Dolan subsequently asked Dickinson for in-terest on the money, the newspaper said.

The money was referred to in correspondence between Dickinson and Dolan as a personal rather than bank loan, the report said. The Times said details of the transaction were

confirmed Wednesday by Dickinson's longtime personal secretary, Mamie Mitchell, 65, in in a telephone interview from her Tallahassee office. "The check (from Dickinson to Dolan) was in repayment of a loan," Mrs. Mitchell was quoted as saying. "It was in connection with his farm."



EPA, FEO In Reactor Dispute WASHINGTON (AP) - The

Environmental Protection Agency says the Atomic Energy Commission has not done enough homework to justify development of the fast-breeder nuclear reactor as the power plant of the future. The EPA released Monday a critique of the AEC's 2,200-page draft environmental impact study on the proposed development and implementation of the Liquid Metal Fast Breeder Reactor (LMFBR).

Despite its bulk, the AEC study "does not adequately detail the potential environmental impact associated with this proposed federal program," the environmental agency said,

"The draft statement is primarily deficient in its treatment of reactor safety, in potential problems associated with plutonium toxicity and safety, and the cost-benefit analysis."

The AEC had prepared the draft study only under a court order, the result of a lawsuit filed in 1971 by the Natural Resources Defense Council, a citi-

zens' environment group. It is believed to mark the first time a federal agency has been required to prepare an impact statement under the terms of the National Environmental Policy Act at the outset of development of a complete new technology.

extra estimated \$100 million" on Postal Service contracts, including \$60 million to "eleven favored companies." We do not know the source of these figures and cannot econcile them, but cost overruns of this magnitude have not

Of 26 specific contracts about which inquiry was made by Mr. nderson's staff, 11 were awarded before the Postal Service took over operation of the old Post Office Department on July 1, 1971. There were cost overruns on four of the contracts, two of which pre-dated the Postal Service. The total amount of the overruns was \$9.7 million — of which \$8.5 million was on old Post Office

Mr. Anderson's incidental qualifier that "some of the additional costs were legitimate, with needed work being done for the extra money" does little to correct the false impression he has

Adding extra work to initial contracts has been by far the rincipal reason for cost growth. So long as the Postal Service is some degree of costs exceeding the original contracted price.

Due to the initial success of these units, the Postal Service in 1972 went into a two-phased program for further development of facer-canceler equipment. There were 12 service test models produced and nine of these were placed into service and are still being tested prior to production of 14 later models. The contractor has been on a stop-work order since September of 1973. The Postal Service's Research and Engineering Department is evaluating whether to continue this program or develop other alternatives.

This delay in development of the new facer-canceler required that the Postal Service seek other sources to fill immediate needs for facer cancelers. Therefore, in December, 1973, we purchased 180 Mark II facer-cancelers from Pitney-Bowes to augment the approximately 700 machines of this model in service. Deliveries are to commence in September, 1974.

2) Air Cullers — The Postal Service awarded a competitive contract in 1968 to the Burroughs Corporation for development of culling equipment. This work led to the concept of an air culler and two machines were produced and tested.

From the early results of the testing of these two machines, it was determined in 1972 to procure 14 additional air cullers for further testing and evaluation in a live mail environment and a data-package which would be used in future competitive procurements. All 14 machines under this contract have been produced. Seven have not been shipped to post offices until the results are evaluated of those air cullers now being field tested as part of a mail preparation line, rather than as a stand-alone unit. This development work has not yet produced the desired results.

Q.. I was wondering who do you think is the best all around player on the Oakland A's .- James Hustead, Albany,

The immediate logical answer would seem to be that Reggie Jackson, the MVP slugging outfielder of the world champions, is their best ball player. And there's no knocking Reggie's talents, offensively or defensively. But my choice for the most versatile talent has to be Jim (Catfish) Hunter, who could make it as a major league outfielder if he weren't already the most consistent winning pitcher in baseball.

Q. Ever since Secretariat won the Triple Crown, I have wondered if there has ever been a horse that has finished second in all three races?-Nancy Willemin, Portland, Mich.

No. Nine horses, starting with Upset in 1920 and most recently No Le Hace in 1972, finished second in both the Kentucky Derby and the Preakness, but not the Belmont. The closest thing to a second-place sweep occured in 1969 when Arts & Letters trailed Majestic Prince in the first two legs and then got out of the rut by reversing the order of finish to win the Belmont and keep Majestic Prince from winning the Triple Crown.

Q..Are any major rules changes likely in professional basketball? Shouldn't the NBA do something about the 24second rule?-John Drury, Elizabeth, N.J.

To the first, no. To the second, I feel the NBA definitely ought to extend the limit to 30 seconds, which is the Olympic rule. In his book, "24 Seconds to Shoot," Leonard Koppett credits Danny Biasone for suggesting the time limit back in 1954. But Max Winter, now the president of the Minnesota Vikings but then the boss of the Minneapolis Lakers, insists he was the one who pushed for a shooting limit after his champion Lakers played in a 19-18 slowdown charade. And that when a test game was played in Syracuse, the available clock happened to be set at 24 seconds. Thirty seconds would accomplish the same purpose and help set up more plays.

Now, "value" is the measure of gold mine shares. And loday, he said, the South African mines represent a better

value than ever. McFalls explained that at the present \$170 an ounce the gross income at the mine doubled over what was received last November when gold was \$90. And a doubling means, he said, "a tripling of net income, and we have not yet seen a
