SACRAMENTO, Calif. (AP)-California's \$5 billion-a-year public school finance system, based on the local property tax, faces the possibility of upheaval because of a state Supreme Court ruling with national implica-

The court held 6-1 Monday that the system is unconstitutional because the local property tax provides a better education to children living in wealthy areas than those living in poor school districts.

The ruling was hailed by big city school edministrators, who said it will mean a better break for poor children who need a good edu-

cation to break out of poverty. "It's revolutionary," said Wilson Riles, California's superintendent of public instruc-







What the United States of America faces in its relationships with Pakistan is a true dilemma - the choice between unpleasant alterna-

If we continue to furnish arms to West Pakistan the emotional pressure brought against the United States will be immense, particularly in the underdeveloped world. The theme will be that the arms will be used to inflict suffering on the East Pakistanis.

If we do not furnish the arms, our communications with West Pakistan undoubtedly will be severed. We will lose whatever chance we have of reasoning with the regime of Yayha Kahn - to urge him to use compassion and restraint in dealing with the civil war on his

Most certainly the purposes of humanity would be best served by keeping the dialogue between the United States and West Pakistan open. Nor is it realistic to assume that West Paskistan would be deprived of arms should they not be available from the United States.

Painful as it will be in the face of the critical demagoguery that it can expect, the United States must take the political blows that it knows are coming and continue to assist the East Pakistani people with diplomacy as well as food and money.

late last night adopted a budget of \$10,631,570 for the fiseal year starting Oct. 1 and approved a tax levy of 7.48 mills. (The budget includes the secondary road program proviously not in the county budget but operated by the state.) The new budget compares to \$8,138,776 for the fiscal year ending Sept. 30. The millage rate is a slight relaction from last year's 7.55 mills but, when combined with increased assessments, reflects a 20 per cent increase in taxes.

Assessments of real prope ty for taxing purposes increased between 15 and 400 per cent in the county this year when the county was obliged by law to achieve a full 100 per cent assessment, as compared to the 30 per cent valuation previously used.

The budget issue was not resolved without some heated debate among the commissioners, Al Davis, who eventually voted against the budget because of the increase, presented several proposals to the Commission which would have reduced the county budget by nearly \$100,000 and by jiggling some of the other lines in the budget would have netted a millage reduction of 1.01.
