Conference center agreement parked

SANFORD - An interlocal agreement between the county and city for a conference center is parked, at least temporarily, until the two sides can reach an agreement on how to handle parking.

The Sanford City Commission is seeking "wiggle room" on the second and third phases of the parking plan. Under the current agreement, the city would be responsible for about \$1.1 million in the second phase of surface parking, and an additional \$5 to \$6 million for a parking garage in phase three.

"We're still committed to doing the park-

Sanford wants to decide on parking before moving-forward with interlocal pact

ing," said Mayor Brady Lessard, "What we - Lessard said, want to ask the county is if we can get some leeway in the second and third phases."

Under the proposed interlocal agreement, which neither body has yet approved, the county would fund \$12 to \$15 million to build a conference center in downtown Sanford. The city would be responsible for all operational costs, estimated at \$400,000 per year, and would fund all parking improvements.

"The real stick in the mud is the parking,"

City Manager Tony VanDerworp agreed, saying, "We might not be able to deliver on

the phase two parking right away." Both Lessard and VanDerworp are pursuing federal dollars for parking, and Lessard noted that U.S. Rep. John Mica has already earmarked \$250,000 in federal assistance.

Commissioner Art Woodruff said he is concerned not only with finding money for parking, but how the city will pay the \$400,000 in operational costs. If built, the Sanford Civic Center would be demolished and the conference center constructed in its place, freeing up about \$150,000 used to operate the Civic Center. But that still leaves the city short by \$250,000.

"It hooks like we're throwing every dime we have, and a few that we don't have, to fund this thing," Woodruff said, noting the tight budget the city produced. "If we had to find \$400,000 in this year's budget, where would it come from? That concerns me."

City officials have said money for operational costs would be generated by a privately-owned hotel located next to the conference center. City Manager Tony

Commission discusses what to do with 17/92 By Dan Ping Editor

SANFORD -- With work already under way for the first phase of the Sanford Riverwalk, city officials are making preliminary plans for phase two. The major question: What to do with U.S. Highway 17/92?

Phase one of the Riverwalk encompasses the stretch of lakefront from Mellonville to French avenues. The city would like to extend the Riverwalk to Interstate 4. One obstacle, though, is that 17/92 uses the same 3.2 mile distance along Lake Monroe.

1,800 students attend SCC's Career Day

Imost 2,000 high school juniors gathered Tuesday at Seminole Community College's Sanford/Lake Mary campus to gain insight into the world of work.

The 1,800 Seminole students were participants in the 10th annual SCC Career Day, sponsored by SCC and Seminole County Public Schools. Professionals representing more than 60 different career fields met with the Hth-graders to discuss the skills and education needed for various professions.

If 17/92 were redirected, the lakefront road would become a city street, allowing for a wider Riverwalk with more amenities.

"It's a design issue," Van-Derworp said. "We could design parking into that stretch of road that would allow people to access the Riverwalk in those areas."

Work still remains on the proposal, VanDerworp said. None of the parties - city, county, state and federal - bave adopted the idea, and CR 15 would have to be improved, most likely to four lanes. Also, the current 17/92 roadbed needs repairs and risurfacing, and an agreement would have to be reached on who would pay for those improvements.

"This is still in the early stages, and we don't know yet what all the issues will be." VanDerworp said

City Commissioners were briefed on the proposal Monday and are expected to discuss the idea at their next meeting.

Should we blame ourselves for participating in such videos, for allowing our young boys and girls to watch this on TV, or for not protesting?


I feel so overwhelmed. Who do we blame? Where does it end? How do we stop this? NOT JUST BREASTS AND THIGHS IN BALTIMORE

Last night, the sound of mullet thrashing in the canal in my backyard was like a giant washing machine --- up and down the canal I could see the water chuming

Under my dock light there were thousands of finger mullet swimming in daisy chain patterns, round and round they were swimming.

Occasionally there would be a big splash as a Trout, Snook, Jack or Blue would destroy their parade as they captured a tastymullet and retreated to the darkness beyond the light. The lucky-

quickly return to their pattern of swimming in circles until the next intrusion by the hungry hunters.

These are the days and nights when you need to find time to visit New Smyrna Beach. Grab a rod, your cast net and get overhere. The fishing cannot be any better and the trophies are there. for the taking. Spinning rod, casting or fly rod, its your choice. A boat is great, but right now, you simply need to find the time to join the fun.

Last weekend a couple of friends called me Sunday morning, much later than usual, suggesting a trip offshore. With the

mullet who escaped would large swells and windy conditions, I suggested we take my 31fool vessel. Within just over an hour we pushed off my dock. with a livewell full of fat pinfishwhich they had caught the day. before. Our destination was the 28 fathom ledge about 37 to 40 miles offshore.

The "ledge" runs north and south along Florida's east coast and holds massive Grouper, Snapper and Jacks along with bait which attracts Dolphin, Wahoo and Sails and the list goes on. A good day on the ledge is one with little current which allows you to drop down those fat Pinfish with 12 to 20 ounces of lead in the hopes of catching our favorite, the Gray Grouper.

On our first drop we found the current to be minimal and that usually means a good trip. Suddenly, two of us hooked up at the exact same time. We looked at one another as we strained to hold on to whatever took our baits. At this moment your mind races as you battle what you know is a big fish. We shouted encouragement to each other as we fought to keep these

having bait cut and ready to throw out as chum to keep them interested while you switch rods. We always take along a couple

of spinning rods rigged with smaller hooks and a trace of wire. These outfits can be used for a drift line off the stern as you bottom fish or they can be quickly baited and used to cast out to circling fish.

I grabbed my flyrod while my two buddies used spinners. With our bottom rods still in the rod holders, we hooked three Dolphin at once and the real fun began. The largest was a bull of 20 pounds and the other two were 12 and 15 pounds.

The only fish to escape our gaff was the one I hooked on a fly. Each time I brought him to the boat he made another run, burning my hands as I tried to slow his escape by palming the spool. On the third run my knot separated where the flyline was joined to the backing. I watched in disbelief as the Dolphin headed east trailing my \$50 flyline behind him.

We kicked the engines in gear

line which was easy to follow. As the line came along side, I used the gaffed it and quickly took a triple wrap with the intention of fighting the frisky Dolphin by hand. He jumped several times like a wild horse at the end of a rope and eventually broke my leader and swam off with my favorite fly. At least I got my line back and reminded myself how important it is to retie old knots and check and recheck your equipment.





Eckstein disagreed, saying a request to put any issue on the balasked. lot would require commission approval. Approving a referendum is not the same as endorsing one position or another, he said.



ORLANDO -- Ryan Schneider passed for 287 yards and three touchdowns to lead UCF to a 28-17 Homecoming victory over Akron Saturday in Mid-American football action at the Citrus Bowl.

The win for the Golden Knights was a special one as it was UCF's first-ever home MAC victory.

UCF improved to 3-4 overall on the year and 2-2 in the MAC, while Akron dropped to 1-7 overall and 0-4 in the conference.

UCF took the opening kickoff and marched 71 yards in 11 plays to take a 7-0 lead. Junior quarterback Ryan Schneider threw a three-yard touchdown pass to senior tight end Mario Jackson for UCF's first scoring play of the game at the 10:35 mark in the first quarter. On the drive, Schneider was 5-for-7 for 53 yards to lead UCF on the scoring drive.

The Zips responded with an 11-play, 65-yard drive to cut the UCF lead to 7-3. Akron place-kicker Bill Sullivan connected on a 32yard field goal for the Zips' first points of the contest at the 8:23 mark in the first quarter.

Akron linebacker Chase Blackburn caught his first career interception on UCF's next drive to set up the Zips with excellent field position at the UCF 42. 




