### Accident produces injuries and fuel spill

**ALTAMONTE SPRINGS** - Two persons were seriously injured in a traffic accident Thursday in Altamonte Springs. Fuel spilling from an overturned semi also presented a serious problem.

According to Altamonte Springs Fire Department Chief George Gaston, Cynthia Gorman, 39, and her son, Taylor, 7, were traveling north on SR-434 when a semi, heading south, apparently lost control, ran over four traffic lanes, and collided head-on into Gorman's Nissan. The Gormans were both taken to Orlando Regional Medical Center, and were listed in critical and serious conditions.

During the collision, the semi ruptured a diesel fuel tank dumping gallons of fuel into the storm water drainage system. The Hazardous Materials Unit responded to the scene and attempted to eliminate the personal and environmental hazards from the spill.

Special equipment carried by the unit reportedly detected high gaseous readings, which prompted the Altamonte Springs police to immediately close north and south bound lanes to eliminate risks of igniting the fuel.

Attempts to stop the fuel leak, possibly into a drainage system, were hampered due to the way the semi landed after the crash, with the tank positioned directly over the storm water system.

Crews managed to pump the existing fuel from the tank into another container, then applied absorbent to soak up the fuel.

SR-434 was closed for approximately two hours while crews worked on preventing serious environmental impact from the fuel. The water department has been checking for any possible hazards that may have resulted from the spillage.

**Discontinue boiling**  
**LAKE MARY** - The City of Lake Mary has announced that the boil water notice issued recently, has now ended, (as of 8 a.m. this morning). The notice was issued because of a water main break that involved the entire area between Seventh Street to the east, Crystal Drive to the west, West Crystal Lake to the north, and Lake Mary Blvd. to the south. A 48-hour test was conducted to insure the water safety.

# Sanford police head to retire

**SANFORD** - Acting Sanford Police Chief Ray Bronson may be retiring this month, but the 25-year veteran will remain active in law enforcement.

Bronson, 47, will retire June 25 after a quarter of a century with the Sanford Police Department, but he will serve as a volunteer reserve deputy with the Seminole County Sheriff's Office.

"You're still going to be seeing me around," Bronson said. "I'll still have my

finger in there."

Bronson said that he will investigate drug-related cases for the sheriff's department. He said he does not know where he will be assigned, or when he will start.

Lt. Mitch Tindel will take over as Acting Police Chief on June 25.

The search for a permanent chief is

expected to last into late July. The list for replacement candidates being considered by the city is down to 12, Bronson said.

"The transition will be smooth," Bronson said. "And, hopefully there will be a permanent chief by late July."

A screening committee will rank the finalists. The city will work with law

enforcement agencies to conduct background investigations and psychological tests of finalists prior to oral interviews.

The salary for the position is from \$53,315 to \$79,973. City Manager Tony VanDerworp is in charge of hiring the new police chief. No current Sanford police officers are applying for the position.

Bronson took over for Chief Joe Dillard, who retired for medical reasons, in the fall of 1998. He is a longtime commander and investigator.

Bronson was one of the first two dozen

## Police to operate checkpoints for the next month

In an effort to promote continued vehicular safety, the Florida Highway Patrol will conduct vehicle stops at checkpoints in Seminole, Volusia and Flagler Counties from mid-June until mid-July.

During the month-long operation, the FHP traffic stops will be made at ten separate places in each county, at differing times of the day and night. The checkpoints will be in operation for at least a week, with some of the stop areas changing each week while others remain unchanged.

Locations in Seminole County include Bunnell Road, Celery Avenue, CR-15, Dike Road, Dodd Road, General Hutchinson, Old Lake Mary Road, Orange Blvd., Osceola Road, SR-426, Chapman Road, E.E. Williamson, Markham

Road, and Slavia Road.

Among locations in southwestern Volusia County, are stops planned on SR-44, Tomoka Farms Road, Lake Helen-Osteen Road and Down In The Dumps Lane.

"This is actually a courtesy stop for many motorists," said FHP spokesman Lt. Chuck Williams. "Many people may not even realize they have a taillight out, expired drivers license, or some other minor problem". In many cases for minor infractions, drivers may be given a 48-hour notice to correct the problem.

Williams said the FHP has been conducting this type of operation for possibly 30 to 40 years.

He explained that recognizing the danger presented to the public by defective vehicle equipment, troopers will concentrate their efforts on vehicles being operated with defects such as bad brakes, worn tires and defective lighting equipment. In addition, attention will be directed to drivers who would violate the driver license laws of Florida.

# Winn-Dixie to add banks to stores

**SANFORD** - Pending regulatory approval, Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce and Winn-Dixie Stores, Inc., will launch a joint venture on a trial basis in the Central Florida market.

Winn-Dixie spokesman Mickey Clerc confirmed the two companies have signed an agreement to begin a pilot program this fall involving about 40 Winn-Dixie stores in the metro Orlando area, some possibly located in Seminole County.

"We're looking to add branch bank facilities to our Winn-Dixie stores that currently don't have them," said Clerc. "We're interested in adding services for our customers and

providing them with an opportunity for one-stop shopping."

Clerc added that Winn-Dixie currently has 250 branch banking facilities in 14 states and is looking for additional opportunities. If the two firms are granted the green light from federal bank regulators, plans call for branch bank installations to begin this fall at about 40 locations throughout the Orlando metro area.

Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce has applied for a federal bank charter under the name Columbus First National Bank. Its initial application was filed with the Comptroller of the Currency in December of 1998 and parallel applications have since been filed with the Federal Deposit Insurance Commission (FDIC) and await

# Fowl play: Osprey falls from nest

**SANFORD** - A young osprey with a nest in downtown Sanford got lost Thursday while learning to fly.

The 10- to 12-week-old osprey flew from his parents' nest on top of the PICO Building on Oak Avenue to the front of American Pioneer Bank on First Street, witnesses said. The Florida Audubon Society rescued the bird at 9:15 a.m.

Although the osprey is fully grown with a five-

foot wing span, the bird is still learning to fly and became confused after leaving the nest, according to Carol Gilliland, a veterinary technician with the Florida Audubon Society's Center for Birds of Prey in Maitland.

"He looks like an adult but he's not," Gilliland said. "He can fly, but it's like when your kids try to walk. They can't do it, and they stumble."

The osprey is uninjured, and recovering in the Center for Birds of Prey in Maitland. A medical checkup revealed that the bird does not have any

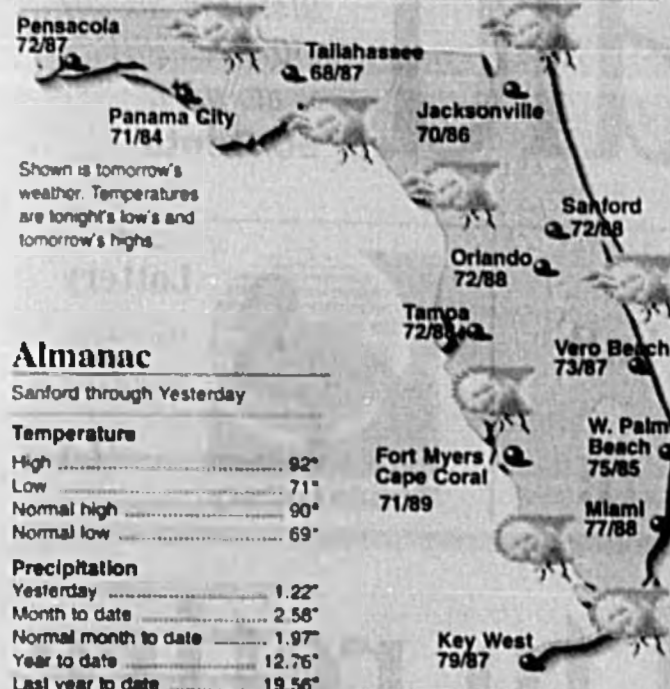

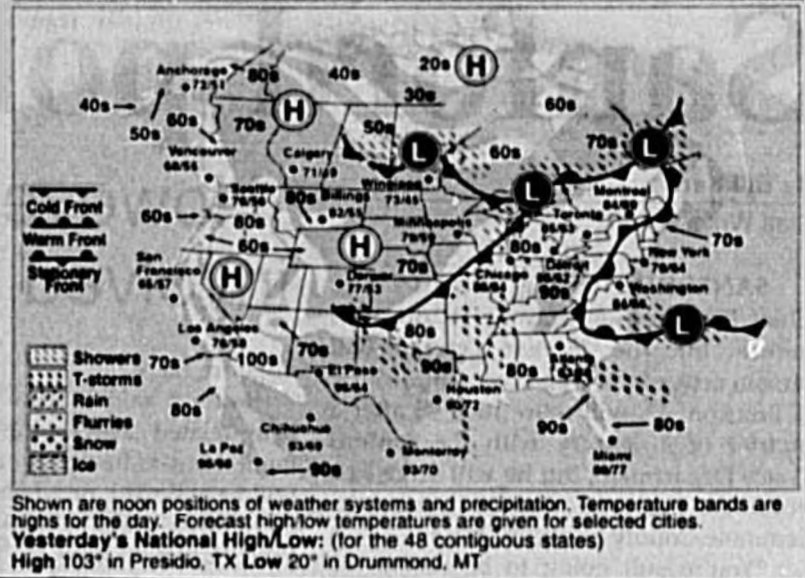

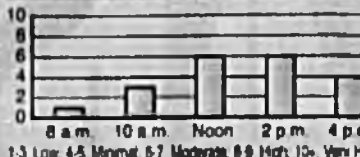

"The Seminole County Sheriff's department and FHP work closely on this," explained Chief Deputy Sheriff Steve Harriett. "Each of us is routinely engaged in aggressive driving enforcement, that is, stopping moving vehicles which may pose a threat. But the FHP also handles stops for equipment problem"

Harriett said equipment failure on motor vehicles is a serious problem. "Take, for example, a car approaching you at night with only one headlight. Motorists may think it's an oncoming motorcycle, and act differently, which could be dan-

gerous."

Additionally, Harriett said traffic stops for equipment problems often lead to other charges. On many occasions, he explained that a car stopped for a broken taillight, can often uncover hidden drugs, drug equipment, open containers of alcohol, and other problems.

"These bring felony charges," he said. "Actually, it has been demonstrated that enhanced traffic enforcement is directly related to a reduction in crime, which is not only the goal of the Florida Highway Patrol, but is an important part of the strategy in community policing."

applicants for police chief in March, but he withdrew his name from consideration in April saying that he was disappointed his application did not receive stronger consideration.

Since taking over as acting police chief, Bronson has implemented many recommendations that a private consultant said would make the department more efficient. One key reform for the department is increased community policing, with an emphasis on the Goldsboro area.

The new Sanford/Seminole Police Community Service Center, manned by four Sanford police officers and four Seminole County sheriff's deputies, opened at 1211 13th Street in Goldsboro on May 31. The Center is part of an overall effort

to increase law enforcement visibility in the community. It is open to the public from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

"It's working exactly like we had planned," Bronson said. "People from the community are coming in to make complaints at the center. It is increasing our visibility and our working relationship with the community."

The department has increased its Community Oriented Policing program throughout the city. The program is designed to increase police visibility throughout the city, and to help rebuild neighborhood watch programs.

Sanford police officers now make a two-year commitment to their community service areas to form a relationship.

diseases. Because of the bird's youth, examiners have not identified the osprey's gender.

The Center sometimes holds ospreys back until they are ready to fly. However, Gilliland said that it is more healthy for the birds to return to their nests. The Center is working with Sanford officials to plan the osprey's return to its nest.

"With nothing being wrong with him we definitely want to get him back," Gilliland said.

Lisa Carroll, a clerk for the Supervisor of Elections Office in Sanford who helped watch over the osprey until the bird was rescued, said that the nest at the building appears to have two parents and several young ospreys.

"On our breaks from the office

we step outside to watch them," Carroll said. "They're beautiful birds. They're something to watch."

In the wild, Ospreys live about eight years. They live about five to eight years in cities, Gilliland said.

"They are kind of a communal bird," Gilliland said. "Aunts and uncles live with the family, and everybody shares in the wealth."

Ospreys are threatened or endangered in some states. In the 1970s, ospreys died in large numbers due to the use of DDT chemical, now banned by the federal government.

In Sanford, Ospreys have been making a comeback since the late-1970s. Gilliland said that the use of platforms that provide nesting areas plays an important role in the comeback of ospreys.

### Expressions of love keep vows alive

This is June, the month of brides. More couples get married in June than in any other month, although August is catching up.

May, September and July rank third, fourth and fifth in the number of marriages solemnized. Half of all weddings in a year take place between May and September.

(Guess which months the lines are shortest at the Marriage License Bureau?)

If you haven't attended a wedding in a long time, you may be surprised (pleasantly) to learn that the traditional wedding service is back in style. However, I still let the couples I marry add their personal touches to the service. If they want me to read things from Kahlil Gibran like "Let there be spaces in your togetherness," I will do so.

Or if they want to omit the line from the marriage service that reads "If any man can show just cause why these persons may not lawfully be joined together, let him speak now or forever hold his peace," I will omit it — although I rather like its stern tone.

Sometimes, though, I draw the line on changes or additions, as I did when the couple being married wanted to make a small modification to their vows. In place of "Will thou love her (him), comfort her (him), honor and keep her (him) in sickness and in health, and forsaking all others, keep thee only unto her (him), so long as ye both shall live?" they wanted to end it with "so long as we both shall love."

I saw a good excuse for a divorce lurking in the words "so long as we both shall love." They were told to say the conventional words.

On occasion I will add my own changes to the service.

While I was joining Don and Cathy in holy matrimony, I said to them, "The best advice I can give you for a happy marriage is to tell you to say 'I love you' to each other often and forever during your married life together."

Then I said to the congregation of 150, "I am going to ask those of you who came here with your spouse — or a loved one — to turn to him or her now, hold his or her hand, and looking each other in the eye, say out loud, 'I love you.'"

Well, they did it. The church reverberated with people saying "I love you." Some people told me later that they hadn't said that to their spouses in years!

I got my idea from watching an old Jack Lemmon movie. Lemmon's character, who is married in the film, is explaining why he takes his shirts to Andre's French laundry instead of having his wife do them.

He says it is because he never has to tell Andre he loves him whenever he picks up his shirts.

Therein lies one of the reasons marriages fail — or fail to be what they might be: We have forgotten to say "I love you" — or, as in the case of Lemmon's character, it has become a chore.

It isn't enough that love be present in a marriage. It must be expressed in words as well as deeds, coupled with a tender squeeze of the hand.

I understand what one of my colleagues meant when he said, "I would advise couples planning their wedding to lean heavily on persons and institutions far more experienced than you or I" in planning one of the great events of their life."

In a way, I agree. Still, I wonder. What should really be embarrassing to us is that we take so lightly the vows we make on the occasion of our wedding (or weddings, as the case may be).

Whether those promises are made in Elizabethan English or modern slang is really unimportant. It is keeping the promises that matters.

Cindy Stifley, VBS organizer, added, "We will be having our 'Hilltop Celebration' on Saturday. That day will be filled

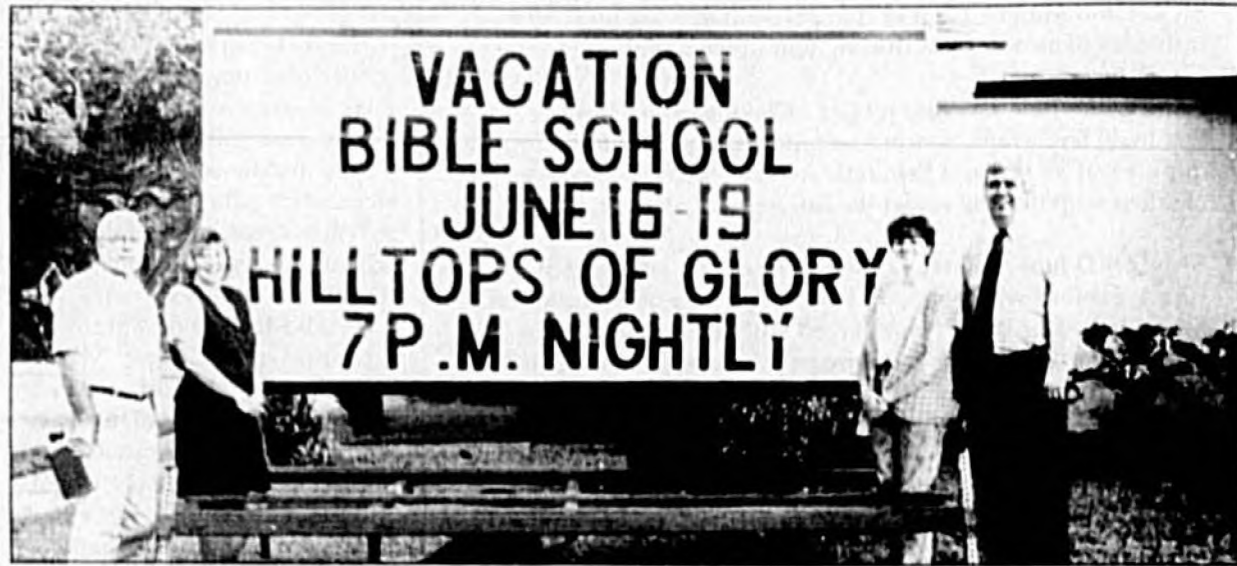

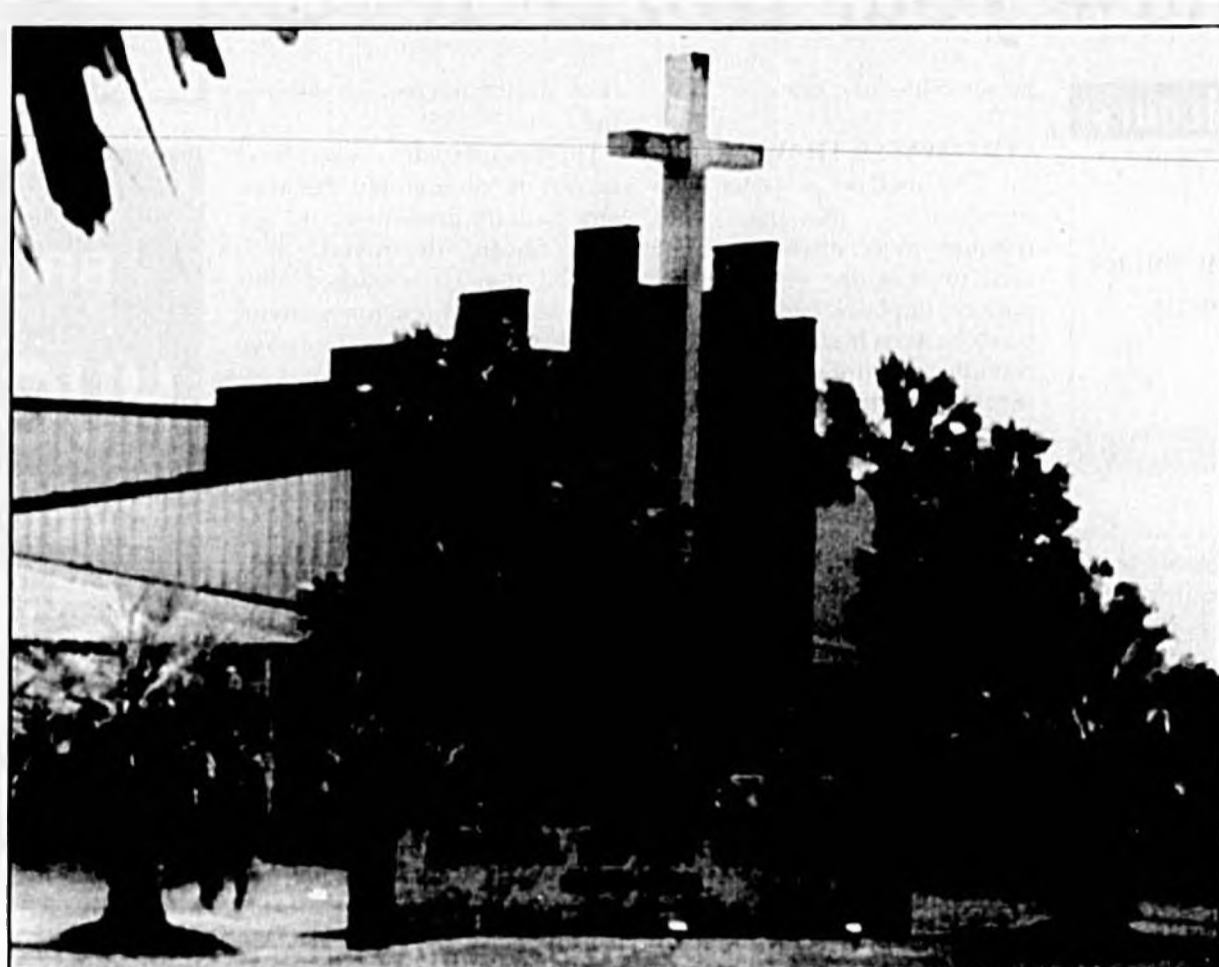

## Safe ways to thaw your frozen foods

According to the US Department of Agriculture, food must be kept at a safe temperature during thawing to avoid bacterial contamination. The story says foods are safe indefinitely while frozen, but as soon as food begins to defrost and becomes warmer than 40 degrees, any bacteria that may have been present before freezing can multiply. There are three safe ways to defrost food.

### REFRIGERATOR THAWING

Planning ahead is the key to this method because of the lengthy time involved. A large frozen item such as a turkey requires at least a day (24 hours) for every five pounds of weight. Even small amounts of frozen food such as a pound of ground meat or boneless chicken breasts requires a full day to thaw. When thawing foods in the refrigerator, there are several variables to take into account.

Some areas of an appliance may keep the food colder than other areas. Food placed in the coldest part will require longer defrosting time. Food takes longer to thaw in a refrigerator set a 35 degrees than one set at 40 degrees.

After thawing in the refrigerator, ground meat and poultry should remain usable for an additional day to thaw before cooking; red meat three to five days. Foods defrosted in the refrigerator can be frozen without cooking, although there may

be some loss of quality.

### COLD WATER THAWING

This method is faster than refrigerator thawing, but requires more attention. The food must be in a leak proof package or plastic bag. If the bag leaks, bacteria from the air or surrounding environment could be introduced into the food.

The bag should be submerged in cold tap water, changing the water every 30 minutes so it continues to thaw.

For whole turkeys, estimate about thirty minutes per pound. After defrosting, refrigerate the food and cook it promptly. Foods thawed by the cold-water method should be cooked before re-freezing.

### MICROWAVE THAWING

When using a microwave to defrost food, plan to cook it immediately after thawing because some areas of the food may become warm and begin to

cook during microwave defrosting.

Holding partially cooked food is not recommended because any bacteria present would not have been destroyed and, indeed, may have reached optimal temperatures for growth. Foods thawed in the microwave should be cooked before re-freezing.

Dismore, from Greenfield, Indiana, took the top spot with a lap of 24.332 seconds in the MCI WorldCom Dallara-Aurora on the 1.5-mile quad-oval.

Sharp was second fastest at 214.839 in the Delphi Automotive Systems Dallara-Aurora.

"We almost won a couple of poles last year but missed it by a few tenths," Dismore said. "But this feels great. I haven't been the luckiest guy in the world, so maybe the monkey has fallen off my back."

Dismore's pole marked quite a turn of fortunes from earlier in the day. He crashed in Turn 4 during the first practice after a mechanical malfunction. He was unhurt.

"I'm just so happy for my guys," Dismore said of the Kelley Racing crew. "We had a motor today that wet the back tires, and I put the thing in the wall. God, they just stayed after it today. This is for them. They are the reason I went fast. I

didn't do anything."

This is the first event where all engines in the Pep Boys Indy Racing League will be required to operate at 10,000 rpm or lower.

The new rule will be in effect for the remainder of the 1999 season. It follows a reduction in the rpm from 10,500 in 1998 to 10,300 at the beginning of 1999.

Leo Mehl, executive director of the Pep Boys Indy Racing League made the announcement during a press conference May 27 at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway along with Joe Negri, GM Motorsports Indy Racing League program manager, and Frank Honsowetz, motorsports manager of Nissan North America.

The required reduction in rpm, controlled by a "rev limiter," will result in reduced speeds produced by the cars in the Pep Boys Indy Racing League.

"Reducing the revs in our engines will obviously slow the cars down, and that is the goal for doing this," said Mehl. "Fortunately, with our formula we are able to slow cars down

without jeopardizing handling."

Engine revs are controlled electronically by Pep Boys Indy Racing League technical officials. It takes one technician approximately five minutes to program an engine's electronic control unit. Teams are not capable of manipulating the "rev limiters."

The Longhorn 500 presented by MCI WorldCom starts at 6:30 p.m. (CDT) Saturday. The 208-lap race will be televised live on FOX Sports Net. Practice resumes at 1:45 p.m. and 4:45 p.m. (CDT) Friday.

Tyce Carlson will start third, his best career Pep Boys Indy Racing League start. Carlson ran 214.417 in the Blueprint-Imunke Racing Dallara/Aurora.

Greg Ray, from Plano, Texas, was fourth at 213.805 in the Glidden-Menards Dallara-Aurora.

1998 Indianapolis 500 champion Eddie Cheever from Orlando qualified 6th at 213.430 in the Team Cheever-The Children's Beverage Group Dallara-Infiniti, the best starting position for an Infiniti Indy engine in Pep Boys Indy Racing League history.

Pep Boys Indy Racing League points leader Jeff Ward qualified seventh at 212.245 in the Yahoo-Merchant Online Dallara-Aurora.

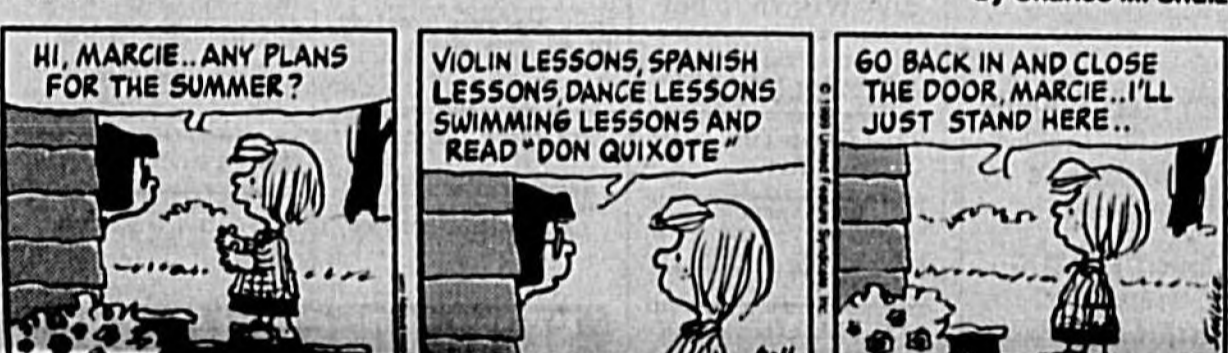

## WIN AT BRIDGE

### A challenge answered

On March 31, I gave a deal in which it was possible to make all five small slams. I ended the column with: "Now we are looking for a deal in which all five grand slams can be brought home. Have you seen one?"

Well, the first reader to rise to the challenge was Dennis Dawson, who runs Dawson's Bridge Vacations, in Reading, Mass. The snag with his layout is that West has only 11 cards and East has 15! Yet Dawson correctly points out that the odds can be improved by giving North and South more of the missing honors. So, by strengthening declarer's spades, I have come up with the given layout.

The auction is reasonable. From

South's point of view, seven no-trump must have some play. However, as it is often wise not to bid a grand slam unless you are able to count 13 tricks, one could understand a final bid of six no-trump.

In seven no-trump, the simple line is to take the diamond finesse. If it wins, you have 13 top tricks via five spades, two hearts, four diamonds and two clubs.

Seven spades offers some other possibilities, especially given the 4-3 trump break. But whatever declarer opts to do, it will work here.

Seven hearts needs the trump finesse and a 3-3 split — not good odds.

Seven diamonds is almost identical to seven no-trump, except that it also needs a 4-3 trump break.

Seven clubs is as bad as seven hearts, needing a 3-3 trump division and a finesse.

## ASK DR. GOTT

### Talk to kids about sex play

**DEAR DR. GOTT:** I occasionally baby-sit for my grandsons, age 7 and 9. More than once, I have come upon them playing with each other's genitals. I don't know if their parents are aware of this and I hesitate to ask for fear of angering them. What should I do? My husband says to leave it alone.

**DEAR READER:** Sexual activity between pre-adolescent children is a common and normal manifestation of curiosity and experimentation; it's part of growing up. On this issue, I side with your husband. In all likelihood, your grandsons will pass through this stage and progress to more challenging teen-age behavior that will leave you yearning for the harmless touching they now enjoy.

Having said this, I must qualify my comments. One child is 9, the other 7. Is it possible that the older sibling is, in fact, abusing his brother? This would be unacceptable. Also, how frequently do they engage in sex play? Is it constant? Every night? Once in awhile? At home? In public?

As their grandmother, you probably can question them in a non-judgmental way to get a feeling for what is really going on. If, as I suspect, their

activity is the intermittent normal sex play of siblings, it can be ignored. On the other hand, if their behavior suggests abuse, inappropriate emphasis on touching or a type of activity that is consistently repetitive, some form of adult input is necessary.

I suggest that you have a sit-down discussion with them and sort things out. I believe that such a session would allay your anxiety. If not, inform their parents and encourage them to seek professional assistance.

**DEAR DR. GOTT:** I know an older woman with diabetes who had to have her foot amputated because of gangrene. I don't understand the connection.

**DEAR READER:** Diabetes causes accelerated aging and arteriosclerosis. Such blockage affects all the arteries in the body, those in the feet as well. If the blockage leads to a profound reduction of blood flow, the tissues will not receive enough oxygen. Over time, such tissues will die and gangrene will result. Or, if other organs are affected, stroke, kidney failure, heart attack or retinal damage will occur.

Once tissue death is evident, the

destroyed portions must be surgically removed, because preventive measures are then of no use. Recent studies have shown that such complications of diabetes can be prevented or lessened if blood sugar levels are assiduously kept in the normal range, either with diet, medication or both.

Your acquaintance's foot was virtually lost long before she had surgery; the operation served only to prevent the dead tissue from making her dangerously ill. Of course, she and her physician are undoubtedly concerned about her remaining foot; if she cannot control her diabetes, gangrene may soon affect the remaining extremity.
