Schwab And The South

Among those who are beginning to recognize the industrial possibilities of the South are Charles M. Schwab, steel magnate. He sees in the excellent climatic conditions of the Southern states, and in their plentiful supply of labor, a fine competitor for the established industrial centers of the East.

Mr. Schwab recently attended an international conference of the Gulf states at the Gulf Hotel in Mexico. He realized that across that Gulf lies a country with the greatest possibilities of trade of any in the world.

"I believe the South realizes it and is progressing as rapidly as safety permits," he told a reporter. "The South, particularly, is equipped for the manufacture of lighter materials. Already it excels in the textiles and is taking its place industrially as it has held its place agriculturally."

Looking out over the Gulf of Mexico from his hotel window the steel magnate waved his arm up and down the coast and declared: "All along here this section has a great opportunity for development. It has climate. It has labor. It has harbors and it is close to the great trade centers of South America."

"For a long time the people of South America thought we wished to dominate them. We do not wish to do any such thing. That is remote from our mind. All we want is friendliness and understanding between our nations. The South will continue to grow as it is the logical place for expansion. The South and the West must absorb some of the activities to relieve the congested East."

A DEMONSTRATION OF DANGER

When the Tribune attempted to point out to voters the danger lying in the proposed constitutional amendment which would have permitted the voters of any school district to fix any amount of the millage they desired, removing the existing 10-mill limit, we did not know that there would be an early demonstration of that danger.

We cited a day or two ago the remarkable incident in one school district in Escambia county, where an election was held to determine the millage for school purposes for the coming year, and where only one vote was cast, that solitary vote deciding the amount of taxes to be paid by all the taxpayers of the district.

Although this lone voter removed the millage of his district from 10 to five mills, he could just as easily and effectively have raised it to 20 mills or 50 mills or 100 mills. The amendment which the people defeated on November 6 had been in full force and effect. It was to guard against the danger of a few voters, taking the trouble to go to the polls in a school district election, imposing excessively and unnecessary taxation upon the non-voting majority of taxpayers.
