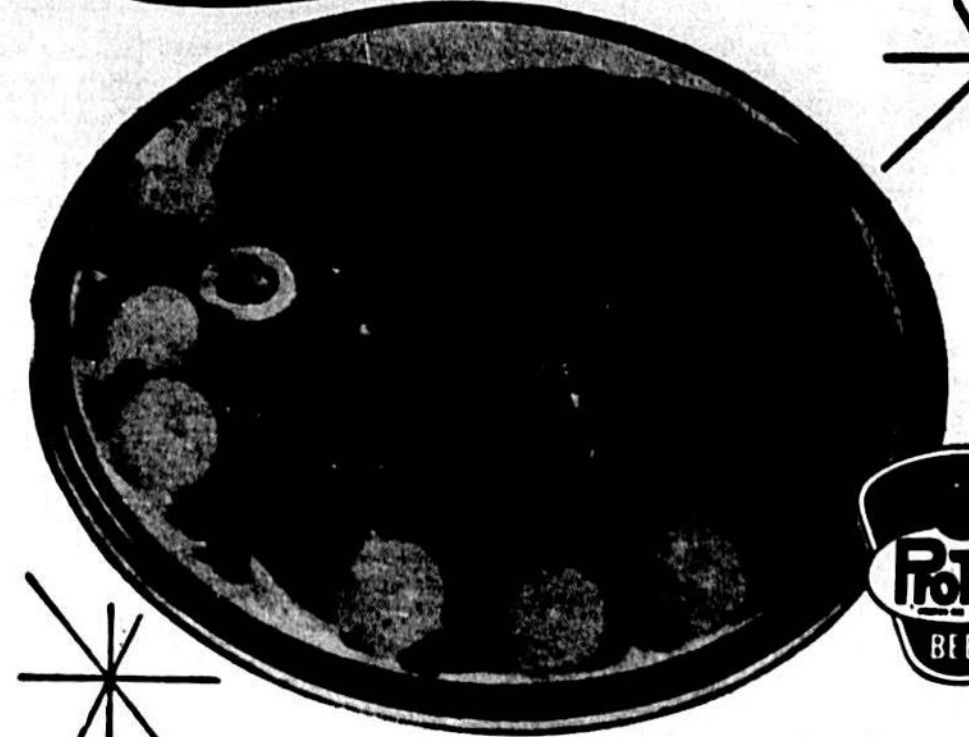

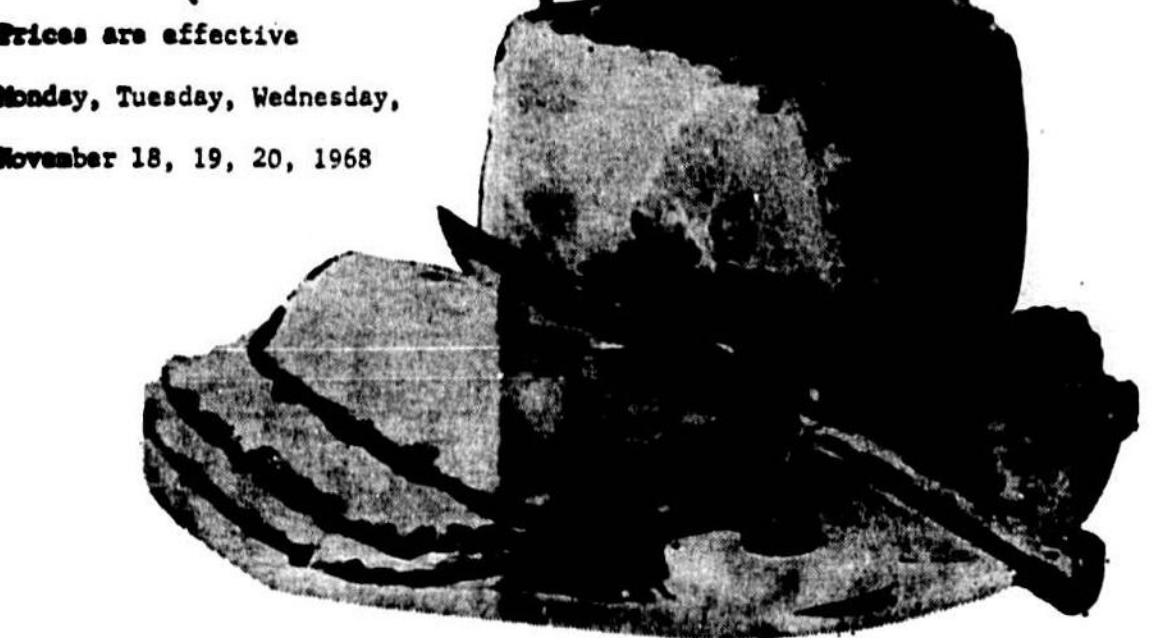

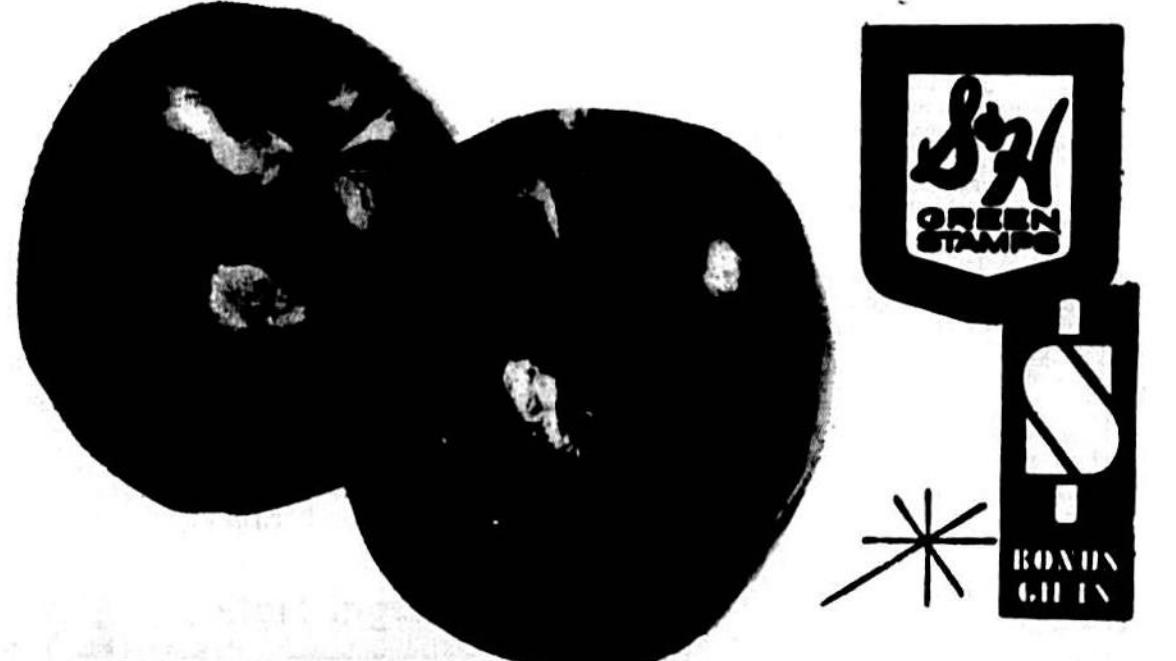

Suicide Arouses Public

Spurred to action by the recent suicide of a youth held at the county jail, representative of 11 county civic and religious organizations, along with the County Commission today to immediately appoint a commission to examine all facets of the juvenile problem.

Carlton Henley, principal of Lyman High School and president of Seminole Education Association, spokesman, delivered a prepared statement signed by the various organizations regarding non churches to Jaycees group.

Henley said, "We are appearing before the County Commission as a group of citizens who share a grave concern about the lack of adequate provision in our county for meeting the needs of its juveniles with problems. These needs include personnel and facilities equipped to deal with juveniles both before and after their problems lead them to actions requiring the attention of law enforcement agencies. Comprehensive counseling, a mental health unit and appropriate detention facilities should be considered in seeking means to improve present conditions.

"This group respectfully urges the immediate appointment of a commission to examine all facets of this problem for the purpose of recommending a solution to the county commission at the earliest possible moment to the County Commission, a far reaching program designed to meet the immediate and long-range needs of juveniles. At the same time, consideration should be given to including allocations in the new budget for implementing such a program.

"Our concern in this matter transcends any partisan interests and we trust that the County Commission will act in the same spirit. According, the undersigned offer their resources for service on the recommended commission, for assistance in carrying out the proposals of this commission, and for support in securing adequate funds to implement such a program."

The statement was signed by the Altamonte Community Chapel, Grace Methodist Church, League of Women Voters of Seminole County, Lyman High Parent-Teacher Association, Sanford-Seminole Jaycees, Sanford Women's Club, Seminole Community Action, Seminole Education Association, Executive Council of Sanford-Lake County, and the University of Florida, in that order.

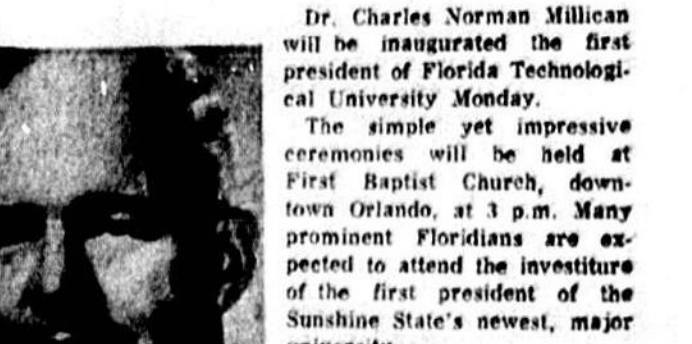

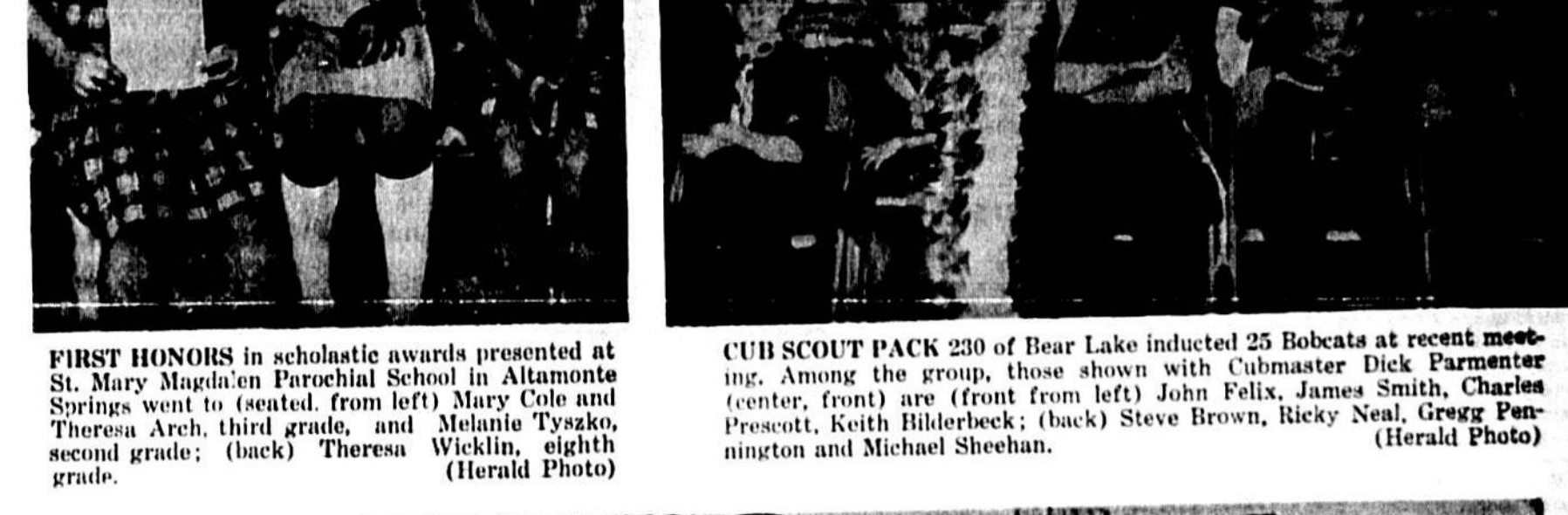

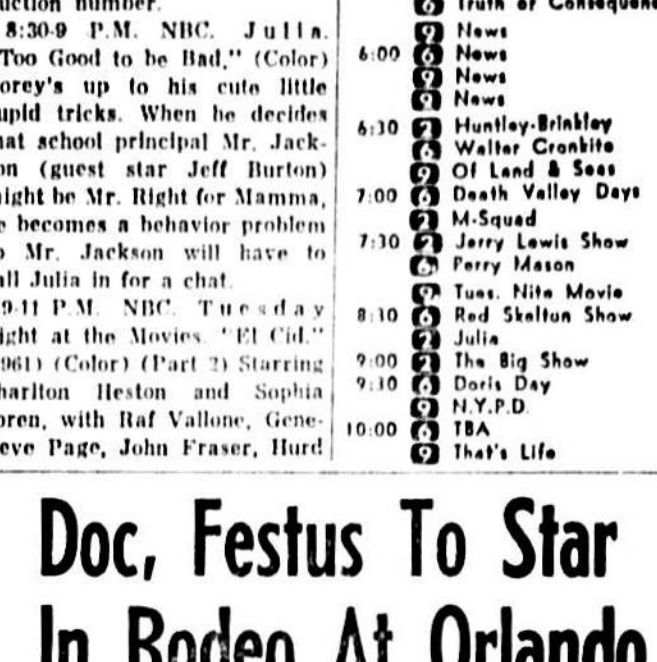
