

Are Under Investigation

WASHINGTON (AP) - Watergate prosecutors are conducting a grand jury investigation of the Democratic party's finances in 1970 and 1971, public records show. Prosecutors have said they are looking into possible violations of the federal law requiring public disclosure of

Two Considered For Job

WASHINGTON (AP) - A Justice Department official and the past president of the homebuilders' lobbying group are among possible nominees being considered to head the Department of Housing and Urban Development. Sources in Congress and HUD confirmed two names persistently mentioned are Asst. Atty. Gen. Carla Hills and Lewis Cenker, until recently the president of the National Association of Home Builders.

Cautions Americans

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Ford is cautioning Americans to brace for a faster-than-forecast surge in unemployment but says the jobless rate will peak at under 10 per cent and gradually head downward before year's end. The President's personal predictions on the closely watched indicator of the nation's recession came at a Topeka, Kan., news conference after he announced the release of \$2 billion in frozen highway funds to spur 125,000 or more jobs in the hard-hit construction industry.

Archdiocese Faces Deficit

NEWARK, N.J. (AP) - The Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Newark, sixth largest in the nation, says it is faced with a multimillion dollar budget deficit. Archbishop Peter L. Gerety told newsmen Tuesday that short-term loans and mortgages amounting to \$25.3 million owed by the archdiocese are the major problem. He said costs for the current fiscal year amount to more

Yo Yo Reflects Economy

MADISON, Wis. (AP) - Like a barometer in reverse, the YoYo reflects the way the economy isn't going. In these times of recession, the nation's largest Yc-Yo company is doing a booming business. "When times are tight, they don't have the money to buy basketballs, but they do have the money to buy Yo-Yos," explained William Reck, comptroller of Flambeau Products Corp., parent company of Duncan Yo-Yos.

Ship To Become Junk

PHILADELPHIA (AP) - The hospital ship SS Hope is headed for the scrap pile. The white ship, which traveled 250, 000 miles and brought 20th century medicine to many underdeveloped nations, was towed out of the Philadelphia Naval Yard on Tuesday bound for Brownsville, Tex., where it will be scrapped. The Hope was retired 18 months ago when it became too costly to operate.

Layer Not Concerned City 'Quitting' About Losing Funds **Utility Business**

By MICKEY LOCHRINGE

A resolution which would eliminate an \$8 utility allowance and leave the residents of the Castle Brewer and William Clark housing projects to pay their own electric bills is expected to be approved tonight by the Sanford Housing Authority (SHA).

According to SHA Executive Director Thomas Wilson. the proposed resolution "could cause a problem" because residents of the two projects, in order to receive electrical service, would have to pay a \$20 hook-up fee and pay menthly charges to Florida Power & Light.

The controversial issue is on the agenda of SHA's 7:30 p.m. meeting in the conference room at the Redding Gardens housing project on Locust Avenue and 5th Street The SHA has been paying utility costs and the allowance, but now Wilson says that the Authority can no longer afford the costs because of decreased federal

"We're getting out of the utility business," he said "The losses have been too great to absorb." Wilson said the rent on the 211 units in the two complexes will drop by \$8, the utility allowance, but the residents will be subject to any rate hikes by the power

"Whether we like it or not, it's someting that's going to be there," Wilson said. Also, tonight the SHA will vote on resolution for a

Housing Assistance Plan for the city of Sanford which will be used in applying for federal funds from the Department of Housing and Urban Development. The four-pronged plan, which lists problems with substandard housing in the city will be presented if approved to the City Commission during their Monday meeting for the commission's consideration.

Problems listed in the plan reveal that there is an "inadequate amount of low income housing in the city." according to Wilson. Wilson said that more than 25 per cent of the city's dwelling structures are either substandard condition or
