## WORLD IN BRIEF

### Police Seal Off Genoa

#### In Search For Aldo Moro

**ROME** (UPI) — Police hunting for kidnapped former Premier Aldo Moro sealed off the city of Genoa today and started a massive search of homes, railroad stations and ships in Italy's largest port.

Police did not say what prompted the search, their second major operation in Genoa since Red Brigades guerrillas kidnapped Moro and gunned down his five bodyguards in a March 16 Rome ambush.

#### 19 Bank Hostages Held

**LINZ, Austria** (UPI) — A masked gunman claiming to be a member of the Red Brigades terrorist group that kidnapped former Italian Premier Aldo Moro held 19 hostages today in a bank he attempted to rob.

Police said the unidentified man fired eight shots into the air when he learned that the bank had been cordoned off, but apparently caused no injuries.

#### Afghani President Slain?

**NEW DELHI, India** (UPI) — Military insurgents in Afghanistan said today they killed President Mohammed Daoud and his brother in a left-wing coup but diplomatic reports fighting was still raging in the Afghani capital of Kabul early this morning.

#### West Bank Options Studied

**WASHINGTON** (UPI) — In an attempt to get the stalled Middle East negotiations rolling, the United States and Israel are studying a new series of proposals for the future of the West Bank and Gaza Strip.

The ideas were put forward in some seven hours of talks between Israeli Foreign Minister Moshe Dayan and U.S. Secretary of State Cyrus Vance.

additional receipts," said Alexander.

Jones said the \$600,000 plan, if carried over into the next year, would mean that taxes will be kept constant at the current rate or even reduced. As for the possibility of rebating the \$600,000 anticipated surplus revenue, Jones said, "I do not know of any authority in the law to rebate taxes. If it is a county tax, then it is a county tax." Jones said the previous year, by offering the tax cut "by working to keep taxes down."

"Frankly, I'm not working for a tax cut," said Alexander. "I'm interested in the taxpayer who has to pay his taxes and the county who doesn't need them." Jones said the reason for the tax partial exemption is only \$500 of additional revenue per family, including that the

tax will could be deferred. If the county does not receive it, the county will not have to pay its taxes.

"If everyone pays his taxes we would have five percent more income than anticipated by using the state law formula of 10 percent," said Jones.

Jones said the county can afford to give up \$500 million, if it is willing to let the county build and finance its buildings.

In addition to business buildings, four apartment buildings, four houses and two dormitories were delivered.

Farmers attempting to fight the blazes were hampered by strong winds and a lack of water pressure.

The fire broke out in a vacant former furniture store, but the exact cause was not immediately known.

There were no reports of death or injuries.

Hundreds of residents of homes immediately south of the business area were ordered evacuated, but officials later said fires had managed to extend the blaze toward the residential areas.

Driven by high winds, the flames quickly spread from the vacated furniture store to the adjoining Woolworth and Penny's Drug Store and then to the branch of Shirley's Boot.

Firemen there the fire jumped to the personnel office of the Ministry of Interior and then to the adjacent Woolworth building.

Firemen from neighboring towns, including Tivoli, were summoned to help battle the flames.

"We call all of this local responsibility," said Jones.

### What Now, Mr. Lance?

The Bert Lance affair is becoming more and more involved.

He now — if he hasn't already — will run the show again forward at the behest of his good old boy Jimmy Carter to serve in public office.

Now we learn this week that federal investigators have charged Mr. Lance with faulty banking practices in a violation of civil statutes. Criminal investigation and prosecution still may be down the road as a grand jury is deliberating in Atlanta.

Mr. Lance has responded to the new charges by agreeing not to engage in any of the banking practices that forced him out as President Carter's budget director.

An out-of-court agreement among Lance, the federal government and the two banks he headed before coming to the White House provides that he will update his financial statements at any bank currently extending his credit and will not borrow to finance political campaigns.

He also has made other agreements — while officially not conceding any wrongdoing.

We wonder now, then, if Mr. Lance reads in the newspapers of his latest troubles, how much of that he can blame on the press itself as he was so wont to do during his recent address to the American Society of Newspaper Editors.

He blamed, for example, bad reporting for the impression that he was involved in dealings for control of a holding company, while he was a federal official. Not so, he insists.

Final disposition of all the charges Mr. Lance so glibly has blamed on the press is yet to come. We haven't heard the last of it.

In the meantime, what interests us more right now is Mr. Lance's view of the potential consequences of the kind of reporting he believes has damaged his reputation.

If the press doesn't straighten out, he says, we'll just have to do our own reporting, notwithstanding the First Amendment, in order to guarantee "ethics and truthfulness" in journalism.

What other groups do we have in mind? Congress? The White House? The courts? Vigilantes?

Mr. Lance is said to remain close to President Carter and his official circle.

That's the worrisome thing. Some of the editors in Mr. Lance's audience were reminded of another prominent figure who once traveled the country saying there ought to be some check on the press because of what it was saying about the administration then in power.

His name was Spiro Agnew.

### Let Buyer Beware

Mexico's government is spraying marijuana fields with a poison herbicide — paraquat — that is provided by the United States.

But some of the sprayed marijuana, harvested before it disappears, is being smuggled into the United States.

It reportedly causes lung damage and might cause death; already there have been reports from Northern Canada of persons stricken after smoking the weed.

Predictably, Washington is being criticized for supplying the poison that pollutes the dogs that some Americans are smoking. There is a hue and cry to cut off paraquat.

But an interesting way to keep Americans that the government they smoke may be poisoned with paraquat, the poison is on the illegal user.

Predictably, the warning being instituted is more verbal.

The government has persuaded Mexico to put an additive in the paraquat spray that will make the marijuana unpleasant to taste and smell. The poisoned marijuana then will be easily identifiable, and for that reason less likely sold and used.

This is a sensible, humane solution that protects the U.S. & government to fulfill its responsibilities to the law and to the people.

To have no off-shoots of paraquat would have stripped our neighbors to the south of an most effective weapon in their fight against the cultivation of marijuana — one of Mexico's big domestic problems — and, also one of ours.

There should be no changes in the Social Security law except under political pressure.

Chairman Al Ullman of the House Ways and Means Committee made this point in response to the three-to-one vote of House Democrats in favor of dipping into general revenues to offset a recommended reduction in the stiff new payroll taxes recently enacted to help the system survive.



## Did Bell Cover Up Probe Of FBI Illegal Works?

**WASHINGTON (UPI)** — Attorney General Griffin Bell faced "cover-up" accusations in Congress today for the second time since the Carter administration took office 18 months ago.

With his February firing of U.S. Attorney David Marston still rattling some Senate Republicans, others are now accusing Bell of a cover-up in the investigation of the FBI's alleged mail illegal surveillance.

The new controversy was triggered by charges of William Gardner, once head of the investigation, that Bell blocked the prosecution of eight highlevel FBI officials on charges of illegal wiretaps and "black bag jobs."

Sen. Lowell Weicker, RConn., said Thursday the testimony of Gardner and two assistants before a Senate appropriations subcommittee "rightfully calls into question the suitability of Griffin Bell to continue as attorney general...."

## Lance Has White House Pass

**WASHINGTON (UPI)** — Bert Lance's recent round of troubles with federal agencies and courts concerning his financial affairs have not interfered with his easy access to President Carter.

"I know of no particular change" in that close relationship between Carter and Lance, says Rex Gramm, deputy White House press secretary.

Gramm says Lance still holds a White House staff pass and that he knows of no plans to ask the former budget director to turn it in.

## Virginia: Emergency Floods

Sections of Virginia are under a state of emergency today because of flooding which flooded 2 feet of snow.

Gov. John Dalton declared the emergency after about 1,500 persons were evacuated from the Roanoke River and the James River basins.

River overflows caused flooding of homes and businesses in Roanoke, and tides as much as 3 feet higher than normal washed away tons of sandy beach along the Tidewater coast.

## Hoffa Kin: Fraud Guilt

**DETROIT (UPI)** — A federal court jury has found Charles L. "Chuckie" O'Brien, self-proclaimed foster son of missing former Teamsters president James R. Hoffa, guilty of two counts of making false statements on a bank loan application.

## Bundy: Teeth Marks Eyed

**TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (UPI)** — Police have taken teeth impressions from Theodore Bundy in an effort to prove he killed two young women and savagely beat two others at the Chi Omega Sorority House Jan. 15.

## Automen Profits 'Dip'

**DETROIT (UPI)** — Inflation and sluggish car sales sacked the Big Three automakers in the packshot early in the year, cutting their combined first-quarter profits 10.4 percent from a year ago to \$1.3 billion.

## Panel Eyes Desegregation

**TALLAHASSEE (UPI)** — A bireacial council that includes former Gov. LeRoy Collins and House Speaker Don Tucker among its 15 members today was named to monitor implementation of Florida's college desegregation plan.

Education Commissioner Ralph Turpin resigned the council and made his chief assistant, Pete Millett, chairman.



**In This Case Weight Loss Vital**

DEAR DR. LAMB: I am an糖尿病 and hypertension. My husband had a heart attack last year and is in hospital for arteriosclerosis. The surgery was six months ago. He is only 41 and had always been in perfect health.

Please could you help me by letting me know where and who I could possibly see to get help. Two other wives depend on him.

DEAR READER: I know how frightening it is to learn that a loved one has a disease. But there are things you can do to help your husband live a longer and healthier life.

He has fatty-cholesterol deposits in his arteries and there is some evidence that the process can be slowed, stopped or even reversed. The two ways to do this are to eat less fat and to get really thin.

The letter has to be done gradually, but I don't think many of the special diets help much if a person doesn't get rid of all the excess fat under the skin. Unfortunately, too often both the patient and the doctor start at the top gear of dieting and exercise.

Get your husband down to the point that there is no more fat around the small of his back than you ordinarily find under the skin over the back of the hand. That means no significant fat deposits around the waist. And what you can do now does all you can do. We do know that in obesity experiments the fatty-cholesterol deposits will disappear if the monkeys are put on a low-calorie, low-fat, low-cholesterol diet.

If your husband happens to have elevated blood pressure that should also be controlled. Weight reduction and elimination of salt help here too.

His diet should be low in fat (that helps control the calorie intake, too) and low in cholesterol. I am sending you
