

Area Sales Soar Over \$10 Million Mark

Gross sales in Seminole County skyrocketed to \$10,038,877.99 last month. This shows a 23.2 per cent increase over July, 1966. It is another indication of the basic strength of the economy in the county and the upward surge which is continuing even during the usual weakness of the summer season. The statistics come from the Florida Retail Federation and were compiled by J. E. Strangh, director of the Florida Revenue Commission.

Our neighboring counties did not fare so well. Volusia, an aggressive Orange County, enjoyed a percentage increase of 8.1 per cent and Volusia, across Lake Monroe, did 5.8 per cent better in July 1967, compared with a year ago.

Coupled with the encouraging report on personal income in Seminole County recently made public which showed a gain in the five year period (1962-66) of \$15,222,000, these new figures disclose a happy picture for the future. Greater personal income, more indicated as a source of more sales, will benefit with the new business climate being experienced.

Business leaders interpret these statistics as more important as omens for the future than hard facts for the past. In Sanford they hang out a "get busy" sign to the merchants who are working on the re-evaluating of the downtown business area. And in the budding south end of the county, they indicate that growth is, indeed, taking place county-wide.

The Seminole County Chamber of Commerce members see these encouraging figures as only a beginning of such increase. They look at the lakefront with the motel, restaurant and marina as a new and most important factor in a profitable future. And the start of the Winn-Dixie \$500,000 complex on the east end of First Street and the modernization of the block dominated by the Sanford Atlantic National Bank and McCreary's on the south side of the same street between Park and Main streets, are expected to do much to stabilize the economy in the Sanford area.

Fire Ravages Packing Plant

\$4,000 Damage In Oviedo

Fire swept through the packing-storage shed of Weaver's Watercrust Plant in Oviedo Saturday night, causing an estimated \$3,000 - \$4,000 in damages. Firemen stood watch over the smoldering building for more than five hours.

Cause of the fire, which started at about 7:30 p.m., was undetermined at this time, according to Don Weaver, owner and operator of the business. Electricians are due today to make complete investigation, he said.

The blaze was discovered by a passing motorist, Wayne Patten, who turned in the call to Oviedo Volunteer Fire Department.

Weaver commended the firemen for their "excellent work in quickly bringing the fire under control, salvaging cold storage facilities in the packing plant." Packing materials and most records kept in the building were a total loss. Current records are kept in an office in Weaver's home.

Investigation and tests today are expected to determine if any damage was done to the cooling machinery, Weaver reported.

Weaver Watercrust, which does an estimated \$150,000 business a year, has been in operation since 1915. It is located approximately one-half mile northeast of Oviedo on the rich hammock lands.

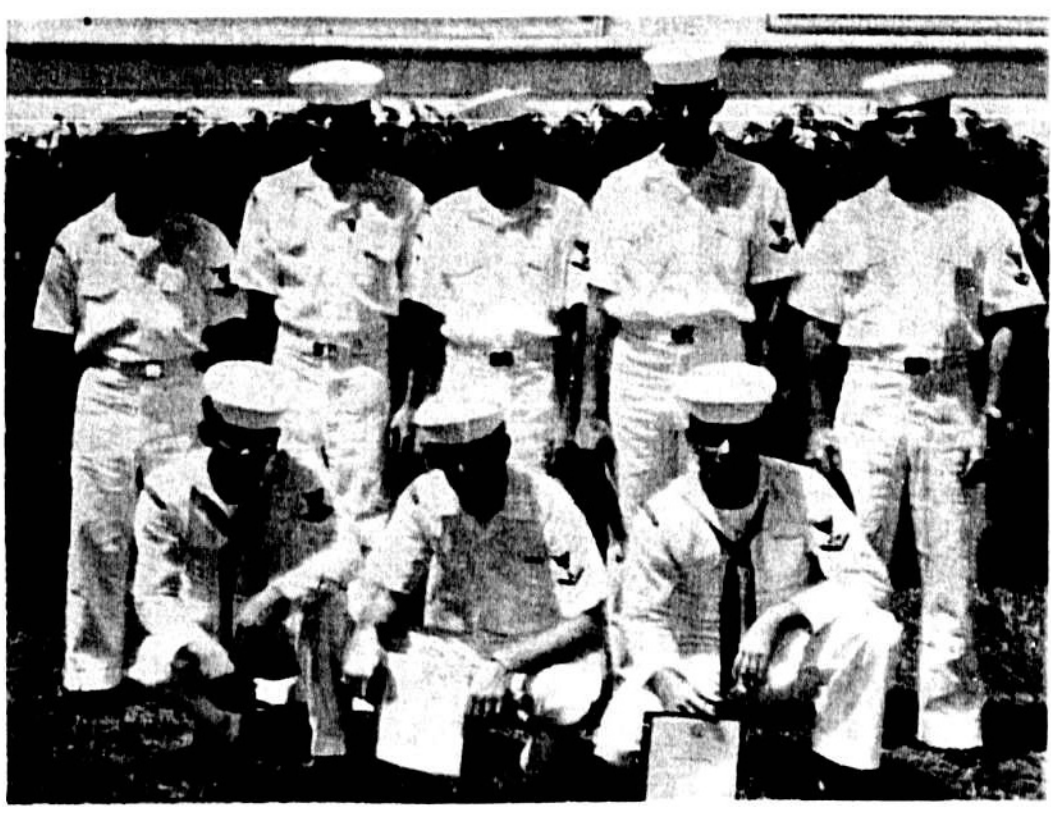

Authorization by the Office of Economic Opportunity of a \$50,000 fund to establish a skilled training center in Florida is expected today with every indication that the Sanford Naval Air Base will be the preferred location. This was given a meeting of the Sanford Industrial Commission Board today by Don Rathel, director, who said that such an announcement might well come from Gov. Claude Kirk in Tallahassee this morning.

County Adopts Budget

County Commission today adopted its 1967-68 budget without opposition calling for a 5 percent increase in the operating budget of \$2,707,000 and to go into effect Oct. 1.

President Dwight Mathews, of the Chamber of Commerce, complimented the commission for its commendable job in working out the budget and the establishment of procedures to handle effectively inquiries also occupied the attention of board members. County Attorney Harold Johnson in drawing up the contract. Members of the district fire commission, Tally Hattaway, chairman; Arthur Hagaw, vice chairman; Vernon Dunn, secretary; O. J. Seila, and A. R. Ginn, met with Altamonte officials in a last ditch effort to furnish fire protection to outlying areas included in the Suburban Fire Control District for a trial period of one year.

Mayor Lawrence Stafford said that he expects the commission to approve the contract on Monday night, subject to approval of the council when it meets at 8 p.m. Wednesday.

Schools Up 634 Pupils

Seminole County's 23 public schools opened Monday with total beginning enrollment of 16,242, an increase of 634 students over first month figures for 1966.

Biggest increase in high school students is at Lyman school with 1,126, up 184 from last year. Seminole High School, with 1,118, has 312 over last year while Crooms shows a decrease of 55 with this year's total of 1,091. Enrollment for all grades at Oviedo is at 835, increase of 115 over last year's figures.

School Doors Closed To Hippies

Standards of dress and grooming for students attending Seminole High School and Sanford Junior High School were issued today.

"In the judgment of county school authorities, appropriate dress and grooming influence actions and attitudes of students who are preparing to take their places as acceptable members in adult society. It is for this reason that standards, which will apply to all students in both schools, have been set," reported Seminole High Principal Andrew J. Bracken and Sanford Junior High Principal Hugh Carlton.

Boys will be expected to wear socks, keep their faces clean shaven and wear their shirts inside their trousers. Extreme hair styles, by adult standards, worn by either boys or girls, will be considered unacceptable.

City Chops Its Budget

The City Commission continued to hack away at its proposed 1967-68 budget last night and is considering closing the Goldboro pool in an effort to save some \$7,000.

After meeting for four hours, the board held off any action on closing the facility until next Monday night.

Commissioner Dr. W. V. Roberts urged closing of the swimming pool and discussed the possibility of leasing it to some community-minded group in the Goldboro area.

City Manager W. E. Knowles cited figures that operation of both pools—Goldboro and Ft. Mellon Park—costs Sanford \$14,000 to operate and that revenue brings in about \$2,000.

The board last night chopped considerable "chunks" out of the recreation, parks and zoo budget before calling it "a night."

Previously they chopped some \$45,000 from the proposed \$1,500,000 operating budget and last night they cut off \$10,000.

In recreation they eliminated athletic officials for the men's softball and church softball leagues at a cost of some \$1,200 and virtually wiped out all cultural activities for the summer recreation program. Charming class, ballet, tap dancing, piano and baton classes were eliminated as well as some \$400 in playground equipment and \$200 for the city's own volunteer fire department, the only logical plan would be to ask Casselberry to contract," he declared.

The amount proposed by the district was based on the assessed value of property in the district and in the town.

Other commission participants in the discussion were Keith Nelson and Charles Newell.

City Delays Zoo Planning

The City Commission Monday night held off proceeding with construction design of the proposed new \$25,000 zoo until after the budget hearings.

"We can't do anything until we finish studying the budget," said Mayor Joe Baker as Architect Eochan Kelley presented final schematics for the zoo relocation to a 10-acre site west of the sewage treatment plant on Lake Monroe.

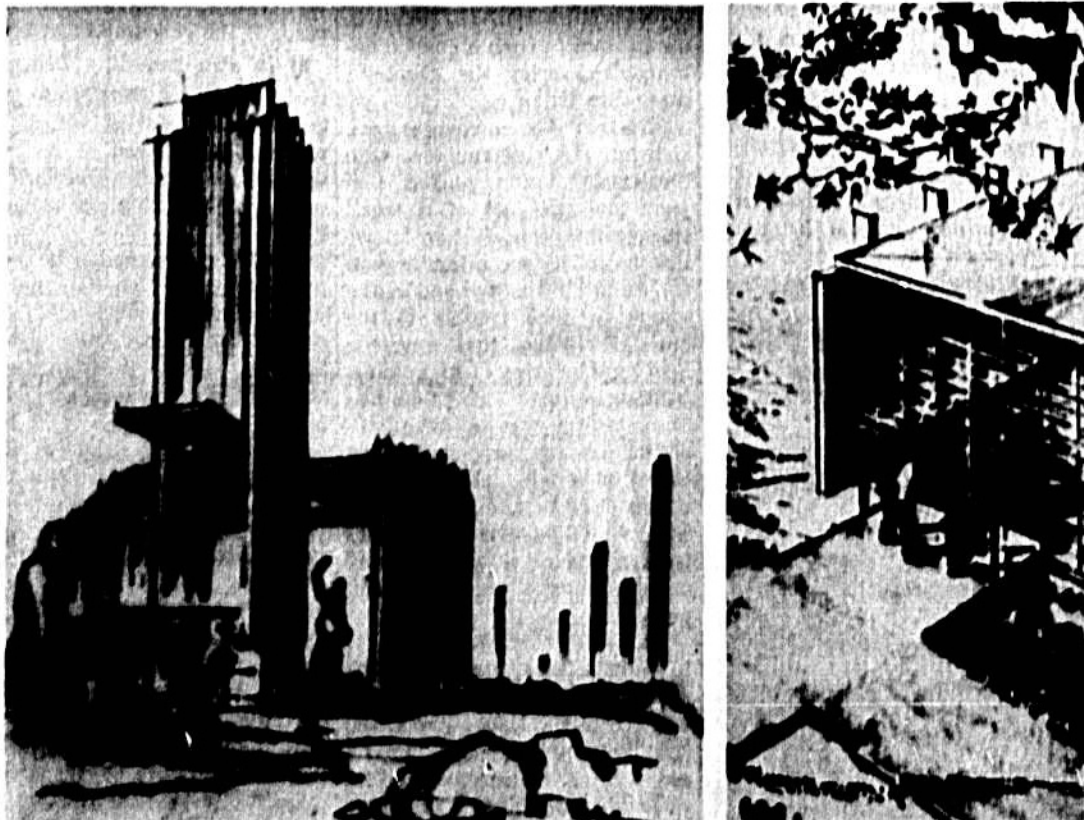
All commissioners were impressed with the land use layout which features a botanical garden, curator's facility, 18 exhibits, concession facility, amphitheater and parking for 100 cars in the first phase.

Kelley told commissioners, "If you had the money on the table now, you still couldn't get started until a year or 18 months."

The commission has some \$25,000 listed in a capital improvement budget for the new fiscal year starting Oct. 1. However, indications are the complete improvements budget will be cut to shreds in an effort to lower the millage.

In other business during the lengthy meeting, commissioners heard Industrial Board Chairman Don Rathel give an "optimistic" report on prospects for Sanford.

"We've got four good prospects and two suspects," Rathel said. He reported the state is expected to announce any day approval for a \$50,000 study for a training school at the air base and that Orlando Helicopter Airways plans to utilize some of the base to store planes.
