

There are astate minds in Florida who may have encouraging answers to this question. There are able leaders in Florida who would dare to take a stand against the domination of the Smith principles, even though it means a complete disruption of the Democratic Party. Isn't it time for these people to get to work in the hope of preventing a surrender to Smith leadership in the national convention?

By showing the people of the United States that the South will not stay "solid" for the endorsement of pro-liquor and pro-looseness in general, it is possible that delegates to the democratic convention will go so instructed to vote against the nomination of Smith, there will be no chance of his name being blazoned as the accepted leader of the great Democratic Party.

Years ago Ralph Waldo Emerson saw a situation which must have been very similar to the one demanding attention today. Clean Democrats anticipating the nomination of Al-Smith as standard-bearer for their party will think Emerson was speaking for them when he said:

Of the two great parties, which, at this hour, almost share the nation between them, I should say that one has the best cause, and the other contains the best men. The philosopher, the poet, or the religious man, will, of course, wish to east his vote with the democrat, for free trade, for wide suffrage, for the abolition of legal cruelties in the penal code, and for facilitating in every manner the access of the young and the poor to the sources of wealth and power. But he can rarely accept the persons whom the so-called popular party propose to him as representatives of these liberalities. On the other side, the conservative party, composed of the most moderate, able, and cultivated part of the population, is timid, and merely defensive of property. It vindicates no right, it aspires to no real good, it brands no crime, it proposes no generous policy, it does not build nor write, nor cherish the arts, nor foster religion, nor establish schools nor encourage science, nor emancipate the slave nor befriend the poor, or the Indian, or the immigrant. From neither party, when in power, has the world any benefit to expect in science, art, or humanity, at all commensurate with the resources of the nation.





Mr. Leopold spent a number of years in the western service prior to coming here two years ago. "The plague of forest fires which has afflicted the inland emtire for the past month," he said, "is caused, at least in part, by poor utilization of the forests. Uncut virgin forest seldom burns...


