BOOST IN FOREIGN TRADE SOUGHT BY HERBERT HOOVER

Details Of Expansion Plans To Increase Trade Beyond \$10,000,000,000 Are Made Public By Cabinet Official

WASHINGTON, Mar. 12. (INS)—A smashing drive to boost America's foreign trade over the \$10,000,000,000 mark annually has been launched by Secretary of Commerce Hoover.

Forecasting exports of close to \$3,000,000,000 and imports of about \$4,000,000,000 in 1927, the commerce department today announced details of an expansion program to further stimulate both foreign and domestic business.

New foreign trade posts were announced tentatively in the following cities:

Oslo, Norway, Bern, Switzerland, Winnipeg, Canada, Caracas, Venezuela, and Wellington, N. Z.

New domestic district offices will be established in Los Angeles, Norfolk, Va., Wilmington, Del., Mobile, Ala., Jacksonville, Fla., and Kansas City.

With establishment of the new posts and others in the far east, Latin America and Europe, now under consideration, the United States will have a net work of foreign trade offices extending to virtually every quarter of the globe. These "outputs of trade" are charged with keeping American manufacturers and exporters in touch with the demands of every market, thus furnishing outlets for surplus goods to form a general prosperity stabilizer.

In addition to the new posts the department plans an increase in the commercial staffs in the important offices at London, Genoa, Rome, Buenos Aires and other capitals. Where the posts are located in national capital the appointments will rank as commercial attaches; otherwise as trade commissioners.

Hoover will select a number of commodity commissioners to operate abroad with a view of special studies of the important articles of foreign trade. The plan will apply to both the market for American articles abroad and to raw materials and commodities of foreign production essential to American industry. An additional \$12,000 was provided by Congress for these investigations.

On the Leon county bridge, the apparent low bidders are as follows:

Concrete construction, Peterson and Earnhart of Montgomery, \$31,611.88.

Treated timber construction, Stevenson engineering and contracting company of St. Augustine, \$13,488.

Cypress timber construction, Stevenson engineering and contracting company of St. Augustine, \$12,492.

On the Jefferson county bridge project, the apparent low bidders are as follows:

Concrete construction, Peterson and Earnhart, \$24,916.52.

Treated timber construction, Stevenson engineering and contracting company, \$10,068.

Cypress timber construction, Stevenson engineering and contracting company, \$9,312.

Judge Hartdridgels To Preside In Palm Beach County Court

TALLAHASSEE, Fla., Mar. 12. (INS)—A. G. Hartdridgels, Judge of the Criminal Court of Record of Palm Beach County, being technically disqualified to sit in the State's cases against Thomas H. Cook, Ralph Payne, Lester Williams, Adrian E. Pearson, and Benjamin R. Clayton, Governor John W. Martin has assigned Judge James M. Peeler of the Duval County Criminal Court of Record to preside in his stead at West Palm Beach beginning Mar. 21.

Judge Hartdridgels was assigned to preside over the Criminal Court of Record of Dade County in place of Judge Tom Norfleet, who is disqualified to hear the case of the State versus J. Peterson and State versus Charles C. Braham at Miami during the week of Mar. 21.

In the absence of Judge James M. Peeler from his bench in the Criminal Court of Record of Duval County during the time he conducts the cases in Palm Beach County, Governor Martin has assigned Judge Hartdridgels to preside in his stead.

St. Johns Bond Issue Ruled Void By Court

TALLAHASSEE, Fla., Mar. 12. The bond issue of \$250,000 for special school district number 1, St. Johns County, passed in April of last year, has been declared "wholly void" by the state supreme court.

The declaration came when the state supreme court reversed the decision of the circuit court of St. Johns County in the case of Charles Weinberger versus the board of instruction of St. Johns County. The opinion is written by Justice Louis W. Strum, Justice James B. Whitfield concurring.

Brown To Be Taken To Jail In DeLand

TALLAHASSEE, Fla., Mar. 12. (INS)—Commissioner of Agriculture Nathan Mays, who is also head of the state prison department, today ordered Sheriff S. E. Stone of Volusia county to take Charles Brown, alias Charles Piselli, from the state prison farm to the county jail in Volusia county to await proper sentence.

Brown was convicted of slaying Howard D. Usher, Daytona Beach taxicab driver.
