Has GOP Small-Print Problem?

WASHINGTON (NEA) - Republican presidential aspirants hoping to gain momentum from early 1980 tests in Iowa and New Hampshire could face a "small print" problem if Sen. Edward M. Kennedy goes forward with his challenge to President Carter.

This is a dilemma best illustrated by a classic anecdote from the 1880 primary campaign, when James Garfield was the top vote-getter.

Despite a superb campaign staff and support from many GOP pros, Bush continues to suffer from low name recognition problems that have kept him down near the bottom of the pack in opinion-poll rankings of Republican presidential hopefuls.

Howard H. Baker Jr., who remains Bush's chief competitor for the support of GOP moderates, has picked up the endorsements of three prominent New England Republicans.

Robert T. Stafford of Vermont, William A. Cohen of Maine and John H. Chafee of Rhode Island have endorsed the Bush campaign.

NEW YORK (UPI) - Seven major league managers who started the season already are, and with as many as seven more possibly to follow in the next few weeks, this could be remembered as the greatest casualty year ever for them.

Latest to go is the Cubs' Herman Franks, saying he had enough and can't take any more although he did an extraordinary job of keeping his club in contention all summer long. He just up and quit.

So did Don Kessinger, earlier in the season when he became convinced he wasn't getting anywhere with the White Sox. He and Franks left of their own accord but five others - Les Moss of the Tigers, Bob Lemon of the Yankees, Jeff Torborg of the Indians, Danny Ozark of the Phillies and Joe Aljobell of the Giants - were fired, and all of them look much better for it right now.

One manager, Earl Weaver of the Orioles, survives all the others, and for anyone who has studied his record or watched his press, the reason is obvious - he's the best manager in baseball.

"You never can really relax," he says. "There's always something in the air."

"After we clinched, I told my players my prime concern is to get them ready for the playoffs," Weaver says.

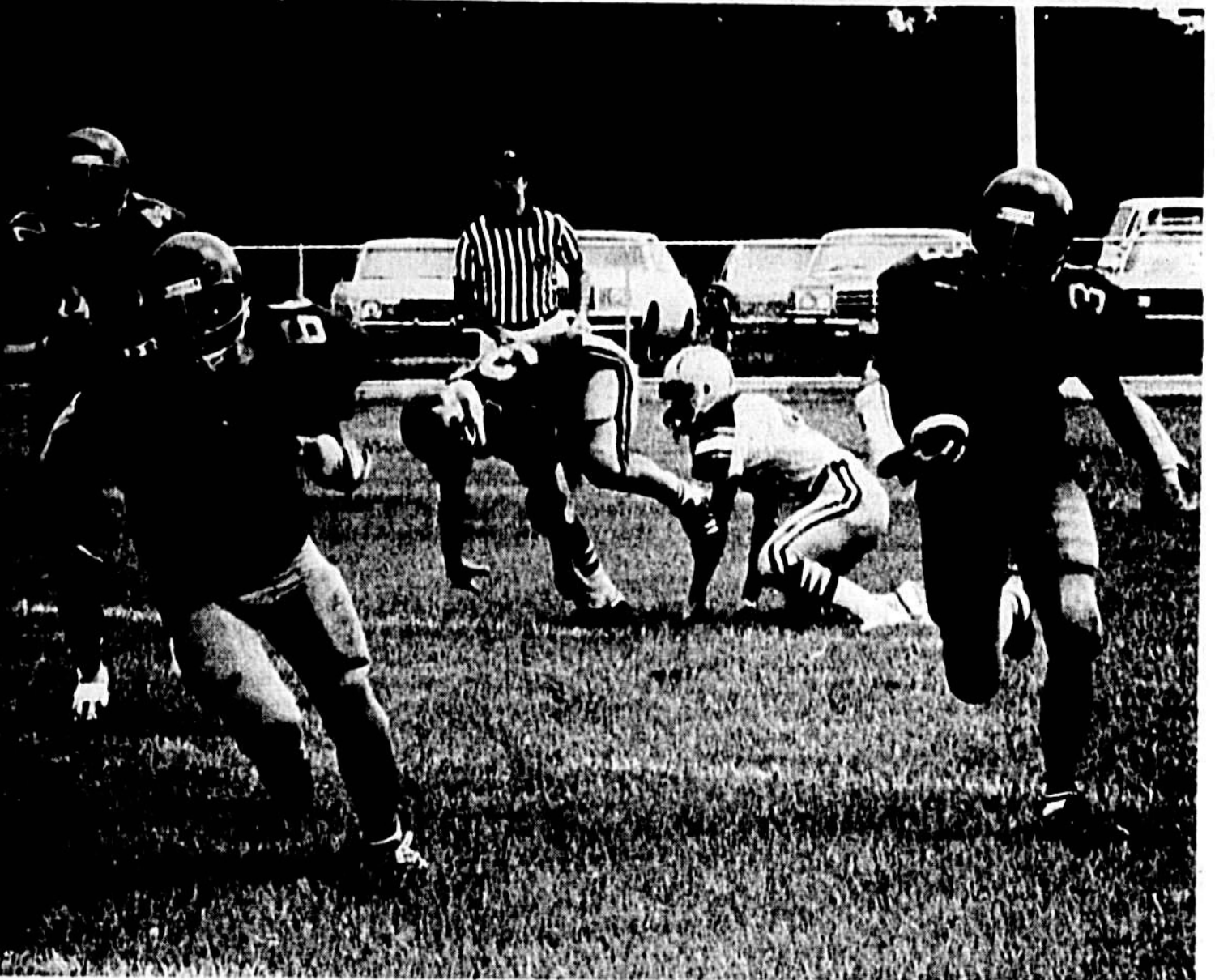

"I wish them all well," the manager said. "There were certainly some disappointments with certain people but that's life."

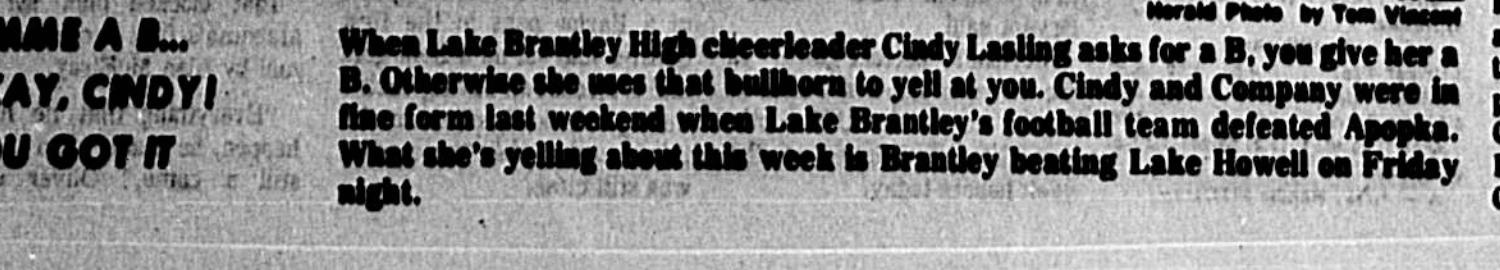

DEAR DR. LAMB—I am concerned about backaches and what causes them. How can I develop my back to resist the strain? I do manual labor. I'm 31 and notice that when I bend over I can feel some strain. I'd like to develop my back. Can you recommend any type of exercises?

Most specialists in backache problems feel that the decreased physical activity characteristic of our society is a major factor. For that reason it may be that the manual labor that you're doing is a help.

One of the important aspects of preventing backaches is to maintain good strength of your abdominal muscles. Unless you already have back problems that might be made worse with certain exercises, you could concentrate on sit-ups and leg lifts to help strengthen your abdominal muscles.

The back is under the greatest strain when you're sitting. This is because many people sit without gaining any support from the abdominal muscles. It's easier on your back to be standing or walking. Of course, bed rest provides the greatest opportunity for rest or relaxing the back. Many backaches that are associated with "Charlie's Angels" and "Vegas."

I've included a discussion of exercises to help prevent backaches in the Health Letter. I'm sending you. We often talk about the importance of physical fitness in improving heart and lung function, but it's equally important in preventing back problems.

Job Figures Are On Rise in State

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (UPI)—Job figures for the past year encouraged Secretary of Labor Wallace Orr and the Department of Labor and Employment Security Monday to predict a resurgence in the Florida construction industry.

The total of 233,800 construction jobs was the highest for this category in nearly five years. Construction had an 8.1 percent increase in number of jobs, a numerical hike of 17,600 during the year.

The category with the highest numerical increase was services and mining with 32,200 new jobs for a 4.7 percent increase. Manufacturing increased 21,700 jobs, up 5.1 percent. Transportation and utilities rose 9.1 percent, adding 17,400 jobs.
