

"The great bulk of Lend-Lease foods which we shipped in 1942 was made up of pork, milk products, edible fats and oils, and aggs," Stettinius discloses. "Is 1942 we shipped 1,112,000,000 pounds of pork to our Allies. That was 10 percent of our American aupply, and is a really big bits of pork."

Stettinius reports that we Lend-Leased 23 percent of our condensed and evaporated milk, I percent of our butter, 10 percent of our eggs, 7 percent of our risk, and about I percent of our vegetables and fruits. All the butter went to the Russian army. "Why such luxury for the Russian army?" Stettinius asks. "The I percent of our butter (17,000, 000 pounds) would permit each of 8,000,000 Russian soldiers, fighting the bloodiest battles in history, to have American butter on his black bread once a week, instead of lard or lineed oll. That is not luxury."

All told, Stettinius reports, we shipped to our Allies in 1942 "least than 6 percent by value of our total food supply, but still it was a great amount, and was of incalculable value to our hard, pressed Allies in a critical year, Stettinius warns that the armed forces and Lend-Lease may each take about twice as much food in 1943 as they did in 1942, but adds that Americans will still have the most nutritious diet of any people in the world.

"While this may not seem like a staggering sum in the light of subsequent Congressional appropriations, it means that America had an airplane industry built up and operating when she realised her peril—an industry that would have taken a much longer time to build up, had it not been for Britain's earlier assistance".


