

Orlando Council Urges Members To Work

Court Action Against Union Vowed By Disney World

ORLANDO, Fla. (AP) — Walt Disney World officials threatened to file unfair labor practice charges today against a Tampa-based union whose seven-member picket line halted construction at the \$300 million amusement center Friday.

The officials said they would file charges against the Retail Clerks International Association Local 1638 with the National Labor Relations Board.

Some 750 construction workers refused to cross the union's picket line Friday.

Officers of the Orlando Building and Construction Trades Council, which represents the bulk of the workers on the project, urged members to ignore the pickets and continue working today.

The clerks union said it wanted official recognition as the bargaining agent for members employed when the sprawling amusement park opens Oct. 1.

Disney officials termed the action "premiere" and said in order to "protect the right to work of construction union members."

Dave Wingate, council president, supported Disney officials and said the clerks did not have any basis for their action.

He said union members were covered by the union were already employed at Disney World.

"We already represent the clerks at Anaheim (location of Disneyland in California), and there isn't any reason why we can't represent these people," Hollinger added.

Quality Education On A Shoestring, Review Reveals Of Seminole County

Is Seminole County getting its money's worth from the quality of the Seminole County School Board and the manner with which it directs the operations of all schools within the county?

Based on an interview with Supt. of Schools John Angel, his opinion, backed with statistics supplied by the Department of Education of Florida, "We've been operating on a shoestring budget and offering to the taxpayers of this county a school system which is far superior to others within the state."

While it is true that Seminole County does compare favorably in many of the categories about to be reviewed, there are also other areas where Superintendent Angel agrees there is room for improvement and that programs have been initiated to improve these instances.

On the "plus" side of the ledger, Seminole has shown continued progress in the mean raw score for each of the tests in the State-Wide Twelfth Grade Tests for 1967 through 1970.

Starting with '67, Seminole County ranked 19th out of a possible 67, the total number of counties within the state. The following year (1968), Seminole improved two positions going to 17th, and in 1969 increased its position still further by finishing the year in 11th place.

For the year 1970, there were only eight other counties which fared better than Seminole as it finished in ninth place.

As impressive as are these statistics, it would be well also to take note of the comments of Cecil Golden of the FDE, who included a note of explanation with the release of this information from the office: "This is the only information we have given to the press and this was given only upon repeated requests for it. The source of pressure for making these scores public was the investigation and public hearings by the House Appropriations Subcommittee on Education."

"I hope county officials will help explain to legislators and the public that the existing norm-referenced tests, such as the Twelfth Grade Test, are not adequate measures of the public school program and will support the efforts of the Department of Education under the educational research and development and educational accountability programs to develop criterion-referenced measurements which will more accurately measure the effectiveness, the efficiency and the quality of the education." Property Tax Unconstitutional Court Rocks School Finance System

SACRAMENTO, Calif. (AP)—California's \$3 billion-a-year public school finance system, based on the local property tax, faces the possibility of upheaval because of a state Supreme Court ruling with national implications.

The court held 6-1 Monday that the system is unconstitutional because the local property tax provides a better education to children living in wealthy areas than those living in poor school districts.

The ruling was hailed by big city school administrators, who said it will mean a better break for poor children who need a good education to break out of poverty.

"It's revolutionary," said Wilson Riles, California's superintendent of public instruction.

"I have been saying all along that the quality of a child's education should not depend on where the child lives in the state. It has been obvious that if a child happens to live in a district which does not have a high tax base, he gets short-changed on his education."

Sanford Gruskin, a California assistant attorney general who argued the state's case for the property tax, said no decision had been made on whether to carry an appeal to the U. S. Supreme Court.

Such an appeal could provide a test for the many other states which finance education with a system similar to that of California—a partnership of the state and some 1,200 local school districts.

The target of the opinion written by Justice Raymond L. Sullivan was the increasingly unpopular local property tax which, statewide,

provides 56 per cent of the funds used to run classrooms from kindergarten through the two-year community colleges. Remaining school funds come from the state and federal governments and other sources.

School districts with little taxable property wealth can't raise enough money to match the education provided in richer districts, the court said, even with a high tax rate and state aid.

Local property taxes have risen nearly \$3 billion in California this year.

The court said the right to a good education is fundamental and "cannot be conditioned on wealth. . . . We have concluded, therefore, that such a system cannot withstand constitutional challenge and must fall before the equal protection clause" of the 14th Amendment of the U. S. Constitution.

Florida Schools 'In Same Boat,' Says Christian

Approximately 25 per cent of the income supporting Seminole County schools' operating budget comes from ad valorem taxes, it was reported this morning by Walter Teague, school finance officer in the wake of the California Supreme Court's ruling that California's school finance system is unconstitutional because it is based on local property taxes.

Teague reported that Seminole County schools' operating budget totals \$10,961,000 this year. Of this amount, \$4,141,000 comes from ad valorem taxes.

Teague pointed out that this is for the operating budget only.

He said ad valorem taxes for district services (bonded indebtedness) is, in his opinion, levied because it was voted by the people.

The School Board has sole control of its budgetary requirements, submitting directly to the county tax collector for collection. Until recently the School Board's budget was processed through the County Commission for its approval, although the Commission had no power to change the school budget.

Teague pointed out that this is for the operating budget only.

Florida Facing Shambles, Too

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) — Florida's school finance system, dependent on property taxes, is open to the same attack that has left California in a legal shambles, Education Commissioner Floyd Christian said today.

The California Supreme Court ruled Monday that the West Coast state's multibillion-dollar school finance system was unconstitutional because it was based on local property taxes. This discriminates against the poor because wealthy areas can afford to provide their children with a better education, said the court.

In California, 56 per cent of each school district's funds come from local property taxes.

"In Florida, the figure is about 45 per cent."

"We could be affected because we use property taxes for about 45 per cent of our finances," Christian said in an interview.

"We are, of course, watching this to see what the final disposition will be," he added.

Christian said it was his understanding the decision was not yet final, pending possible rehearing.

For the past several years, the Florida Legislature has moved toward greater state support of schools—less relieving property taxes.

Two years ago, Christian said, property taxes made up about 55 per cent of a county's support of schools.

"We've been working toward the elimination of this (dependence on property taxes). We want more state support, more federal aid, and less county support."

NEGOTIATIONS UNDERWAY FOR HLH PLANT SALE

Sanford's economic picture was brightened today with the disclosure from the Greater Sanford Chamber of Commerce manager John Krider that a modular-mobile home manufacturer is negotiating with H. L. Hunt Company for acquisition of the 117,000-square-foot former canning plant.

While not disclosing the name of the company, now in Sanford meeting with Hunt officials, Krider said it is a "nationally known firm" making mobile and modular homes. However, he said this is not the American Modular Systems (AMS) which had earlier expressed an interest in acquiring the Hunt facility.

Krider said 300 employees will be recruited on the local scene to work at the facility as soon as negotiations are completed. He said the company planned to start operations in "about six weeks" if all arrangements are completed.

R. R. Smithwick, county executive director, is in charge of the office, open on Mondays and Tuesdays of each week.
