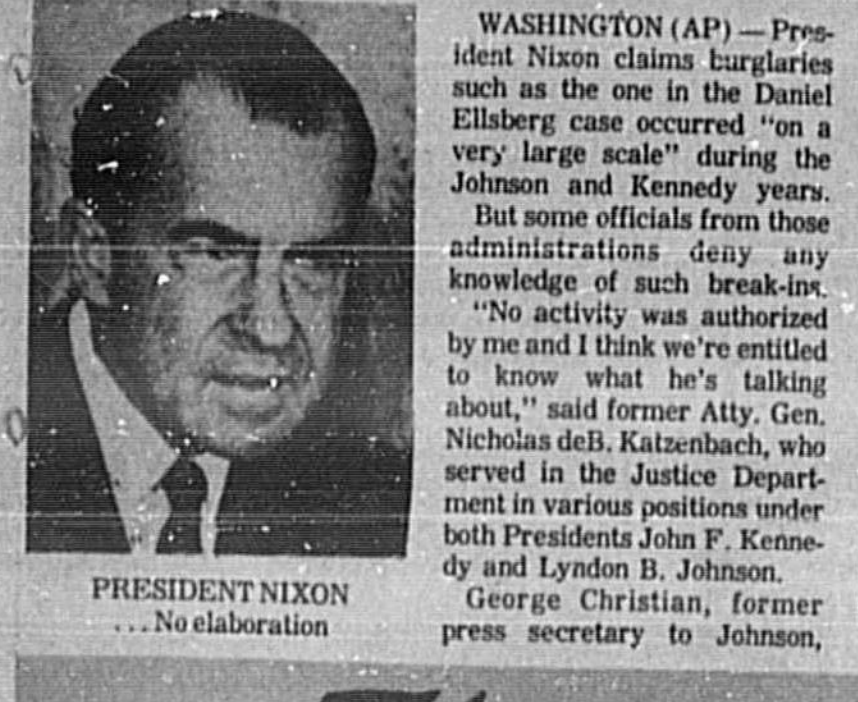

# Kennedy-Johnson 'Burglaries' Were 'Commonplace': Nixon



WASHINGTON (AP) — President Nixon claims burglaries such as the one in the Daniel Ellsberg case occurred "on a very large scale" during the Johnson and Kennedy years.

"No activity was authorized by me and I think we're entitled to know what he's talking about," said former Atty. Gen. Nicholas de Katsenbach, who served in the Justice Department in various positions under both Presidents John F. Kennedy and Lyndon B. Johnson.

George Christian, former press secretary to Johnson, said: "I don't know what he is talking about." Nixon, at his press conference Wednesday in San Clemente, Calif., said he believed the information "can only come from the White House."

Nixon last May, in a lengthy statement on Watergate, first mentioned that there may have been burglaries for national security purposes engaged in by the FBI during previous administrations.

But he also noted that under both Kennedy and Johnson, "surveillance of this type" took place "on a very large scale."

Nixon did not elaborate and Deputy Press Secretary Gerald L. Warren refused to give details.

In Washington, a Justice Department spokesman refused to confirm or deny that such burglaries had taken place in the past, saying the information "can only come from the White House."

Nixon's request for an investigation was refused to Atty. Gen. Elliot L. Richardson on Wednesday by White House Chief of Staff Alexander Haig, said a Justice Department spokesman in Washington.

The spokesman, John Hatcher, added that Richardson would take "every reasonable step" to plug the leaks.

WATERGATE WARNING — Said he considered that a directive to former acting FBI chief L. Patrick Gray III to investigate Watergate thoroughly was adequate response to the warning Gray said he gave the President in July 1972.

**3 Corpses Found In Altamonte**

At a stench-filled dump in Altamonte Springs Wednesday police uncovered the decomposed remains of at least three bodies — one of them a child — today confusion reigns about the exact number of corpses found in the open air graves and how long they had been there.

Seminole County Pathologist G. V. Garay today said his autopsies showed one of a child dead at least a year, and one of the other bodies was that of a young woman.

Garay said the bodies were so badly decomposed that his examinations will take several days to complete.

At one point, authorities were probing the possibility that a cemetery may have been disturbed because a ring found near one of the bodies had been cut in a manner similar to the way rings are cut at funeral homes.

Confusion on the count exists because they were "in such a bad state of decomposition and animals had scattered the remains over a large area."

Authorities have no clues as to the identities, but apparently have ruled out the possibility that the corpses — which were in the dump approximately a month — are those of a Daytona Beach couple missing since March.

According to authorities, the bodies were discovered by an Estoville man on Tuesday while he was dumping trash. But the man, whom they refused to name, waited until Wednesday to report the discovery because "he was afraid he'd get in trouble for dumping trash in an unauthorized area."

Police are currently checking all missing persons reports that have been filed and Sheriff John Polk has requested that any missing persons that have not been previously reported should be reported.

Among evidence uncovered, according to Polk, is an 18-carat gold ring with an inlaid birthstone.

Polk said the ring had been cut in a manner similar to the way in which a ring is cut at a funeral home when a person is buried wearing a ring.

Altamonte Springs Police are investigating, with cooperation from the Seminole Sheriff's Office.

# Sanfordians Reaction Split On President's Conference

Reactions among Downtown Sanfordians to President Nixon's Wednesday news conference are divided according to a Herald survey conducted this morning.

Those who are for the President, are for him all the way, and his answers at the press conference "do give us some good answers and I support him all the way," said Noah Booth.

"I thought he was most believable," said Mrs. Jean Tamm. "I don't think he should give up the tapes. Something's got to remain sacred." Her opinion was shared by Mrs. Pat Hardin, who commented: "He was pretty good.

The confidence of the tapes should be respected. He's right we should get on with doing something about our economy and let Watergate be."

Frankie Dunn thought the press was hounding the President. "They're out for a sensational story. I think he's been sincere all along, and as president has the right to do what he likes."

More philosophical was the comment of Mrs. Ruby Harris: "I feel like this: he's the only one we've got, and I don't want to change right now."

Not everyone found the answers satisfactory however, "I think he's been lying in the past, and he's still lying," said Bill Burden. "He's a cold fish, but he's making a stronger attempt now to use a more emotional line. His coaches are teaching him gestures to bring in a more sympathetic reaction." Burden added he thought the press had put the President, not to put him on a spot, but to get to the bottom of things.

"This Watergate thing is getting burdensome to him. It's getting on his nerves," said Howard Hodges. "He didn't give the impression of sincerity expected during the conference. I believe he's embarrassed about the taping business in his office and isn't likely to give up the tapes."

"He's so involved he'll never give up the tapes," said Larry Blythe. "He thinks he's above the law, and says the same thing over and over."

Ted Barker thought the President showed poise in answering the press's questions, but knows more about the situation than has

come to light. "These things have been happening in the government all along. Nixon just happened to get caught," he said.

Although no strong increase in favor of the President was apparent in Sanford, across the country the Gallup Poll reports Nixon's popularity rose following his Watergate speech last week.

It had reached earlier this month.

But the poll said Wednesday that a survey conducted Aug. 17-20 showed a majority of Americans, 54 per cent, still disapprove of his performance in office.

The survey also showed that the majority of the 1,492 adults questioned are dissatisfied with his Watergate explanation and believe that he either knew or should have known that he had reached earlier this month.

# City Sewer Rates, Board Pay Boosted

Sanford city commissioners Monday agreed to raise their salaries \$100 a month, boost sewer service rates to fund an operations deficit and authorize intentions to pass a dog leash law.

Commissioner Gordon Meyer pushed through the raise on the basis the elected officials are spending more time in meetings and conducting city business.

Mayor Lee Moore stood alone in opposition, saying the present \$200 a month mayor's salary and \$150 a month to commissioners is adequate.

Monthly expenses of \$175 for the mayor and \$150 for commissioners won't be affected by the ordinance which will become effective in January, under city charter provisions.

"Even though I'm running for re-election in December, I agree with Commissioner Meyer, John Morris and A.A. McClanahan," said Commissioner Julian Stenstrom.

The new state Home Rule Law takes effect Oct. 1, overriding the city charter provision allowing commissioners to raise their salaries by ordinance.

Under Home Rule the raise would have required a charter amendment and referendum approval by city voters.

City Manager Warren Knowles said the sewer rate hike will mean users of more than 10,000 gallons a month — who now pay sewer rates of only 81 per cent of the water rate — will be paying 125 per cent starting in October. This will provide an estimated \$275 in additional revenue. The remainder of the deficit will be made up by spreading additional charges among the 10,000 gallon per month or less customers at a 15.6 per cent rate increase.

Knowles said the city's water department operations are paying their own way. Increased costs for sewer operations are brought about in part by treatment plant expansion and mandatory higher treatment standards by the state and federal governments.
