Articles of Incorporation of Sanford Properties Inc. We, the undersigned, have agreed to associate ourselves and do hereby become associated for the purpose of forming into a body politic and corporate, under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Florida, and do hereby adopt the following Articles of Incorporation:

Article I. The name of this corporation shall be SANFORD PROPERTIES INC., and its principal place of business shall be at Sanford, Seminole County, Florida, but it may have and establish such other places of business as the Board of Directors may from time to time determine.

Article II. The general nature of the business to be transacted and conducted by said corporation shall be as follows, to-wit: To hold, buy, own, control, work, develop, sell, convey, lease, rent, mortgage, pledge, exchange, cultivate, improve and otherwise deal in and dispose of real estate, and any right, title, interest or estate therein, in the State

of Florida, and in other States of the United States and in foreign countries; to plan, improve and develop lands for the purpose of sale, to do and perform all things appropriate and needful for the development and improvement of the same for any purpose for which the same may be adapted.

To erect houses and dwellings for sale or rent; to erect stores and office buildings, and to sell, lease, rent or otherwise dispose of the same; to erect apartment houses, and to sell, lease, rent or otherwise dispose of the same.

To act as agents for the sale or rental of property, and to generally engage in the business of real estate brokers and agents, and to accept commissions as such real estate brokers and agents.

To buy, own, sell and generally deal in real estate, mortgages and other forms of real estate securities; to buy, own, and sell all personal property necessary and incidental to the conduct of any business in which the corporation may engage.

To borrow money in amounts not to exceed the aggregate limit of indebtedness hereinafter stated, and to issue as evidence of indebtedness therefor bonds, promissory notes and other forms of securities, and to secure the payment of the same by mortgage or deeds of trust upon the property of the corporation.

To own stock in other corporations, to enter into partnerships with other corporations or individuals and other partnerships, and to do all such other things as may be necessary or expedient to be done for the successful transaction of the business and affairs of this corporation, and to have, exercise and enjoy all of the rights, powers and privileges incident to corporations organized and existing under the laws of the State of Florida.

Article III. The amount of the capital stock of this corporation shall be the sum of Fifty Thousand (\$50,000.00) Dollars, to be divided into five Hundred Shares of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars each.

The capital stock of this corporation may be payable in, issued or

used for the purchase of property, either real or personal, or for the payment of labor or services, as a just valuation therefor, to be determined by the Board of Directors at a meeting to be called for that purpose.

Article IV. This corporation shall continue and have full power to exercise its corporate rights and franchises for a period of ninety-nine years from and after the commencement of its corporate existence.

Article V. The business of this corporation shall be conducted by the following officers: a President, a Vice-President, and a Secretary and Treasurer, who may be one and the same person, and a Board of Directors of not less than three nor more than eleven, who must be stockholders.

Until the first meeting of the stockholders hereinafter provided for, the officers of this corporation shall be: F. O. BENTLE, President; Van C. Kussrow, Vice-President;

Frank R. Chapman, Secretary and Treasurer. The Board of Directors shall be P. O. Bentle, Van C. Kussrow and Frank R. Chapman.

The first or organization meeting of the stockholders of this corporation shall be held in the City of Miami, Florida, on the 14th day of April, A. D. 1925, for the purpose of adopting by-laws and completing the organization of this corporation, and also for the purpose of electing such officers of the corporation as are hereinabove provided for, and thereafter the annual meeting of the stockholders of this corporation shall be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in April of each and every year.
