Summary Of Crop Damage Is Released

Federal Marketing Service Says Nearly All Tender Vegetables Destroyed

Government Aid Efforts Continue

Texas Also Suffers Heavily In Unpre- cedented Cold Wave

Practically all tender vegetable crops in Florida were destroyed and while the damage to citrus was believed severe in nearly all areas the full extent of the damage from the 11-day cold wave cannot be determined for several days yet, according to a summary of the freeze damage released today by the Agricultural Marketing Service of the United States Department of Agriculture.

Texas, Alabama and Tennessee crops were also hard hit by the cold-freezing temperatures which gripped the South for more than a week, the Bureau reports.

Meanwhile, efforts are continuing in Washington to mobilize all agencies which can aid those who have been thrown out of work as a result of the freeze and farmers who have been made nearly destitute through the loss of their crops.
