





WEALTHY PLAYBOY'S HOME WHERE ACTRESS





Buddy Lake To Pitch Final Game Of Year

Bonner, Maxwell, McCrone To Be Honored

Buddy Lake, who pitched the Sanford Herald's brilliant 4-1 victory over Leesburg here last Sunday, will show his warlike prowess in the final game of the season on Tuesday afternoon. He will face the Cocoa Indians who, because of a 2-1 victory over Leesburg yesterday, are favored to win the second half championship of the year for the Florida League.
