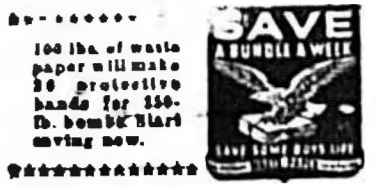

Russians Root Out last Nazis On Continent

Churchill Promises Britain Will Fight Side By Side With U.S. Against Japs

WASHINGTON, May 14, (AP)—British Foreign Secretary Anthony Eden today arranged an afternoon appointment at the White House amid reports of a possible early "peace in Europe" meeting of the Big Three. London reports said Eden expected to discuss with President Truman the possible date and site of a meeting of Truman, Churchill and Stalin. There was no comment on these reports at the White House. Chinese Foreign Minister Hoang also planned to see President Truman.

PARIS, May 14, (AP)—General Eisenhower said today he regrets instances in which senior officers treated captured Nazi and high German officials as "friendly enemy" in direct violation of his orders. The statement followed British and American press criticism on the treatment of Reichsmarshal Goering by the Seventh Army.

(By Associated Press) Four Russian armies today routed the last fanatical Germans from isolated pockets in Austria and Czechoslovakia. Moscow announced 1,060,000 Nazis have been rounded up since Germany's surrender for a total of 2,860,000 captured or killed since the Russians' final offensive began on Jan. 18. This included the German casualties by Soviet account to 12,600,000 in four years.

Spring Vegetable Season In Florida Passes Its Peak

JACKSONVILLE, May 14, (Special)—Last week Florida's spring vegetable season passed its peak and will now go into a steady decline until market returns today. "Tomato shipments at Palmtoet will probably and this week," he continued. During the first nine days of this month our market there handled 18,780 bushels which brought \$45,386.00. The market will be open all this week, and a large number of buyers are expected to be on hand.

"Plant City passed the peak of its shipments last week with 53,564 packages passing through the market. Field peas continued to lead with 18,546 hampers, peppers were second with 14,519 hampers, and tomatoes came third with 12,387 crates. The movement will go into a decided wane now due to continued dry weather.

"Wachula is still having strong movement of tomatoes, although the peak has been passed. Volume is holding up remarkably well in view of the dry weather but is liable to break sharply downward soon. Quality is excellent carrying quite a premium and prices are satisfactory. Pepper is the only other commodity being shipped in volume worth mentioning.

"Sanford is still doing a small amount of business and expects a light volume of beans, field peas, beans, eggplants, corn, peppers, potatoes, tomatoes, and possibly melons this week.

"Fort Pierce is very quiet. A few tomatoes continue coming in, but all other produce is gone. "Palmetto movement continues slow. Light volume of eggplants, peppers and okra the only commodities moving.

"Tampa is also reaching the end of its battle with volume. Volume dropped down to 8 to 10 carloads per day last week and will be much smaller this week. Peppers and eggplants are the only commodities moving in volume. Shipments through May 8 were 150 cars above the 1944-45 season.

"Our livestock market at Jay continued to be quiet with cattle for \$1.74.00 and 80 head of hogs for \$13.85.00 last Tuesday." (Special)

Seminole County Property Owners Pay Their Taxes

One thousand more Tax Receipts have been issued for taxes for the year 1944 than for the same period the previous year. It is revealed by records of County Tax Collector Jno. D. Jinkins, who explains that this means 1,000 more persons are paying taxes on property in Seminole County than heretofore.

The total amount of County and School taxes assessed in Seminole County for the year 1944 is \$249,423.04. Collections amount to \$193,771.00, or a total accounted for of \$334,438.00, which is a little more than 97 1/2 percent.

3,000 Violators Of Price Control Are Revealed To Bureau; May Be Prosecuted

WASHINGTON, May 14, (AP)—Ration-point harassed housewives today had more worries about lard, shortening, cooking and salad oils. The OPA boosted their ration values six to ten points a pound. The OPA also disclosed a new drive on black market operators. The names of more than 3,000 price violators have been turned over to the Bureau of International Revenue and more are to be added, the OPA said.

Following needs of liberated peoples, plus the growing threat of black markets, are putting the war's heaviest strains on the rationing and price control system.

Many officials are frankly worried. Some fear the curbs may not be able to meet the tests as European necessities cut further into American supplies. Some predict more drastic control measures will be required. A few go so far as to say it may become necessary for the government to take over the food distribution system.

(Continued From Page One) Minister Churchill pledged Britain to fight beside the United States against Japan.

The Manhattan spread, not only for such leading Nazis as Heinrich Himmler, Joachim von Ribbentrop, but other war criminals. It was reported that Himmler's capture had not been confirmed at Allied headquarters.

The twelfth Army announced the capture of Col. General Heinz Guderian, the German tank expert and former chief of the Nazi General staff. He was a leading general in Polish, French, and eastern front campaign.

LONDON, May 14. (AP)—Prime Minister Churchill revealed last night in a victory review that the Germans had hoped to wreck London last year with secret super-sonic missiles and at the same time have bitterly denounced the Eire government of Eamon de Valera for imperiling Britain in her darkest hour of the war.

Signifying his intention to remain at the head of the government, and not to be "put out to grass," Churchill said that much remained to be done in Europe if some other form of totalitarianism is not to replace the destroyed armed might of Germany.

And beyond all, he said, "there is a Japan," whom Britain is bound by her ties with the U. S. and the Empire to fight to the finish.

He gave no hint that he might soon dissolve the coalition parliament to pave the way for a general election, although he had been generally expected to do so.

A great part of Churchill's 2500-word speech was devoted to a sweeping review of the desperate struggle to final victory in Europe and praise for the Allied arms which brought it about.

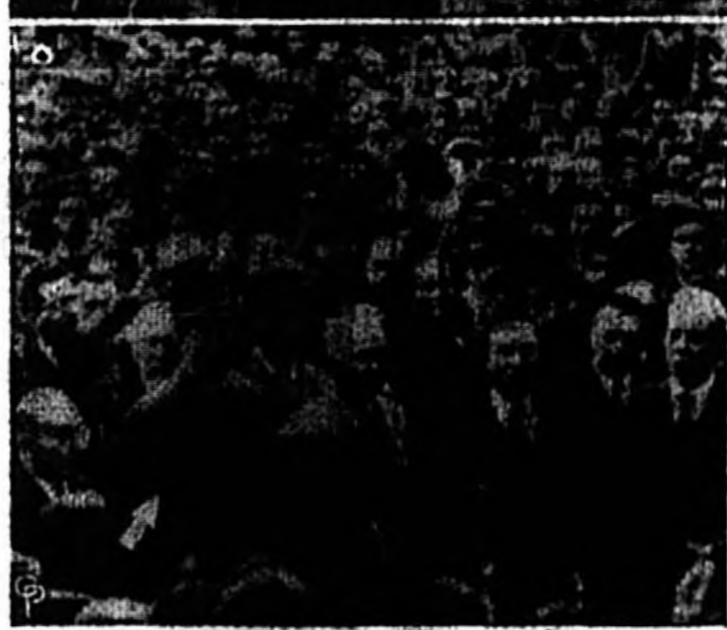

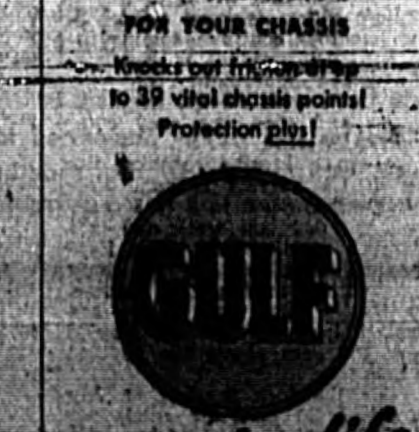

Truman Is The First Veteran Of World War I To Sit In White House

It has taken exactly 27 years for World War I to produce a President of the United States about twice as long as any other war in American history.

Harry S. Truman, first U.S. vice-president since Theodore Roosevelt, is also the first World War I veteran in the White House.

America's 14 other military Presidents from one to 14 years after the close of the war in which they served. Zachary Taylor was nominated for the Presidency within a month after his victory at Buena Vista in the Mexican War. Andrew Jackson entered the White House 14 years after the War of 1812.

Although almost half of the Presidents have worn an Army uniform along the road to the White House, the highest office in the land never has been held by a naval officer. The majority of the military Presidents have been generals; nine held that rank and built their political success on military achievement. In addition there have been one lieutenant, one colonel, one captain and two majors—McKinley and Truman. Truman saw some of World War I's fiercest fighting in the St. Mihiel and Meuse-Argonne offensives.

Great Mixers
 The mixing of military and political careers, is a well-established custom in U.S. Presidential history, dating to George Washington, who was commander-in-chief of the Continental Army, began service at the age of 21, just before the French and Indian War. He was a lieutenant colonel in a Virginia regiment, and later was an official member of General Braddock's staff. Washington was promoted to colonel after distinguishing himself at the famous ambush on the Monongahela.

After Washington's Presidency there was an interval of ten years before the next military man, James Monroe, went into the White House. Monroe was a lieutenant in the War of Independence, but ended military service when he went back to studying law in 1780.

Instructions Given On Feeding Baby

Dr. CHARLOTTE ADAMS, Associated Press Food Editor, says you are one of those young mothers who finds the mechanics of preparing the baby's food and the actual process of feeding him a chore? Do you feel as though it were just a more thing to do—the point where you sometimes wonder why you stand him, even though you love him very dearly? Take heart!

The question of what your baby shall eat, how much, and how often is the business of your doctor. No layman could, or should, advise you on such matters. But work efficiently in her kitchen, and especially one who has children of her own, can perhaps give you some tips on procedure that you've never thought of, joggled down as you are by all these new and important techniques.

Schedule For Mama

In the first place, just as your baby is brought on a schedule, you should have one for yourself. You're not going to be dependent on him, and this will be written down on paper—by you, instead of the doctor. You'll be surprised how much easier it is to get through all your household tasks when once you've thought them through and set them down. In the kitchen, fix a place

where all the utensils which are used in preparing the baby's food are kept. It should be convenient to the work surface where you put the formula together, or puree the vegetables, or whatever else you have to do preparatory to his feeding. Until a child eats precisely what the rest of the family does, it only adds to your burden to mix his special cooking utensils, in with those of the rest of the household.

Be sure, in working out your time schedule, to set a time for preparing formula when you've cleaned up the rest of the kitchen completely. It will go much faster if you haven't a sink and work surface cluttered with dirty pots and pans.

Menu For Baby

If your baby has reached the age when he eats vegetables and other solid foods, try to make what you buy for him fit into the family menu as far as you can. When his schedule calls for peas or beans, carrots or beets buy an ample quantity for all to eat, and cook just a little for him at his mealtime.

Do not cook all the peas at once, in time for his dinner, and then warm up those for the family at night. Vitamins are lost in the warming-up process, as are taste and appearance. The little bit of time you'll save by cooking them all at once is not worth the price in food value.

Another time and labor saver for the mother of a toddler is a good big square of oil cloth to

put under the high chair or little table and chair to catch all inevitable spills. (And they are many!)

Remember that to learn to feed a self is a very difficult process and spills and food all over the face are a necessary part of it. If the mess he must make in learning is easily cleaned you will be far more relaxed about it and that means he will learn more easily—and everybody concerned will have a better time. There's no more fun than eating. Let your child learn that early.

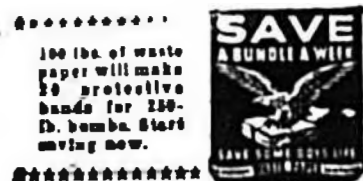

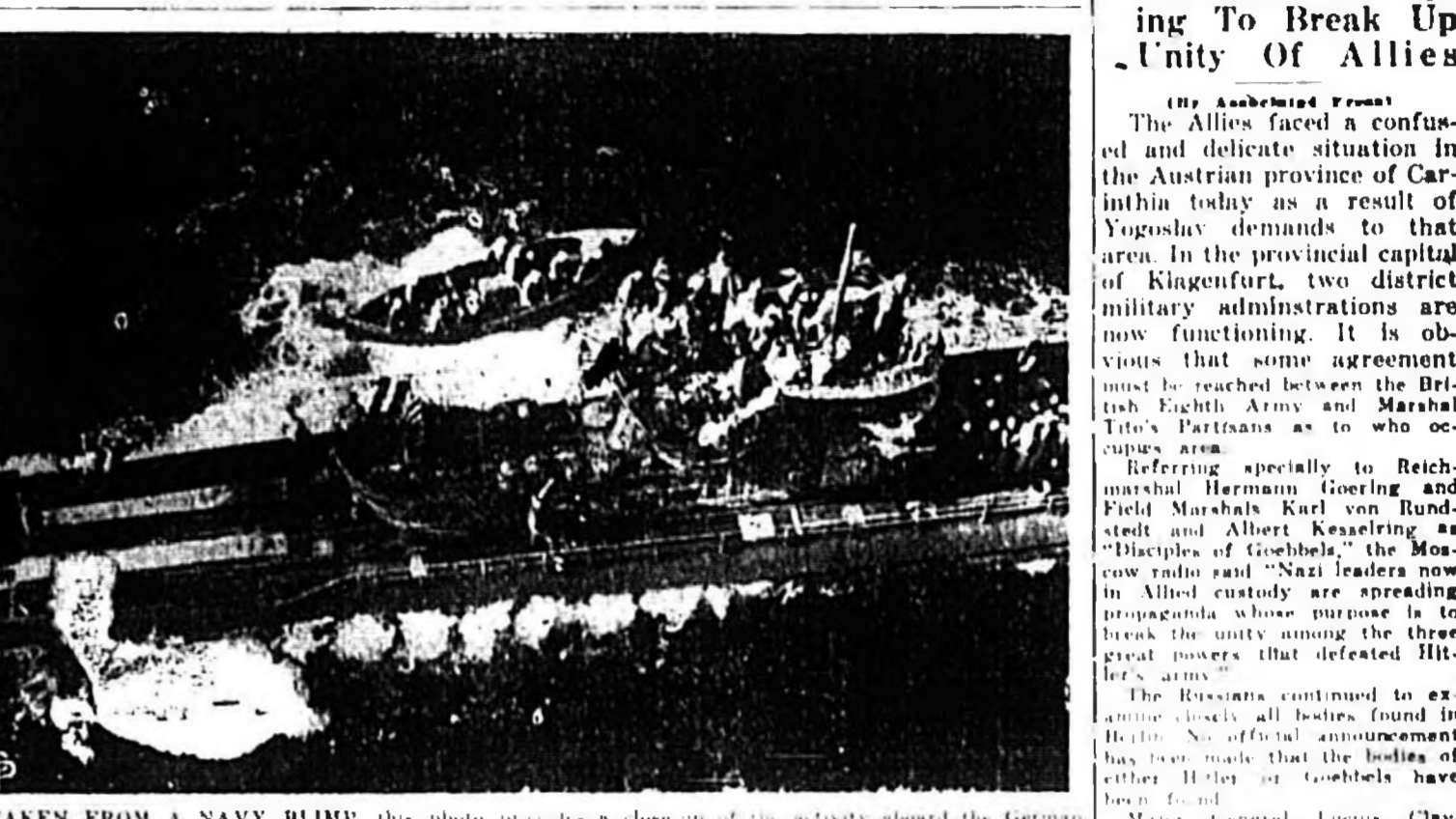
