Retail Food Prices

Show Moderate Increases

WASHINGTON (AP) - Retail food prices have moderated more than expected and consumers may see only slight increases at least through midyear, according to the Agriculture Department.

Instead of going up 1 per cent during the first three months of 1976 as USDA experts had been predicting since last fall, food prices held steady, Don Paarlberg, USDA director of economics, said Wednesday. That meant, on the average, that consumers paid about the same for food as they did in the final quarter of 1975.

Further, Paarlberg said, food prices may only "in crease slightly" in the second quarter of this year. He said the leveling off in the first three months was due to "unexpected gains in meat supplies," which dampened over-all grocery cost increases.

According to USDA records, the January-March leveling off was the first on a quarterly basis since the price index dropped slightly from the third to the fourth

Paarlberg cautioned that "some seasonal price increases" are expected in the coming months for fruits, vegetables and coffee. Also, he said, the farm price of livestock is expected to go up.

Frank Epp Gots Fired

WASHINGTON (AP) - Question No. 8 on the government form asked if he knew of any espionage activities on the part of a foreign government. James F. Sattler, a political scientist working in Washington for a foreign relations think tank, said yes - that he was an East

Sattler encountered Question No. 8 as he registered March 23 with the Justice Department as a person who acts on behalf of a foreign government. Such registrations are routine, required of lobbyists or others who are hired to represent foreign countries. But Sattler's reply to question No. 8 on the registration form was not routine. Last Friday, after his employer learned of his answer to question No. 8, Sattler was fired.

Reagan Speech Successful

WASHINGTON (AP) - Ronald Reagan's national television address may have been a failure in the ratings,





Trade Quotas Are No Answer

During a recent speech in Chicago, Ill., Assistant Secretary of Treasury David R. Mc-Donald said that economic protectionism is a "lagging economic indicator." The urge to protect our markets from foreign competition begins to take place about half a year after a downturn in the

If that is the case the pressures for protectionism that are evident in the United States adhere to a different calendar or have yet to take their cue. Nearly all of the economic signs in the United States are showing a steady improvement. Additionally, the United States finished 1975 with a record \$11 billion surplus of exports over imports Nevertheless, the Treasury Department, pursuant to its authority under trade acts, is sifting through some 30 allegations by U.S. industries ranging from stainless steel flatwear manufacturers to mushroom packers, that they need protection from is dedicated to turning America into a fascist

And the International Trade Commission - the former Tariff Commission — has recommended to President Ford that he slap tariffs as high as 35 per cent on imported shoes. (The tariffs now average about 11 per cent.) Earlier, the commission recommended that the President establish quotas on stainless steel and tool steel products. Under provisions of the 1974 Trade Act the President can accept or reject the commission's recommendations. Congress has 30 days to alter any decision that the President makes.

The timing of the commission's decision is unfortunate because the protectionism issue is politically flammable — and the political arena is not the place where it can be discussed calmly. President Ford is temporarily defusing the political explosiveness by asking Japan and European nations to curtail certain steel imports.

However, even this action runs counter to the prevailing policy of the United States that free trade is to everyone's advantage. The proof is visible in the 20 years between 1950 and 1970, a period of declining tariffs. During the same period world trade rose from \$60 billion to \$300 billion. The United States has captured its share of the trade. translating it into industrial and technological growth and jobs.


Generally, protectionists argue that the higher tariffs are needed to save jobs. However, it is noteworthy that while shoe manufacturers say that they need to decrease the flow of shoes from Italy, Spain, Brazil and Taiwan, shoe retailers are saying that the American industry is expanding - and that shoe stores will lay off employes if imports are curbed. Of one thing there is no doubt. Shoes would cost more if foreign competition is stifled.

Other consequences of protectionism are evident. Our trading partners in Europe and Asia already are accusing the United States of applying a thin veneer of free trade rhetoric over a hard core of market protection. FALL CITY, Wash. (AP) -Albert Teller says he never had a blast he was completely hap-

But he admits to getting a kick out of blowing up things right next to expensive equipment. "Now those blasts are exciting - not spectacular, just a challenge."

Teller, 51, has spent the last 18 years blowing things up. Recently he graduated the first six students from his blasting school, which he says is the only one of its type in the nation, possibly in the Western Hemisphere.

There were no fireworks to mark the first ceremonies, bu for finals students blasted several thousand tons of rock from a quarry.

The students come from all over the nation for the class, costs \$850. A student must be spensored by a company and get Teller's personal approval. "I don't want someone coming on here saying and want to be powder men. I want thinkers and planners," he said.

To Teller, blasting is an art and must be approached as such. "I've never had a blast I was completely satisfied with. There is always something wrong with it." He got into blasting in the
