

"Well, if you want to do some-thing so d-n bad, go out and get Caruso to write us a song," said his boss, one morning. About a week later, to the aston-


ishment of everyone, Carroll walked in with the only song Caruso had ever written. It was the musical "scoop" of





Conversation Results In Way For Jenner To Conduct His Experiments With Cowpox; Modern Methods Are Result

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. Mar. 10.

—(P)—The method of preventing smallpox through vaccination started in 1796 as the result of a conversation between Jenner and a dairy maid, according to Dr. F. A. Brink, director of the bureau of communicable diseases of the state board of health, writing in the monthly bulletin of that organization.

Best obtainable records show, Dr. Brink writes, that in 1796 a dairy maid told Jenner that she could catch the smallpox as she had already had the cowpox Jen-

The physician first transferred cowpox vaccine material from the hand of the dairy maid to the arm of a boy," the article continues, "A typical case of cowpox followed. Six weeks later the boy was inoculated with smallpox and it did NOT take. Subsequently, a group of people, some who had had cowpox and some who had not, were inoculated with smallpox. Those persons who had had cowpox were found to be immune to smallpox. "That was in 1796, one hundred and thirty years ago, little was known then about germs, asepis and surgical cleanliness. Disease producing germs were sometimes ner then made a study of cowpox.
