The world's first scheduled airline service orginated on January 1, 1914, with the inaugural flight from St. Peteraburg to Tampa by the St. Petersburg - Tamps Airboat Line, Piloting the sturdy Benoist Airboat across Tampa Bay on that first flight was pioneer aviator, Tony Janzus. From that day, and for the next four months, the little airline, which later added a second plane, prospered and met its twice-a day schedule without accident or injury.

The snub - nosed airboats were constructed by Tom Benelet at his St. Louis sireraft company specifically for use on the airline that Benoist founded

C. Burrell Tibbs, a youth of 14 years, worked with Benoist in developing the historic Airboat. Today, at 64, Tibbs is supervising and ram-rodding construction of the new model, 50 years Tibbs has distinguished himself in aviation felt. and is a well-known pioneer figure the nation over.

## **Roumillat Commended**

When Sanford attorney Kariyle Housholder became president of the Seminole County Chamber of Commerce for 1964, he stepped into what many believe to be one of the most important jobs anyone in this county will fill during the year.

For the man who turned over the president's gavel to Housholder led the chamber through one of its most ambitious years. That man was Francis E. Roumillat Jr., a local druggist, who freely gave of his time and talent in leading the chamber through the highly productive year of 1963.

The first of the many important developments to come during Roumillat's administration was the opening of the new 100.000 square-foot HLH Products plant for the processing of vegetables. This \$1 mil-Hon-plus industrial plant became the largest individual structure for industry ever built in Seminole. In addition, the H. L. Hunt Company purchased 600 acres to be developed into the Sanford Industrial Park. One 80,000 square-foot speculative building has already been construct-

Following the opening of the Hunt plant, Alix's new, modernistic plant was formally opened for the manufacture of swimsuits and sportswear.

A huge celebration commemorating the founding of Seminole County 50 years ago was held in April after six month of carefully and auccessiful planning by a committee headed by George Touhy. The allday event was attended by the largest crowd ever to be assembled in one place in the county.

The members of the countywide committee who planned the calebration left a tremendous challenge ot those who will be trying to surpass this year's semi-centennial event when the county observes its 100th birthday in the year 2013.

All of these events were followed by the chamber sponsored pipeline from Lake Monroe to the Sanford Naval Air Station, and the establishment of the Sanford Naval Academy- private school for boys.

On the surface, neither of the two projects just listed appear to have been controversial. However, numerous complications developed that required the coordinating efforts of the Chamber to reach the successful conclusions which finally materialized.

This undoubtedly was the great-est challenge the shamber ever fac-ed. Due to the fine work of this chamber committee Seminole approaches the State Board of Control Meeting in Tallahasses, Jan. 10, with two of the three sites remaining under consideration. The success of this committee can be attributed to the careful planning of the members, their perseverance, and the cooperation of all of the county's public officials,

Because of the scope of the work of the university site location committee, the work carried on by the Armed Forces, Industrial, Airport and Long Range Planning committees was overshadowed.

For example, there is the cham-ber sponsored metropolitan telephone service that, if approved, will unite the county more closely by providing communications without toll charges. This committee, under the chairmanship of Clifford McKibbin and Rep. Davis, plans to culminate their erforts late this month.

The initial Seminole industrial show, under the chairmanship of Scott Burns was such a huge success that this will be a planned program each year. Between 85 and 40 business and industrial firms participated in the event.

Last, but certainly not least, the 1963 Legislature created the St. Johns-Indian River Canal District with authority under the Act to build a canal linking the two waterways. The District is comprised of Seminole, Brevard, Orange and Vol-usia counties. The district obtained \$40,000 from the State Internal Improvement Fund and has completed preliminary engineering and survey design. This, of course, is the result of many years of work by the chamber.

This report of Roumillat's year of leadership could not be complete without reporting the tremendous increase in inquiries resulting from the chamber's expanded activities during 1963. This has required the replacement of practically all mailing pieces used in its promotional program. Sometimes, requests for information about Seminole total
