



On the whole we think he has made a fairly good President since he has been in office, but in recommending increasing the dole to those who won't work, he certainly went off the

This is no bonus to soldiers who have been sweating it out in the foxholes of Iwo Jima and Okinawa. This is no pension for veterans who lost an arm or a leg at Anzio, saint Lo or the Belgian Bulge. This is not even a federal appropriation to build schools for the nation's children hospitals for the sick and injured, or homes for the aged, crippled or destitute. This is not even a charitable contribut'on to take care of the nation's under-privileged.

It is a handout, pure and simple, to those who have been colding the best paying jobs of the past few years. It is hush money for the war profiteers of the Second World War, who now that peace has come, are trying to create a condition of chaos by fomenting strikes. It is political graft of the worst sort for a class of special privileged persons who have grown fat on their swollen war time wages and who insist now upon being supported in idleness by their Rind-hearted but fat-headed Uncle Sam.

President Truman said himself that he is not recommending this \$25 a week for everybody, not even for everybody that is unemployed. A White House statement issued Saturday said, "The President has sought to make it clear that the \$25 is a ceiling and does not mean that every-body would get \$25.a week." The statement then goes on to say that "Only a worker who would earn \$50 or more a

week would receive the maximum of \$25 a week."

This business of almost doubling the handout to those who have been receiving wages of \$50 a week or more will cost the government-we should say, the taxpayers -hundreds of millions of dollars. Many of those taxpayers are themselves workers who have been receiving less than \$50 a week throughout the lucrative war years. The poor will be taxed so that those better off than themselves may







The situation in Bavaria came to a head early last week when Patton told correspondents that complaints of anti-Nazis that Nazis were in the civil government were just a case of the "outs fighting the ins" and reminded him of the bickerings between Democrats and Republicans in the United States.

The transfer relegated Patton, a pistol-packing exemplar of aggressive warfare to the command of an "army" which is virtually don-existent. Since Jely, when it relinquished the Rhinehead, the 15th has been a phantom" army consisting of little more than a headquarters detachment which has been assigned to compile an write a report of American participation in the European war.

In his new post, the committed ing Patton will have no authority over the German civil population. The handful of troops he will command are stationed west of the Rhine, at Bad Neuenahr near the Remagen bridge, in the center of the Frach occupation zone. 




