We Never Close

Will Sanford and Seminole County schools be putting up signs, "we never close," like the ones you see in all-night diners? The sign may be a far-fetched idea, but a year-around school term could become a reality here in a future not too distant. Even after floating a giant bond issue to expand schools, Seminole County people find our physical school plants below par, not modern enough, and too crowded still for our growing population and ever-increasing atudent load.

It is no wonder, then, that there is some talk about the year-around school plan. Such a plan, with numerous variations, is being adopted in other parts of the country to solve school over-crowding, and to make the fullest use of the physical plants of schools already there.

In our opinion, a full schedule isn't feasible here because of summer heat and humidity. Not yet, anyway. It maybe, of course, when school buildings are fully air conditioned. Parents and school officials ought to be working toward that end, because sooner or later a yeararound school term (with vacations staggered), is going to come about, here and elsewhere.

Those who have students in the Florida universities are familiar with the new "trimester" system of scheduling. Under this plan, the full college year is divided into three periods of four months each, Each period is a full semester; and since a full college program is made up of eight semesters, the trimester system allows a student to finish college in less than three calendar years; that is, if he elects to stay with it and move that fast.

From reading other papers, we learn that some secondary and even elementary schools are adopting similar plans in the North, Educators in some cities have found this preferable to the "double session" when the school is obliged to run two identical sessions, one in the morning and another in the afternoon.

It is too early to come up with a definite plan here-but all parents, taxpavers and interested citizens might well "bone up" with some serious study about what scheduling is best for the youngsters.




