26,856 Students Enrolled 32 Schools Open Tuesday

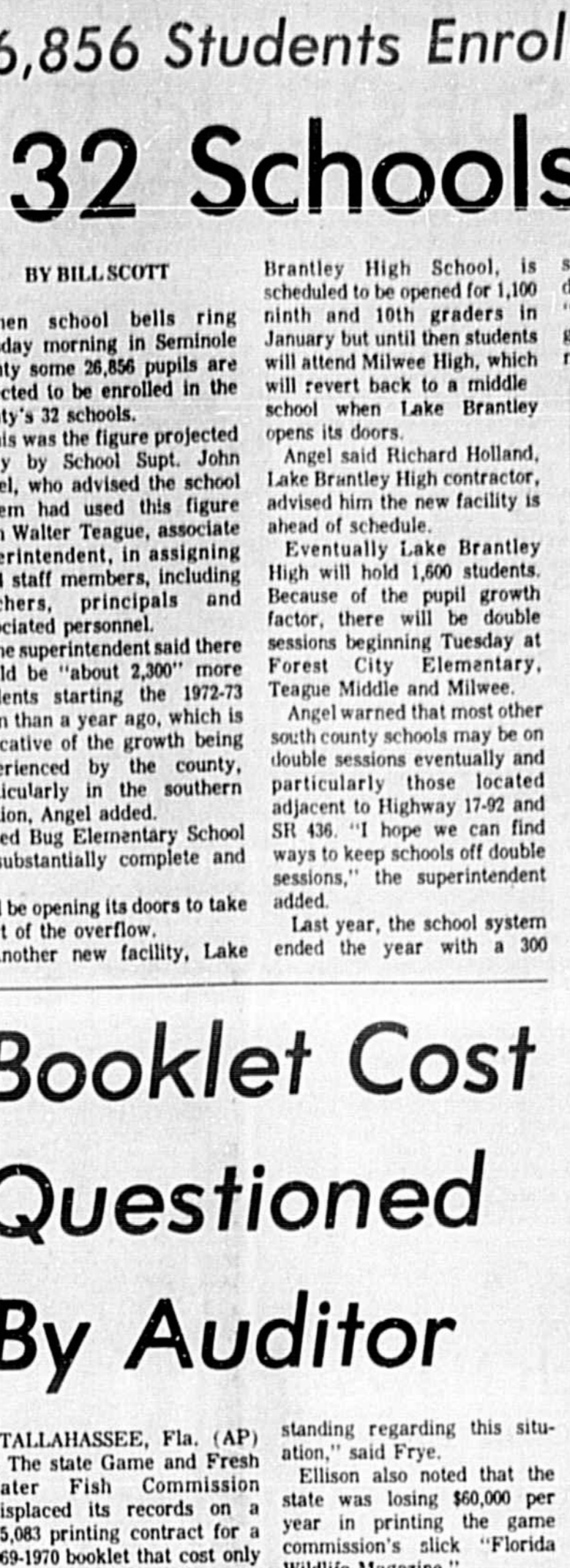

By PAT LEISNER Associated Press Writer ORLANDO, Fla. (AP)—Once a 70-company conglomerate, the business empire of Florida's Glenn W. Turner today numbers only 10 firms, a company inventory shows.

Mother 'Sad' For Families

DUNEDIN, Fla. (AP) — The mother of an American prisoner of war promised freedom by his North Vietnamese captors says she is still sad because "every mother and family doesn't have the same good news."

And Mrs. Gerald Gartley has vowed to continue her crusade to "end the slaughter in Southeast Asia so all prisoners of war can be reunited with their families."

The North Vietnamese have promised to free her son, Navy Lt. (j.g.) Markham Ligon Gartley, 28; Navy Lt. (j.g.) Norris Alphonso Charles, whose parents live in Tampa; and Air Force Maj. Edward Knight Elias, 34, of Valdosta, Ga.

Mrs. Gartley, a Dunedin school teacher, said after learning the news Saturday that her son "is a political pawn" and promised to continue her efforts "to bring about a real concerted effort of the American people to end the war."

"I want them to realize the prisoners won't be released until the war is over," she said. "But the war will not ever end as long as we insist on staying until the South Vietnamese could as President Nixon said, 'huck it alone.'"

Damage Is Extensive Vandals 'Smash' Teague

School maintenance personnel and teachers may have to work into tonight to restore a semblance of order to the chaos created at Teague Middle School when vandals entered the year-old 6-8 grade facility some time during the weekend and ransacked the almost new facility.

According to reports from county investigators called to the scene early this morning after maintenance workers engaged in restoring the school for Tuesday classes, discovered the facility had been literally wrecked.

All fire extinguishers were ripped from the walls and their contents sprayed over the area; books and magazines in the school library

The Herald dispatched its photographers to the Teague Middle School to record the acts of vandalism. One of the many photos taken is shown on page 2A of today's edition, with more to be shown in Tuesday's edition of The Herald.

Desks were overturned and thrown to the floor and into trash cans. The science classroom was completely ransacked with materials scattered onto the floor.

Teachers' investigators, including an identification officer and Det. Robert Kunkler, were dispatched to the scene soon after the report was called into the sheriff's office.

A plexiglass window leading to the outside was found broken, leading investigators to believe the vandals may have used this as a means of entering.

Teague principal William (Bud) Lauer was on the scene this morning checking the extent of the school damages and was unavailable for comment on the amount of work to be done before the facility is opened tomorrow.

Fraud Indictment Hits Jerry Bross

An election slogan has led to an indictment charge of election fraud against Brevard County Solicitor Jerry Bross, a Republican candidate for Brevard-Seminole state attorney.

Bross has been using the slogan "Reelect Jerry Bross and his prosection team vote Jerry Bross for state attorney." This prompted incumbent

State Atty. Abbot Herring to request a grand jury indictment last Friday, saying the slogan gave the inference that Bross and not Herring was the incumbent. And this was, according to Herring, a violation of section 104.91, Florida statutes.

The indictment by a Brevard County grand jury came after both Herring and Bross as well as members of their campaign staffs had testified. Circuit Judge Clarence Johnson was handed the report by jury foreman James Brown and then ordered the indictment sealed until a special county prosecutor could be named to try the case.

Bross was formally arrested two hours later after Johnson had conferred with Court of Record Judge Anthony Hosemann Jr. and Titusville attorney William Taylorford was sworn as special solicitor. Later Bross was released on his own recognizance.

Bross says he will not work at his job as county solicitor until the matter is cleared up.

In FTU Sociology Class Deviants Bare Life To Students

Dr. William D. Allen, professor of sociology, is in his fourth year with Florida Technological University. The 48-year-old professor is a native of Evansville, Ind., and received his Ph.D. degree from the Ohio State University. He is married and the father of three children, a son, 20, and two daughters, ages 17 and 15. He has also taught at the Ohio State University, University of Texas and the University of South Florida.

When the subject, "Sociology of Deviant Behavior," was first introduced at FTU in the summer of 1971, Dr. Allen believed the course would be more viable and relevant if he could bring speakers to class who were considered by the larger segments of society to be deviant in their behavior. He was able to recruit a former drug user, a male homosexual, a female prostitute, and a former prostitute to speak to his class.

To discuss points made by the speakers in relation to their assigned readings and class lectures. Students, as well as members of the larger society, do not always concur on what is deviant behavior.

Dr. Allen made very effort to maintain the anonymity of his speakers. He accomplished this by not announcing in advance when they would speak, nor did he introduce them by name or in any other manner provide identifying information. Student attendance was optional when speakers were present. The professor also made every effort to recruit persons who were not only articulate, but whom he believed could relate well to the younger members of his class. He met with each speaker several days prior to their appearance before the class in order to get acquainted and to review materials for discussion.

There were no unfavorable comments from members of the class regarding the speakers, nor was there any unfavorable publicity from other sources. In view of all this, Dr. Allen decided to repeat the format again this year but to increase the number of speakers appearing before the class.

Deviance is always defined from the point of view of a particular normative structure, that is, a rule or standard of behavior which is considered to be acceptable within a given society at a given time. The same behavior may be acceptable in one society today and rejected in another society at the same time or the same behavior may be accepted in that society at a later time.

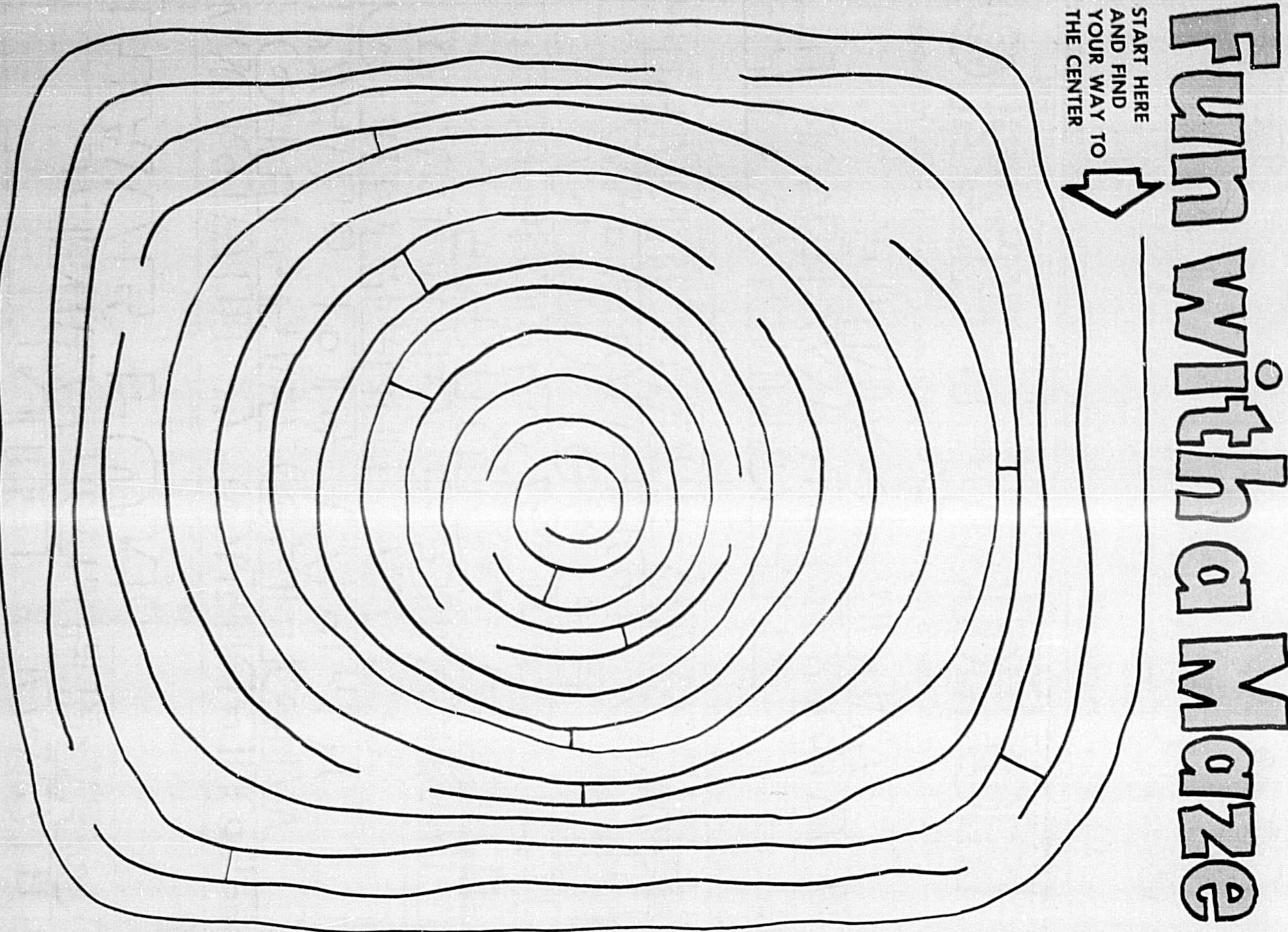
Dr. Allen cited two examples applicable to the United States. Alcohol is not considered to be deviant by the larger society since at least 90 million people drink, but alcoholism is considered deviant although only about 9 million people are diagnosed as alcoholics. Moreover, the larger, older segments of the population do not consider alcohol to be a drug, whereas, it is in fact a drug.

Abortions have been legal in Japan since 1948, but in the U.S. only four states have legal and liberalized abortion laws and these were enacted within the past two or three years. The Florida State Legislature rewrote the 104-year-old abortion law this year. Abortion is still considered to be deviant, but our normative system

toward this behavior is rapidly changing and by 2000 A.D. it will probably be just as acceptable as drinking milk.

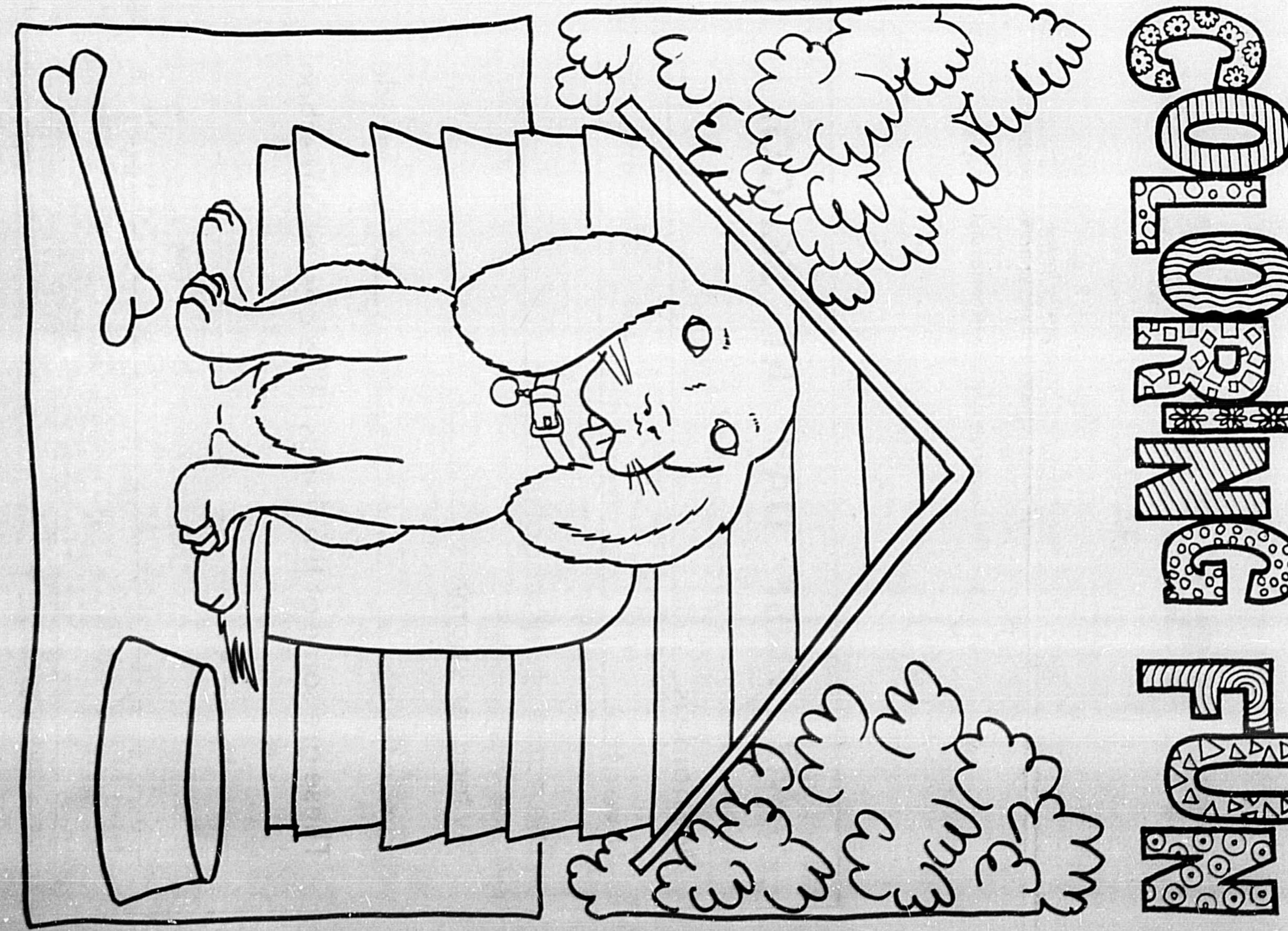
