

# Making room for growth

SANFORD - A new four-story 72-room Holiday Inn Express motel aite plan will be up for consideration this Thursday night at the Sanford Planning and Zoning Commission meeting.

The motel is to be located 3401, (east side) of Orlando Drive, between Airport Boulevard and Lake Mary Boulevard. The actual request to be heard by P&Z to consideration of a site plan.

If approved, there is no immediate indication regarding when actual land clearning and/or construction

might get under way. Other items on the P&Z agenda include consideration of a preliminary subdivision plan for Sterling Woods, a proposed 123 lot residential subdivision, located at 1250 W. Lake Mary Boulevard. The development is located southeast of Old Lake Mary Road.

Among persons listed as representtives of the property owners is Sanford Mayor Larry Dale. When the development propossi has previously been presented before the city commission. according to requirements, Dale has declared a conflict of interest and refrained from voting on the matter.

#### School board member says union defamed him

A Seminole County school board member has named the teacher's union in a suit for allegedly making inappropriate campaign con-tributions to his opponent and defaming him during the last election.

The counter suit was filed August 13 in cir-cuit court by board member flob Goff. In his

counter suit, which names Jane Ehrlich, William Fahey. Robert Picheny. Nancy Warren. the Seminole Education Association Inc., Seminole Uniserve and the Seminole Uniserve Political Action Committee, Goff is seeking in excess of \$15,000 in damages. He claims that the defendants violated state campaign laws and defamed his character.

This action is a continuation of a lawsuit that began last year when Warren, a 16-year incumbent running for the school board in Dis-

trict 3, filed an action against Goff claiming that he had not established proper residency. In November 1996, a Judge subsequently dis-missed the case and Goff won the election by a 600 vote margin. Goff then filed a counter suit in January, amending it last week to include the teacher's union and its political action

They had said they had no financial responsibility. The people behind the suit told people See Suit, Page SA

#### **UPS** forges tentative agreement



In a statement issued Monday night at 10 p.m., Public Relations representative Gina Ellrich said that United Parcel Service has reached a lentative agreement with the International Brotherhood of Teamsters. The Washington D.C. Public Relations Office for UPS promised Secretary of Labor Alexis Herman that it would not disclose the terms and details of the agreement until it is finalized. The agreement should be finalized some time today. This agreement ends a strike that has lasted 15

The original contract expired July 31, and the strike began August 4. The strike had the nation scrambling to find an alternative for their packaging needs. UPS ships out about 3 billion packages a year; about 12 million a day. UPS, based out of Atlanta. Georgia, is the largest shipping company employing over 300,000 United States workers. Two thirds of those employees are Teamsters.

According to the D.C. Public Relations office, the Teamsters must vote and ratify the agreement. The See Strike, Page 5A

## Audubon, airport spar over eagles' rights

SANFORD - The Florida Audubon Society says that the destruction of an eagle's nest by the Orlando-Sanford Airport is in violation of a state law. Airport Director Steve Cooke disagrees. saying he was following state as well as federal

orders in having the nest removed.

While the Audubon Society has released a statement saying it has filed a formal challenge against the airport, the actual objection challenges a decision by the Florida Game and Fresh Water Fish Commission which allowed the airport to take down a tree in which there was a

"We found it (an abandoned nest) when we were evaluating a proposal for a new runway," Cooke explained. "It was not in the new area, but near an existing runway, and as anyone who flies will tell you, hitting a bird as large as an eagle with an aircraft, could result in serious pro-

He said the nest was not presently in use, but expected the eagle would be returning to resume occupancy by late October or November. "So we

attempted to seek approval to have the tree taken down before the eagle returned," he said.

Although Cooke said the airport obtained approval from the Federal Aviation Authority (FAA), the Federal Fish and Game Commission, the State of Florida, U.S. Department of Agriculture, and Department of the Interior, Florida Audubon's statement says the challenge is based on the position that "the Airport Authority still needed a permit to take down the

Audubon President Clay Henderson said. "Florida law makes it a crime to molest an eagle nest without a permit but the Game Commission

didn't even make them apply for one."

Audubon Vice President Reese Collins commented, "The Airport Authority thinks it has found a loophole in Bald Eagle protection which allows them to down the tree without a permit." He added, "All the nests in the area north of

Lake Jesup are now in jeopardy until this issue is resolved and any loophole is closed." Cooke said the authority was, by no means, attempting to seek any loophole or attempt to avoid authority. "We got approvals from everyone," he said. He added that after a few questions were answered, the state sent the authority an 11-page letter stating that it no longer had any objections.

He added that the Federal Fish and Game

Commission also sent the Sanford airport a lengthy biological opinion regarding the matter.

"We got what we believed to be the final approval last Wednesday," Cooke explained, "so I immediately ordered the tree taken down, and it

He added that, had the tree with the nest remained and the eagle returned to the location, it could have proven dangerous to pilots. "We checked with the FAA in Atlanta," Cooke said, "and they have records of what happens when a light aircraft collides with an eagle." There was one reported crash between an eagle and a light plane in Sanford in 1992.

He continued, "Of course, the eagle hardly ever survives such a collision either, so, in effect, we were helping to actually save the eagle in removing that tree."

The complaint challenge from Florida Audubon, to be presented by Collins, is sched-uled to be made before federal officials later this

#### Annual gator harvest to begin Sept. 1

Special to the Herald

September I marks the beginning of the 10th annual public waters alligator harvest in Florida. This year's harvest will give approximately 700 alligator hunters the opportumily to take five alligators each from 39 sites throughout the state Eighteen of those harvest sites lakes, rivers and wetlands are located in the Florida Game and Fresh Water Fish Commission's (GFC) 12 county Central Region

The harvest season is di vided into two phases. Sept. 1-15 and Sept. 15-30. Each hunter is selected to hunt during one phase only The split season gives more hunt ers an opportunity to partiespate. Hunting hours begin one-half hour before sunset and end one-half hour after sunrise each day during both phases.

"This year, as in years past, applicants were selected through a computerized, random selection process," said Lt. doy M. Hill. GFC's public information coordinator for the Central Region There were 13.810 applicants for 728 slots

Selected applicants were required to purchase a 8250 resident alligator trapping hi cense or a \$1,000 nonresident license by July 15 in order to participate in the harvest, or else forfeit their opportunity. Of the 728 names drawn, 610 purchased their licenses by deadline. The forfeited permits were assigned to alternate applicants who were randomly selected from those who originally applied but were not selected in the initial drawing.

Each licensed trapper is also allowed to purchase 850 alligator trapping-agent licenses for assistants to help during the harvest. These trapping-agents are not permitted to hunt independent of the licensed trapper. Trappers may use snatch hooks, snares, gigs or harpoons to take alligators, and bows-andarrows or crossbows may be used if the projectile is attached to a restraining line. Firearms are prohibited.

Since 1988, alligator hunters have taken 22.178 alligators during the annual public waters harvests. This year they can take a total of 3,640 alligators during the monthlong hunt

The annual alligator harvest is one of five programs of the GFC's Alligator Management Section (AMS). The main objection of the AMS is to implement alligator harvest programs under the concept of sustained annual harvests while optimizing the economic, aesthetic and ecological values of the alligator as a renewable resource.

By emphasizing these values, the GFC hopes to provide incentives for conservation.

Lake Rousseau (Citrus, Marion and Levy counties). Lakes Tohopekaliga and Marian (Osceola County). Lake Okahumpa (Sumter County) and Lake George [Putnam and Volusia coun-

Father Richard Trout, the pastor, told the congregation at the church this past Sunday that Mrs. Holdos soon was going to take a trip to visit relatives in Pennsylvania Hernephew, Father Don Herdis, will accompany her.

She was also there for each weekday Mass at 8 a m

A small woman with a big heart, she would stand on uptoes to reach the Tabernacle at the side altar or to light the candles. Parishioners would see her gently pecking out from the sacristy to observe Mass. She would appear at Communion time to receive the Bread and Wine.

"If any of our altar servers made a mistake, Mrs. Holdos would gently tell them what to do," said Jon Trout, the church administrator—and—younger

brother of the pastor.

Mrs. Holden celebrated here 93rd birthday on May 6. She was born in Vienna, Austria. She came to New York and married a policeman from that city. She has been widowed since 1981.


When asked what advice he

## Keep both hands on the wheel

BOSTON-As of Aug. 15, any blushing bride and groom heading out for a marriage license in the Great State of Louisiana is going to face a choice. I don't mean a choice of spouse, since that decision is presumably over. I mean a choice of marriage.

Louisiana just became the first state in the country that offers two distinct marriages. These are what the people thereabouts have taken to calling "regular" or "high test." The options however may have less to do with the mileage than with the exit ramp.

Under the "regular" marriage, as it now exists almost everywhere, a married couple is entitled to a no-fault divorce after a six-month separation. But under the brand new "high test" marriage or what's really called a covenant marriage, the divorce rules are more stringent. The couple would have to be separated two years or prove, for example, that one apouse was an adulterer or a felon or an abuser.

The theory behind the covenant marriage is a popular one. It's the idea that something has gone awry since the horse-and-buggy days when people got hitched for life. That today couples split as soon as the first bump takes off the first hubcap.

Tony Perkins, the Louisiana state rep and author of the bill that passed with one lone dissent, compares marriage to buying a new car not just driving it. In an analogy his wife must adore, he says, "Making those payments for the first 12 months aren't a problem. But you get into the third, fourth and fifth year of making those payments, the car, you know, is getting a little old and you're not so excited about making those payments."

Under this auto-marital theory, no-fault divorce makes it too easy to give up the car payments--or at least to trade them in for child support. So in Louisiana they are road-testing the belief that government can alter the rate at which marriage ends, by altering the terms under which it begins.

I must confess that I am somewhat intrigued by this experiment. The consumer reporter in my soul can't wait to see whether regular or high test marriages handle differently on the highway of life. The goasto columnist in my soul can't wait to see the couples at the registry facing a choice between what appears to be great or greater commitment.

But I have trouble with the underlying notion that the people who get divorced got married too casually. Four years ago, two psychologists from the University of Virginia selted about-tobe-weds about their perceptions and expectations of divorce. Proposals to go to weekend elections or make election days a national holiday were considered in the 1970s and 1980s, but went nowhere. For example, in the Eastern time zone, the polls would be open from 6 p.m. Saturday to 6 p.m. Sunday and in the Pacific zone from 3 p.m. to 3 p.m., so that the polls would close at the same time across the country, eliminating the effect of early "calling" of election results based on exit polls in the East.

Wilson anticipates several objections to her easy-voting idea. One comes from "Puritans" who think that elections should not be convenient so as to restrict voting to those who "care enough" to go to the trouble.

A kindred objection is from traditionalists who think of voting as an opportunity for citizens to gather outside the local school or firehouse, hold a bake sale, and greet their

According to Wilson, though, convenience was the original idea behind Tuesday voting in the first place. Tuesday was court day and market day in rural communities, the time people were most likely to be in town.

Nowadays, she says, most people don't stop and chat at the polls -- they get it over with as quickly as possible on the way to or from work, and if they are harried by job or parenting responsibilities, they skip it.



## Adopt a grandparent at Lakeview

Newly arrived Lakeview Nursing Center Activities Di-rector Connie Dickey is busy implementing programs for residents that involve them with the Sanford community.

Just five weeks into the job. Dickey has already coordinated a fashion show hosted by Weekenders, a home shopping club specializing in clothing for people on the go. This coming week will be Pet Week at Lakeview. Staff will bring small pets from home for residents to

enjoy. Her largest endeavor is to get an Adopt a Grandparent program into full swing. She says,
"It has been very successful in
other areas such as Sarasota and I don't know why we can't make it work here. She is calling area churches seeking volunteers. Response, she says, has been good. Family members of residents with whom she has spoken are enthused: "Most of the children of residents are pleased their parents will have some company. A lot of residents just don't have anybody in the area.


## Try growing the native muscadine grape

Excerpts from the University publication FC 16 by T. E. Crocker and J. A. Mortensen. The muscadine grape is native to Florida and has been cultivated in the state for many years. One reason for its popularity is that the muscadine is seldom seriously affected by disease or insect pests. It is harvested as single berries instead of in bunches and has smaller leaves and fruit with thicker skins than the bunchtype grapes.

Varieties: The varieties recommended for Florida are: Alachua. Albemarle, Carlos. Cowart. Dixie. Doreen. Fry. Golden Isles. Granny Val. Jumbo, Nesbitt, Noble, Southland, Summit, and Triumph.

Pollination: Muscadine grape varieties have three different flower types: 1. perfect flowers with functional stamens and pistils that produce fruit without cross-pollination; 2. female flowers that must have pollination from another plant with perfect or male flowers; and 3. male flowers that do not bear fruit. Bees are recommended to aid pollina-

Propagation and Plantings Layestog-is a common method-of propagating muscadines. In June, peg a long cane into a trench dug in the ground leaving the cane attached to the vine. Make a slight cut at the bottom of the cane to promote root production, and cover the

wounded part with soil. Leave the shoot tips exposed. The layers are uncovered and rooted shoots are separated from the mother cane in the winter. Grapes are adapted to a wide range of soils, including most of those suitable for cit-rus culture. Poorly drained soils, are not recommended. Usual planting time for Central Florida is in February, the later part of the dormant season. Common spacings are 10 to 15 feet between rows, and 15 to 18 feet between plants.

Trellising: The 2 and 3 wire systems are the most common vertical trellises. The wires are run at heights of 2.5 and 5 feet for the 2-wire type and 2.4 and 6 feet for the 3 wire system. Pruning the vines on the 2 wire agatem is less time consuming them, on the 3 wire system. which should be used only on email plantings. An overhead trellis with wires at a 7 foot height may be used where shade and maximum yield are

Pruning: The spur system

with permanent arms is used. Remove tendrils and all branches not needed for spurs and fruiting arms. Prune all branches that are less than 3/16 inch in diameter, leaving 2 to 3 buds per spur, depending on the vigor of the branch. Remove most of the spurs located at the top of the trunk to prevent crowding and bushi-ness, which will interfere with harvest. Renew arms that are no longer vigorous. Dormant pruning is done in January and February in Central Florida.
Fertilization: The pH and

nutrient status of the soil should be determined by soil analysis prior to planting. Highly acidic soils can be brought to a more destrable level, preferably about pH 6.0, by mixing dolomite limestone in the soil at about 5 pounds per 100 square feet of area. About 1/4 pound of steamed bonemeal should be thoroughly mixed with soil around the roots at planting time. The first year apply 1/4 pound of 6-6-6 or 8-8-8, with 20 to 30 percent of the nitrogen from natural organic sources, in lateral bands, I foot away from the plant soon after growth begins. Repeat this application in May. July, and early September. The second year apply 2/3 pounds of the same mixture in late March, May, and just after harvest. Rates can be increased in future years, but should not exceed 4 to 6 pounds per vine per year. Split applications are

more efficient than a single application.

Cultivation: Cultivation is probably the best method for the homeowner. Maintain an area approximately 2 feet from the trunk of the vine in a weedfree condition. The grape has a shallow root system, so cultivate as shallow as possible. Mulches can be used to control weeds and conserve moisture. but a circle at least 6 inches in diameter around the trunk of each vine should remain bare. Irrigation: Many first-year

grape plants in Florida vine-yards have died from lack of soil moisture. Apply 1 to 1-1/2 inches of water every 2 weeks during April and May. Maturity: Muscadines ma-

ture in August and early September. They should be picked from the vines and stored at 40 degrees F. if not processed into

jellies, jams, or wine.
Post Control: A spray program for grapes in Florida is advisable to minimize fruit losses. Black rot and bitter rot can cause damage if vines are unsprayed. Spraying should begin at bloom time and be continued at intervals of 10 days to 2 weeks until 7 to 10



# Bass license plate makes splash with Floridians

SANFORD \_ The Game and Fresh Water Fish Commission's (GFC) largemouth bass license plate is a big splash with Florida drivers based on early tag sales.

drivers based on early tag sales.

The Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles reports that Floridians bought 4,141 bass tags between March 15, when the tag went on sale, on July 3.

The GFC recled in \$103,525 in revenue from sales of the new tag, which features an underwater scene with a largemouth bass and several panfish swimming in a natural eel-grass bed. For each tag sold, the GFC receives \$25 for fish and wildlife management.

Dr. Allan L. Egbert, the GFC's executive director, said he is encouraged by the popularity of the new tag. It shows that Floridians are concerned about conserving the state's fish and wildlife heritage.

"Revenue from tag sales will enable us to enhance Florida's fish and wildlife resources." Egbert said. "The money will be used to support conservation projects for fish and wildlife, including such things as habitat enhancement, enforcing wildlife regulations, restocking programs, access enhancement and environmental education."

GFC officials expect to exceed their original goal of selling 10,000 tags during the first year and eventually reap 81 million per year from tag sales.

The GPE's Bob Watterflorf said the bass tag is doing the best of the new plates released earlier this year selling at a rate of

38 tags per day.

"Bass tag sales compare favorably with some of the other best selling tags such as the panther, education and arts tags." Wattendorf said. "The bass tag's appeal is that it looks great and complements many of the most popular car colors."

The GFC also is marketing the tag to be used for boat trailers as well as vehicles.

Slow trolling live bait is the ticket for non-stop action. A few king mackerel are also in the buoy line and just off the beach. Inside the Port, expect flounder and sheepshead. Trout and redfish are rated as fair on the flats of the Banana and Indian Rivers.

Sheepshead are the main attraction at Ponce Inlet. Live shrimp or fiddler crabs are the best baits. Drum, redfish, and jack crevalle round out the action. Trout and redfish are rated as good in Mosquito Lagoon.




















## Can Cyclert have adverse effects?

DEAR DR. GOTT: I've read that Cyclert, which two of my children are taking for attention deficit disorder, can cause liver damage. Is this a serious risk?

DEAR READER: Cyclert is a central nervous system stimulant which is used with Ritalin and other drugs to overcome the distractedness and learning difficulties of ADD patients.

The manufacturer cautions that liver inflammation, usually mild, may he caused by Cyclert; however, liver-related fatalities have been reported. Thus, it is important to obtain blood tests of liver function before starting Cyclert therapy and at periodic intervals thereafter. At the first sign of abnormalities, the drug should be stopped, thereby preventing serious,

permanent damage. If you follow your pediatrician's advice about testing at regular intervals, your children should be able to avoid any adverse consequences of the medicine.

DEAR DR. GOTT: Please discuss temporal arteritis

DEAR READER The cause of this relatively common affliction is unknown, but the effects are striking Associated with an inflammation of the temporal artery (just behind the eye), temporal arteritis may lead to headache, fever, anemia and sudden, temporary blindness. Typically, the artery itself is swollen and painful. The disease is often part of a syndrome of general aches and pains (polymyalgia rheumatica), for which cortisone therapy is usually rapidly effective.

The diagnosis is suspected from the symptoms, supported by blood tests respecially the sedimentation rate). and confirmed by biopsy

Once begun, cortisone therapy will salvage eyesight, but it may have to be continued for a year or more, until the inflammation subsides and the threat of blindness is over

DEAR DR. GOTT: Why don't you recommend acupuncture for back pain due to arthritis? It is certainly saler than some medications.

DEAR READER: Yes, it is. And it is precisely for this reason that I consistently encourage - both in the office and in print - patients with back problems to try acupuncture.

In China, it is possible to perform certain surgical procedures with acupuncture as the sole anesthetic. For some reason, acupuncture hasn't really caught on in the United States. The technique is widely used, but only for relatively minor complaints such as headache and backache. In my experience, acupuncture won't help



the pain of a herniated disc or presure on the spinal cord; however, it is very useful in treating chronic back pain caused by arthritis or muscle

DEAR DR. GOTT: Following gallbladder surgery two years ago, I developed a softball-sized lump under the incision. This is more presounce when I strain or sit up, but it isn't painful. The surgeon reassures me that nothing is wrong. Should I be


