Act is Amended Sanford City Commission, faced with last night amended the recently passed city ordinance on garbage pickups to allow back-

yard refuse collection for those residents willing to pay an extra 50 cents a month. By a three-two vote, the commission mended its ordinance, which had been scheduled for a second reading, and voted to allow those persons opposing the change to curb pickups to retain the backyard collection provided they come to the city hall and sign a request for the service and agree to pay a \$2.50 monthly refuse bill, instead of the \$2 a month bill to be paid by those persons who continue to carry the refuse to the street.

On a motion by Commissioner Thomas Mc Donald, seconded by Commissioner J. A Crapps and with Mayor Lee P. Moore casting the tie-breaking vote, the commission approved the change, which will now require that a new city ordinance be drawn exempting those residents paying the extra fee from hav ing to "tote" their refuse cans to the curb.

While on the way to the hospital there are certain steps that could be taken by almost anyone that could be the difference between the victim living or becoming one of the 10 who will die of snakebite this year. Here again this is the method

The pext action to take is to place a constricting band above the bite. This should be tight enough to stop blood flow from the surface vessels only and not arterial flow. After the constrictor is in place, a cut should be made into each fang mark. The cut should be at least 4" to 4" deep or enough

as possible. This can be done several ways. The suction devices with the mouth. The only danger is if there are open sores in the mouth it could cause problems. There is no danger if the venom is swollowed. If the swelling moves up to the constricting band then the band should be moved up and new cuts above but in line with the first cuts. This procedure should be maintained until the hospital personnel take over. The bite from a poisonous reptile can be painful and very frightening but if no one panics there is no need to die from one, believe me I know this from first hand experience.







Two of Seminole County's scenic waterways are under consideration for designation as official canoe trails, it was learned from Ney Landrum, director of the parks and recreation division, State Department of Natural Resources, at Tallahassee, in a telephone interview. The information came to light after the State Cabinet declared the Withlacoochee River in North Florida as the state's first official canoe

Under consideration for possible inclusion in the canoe trail system are the Wekiva and Big Econlockhatchee Rivers, both of which originate in Orange County and empty into the St. Johns River, the Big Econ near the Mims bridge and the Wekiva north

(The question of the spelling of "Wekiwa" arose again. Landrum said it should be "Wekiwa Springs" and "Wekiva River." William Bush, Seminole County engineer, said it is "Wekiwa" River from the headwaters to Sanlando Springs and "Wekiva" River from there to the St. Johns River.)

Landrum said the Big Econ and the Wekiva could be designated officially as "state canoe trails" within two to four months. He said at the beginning they will be identified and marked for canoeists and later will have loading facilities and rest areas installed. Periodic inspections will be made to insure navigability. Powered watercraft will not be barred from the Salt Springs Run in Ocala National Forest also is

included in the study. Objective is to pick some of Florida's "smaller, more scenic rivers" for canoe trails. They would offer potential for combination with other forms of outdoor recreation, such as fishing, swimming and camping.
