

Gasoline, Oil Lead Another Big Price Jump

consumer level climbed 1.1 percent in August, led by another big jump in gasoline and heating oil prices, the government reported

With the exception of grocery prices, the cost of most items used by consumers went

The Labor Department's monthly analysis of prices paid by consumers represented another setback to the White House, which has been hoping to see a slackening of inflationary pressure as a result of slowing economic growth.

The 1.1 percent price climb — a 14 percent annual rate - was the seventh consecutive month that consumer costs have risen by 1 percent or more, the department said.

Prices for gasoline and home heating oil continued to surge upward. Gasoline prices at the pump rose 4 percent last month while home heating oil increased 7.1 percent. The Labor Department said the average price for all types of gasoline was 96.7 cents a

gallon last month, up 3.7 cents from July

During the first eight months of 1979, average gasoline prices have surged by 28.2 cents a

The average price for a gallon of home heating oil was 80 cents last month and has now climbed by 25.5 cents per gallon in 1979,

Housing costs, the government said, rose 1.4 percent for the largest increase of the year. Besides heating oil, house prices jumped 1.5 percent and financing costs rose 3 percent last month.

Furthermore, the cost of clothing rose 0.7 percent after three consecutive months of

The only bright news in the report was that food and beverage prices were unchanged over the month, the best performance of 1979, and grocery store costs fell 0.3 percent.

The Labor Department said its price index for all urban consumers stood at 221.1 last month. That means goods and services which cost \$100 in 1967 were prices at \$221.10 in

Sanford Taps Attorney For Sands Lawsuit

named special attorney to defend the city of Sanford and Police Chief Ben Butler in a lawsuit filed by former police

Sands is suing the city, alleging his rights under state statute called the "Police Bill of Rights" were violated when he was fired from a position with the city police department. The city has claimed however, that Sands was serving only as a probationery officer and thus did not come under the protection of the state law.

Compromise Reached

On Canal Legislation

WASHINGTON (UPI)— A new compromise version of the troubled Panama Canal legislation is given a good chance of passing the House and Senate in time for the Oct. 1 effective date of the canal treaties. A House-Senate conference committee agreed on the new language Monday, and the bill was expected to reach the Senate today and come up for a critical House vote

It was the House that threw the issue back to the negotiators last week when it rejected an earlier compromise worked out by the committee... The legislation is needed to carry out provisions of the Panama Canal treaties which give the waterway to Panama in the year 2000.

Jackson Tours West Bank

RAMALLAH, Israeli-Occupied West Bank (UPI)— The Rev. Jesse Jackson toured a rundown Palestinian refugee camp today and accused the United States of injustice in giving more aid to Israel than to the refugees. "I understand this camp," the American civil rights

leader said as he walked through this camp. "I identify heavily with this camp...The stench, the open sewers this is nothing new to me. This is a reminder." Jackson compared U.S. aid to Israel with that given to UNWRA for the care of refugees. "America is a party to an arrangement that gives \$2 billion to 3 million people and gives \$50 million to 2 million and by no arrangement of arithmetic is that balanced or is it justice," he said.

Soviet Defectors In Hiding

BERN, Switzerland (UPI)- Two Soviet ice-skating stars, the fourth and fifth Russian artists to defect to the West in recent weeks, were in hiding and under police protection today.

Swiss officials announced Monday Oleg Protopopov and Ludmila Belousova, winners of two Olympic gold medals, asked Switzerland for political asylum.

Protopopov, 47, and Miss Belousova, 43, who first skated together in 1951 and married seven years later, will have to stay under cover "for several weeks" before a decision is made by the Swiss government, officials said. They revue in the town of Zug, near Zurich.

Security Tight For Pope

DUBLIN, Ireland (UPI)— Irish policemen may be the only people to catch a close-up view of Pope John Paul II during his visit to Ireland at the end of this week. Rendered especially nervous by last month's murder of Queen Elizabeth II's cousin, Earl Mountbatten, and three other people, Irish police have devised unprecedented security measures at an estimated cost of some \$3 million for the 50-hour papal visit beginning Saturday.

The Polish-born pontiff will stay at Dublin's Papal



And Yes, Hope Springs Eternal

Every session of the United Nations opens on a note of hope, even if every session in the past seems to have ended on a note of disappointment. The 34th session of the General Assembly which just convened in New York is no exception.

There is always hope when delegates from 154 nations are willing to meet under one roof, if only to talk. This year the hope for progress on an agenda of depressingly familiar issues lies mainly in the tone of that talk. The Third World countries which dominate the assembly are not speaking with one voice to the extent they have in recent years.

The fragmentation of this familiar "bloc" can only be healthy for the U.N. Its credentials took a dive when its debates and decisions followed a predictable course of villifying the United States. or Israel, or the industrialized nations. We haven't heard the last of this rhetoric, but some realism is

The poorer nations are now pressing OPEC to show more mercy on oil prices. Heretofore in their eyes, OPEC could do no wrong. After all, the oilexporting countries were part of their own Third World, and their cartel was only trying to wrest economic power from the United States and the colonial powers of Europe.

Now, these least-fortunate of countries are realizing that they are suffering as much harm, or more, from high energy prices, than any of the richer nations. The result is that the U.N. dialogue on economic development is no longer so polarized along simplistic lines which obscure the way the world's economic system really works.

Third World leaders are finding it increasingly difficult to pin their problems on "imperialism" by Western powers, particularly the United States. The U.S. intervention in Southeast Asia has long since faded as a convenient target. It is the North Vietnamese who are now on the defensive, for their persecutions, their invasion of Cambodia and their discrimination against ethnic Chinese.

The recent summit of non-aligned nations in lavana demonstrated the depth of disagreement among undeveloped countries over the proper course for their political orientation. They have seen that blindly following the anti-American, anti-Western line puts them in bad with Fidel Castro. whose slavish pro-Soviet line twists the concept of non-alignment to the breaking point.

Flights of rhetoric which exaggerate or distort the truth have been characteristic of U.N. sessions. Andrew Young's proclivity for the flamboyant style made him popular among Third World diplomats given to the same habit. The replacement of Mr. Young as our U.N. ambassador



WASHINGTON (NEA) - Republican presidential aspirants hoping to gain momentum from early 1980 tests in Iowa and New Hampshire could face a "small print" problem if Sen. Edward M. Kennedy goes forward with his challenge to President Carter.

This is a dilemma best illustrated by a classic anecdote from the 1966 primary campaign, when a plane carrying the late Robert F. Kennedy and dozens of reporters nearly ran off a runway following a teeth-rattling aborted takeoff. The candidate, in typical Kennedy fashion, was the first to recover his wits — and his voice. 'With all due immodesty," he told his shaken fellow passengers, "if we don't make it this time,

Should Library Stay Put?

Members of eight Sanford civic organizations made it clear to County Commissioner Bill Kirchhoff this morning in no uncertain terms they want the North Seminole county branch library retained at its current site at the former post office building on First Street. Representatives of the Beautification and Civic

Improvement Committee of the Greater Sanford Chamber of Commerce, the Sanford Senior Citizens Club, the Sanford Business Association, the Junior Womans Club and Senior Women's Club, Kiwanis and Rotary, SISTERS (Sanford's Interested Sarahs To Encourage Rejuvenation) toured the facility and offered suggestions to the commissioner for expanding it.

Among the suggestions was that a cooperative arrangement be initiated with the Sanford city government to use the city-owned lot west of the building for expansion purposes under a lease agreement. City Commissioner Eddie Keith, speaking on behalf of

the commission, said that board would "make any agreement to keep the library where it is." The county is currently leasing the library facility from the city for \$1 annually. But the lease agreement is due to expire in 1960, Kirchhoff said. The city acquired the old post office building from the

U.S. General Services Administration (GSA). Under the contract with GSA, the building must be maintained as a library until 1983 or its ownership will revert back to the federal government. Leading a guided tour of the building, Kirchhoff, an

amateur historian, said the structure was built in 1917 as a post office during the "Red Scare" when people were afraid the Bolsheviks were going to take over the government. In addition, he said during those days a considerable amount of money passed through the post office. Kirchhoff said the building was constructed not only to withstand enemy attack but also to withstand the efforts of robbers.

Although the building has 5,000 square feet, Kirchhoff said, there is only 2,500 to 3,000 square feet of actual

Standards for a library the size necessary to serve the population of the north end of the county, requires used to space of 5,000 to 10,000 square feet, Kirchhoff said. He said the cost of repairing the building, bring it a, .o building, plumbing, electrical and fire code standards and providing adequate restroom facilities, could be ex-

The commissioner, whose district includes the city of Sanford, said he personally has maintained the library should remain a cohesive part of the downtown section of the city. To a question of whether county funds can be spent to update the building, Kirchhoff said the county, under state law, cannot bind the taxpayers for longer periods of time than two years.

Mrs. Ruth Swinney, a downtown businesswoman, pointed out the county could use a similar amount of money to expand the downtown library as it spends to rent library facilities in the south end. "The people in the south end of the county have their

library; there is Seminole Community College library midway and this library near Bram Towers," said Jack Horner, director of the Greater Sanford Chamber of Commerce. "We are interested in this facility." Kirchhoff said there is a "crying need" to have a library

in the area west of Interstate 4 in South Seminole and one in the Oviedo area. He said at a future time another library will be needed in the Lake Mary area. "The argument is that if the library is moved to a more central location in the city, it can better serve." Kirchhoff said.

"Billy Kirchhoff is fighting to keep the library here," Keith said, defending the county commissioner. "If all books in circulation would come in to this library," Kirchhoff said, "there would not be enough shelves to hold them."
