Mrs. Leroy Broun of the Southern Society who has charge of the welcoming of wounded men, centering at the Hall of States, maintained by War Camp Community Service at 27 West 25th St., has appealed repeatedly for more volunteers from the states of Alabama, Arkansas, North Carolina, Florida, Georgia, Louisiana, Mississippi, Virginia, and West Virginia, and has a few representativer of some of these states picked as Chairmen for their own commonwealths, but she has not been able to find sufficient volunteers to take care of separate deaks for each state, as should be done in view of the great number of wounded men arriving here daily, sometimes to the number of 4,000 4n 24 hours

The Southern Society maintains at the Sewannee House, 134 East 56th St. a home center for the southern soldiers and times who are able to find their way there are entertained lavishly. The men who are unable to leave the hospitals or who have only a few days in the debarkation hospitals, however, are dependent for their welcome on letters sent by State committees in the Hall of States, and Mrs. Broun has been unable to recruit sufficient forces to write to all the southern men.
