## Is U.S. Getting Ready To Quit A Pal?

A little noticed recent development has provided new evidence that the Nixon administration is moving releatlessly toward dumping its long-time ally, the Republic of China, in favor of diplomatic ties with Com-

The event, which might appear on the surface as minor, was a four-day visit to Taiwan by Secretary of Commerce Frederick B. Dent. The occasion was Dent's announcement that the United States next spring would establish a U.S. Trade Center in Taipei.

This was announced straight-faced by the Free China Feature Service, a Chiang Kai-shek government news agency, along with Dent's assurance that the center "could further strengthen our economic partnership and greatly expand the petertial for U.S. exports to the Republic of China."

What the Free China Feature Service didn't say about Dent's visit and its implications has far more importance than what it did say. For instance, what leading Chinese government figures are asking, collectively, is, "With U.S.-Free China trade flourishing for many years under the guidance of the U.S. Embassy, why is there a need now for a trade center?"

More to the point, the Chinese note that "trade centers" seem to be the route taken to retain some kind of ties when other countries have broken off relations with the Chiang government in a rush to the Peking diplomatic door of Mao Tse-tung. This is the situation with Japan, whose break

with Taipei in favor of Mao has embittered the 14 million island Chinese. The government leaders on Taipei also note

that Dent and Secretary of State William Rogers traveled together for high diplomatic consultations in Japan and South Korea but only

## Mexican Propaganda Is Ridiculous

What happens to a Latin American country that no longer has the United States to blame for all that is wrong? Mexico offers an answer of sorts to that question. Mexico, the country whose great social revolution of 1910 antedates even the Russian revolution, has been running things its own way for longer than any of the other major

Latin American republics. Periodically, Mexican governments engage in sustained ropaganda cempaigns with a markedly anti-Yanqui tone to

One such appears to be winding down at the moments. It simply ran out of fuel. For one thing, it is as easy as fingering the keys of a pewriter to charge wildly that a foreign conspiracy is olling, or trying to control, the Mexican economy. But, in a nation where the same revolutionary political party, with a few changes in name, has dominated national

politics for over four decades, it is hard to make the charge Particularly when, say, the National Railways have been under government management since 1914, or the government oil monopoly, Petroleos Mexicanos, last March 18 celebrated the 35th anniversary of expropriation of most foreign ioil companies, and the government runs the country's electric power system, having nationalized the foreign

power companies in the 1963-62 period. (To keep the record straight, it should be noted that Mexico, in marked contrast to many other Latin American companies, compensates the owners of properties it "nationalizes" or "expropriates."

(Since the rise of Premier Fidel Castro in Cuba in 1959, and the Cuban Communists' takeover of private property on that Caribbean island, there has been a confusion between the terms, "confiscation," which is the practice of the Marxists, and "nationalization" or "expropriation," both of which involve payment for what is obtained by the government. Mexico pays its debts; the Marxist-criented regimes do not.)

But, despite Mexico's good international credit rating, government ownership or operation of some 500 enterprises in strategic sectors of the economy has not been the success. that was hoped. The Federal Electricity Commission, the National Railways and Petroleos Mexicanos all currently need sizable price or rate increases to finance the expansion required to meet the country's growing demands. Just as they would if they were still privately owned.

There is no talk of "denationalization" of any of the large government-run utilities or industries. But, for example, when the new head of the National Railways, a veteran Mexican politico, Luis Gomez Z., former secretary general of the railroad workers' union, announces publicly that a major part of the railroad ties on which tracks are laid throughout the republic are rotting and should be replaced more and more Mexicans question the efficiency of government operation of the company.

It does no good to point out that the artificially low fares and freight rates traditionally charged do not earn the company enough to permit periodic reworking of the tracks. Nor are Mexicans really satisfied when they learn that because of the relatively low prices charged for gasoline and other petroleum products, Petroleos Mexicanos did not have the movey to keep production up with demand, and has to import petroleum from Venezueia.

Even apart from Watergate, the past three months at the White House have been a difficult period. Since the resignations of H. R. Haldeman and John Ehrschman, Gen. Alexander M. Haig Jr. and Melvin Laird have

made a series of moves to open the gates and bring more Haig sees that more men and women see the President and that he's briefed on a wider variety of news and com-

WASHINGTON (NEA) A kind of numbing bewilderment is settling over this city

For awhile the developments in the case, especially as they unfolded day by day in the Ervin Senate committee hearings, seemed to be producing a logical ebb and flow which anyone could grasp. Now some of the town's busiest observers are offering diametrically opposed themes from week to week, and the confusion is almost smothering.

Not too long ago, many analysts argued, persuasively and quite understandably, that the scandals meant that President Nixon either would resign, or ought to. Among the most perceptive was Garry Wills, a writer of lean, brilliant prose who is both under-read and insufficiently

His thesis, which a lot of us came to second or third hand, was that Mr. Nixon — accustomed to crises which he could deal with by self-devised formula — had in Watergate an open-ended mess which was essentially beyond his control. From this it was casy to move to the presumption that the President would be forever on the defensive, would be unable to govern, and would (or should) soon recognize this.

In Phase Two, it was widely written that Mr. Nixon would Ride It Out. If the White House chandeliers tinkled noisily in the shaky days while former Nixon counsel John Dean was "documenting" the mess, they quieted as the President's more prestigious aides moved to center stage. National polls showed him plunging to new lowe in popularity, but a "plebiscite" taken by the National Observer

suggested that most people — ebviously including a substan-tial proportion of the many Americans who think he was "involved' in Watergate one way or another — thought Mr. Nixon should stay. Sentiment in Congress for impeachment could be measured with an eyedropper.

## Sports Spotlight

It will be interesting to see whatanything-the Russian hosts to the World University Games do about their Cuban guests, or, for that matter, do about their own conduct of the worldwide meeting in "good spirit of brotherhood and sportsmanship.

We don't see much "good spirit" or "brotherhood" in either the latest incident is which the American and Cuban basketball teams engaged in a mid-court melee, or in allowing "fans" to pester and jeer the Israeli

Is it because now that the Russians have won their first cage tilt over the U.S. that all the hassle started? We doubt it. This is but an extension of a deeper problem that confronts organized international athletics. At that level of country-against-country competition, what seems to matter most-as duly reported by the nation's press-is the total number of gold medals as if they were battle stars indicating which army won the war.

Athletics, in its own right, is a kind of war. It's a battle between men and teams, and it's also an individual fight to conquer the established mark of excellence that every athlete strives to make. But, it's also a whole lot

#### THE BETTER COUNTRY?

As it says in the stories about competition on almost any scale, "for the good spirit and sportsmanship," ostensibly, the reason the world's nations gather every four years to meet on the field of athletic competition is just that, but it's always been made out that the winning team is automatically the better country.

We find that proposition absurd, yet one can count on it. Everytime the Russians and the Americans meet it becomes an issue much greated than who wins or loses a basketball game or a 100 meter race-it becomes which country wins or loses the event-the gold medal.

#### NO PLACE FOR FIGHT

Personally, we like our fights confined to a boxing ring, and we don't at all like the idea that any country's youths get so "heated-up" over a win or loss that they must take the field after the

contest fists flying and chairs a-swinging.

While to abruptly withdraw our country's collegiate athletes from the "Games," may seem to be an over-reaction and isolationist as far as world opinion is concerned, we think if that's the case, it's time the world formed a new

opinion of what sports should be.

Remember all the hulabaloo raised over South Africa about its aparthied policy? Who raised the specter of that rascist practice? If the world can be so concerned—and rightfully so—about one country not allowing its own people to represent them, should we also be concerned about countries taking up fistignific to determine about countries taking up fisticuffs to determine which is the better team, or country after the match is over?

The world needs to reevaluate its thinking on international meetings. Politics, of course, will enter almost any gathering of people from different backgrounds, but it has no room on the playing field or court.

#### **POLLY'S POINTERS** What Were Those

Ingredients Again?

Poliy's Problem DEAR POLLY - I have heard that a solution of salt, soda and vinegar (two of these or all three) added to water in an enamel pan and brought to a boil will clean silverware perfectly. I remember that the silver must be put on a rack in the pan but I do not remember the exact ingredients and procedure. My sincere thanks if any readers can help me. — M. D.

DEAR POLLY — My Pet Peeve is with makers of pat-terns for pantsuits. I wish they would give separate yardage for the pants and the blouse or jacket because sometimes we would like to make them of contrasting colors or materials.

DEAR POLLY - snd UNA MAE - I made a beautiful mirror and wall sconce set from a bunch of soiled and faded artificial flowers. A small round unframed mirror and a pair of shelf brackets were bought at the variety store. A circle of cardboard was cut so it was about three inches larger than the mirror. I centered the mirror on the cardboard circle and traced around it. After the flowers were washed in hot suds, rinsed and dried, I attached them to the extra three inches of cardboard with an epoxy glue. The flowers and the cardboard were sprayed with flat black paint. When dry, the mirror was glued into the center tracing and I had an instant wrought iron - New Orleans balcony style. The same procedure was used for the sconces, except the flowers were attached to the metal shelf brackets in an eye-pleasing fashion before they, too, were sprayed flat black. These pieces look quite expensive hanging in my guest bedroom. —

DEAR POLLY - I like to keep my sewing machine open for convenience but the head would get so dusty. I made a cover by cutting about 12 inches or a bit more from the closed end of a worn pillowcase and French-seamed the raw edges. I used a case that had a decorative border. Now the cover not only keeps the dust away but looks attractive. This is a good use for a hand-embroidered case that has worn thin but you hate to throw into the rag bag. - MARGUERITE






