Federal Marketing Service Says Nearly All Tender Vegetables Destroyed

Government Aid **Efforts** Continue

Texas Also Suffers Heavily In Unprecedented Cold Wav

Practically all tender veg etable crops in Florida were lestroyed and while the damage to citrus was believed severe in nearly all damage from the 11-day cold wave/cannot be determined for several days yet, accord-

for several days yet, according to a summary of the freeze damage released today by the Agricultural Marketing service of the United States Department of Agriculture.

Texas, Alshama and Tennessee crops were also hard hit by the sub-freezing temperatures which gripped the South for more than a week, the Bureau reports.

Meanwhile, efforts are continning in Washington to mobilize all agencies which can aid those who have been thrown out of work as a result of the freeze and farmers who have been made nearly destitute through the loss of their crops.
