Far from restricting freedom, the quality of life is erhanced by the recognition of law and adherence to its principles

Inspired writers of the Bible understood this centuries ago and our age will not be fully enlightened until we make this discovery, ourselves. Moral law-the Ten Commandments, Civil laws-the governing of relationships between people, Health laws-the protection of life quality all have their substance in Scripture. Disobey the Moral Law and one is guilty of sin. Disregard the civil laws and society suffers. Flaunt the laws of physical health and one bears the consequences in his own body. Jesus Christ came to live a life exemplary in its conformity to these three areas of law. 

Panama Claim Can Be Substantiated

"Panama claims effective sovereignty and exclusive jurisdiction," Aquilino Boyd of Panama asserted here earlier this year before the United Nations Security Council. "A power foreign to the territory of Panama occupies the area and the Council is needed to eliminate

Shortly after this statement the U.N. Security Council voted over U.S. and British objections to hold a series of special Security Council meetings in Panama City in mid-March for the expressed purpose of providing a propaganda forum for Panama to demand U.N. action to oust the United States from the Panama Canal, which it has controlled by treaty

While the United States vehemently objected to the Security Council move, it refused to exercise its veto. Thus, is the stage now set for a renewed round of conflict over the strategic Canal Zone that has profound implications as great or greater than the seizure of the Suez Canal in 1956 by then Egyptian President Gamal Abdel Nasser.

For the seizure of Suez by the pro-Soviet Nasser, the meddling of the United Nations and the shortsighted policy of the Eisenhower administration in 1956 made possible the domination of the Middle East by the Soviets.

It was, however, during the Kennedy-Johnson years that crucial concessions were made that places the Panama Canal in clear jeopardy of being turned over to a left-leaning military junta that has ties with Communist Cuba, Russia, and China

In the wake of the 1964 canal riots, then private citizen Mr. Nixon urged President Lyndon Johnson to take a tough line.

"If the United States retreats one inch," Mr Nixon said in a Philadelphia speech on Jan. 16, 1964, "we will have raised serious doubts about our bases throughout the world." Nevertheless, as president, Mr. Nixon is

The issue of press freedom is as hollow in this case, however, as it was when the Defense Department documents stolen by Daniel Ellsberg wound up in the pages of the New York Times.

"The fact of this conference," stated Democratic Congressman Daniel Flood of Pennsylvania, "has never been denied by either Panama or the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics. It has been reported that Kosygin promised financial aid, armaments, and technical advisers. The last are already arriving in (the Canal Zone) as 'guest speakers' but they remain as residents.

Cuba—N. Vietnam Linked

Castro's Crew Trapped By Mines

MIAMI- Americans are not the only Westerners withdrawing from Vietnam. Cubans are leaving, too. Cuban seamen, trapped therewhen the United States mined Haiphong harbor in 1972, are en route back to the Caribbean and a Cuban medical brigade, there for nine months, also is returning home.

The seamen were aboard the Cuban merchant ships, Imias el Jigue, vessels that had carried sugar to North Vietnam as part of Cuba's efforts to assist the Vietnamese Communists. Support for the Vietnamese Reds has been a prime propaganda issue with Cuban Premier Fidel Castro. He has likened Cuba to North Vietnam, saying that both have been engaged in a struggle with the U.S. "imperialists." The official Cuban newspaper, Granma, played up the

propaganda aspects of the Cubans' departure from North Vietnam. It reported that the crews of the Cuban vessels were decorated by the North Vietnam government and that the mayor of Haiphong told them that "the people of Haiphong admire your spirit and your tenacity. We give you our heartfelt congratulations.

Granma said of the seamen "It has been a long trip for all of them. It has been a year of

deep emotions as well as great risks and difficult moments. but all that is made worthwhile when the sirens start screaming to announce the departure of the ships, bedecked with flags, as they make a victorious exit from the port of

A Cuban aboard one of the vessels reported, "We are the first newsmen to verify personally the effectiveness of the mine clearing done by the North Vietnamese. But later he stated, "We saw a helicopter (presumably U.S.) and several ships of the Seventh Fleet that may be engaged in clearing the mines laid along the North Viet-

namese coast. Cuban assistance to North Vietnam has not ended. Before the two Cuban ships departed a third had already arrived. According to Granma the Cuban vessel Guisa was "first large-tonnage freighter to come into the port" after the mine-Granma carried an interview with North Vietnamese



There is a great deal of attention to blocking key highways and controlling points on specified roads. What this all points to is a reversion to the Mao Tse-

tung approach in the war in South Vietnam - control the countryside, surround the cities. That is, Mao doctrine would call for a gradual strangulation of commerce and the cities through the control of strategically placed hamlets, roads, rivers and check-

The evidence to date is that the regular North Vietnamese army forces in the South, though many have been ordered to doff their uniforms, are not being used as guerrillas, but as regular army troops attacking the aforementioned specific targets by rather conventional means. In any event, these North Vietnamese regulars, or most of them, would be a dead loss as guerrillas. They are not native to the countryside. They have no relationships with the population. They are "foreigners" and mistrusted

Therefore, the only purpose for leaving these men in the South must inevitably be to engage in continued military campaigns. Not being hard-core Communist-indoctrinated men, they cannot be left idle to wait for the future; they could grow impatient and be tempted to desert, enticed by the relative local prosperity. Meanwhile, Hanoi is sending troops down the Ho Chi

Minh trails at the precease-fire rate. Whether these men will be infiltrated into South Vietnam at this time or quartered just across the border in Laos or Cambodia, is not



Nixon Coterie Is Secrecy-Shrouded

Somewhere along the line we seem to have lost track of a significant fact: the president of the United States. however exalted his station and however noble his performance, is a public employe, just like the mailman or the policeman on the corner It is the American citizen who chooses him and pays his

salary. It is the American citizen alone, not a political party or a cadre of followers or Destiny with a capital D, o whom he is, or should be, responsible. So along comes President Nixon, whose idea of commuricating with the citizenry begins and ends with waying to people on the street as he speeds by in his limousine. He has closeted himself in an Olympian seclusion that borders at times on hermitry. He has downgraded and degraded the presidential press conference to the point where people could learn more about how the presidency works by watching reruns of Eisenhower and Kennedy news conferences. And now the President has issued

a statement on "executive privilege," a logic-barren "jus-

tification" of his desire to seclude his staff of White House assistants (who are also public employes). More specifically, the statement was intended to forestall attempts to call White House counsel John W. Dean III before the Senate Judiciary Committee, which is conducting hearings on the nomination of L. Patrick Gray II as permanent director of the FBL

Gray himself has already testified that Dean played a peculiar, if not illegal, role in the investigation of the Watergate break-in. Dean insisted, Gray said, on lending a big brotherly presence to FBI interviews with White House staff members in the Watergate investigation. In his "executive privilege" statement, President Nixon said White House staff members "must not be inhibited by the possibility that their advice and assistance will ever become a matter of public debate, either during their tenure in government or at a later date. Otherwise, the candor with which advice is rendered and the quality of such assistance will inevitably be compromised and

Mr. Nixon makes no attempt to explain what "inevita-bility" he is talking about. This is what logicians called 'begging the question" (it is so because I say it is so). Others call it nonsense Obviously Dean should not be required to give public answers to every question. But he should be required-

as should all members of the government-to be held It is beside the point to argue, as President Nixon has that "tradition" supports his use of "executive privilege." For one thing, just because previous presidents have used the tactic does not make it justifiable; perhaps Congress and the public have just been too apathetic in the past. For another, Mr. Nixon appears to have wound a tremendous unprecedented amount of power around himself in the Haldeman-Kissinger-Ziegler-Ehrlichman-Dean axis, whose operation is completely out of the public view.

The chairman of the Senate Judiciary Committee James Eastland, D-Miss., has called Dean to testify in spite of Mr. Nixon's statement and Senate Democratic leader Mike Mansfield of Montana suggested holding up Gray's confirmation until Dean testifies. But Congress still seems reluctant to use the subpoena power. They should not be reluctant. They should do everything in their power to force Dean to testify and testify fully as a precedent that would make the assistants of President Nixon and all future presidents accessible and accountable, through Congress, to all of us.




