. 8.

The difficulty of that task was evident in the massive Superdome after Bush bared the secret that had been building for weeks. Convention delegate Bruce Patterson of Seattle summed up the reaction of many: "Who the hell is he?"

That is the question Quayle sets out to tackle as he touches base with the GOP faithful, rallies the party behind its nominees.

Bush initially planned to make his choice public Thursday.

### Shootings, beatings mark Gaza violence

GAZA CITY, Israel-occupied Gaza Strip — Violence flared in the curfew-bound Gaza Strip today and workers in the occupied West Bank observed a general strike to honor Jerusalem, "the capital of our Palestinian state."

Palestinian sources said two people were shot and wounded during clashes with troops in the Israeli-occupied Gaza Strip, including a 12-year-old girl shot in the head.

The sources said 20 people were treated for beating injuries they received during the clashes. Since 7 p.m. Tuesday, at least 90 people have been treated for beatings and tear gas inhalation, they said.

U.N. relief officials in Gaza said they had reports of some people breaking the 3-day-old curfew today and being chased by soldiers. They said they had heard of beatings and soldiers firing live ammunition.

### At least 10 killed in Russian train crash

MOSCOW — At least 10 people were killed when a train traveling from Leningrad at high speed derailed and a fire engulfed the wreckage, transport officials and the official Tass news agency said Wednesday.

A spokesman for the Ministry of Transport declined to give precise casualty figures but said there were "more than 10" fatalities in the Tuesday night accident halfway between Leningrad and Moscow.

He did not say how many people were injured nor how many people the train was carrying, which is normally jammed with passengers.

### Thousands flee Chinese flood waters

BEIJING — Tens of thousands of people fled their homes today along a rain-swollen northeastern river that officials feared would overflow its banks and cause the biggest flood in China since 1949.

More than 20,000 people already had been evacuated from areas around the Nenjiang River, which runs south from the Sino-Soviet border through Inner Mongolia and Heilongjiang Province, said Chen Dekun, spokesman for the Central Flood Control Headquarters.

Another 40,000 were scheduled to be moved before the river's record-breaking waters reached the industrial city of Qiqihar.

### Burmese leaders seek to defuse strife


RANGOON, Burma — Authorities have released 81 demonstrators arrested during last week's violent protests, eased travel restrictions and partially lifted emergency regulations in an apparent bid to head off further unrest, official reports said today.

"At the moment, we seem to be in the eye of the storm," said one Rangoon-based diplomat. "I believe everything will start all over again after Friday."

On Friday, the ruling Burma Socialist Program Party is scheduled to select a replacement for president and party leader Sein Lwin, who resigned his posts last week following harsh suppression of anti-government demonstrations.

Diplomatic estimate that about 1,000 people were killed in shooting by army and security forces, while thousands more were wounded or arrested.



Republicans hope the youthful vice presidential candidacy of Indiana's Sen. Dan Quayle, 41, can help draw votes from several generations and bring new vigor to George Bush's campaign, especially when compared against Sen. Lloyd Bentsen, the 67-year-old running mate of Democrat Michael Dukakis.

But when the question of age was put to Bentsen Tuesday, the Texan deflected it in much the same style as President Reagan used against his 1984 challenger, former Vice President Walter Mondale.

Reagan, 73 at the time, drew a big laugh in a debate with Mondale when he said of the 56-year-old Democrat, "I won't hold my opponent's youth and inexperience against him." Bentsen quipped in a CBS News interview, "Dan Quayle shouldn't worry about middle age. He'll grow out of it."

**Quayle reactions mixed****United Press International**

NEW ORLEANS — GOP leaders are embracing Indiana's young Sen. Dan Quayle as a qualified vice presidential candidate, but some Republicans appear upset with the decision and still others are wondering just who in the world he is.

Vice President George Bush, to be nominated tonight for the White House at the Republican National Convention, tapped the 41-year-old second-term senator Tuesday to be his running mate against the Democratic ticket of Massachusetts Gov. Michael Dukakis and veteran Sen. Lloyd Bentsen of Texas.

Bush's choice received the positive convention reaction that could have been expected generally for any candidate, even from those he passed over for the vice presidential spot.

Senate Republican leader Robert Dole of Kansas, a front-runner for the job after failing to beat Bush for the presidential

nomination, said, "The process worked. We've got a good candidate." His wife, Elizabeth, also considered for the Republican ticket, agreed. "I think it's a fine choice."

Rep. Jack Kemp of New York said "nobody jumped up and down" when he got the word that he too had been rejected, but he said Quayle "is going to make our party as appealing to young people as it ever has been in our history."

Illinois Gov. James Thompson, who withdrew his name from consideration as a running mate, said, "I'm particularly pleased he's from the Midwest. He's a superb campaigner."

And Sen. Alan Simpson of Wyoming, a close friend of Bush, said, "Danny Quayle is a splendid man. I think it was an excellent choice."

Residents of Quayle's hometown were delighted.

#### Navratilova routs Mascarin

MONTREAL — Martina Navratilova posted an easy victory in her first tournament match since Wimbledon, defeating Susan Mascarin Tuesday in the \$315,000 Players' Challenge Canadian Open.

Navratilova, top-seeded in the tournament and ranked No. 2 in the world, eliminated Mascarin, of Boca Raton, Fla., 6-2, 6-2. Navratilova, who lost the Wimbledon final in July to world No. 1 Steffi Graf, advanced to the third round with six other seeds, all of whom had little trouble.

Third-seed Pam Shriver, of Lutherville, Md., downed Switzerland's Eva Krapf 6-4, 6-2; fourth-seeded Argentine Gabriela Sabatini ousted Stacey Martin, of Largo, Md., 6-2, 6-2; fifth-seed Helena Sukova of Czechoslovakia beat Marianne Werdel, Bakersfield, Calif., 6-3, 6-4.

#### Hawks sign Moses Malone

ATLANTA — The Atlanta Hawks enhanced their bid for an NBA championship Tuesday by signing star center Moses Malone to a three-year contract.

Malone, a 33-year-old free agent entering his 15th season, could earn nearly \$1.5 million this year and exceed that the following two.

"Money's always nice," said Malone, a three-time Most Valuable Player who spent the last two seasons with the Washington Bullets. "But the reason I selected the Hawks is because this is a talented team. They have the talent to win a ring. I have 10 fingers but I have only one ring."

The 6-foot-10 veteran played on Philadelphia's 1983 championship team. He has averaged 23.6 points and 13.9 rebounds a game during his 12 years in the NBA. Last season, Malone's effectiveness dropped as the Bullets went with younger players.

## Buddy Baker recovering after surgery

CHARLOTTE, N.C. — Veteran NASCAR driver Buddy Baker was awake and recovering Tuesday from surgery that removed a blood clot from between his skull and brain, doctors said.

Baker was rushed into surgery early Tuesday at Charlotte Memorial Hospital after doctors discovered the blood clot Monday.

The 47-year-old driver had missed Sunday's Watkins Glen, N.Y., race after suffering physical problems during last week's practice. Complaining of headaches, loss of balance and nausea, Baker consulted Charlotte neurologist Dr. Jerry Petty on Monday.

Petty performed the 90-minute surgery Tuesday that went "very well."

Petty said blood was collecting between the covering of the brain and the brain itself, causing pressure on the brain. He said the operation was a fairly common procedure.

The surgeon said Petty could be back behind the wheel in less than two months.

"I would say it would be not less than 6 weeks before he can drive, but these racing folks live by different rules than the average patient," Petty said at a post-surgery press conference.

Before going to surgery Baker said he hoped to be back for the Southern 500 at Darlington, S.C., on Sept. 4.

"He's awake, he's hungry and every time a nurse walks by he raises his head," said Baker's son Bryan. "Apparently he's all right."

The condition apparently goes back to Baker's crash at the Charlotte Motor Speedway in May during the Coca-Cola 600.

Baker was involved in a five-car crash on the 244th lap of the 400-lap race. He crawled from his car and collapsed. Rescue crews placed a neck brace on him at that time. He was examined at the infield hospital and released.

## LA gets Tudor for Guerrero

LOS ANGELES — Pedro Guerrero didn't want to leave, but when the Los Angeles Dodgers attempted to trade him for Kirk Gibson last winter, he knew it was only a matter of time before he was playing elsewhere.

Tudor, who won 31 of 41 decisions in the

Cardinals' perennial-winning seasons of 1985 and 1987, becomes the lone southpaw in the Los Angeles rotation. The Dodgers have been without a left-handed starter since Fernando Valenzuela was disabled July 30.

Los Angeles, which leads second-place Houston by 3 1/2 games in the NL West, had been searching for a left-hander and had considered, among others, Toronto's Mike Flanagan and Philadelphia's Don Carman. Now they may have enough talent to win the division.

"I think so," Los Angeles Executive Vice President Fred Claire said. "We have a ballclub that is in first place. And we've made an addition." See Trade, Page 2B

## Gators feature plenty of intrigue

GAINESVILLE — Still feeling the effects of NCAA sanctions, the 1988 University of Florida football program features a legitimate Heisman Trophy contender, solid defense, an easier schedule and plenty of intrigue.

Coach Galen Hall is grappling with a key question heading into his fifth year. Kerwin Bell, who threw for more yards and touchdowns than any passer in Southeastern Conference history, must be replaced and Hall still doesn't know which inexperienced quarterback will be taking snaps behind a thin offensive line.

Sophomore Herbert Perry is considered the veteran of the contending quarterbacks after attempting all of eight passes during Florida's 6-6 season last year. Red shirt freshman Kyle Morris, who runs a 4.65 in the 40, is also in contention along with true freshman Lex Smith, who threw for 3,000 yards and 20 touchdowns in a superb Florida prep career.

"Whoever the quarterback is, I will have confidence in him," says Hall, who brought in new offensive coordinator Lynn Amedee. "You might see us use two quarterbacks this season. We will use a lot of variations and formations to keep defenses off balance and you will see a

much more diversified offense."

Emmit Smith, who neared off nine 100-yard rushing games as a freshman, earned more Heisman Trophy votes than any player returning to college football. The No. 3 freshman rusher in history belittled Herschel Walker and Tony Dorsett could be even more effective as a sophomore.

"He is going to get better," vows running back coach Larry Kirksey. "He's worked hard at getting better and he knows what he will have to do. He wants to win and he is becoming somewhat of a leader around here."

Tackle David Williams anchors an inexperienced offensive line that has been hurt by Florida's past NCAA probation and scholarship sanctions. Nearly 50 percent of the players on

Florida's scholarship roster have never played a down in college.

Stacy Simmons and Ernie Mills are fleet receivers whose hands are suspect. Terrence Barber, a Proposition 48 casualty in 1987, will get a long look at wide receiver while Mark McGriff offers marginal receiving skills and decent blocking at tight end.

Florida's kicking game looms as a potential disaster area. The three contenders for the field goal duties — David Francis, Andy Elton and Arden Czyzewski — have one collegiate attempt between them. Punting chores are uncertain following the departure of Jamie McAndrew.

"The strength of our football team has to be defense," says Hall, whose team has led the SEC in total defense for three of the last four years. "We have three quality players up front in Rhondy Weston, Jeff Roth and Trace Armstrong. Our linebacking is questionable and we are very inexperienced in the secondary, but we will be sound on defense."

Armstrong transferred from Arizona State after posting seven sacks and 46 tackles last season. He and Weston will flank Roth at middle guard and the trio combined for 20 sacks in 1987.

"Trace brings three years of experience and the promise that offenses can't avoid one side of the line," says Roth.

## Heat takes its toll

**NEW YORK** — Babe Ruth once put the issue of weather in perspective for no less a figure than the president of the United States.

"Hot as hell, ain't it prez," he supposedly said.

Besides illustrating how to speak in a White House receiving line, Ruth's comments also remind us of a flaw in baseball history. It seems Alexander Cartwright neglected to await the invention of lights and air-conditioning before devising his favorite pastime.

Thus, players faced heat not only from wild left-handers, but from the elements as well.

"I can remember certain cities like Washington and St. Louis," said former major leaguer Larry Doby. "St. Louis had that clay type infield and in Washington the humidity was unbelievable. We wore those woolen uniforms. Those two cities were the hottest."

The issue arises today because of the national heat wave. On Monday alone, heat set records in three dozen cities in 20 states. Such conditions remain a challenge for men who circle bases for a living.

"It's been very hot," said Mike Jorgensen, who manages the St. Louis Cards' farm team in Louisville. "I think it's a factor. We play 140 games in 146 days. You can't really play everybody every day. It's a factor for pitching. You don't see as many complete games."

Louisville plays in the American Association, a league positioned to catch all the heat the midwest can throw. Tuesday's temperatures in AA cities included 101 in Oklahoma City, 98 in Louisville, 94 in Nashville, 104 in Des Moines, 97 in Indianapolis, 100 in Omaha and 91 in Denver.

"When you get to Denver," Jorgensen said, "it's just wonderful."

Doby, 63, can enjoy air-conditioning from the New Jersey Nets front office, where he works as the club's Director of Community Affairs. But it wasn't always so simple. He was born in Camden, S.C., and played Negro League ball before reaching the majors with Cleveland in 1947.

"The only thing they had at that time was salt tablets," Doby said. "You drank a lot of water. Especially the day games. If you played at night it wasn't bad."

Doby says he played about two years with the Newark Eagles, where long trips became the norm. He says he never rode a train until he reached the big leagues. It's a long way between Newark, N.J. and Norfolk, Va.

"You'd play a night game, ride all night on the bus, play the next night," Doby said. "It became part of your life and you never thought much about it. It was our job, we enjoyed playing. You never let it become a problem."

As far as keeping cool, Doby said, "Open the windows, use a fan, whatever you could do to get some fresh air, you did. Most of the windows had screens. You took a cold shower, took a bath. Drink a lot of water. There wasn't a lot you could do."

Grady Hatton, now an advance scout for the San Francisco Giants, was born in Beaumont, Texas. Like Doby, he both played and managed in the big leagues. Like Doby, he says he simply adjusted to the heat because there was no choice.



## Clemens to miss start

BOSTON — The Boston Red Sox received good news and bad news on injured pitchers Dennis "Oil Can" Boyd and Roger Clemens.

Clemens, the back-to-back Cy Young Award winner, will miss his next scheduled start Friday against Oakland and be held back for 10 days. He is scheduled to start the final game of a 12-game homestand Aug. 24 against California.

Clemens, who reportedly injured his back moving into his new home Aug. 3, admitted his time to rest his injury.

"I've got to give into it," said Clemens before Tuesday's game against Seattle. "I've had a similar injury before and been able to pitch through it. I wasn't about to give in."

Clemens was diagnosed by

team physician Dr. Arthur Pappas Sunday as having a muscle strain in the left side of his rib cage in the back area. He is taking muscle relaxant and rest is prescribed.

Clemens admitted he probably should have rested his back sooner instead of starting three times.

"I should have faced the reality of the situation," he said. "I was stubborn. I should have listened to my instincts. It's important to rest and think about September."


Clemens lasted only 1 1-3 innings in his last start, allowing eight runs on five hits against Detroit in Sunday's 18-6 loss. He has lost his last three starts.

# Kimball will seek Seoul spot

INDIANAPOLIS — Bruce Kimball, who faces up to 45 years in prison for his role in the deaths of two Florida teens, said Tuesday he will compete in the U.S. Olympic diving trials.

"I don't give up. I won't give up. I'm not sure I can live with myself if I do," a distraught Kimball said. "I've come to Indianapolis with the feeling I will compete in the Olympic trials and do the best I can under the circumstances."

Kimball, 25, spoke one day before the trials begin at Indiana University Natatorium. Kimball has qualified to compete in the 3-meter springboard and 10-meter platform events. But his status was uncertain since a car he was driving struck a group of teenagers Aug. 1 near Brandon, Fla., leaving two dead and six hurt.

"The reason I have not made a statement until now is because I have been pretty devastated," said Kimball, who read from a prepared text and answered no questions. "Not a person here has any idea of the grief I have felt."

Other than that, Kimball expressed no remorse.

Kimball walked to the door of the interview room, saw a crowd of reporters and walked away, but composed himself and entered moments later, followed by his parents and 20 of his friends, many of them hoping to earn a berth in Seoul at the meet. Kimball hesitated before walking to the podium, then spoke in a calm, collected voice.

"The first reason I'm here is to help me get on to the next day," he said. "I've come here to face what's in front of me."

Kimball, the 1984 Olympic silver medalist in platform diving, said that after 21 years of work, dedication and commitment, "I cannot disappoint my family and friends."

Kimball is free on \$10,000 bail and was not prohibited from traveling to Indianapolis. He was charged Monday by Florida state attorney Bill James with two counts of driving under the influence-manslaughter and three counts of DUI-injured person. He faces an Aug. 26 arraignment on the felony charges. Each manslaughter count carries a penalty of up to 15 years in prison. Each injury count carries a maximum sentence of 5 years.

Investigators said Kimball had admitted drinking at least four beers before the crash. Reports

said his blood-alcohol level was twice the legal limit for drivers, but officials would not reveal Kimball's blood-alcohol level.

Friends of the victims and the Mothers Against Drunk Driving group have started petition drives in Florida aimed at preventing Kimball from competing even if he earns a place on the team at this week's meet.

As Kimball walked from the interview room, a voice shouted, "Go home Bruce." It belonged to Katherine Owen, local chapter president of MADD and an invited guest at the news conference. Owen said her group will have some type of protest at the meet.

"I'm absolutely appalled. This is another example of his arrogant, pompous attitude that he's going to do what's best for him and not for his Olympic teammates. You expect Olympic athletes to be the epitome of their nation. This is a disgrace. I'm surprised and outraged he would put his teammates through this. I'm so surprised by this that I don't know what action we will take. But we will do something."

Kimball, who himself was nearly killed by a drunken driver in 1981, is a six-time U.S. platform champion and has earned bronze medals in the past two world championship meets. Before the incident, he was considered a strong contender for an Seoul Olympic berth along with favored Greg Louganis, the 1984 champion on platform and springboard.

Kimball's attorneys, Lee Fugate and Frank Quesada of Clearwater, Fla., said Kimball's case might not reach trial before December and that they felt confident he would be allowed to compete in Seoul if he earned a place on the team.

"Anyone who knows Bruce knows he will appear," Fugate said. "It's our hope and the family's hope that everyone can get back to diving and not answering questions. He would like to see everyone have the opportunity to compete without having a notebook and pencil in their face."

Louganis, who is struggling with the flu, was concerned as late as Sunday that he might miss the meet because of his illness. He said the Kimball situation will not disrupt his preparation for the meet.

"I'm going to be oblivious to what's going on," he said. "My heart goes out to all concerned but at this point, I have to concentrate on myself. It's not

my position to say whether he should compete or not."

#### SOVIET DELEGATION

SEOUL, South Korea — The Soviet Union will send a consular delegation to Seoul to help Soviet nationals during the Olympics, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs announced Tuesday.

The six will be the first Soviet diplomats to visit South Korea since World War II, officials said.

A ministry spokesman said the Soviet request to send the four diplomats and two administrative officials was approved in the interest of the Soviet athletes and tourists during the games starting Sept. 17.

Although the consular mission is temporary and expires Oct. 10, observers said it was a stepping stone for improvement in relations between South Korea and the Soviet Union.

# Livingston earns spot in Olympics

HOUSTON — Bobby Livingston won the men's kilometer race Tuesday to earn a spot on the U.S. Olympic Track Cycling team and qualify for the Seoul Olympics.

Livingston, 23, of Riverdale, Ga., was the lone Olympic qualifier at the Alkek Velodrome in west Houston.

Livingston won the three-lap, 1,000-meter race in 1 minute, 6.82 seconds, beating Leonard Harvey Nitz, of Citrus Heights, Calif., who finished in 1:07.06. Livingston was fifth at the National Track Championships last year. Nitz was a 15-time national champion and had placed third in the event at the Pan American Games last year.

Rory O'Reilly, of Santa Barbara, Calif., finished third in 1:07.39.

The kilometer event pits the riders in a race against the clock. National championships were decided in the men's tandem and women's kilometer, both non-Olympic events.

Bart Bell, of Houston, and Tom Brinker, of Washington, Mo., won the men's national tandem championship followed by the team of Mark Garrett, of Alhambra, Calif., and Artie Marcello, of Altadena, Calif.

"It could not have gone any better," Bell said. "We got a gap on them and they had to chase us. They did not have enough speed. We picked it up too hard."

The men's and women's tandem and the women's individual pursuit are not Olympic events but the national champions in the men's tandem will go directly to Belgium for the 1988 World Cycling Championships.

# Yow faces difficult task in making cuts

RALEIGH, N.C. — The toughest task for U.S. Olympic women's basketball coach Kay Yow may be coming this week, a month before the team's first game in Seoul.

Yow is expected to reduce the roster from 15 to 12.

She may do it after Wednesday night's exhibition with Cuba at Francis Marion College in Florence, S.C. The teams play again Saturday in Myrtle Beach, S.C., where the U.S. team will train until the end of August.

"For the situation they're in, they're a pretty tight group," Yow said of her players. "There is a big difference in making the team and being an alternate, but they've done a good job of competing with rather than against each other."

Yow's task is difficult for two reasons:

One, she is attached to virtually each candidate. Of the 15 remaining, 11 played for Yow in 1986 when she was coach of the first U.S. women's team to beat the Soviet Union.

Two, she is cutting from strength. With the majority of the team experienced in international play, the performance of each one was solid in two previous exhibitions with Cuba. The USA won 119-58 and 96-78.

Yow's situation contrasts with that of U.S. men's coach John Thompson. He is attempting to build many of the intangibles that Yow's club already has.

"We have an experienced team, players who have been together for some time," Yow

said. "We have made some minor changes from 1986 in the system, but the major things are still the same."

"Our strengths are great quickness and speed. But I think team unity will be the greatest strength of all. When we cut, the emphasis on unity will become even stronger."

Three players will be dropped. Those in jeopardy would appear to be 6-foot-1 Clarissa Davis, 6-3 Jennifer Gillett, 6-3 Vicki Bullett, 6-0 Fran Harris and 5-4 Suzie McConnell. All have done well, but others have played as well or better at their respective positions.

#### POSSIBLE TRUCE

TOKYO — North Korea, signaling a possible reversal of its boycott of the Olympic Games only a month away, today agreed to meet South Korea for the first time in three years at the truce village of Panmunjom.

The communist North Korean government said it would send a five-member delegation to the northern side of the Korean village on the 38th Parallel at Friday to meet with representatives from Seoul, according to the official (North) Korean Central News Agency.

The North had originally proposed that the one-day session be held Wednesday to hammer out details for an unprecedented joint session of the nations' parliaments on Aug. 26, either in Pyongyang or Seoul, to discuss the Olympics and a non-aggression treaty to end 40 years of hostility.

Remember too, that the total meal should have a variety of flavors, textures and colors for appeal.

Ground beef casseroles are a basic for many families. This nutritious combination of meat and cheese reminds one of enchiladas.

### ENCHILADA CASSEROLE

1 pound ground beef  
1 medium onion, chopped  
1 clove garlic, minced  
1 can (12-ounce) tomato paste  
1 cup water  
1 can (4-ounce) chopped green chilies, drained  
½ cup sliced ripe olives  
½ teaspoon salt  
2 eggs  
1 package (8-ounce) Monterey Jack cheese, sliced  
1 package (10-ounce) corn tortillas, quartered  
1 cup (4-ounce) shredded cheddar cheese  
Sour cream

Crumble ground beef into 1½-quart casserole; add onion and garlic. M/W on 100 percent power 5-6 minutes, stirring once. Stir to break meat into smaller pieces; drain. Stir in bouillon, pepper, noodles, and water. Cover with casserole lid. M/W on 100 percent power 10-12 minutes or until noodles are tender, stirring once or twice. Add cheese and milk. M/W on 100 percent power 5-6 minutes or until vegetables are tender. Combine water and cornstarch until smooth. Stir into vegetables. Mix in bouillon, soy sauce and pepper. M/W on 100 percent power, uncovered, 2-3 minutes or until mixture boils and thickens, stirring once.

Serve over rice or chow mein noodles.

## Observation bred cuisine

### Housekeeper's lessons carry on

**SANFORD** — The family housekeeper taught our Cook of the Week her first cooking skills, although cooking is only one facet of her active life.

Gail Stewart was born in Conway, S.C., and started school there but moved to DeLand when she was 10, eventually graduating from DeLand High School.

Stewart's father owned a construction company in DeLand, but died when Stewart was 12. Her mother continued on with the construction company and became one of the first female contractors in Florida. Stewart's mother has since remarried and lives in DeLand as Mr. and Mrs. C.L. Clements—both retired.

An older brother of Stewart's also lives in DeLand.

"I was taught to cook by our housekeeper in Conway, South Carolina," Stewart said. "My mother owned a business in Conway and we had a housekeeper by the name of Lottie Dixon who would come and take care of me and the house. I spent so much of my time with Lottie that I would sit for hours watching her cook. She explained to me how and what each dish was she was fixing so that I just picked up how to cook."

Being born in a southern state leads to one learning much about good old-fashioned southern cooking handed down from generation to generation. Stewart said, "My mother was a real good cook also," she added. "Back then we canned everything out of our garden. We had our own pigs and cows that we slaughtered for the meat and had a large garden that we raised for plenty of fresh vegetables."

The first dish Stewart remembers preparing was spaghetti. "It was really very good and disappeared very quickly. I still make it to this day."

She said she has never entered a cooking contest, simply because she cannot find the time. "It might be fun, though, just to see where I would finish," she said, grinning.

Stewart met her future husband at the Kentucky Derby in Louisville, Ky., in 1968. She and Roger both were attending Eastern Kentucky State College. Roger then transferred to the University of Kentucky in Louisville, where he graduated from dental school. "It was love at first sight," Stewart said of their meeting.

The couple have three children. Daughter Shanan is 16 and attends Seminole High School. Shanan, Miss Florida U.S. Teen for 1988, placed eighth out of 52 contestants at the recent competition for the title of Miss U.S. Teen in Atlanta.

"If I had my life to live over again, I don't think I would change a thing because I have really enjoyed my life as it is," Stewart said. "I am very content with my life and have lived every facet of my life just the way it was meant to be lived."

**PEANUTS****Building inspectors advise on asbestos**

DEAR DR. GOTTL: We recently moved into my parents' house and suspect that the ceiling tiles are asbestos. Should we just live quietly beneath them, get them removed or paint them? Would an air purifier help?

DEAR READER: You are probably not in any danger, providing the tiles are not shredding or coming loose. Removal is quite a job and should be performed only by qualified personnel; the process is quite expensive. Painting the tiles would help if a health hazard exists.

I suggest that you have the house inspected by a building inspector. Based on his findings, you can make a reasonable decision. In my experience, asbestos insulation on pipes is a greater potential threat than are ceiling tiles. Nevertheless, an authorized inspector can advise you and, I hope, put your mind at rest.

DEAR DR. GOTTL: When I was in my 30s, an ophthalmologist examined my eyes and remarked, "I bet you get motion sickness." I had been plagued with this problem since childhood. He went on to tell me that my vision was blurry at a distance and that this would cause it. He prescribed eye-glasses and I've never been sick since. Maybe your readers who get motion sickness should have their eyes checked.

DEAR READER: Ophthalmologists can often discover amazing things. I think they plan it that way, to astound unsophisticated and unwary general doctors. A friend of mine, who is a very good ophthalmologist, once told me, "They don't teach you guys the really interesting parts of ophthalmology in medical school; they save that stuff for us."

In any case, your eye specialist made an astute observation. Motion sickness can be related to poor distance vision, because one of the ways to avoid being motion-sick is to focus on distant

objects. This tends to reorient the body. Obviously, if distance vision is blurred, this reorientation is difficult. In my experience, poor distance vision is not a common cause of motion sickness, but it certainly could be a factor in special cases.



**WIN AT BRIDGE**

When competitive bidding becomes flamboyant, bids are made more on momentum than on rational analysis. When North jumped to four hearts, East bid four spades. He hoped his partner had four-card spade support for his takeout double, and he thought his side lacked defense against four hearts. I sympathize with South bidding five hearts. The farthest thing from his imagination was that North held six cards in the spade suit. The business double by West needs no explanation — if his partner could bid four spades, where were the opponents going to make 11 tricks?

The heart lead was best. Declarer won and led a low diamond. East won and played a club. South played the queen and West won the A before playing a second trump. All

though declarer was able to ruff two diamonds and pitch another on dummy's spade ace, he still had one more diamond to lose for down two.

Would your opening lead be a low spade if you were West? Declarer would put in the jack and ruff East's queen. Then A-K and a small heart to dummy would allow him to pitch a club on the ace of spades. Another spade would be ruffed as the king dropped, and now declarer would only have to give up a club and a diamond to make five hearts doubled. What a difference a lead makes!

 1 cup dry white wine  
 1 small onion, sliced  
 1 tablespoon snipped parsley  
 2 teaspoons pure lemon juice  
 Salt to taste  
 5 tablespoons butter, divided  
 6 tablespoons whole wheat pastry flour  
 1 cup cream  
 2 ounces Gruyere cheese, cut up  
 Dash pepper  
 1 can (7½ ounces) crab meat drained and flaked  
 1 can (4½ ounces) shrimp meat drained  
 1 can (13 ounces) sliced mushrooms, drained (better if you can get fresh mushrooms)  
 1½ cups soft whole wheat bread crumbs

Combine scallops, wine, onion, parsley, lemon juice, and salt. Bring to boil and simmer for 5 minutes. Drain, reserving 1 cup liquid. In saucepan, melt 4 tablespoons butter and stir in flour. Cook, stirring for 3-4 minutes. Add cream and reserved scallop liquid all at once. Stir and cook over medium heat until mixture thickens and

bubbles. Remove from heat. Stir in cheese and pepper until cheese melts. Add scallop mixture, crab meat, shrimp and mushrooms. Spoon into 6 individual-sized or one large casserole. Combine bread crumbs with 1 tablespoon melted butter and spoon over casserole. Bake in preheated 350°F oven for 25 minutes or until heated through and bubbly.

**HARVEST VEGETABLE CASSEROLE**

3 tablespoons oil  
 2 large onions, sliced ¾ inch thick and separated into rings  
 1½ large green peppers, cut into 2-inch strips  
 1 cup beef broth  
 1 cup barley  
 4 beef bouillon cubes  
 2 large carrots, cut into chunks  
 2 large tomatoes, peeled and quartered  
 1 large zucchini, cut into 1½-inch chunks  
 1 pound green beans, each cut in half  
 1 10-ounce package frozen peas  
 ½ small head cauliflower, separated into flowerettes  
 3 tablespoons lemon juice  
 2 cloves garlic, crushed  
 1 tablespoon salt  
 1 teaspoon paprika  
 ¼ teaspoon pepper  
 ¼ cup chopped parsley  
 In 12-inch skillet over medium heat in hot oil cook onions and

green peppers until browned, about 10 minutes, stirring frequently. In a casserole dish, combine 1 cup beef broth, ½ cup barley, Top with the carrots, tomatoes, zucchini, green beans, peas, cauliflower, then onion mixture. In a cup, combine lemon juice and garlic. Pour into casserole. Sprinkle vegetables with salt, paprika and pepper. Cover and bake in 400°F oven for 1½ hours or until barley is tender. Stir in parsley and serve.

**BRAN MUFFINS**

1 cup whole wheat flour  
 1 cup bran flakes  
 2 teaspoons baking powder  
 ½ teaspoon salt  
 1 teaspoon cinnamon  
 ½ cup raisins  
 3 teaspoons oil  
 ½ cup sunflower seeds (optional)  
 1 egg  
 ½ cup cream  
 ½ cup water  
 3 tablespoons honey

Mix together the flour, bran flakes, baking powder, salt, cinnamon, raisins, and sunflower seeds. In another bowl, beat together the egg, cream, water, honey and oil. Stir in the dry ingredients only enough to mix. Fill greased muffin tin ¾ full and bake at 425°F for 15 minutes.

## Rape suspect takes hostage

**GRAND JUNCTION, Colo.** — Police negotiated today with a rape suspect holed up in a judge's chambers with a woman hostage and a female accomplice who gave him a semiautomatic weapon as he was being taken to trial.

Kevin Firth took three women hostage around 10:30 a.m. MDT Tuesday and held police at bay all day, authorities said. The Delta man released two of the three hostages unharmed later Tuesday.

He remained holed up early today with his accomplice and the third hostage in the courthouse chambers of Mesa County District Judge Charles Buss, police said, adding that Firth had made no demands.

"Negotiators continue to talk to him by telephone and (police) radio," officer JoAnne Christian said. "They're monitoring the situation. There has been nothing new since he released the second hostage."

Earlier, Firth claimed to have rigged explosives in the courthouse, but police have been

unable to confirm that report. When Firth took the hostages, police evacuated the courthouse — using ladders to remove employees and visitors from some upper floors — as well as the streets surrounding the downtown building.

A leg of the nation's largest bicycle race, the Coors Classic, also was delayed because the start-finish line was at the courthouse.

Police Sgt. Greg Kuhn said Firth got a semiautomatic weapon from the female accomplice as he was being taken into court to face 1987 rape conviction.

Kuhn said police negotiated with Firth using a police radio that Firth apparently took from a deputy sheriff. There were initial reports that the deputy had been taken hostage, but the deputy actually escaped from the building.

"We believe (the accomplice) is his wife, but we have been unable to confirm that," Kuhn said.

The two took three women employees hostage, but released one of the women a short time later. Kuhn said. A second hostage was released about 8:05 p.m. in exchange for food.

"He has been talking by telephone with our negotiators for the last eight hours but has made no demands," Kuhn said. "Actually, the negotiators are

controlling the conversation to keep him occupied and trying to make deals."

Firth said the only request Firth had made was to talk with a sheriff's investigator who had worked on his sexual assault case.

Firth had been scheduled to go on trial before Buss on charges of abducting a Grand Junction grocery store employee, driving to a remote area and raping her. He was on probation at the time on a previous sexual assault conviction.

Kuhn said police negotiated with Firth using a police radio that Firth apparently took from a deputy sheriff. There were initial reports that the deputy had been taken hostage, but the deputy actually escaped from the building.

## Police lose track of gunmen

**GLADBECk, West Germany** — Police said they have lost track of two men who held up a bank and were allowed to escape with two hostages and booty of about \$225,000 in an automobile provided by authorities.

Authorities gave in to the demands of the robbers for a ransom and getaway car in fear two bank employees taken captive early Tuesday would be killed.

But more than 24 hours later they still were missing and presumably in the hands of the two men.

"We don't know what has happened to the hostages," said Manfred Becker, a Gladbeck police official. "But we hope the robbers will decide to release their hostages."

"We expect a break in the case in a few hours," he said. "We must be patient and hope it turns out well for all concerned."

Riot police from Dusseldorf, Essen and Dortmund looked on as the men with their handcuffed hostages at 10 p.m. Tuesday drove away from a branch of the Deutsche Bank in a

shopping center in Gladbeck, about 60 miles north of Bonn.

Prosecutor Hans Christian Gutjahr, who directed the police operation, told reporters he had accepted demands of the two armed, masked men to save the lives of the hostages.

"We gave in to their demands because our main interest was the safety of the hostages, he said."

The two men, one believed to be a convict on furlough from prison, entered the bank when it opened Tuesday morning and took captive a 34-year-old male cashier and a 23-year-old female consultant.

In telephone conversations with West German media the men threatened to kill their hostages and then themselves if their demands were not met.

"We will all die," one said in what was described as a Rhineland German accent.

They demanded \$150,000 in small bills, a car, two pairs of handcuffs for the hostages and free passage.

A policeman who wore only swim trunks handed over the money.






