If they just want it for speculation it is a different matter but if they want to improve it they should be offered every facility in obtaining the property and making Sanford better in every way. We need new people and new money here if we intend to make Sanford more than the census taker gives us.

And that reminds me that Sanford made a mighty poor showing in the census and with all the respect to those who took the census I really believe that they missed many a family in Sanford. If Sanford right now is not over the ten thousand mark I do not care to live here this summer. If Seminole county has only gained three thousand or more in five years it has no attractions for me but I feel that Seminole county has more people and I know that the figures do not seem right.

There are many people coming in here every day looking over Sanford with the view of investing here. They have heard that Sanford has taken on a marvelous growth and it has but we will have to show them by the census figures that Sanford and Seminole county have made this growth. Polk's Directory gave our city figures that would put Sanford well over the ten thousand mark. How about it?

Every day folks ask me about the price of this and that piece of property and want to know if it is right. Honestly, folks. I am not able to tell anyone about the price of anything. How can any man look ahead in Sanford today and foresee the marvelous growth and the many advantages and improvements and be able to give the price of property of the future. Buy it. 


