

Vote Due On Land Swap

TALLAHASSEE (AP) — The Senate will vote today on a bill to approve a 445-million-acre land swap in Hendry County for a price. Officials said the land offered by the Seminole Sugar Corp. and Pahokee Produce Inc. could be used for the 42.2-million-acre swap. The bill would allow the legislature to raise the price to \$1.1 million. In exchange for receiving the land valued at \$1.1 million, the state would give the two firms \$1.1 million worth of Palm Beach County land.

Report Due In Two Months

SEEDCO Audit Completed

By ED PRICKETT Herald Staff Writer. Federal auditors today completed inspection of the books of the Seminole Employment & Economic Development Corp. (SEEDCO) and promised a full report to U.S. Sen. Lawton Chiles in about two months. SEEDCO's director, Horace Orr, said General Accounting Office (GAO) auditors found no instances of illegality or misfeasance during the review which began in July. GAO auditors were sent here after Orr claimed the poverty-fighting agency came "under fire" from articles published in the Orlando Sentinel-Star. "I made the request for the audit," Orr said, "because people of the area had been deluged by stories that accused me of misfeasance. I had no purpose but to raise doubt in the public mind about a corporation that has a proven record of positive contributions to the community." Since SEEDCO moved here in 1970, Orr claims about \$5 million in federal dollars have flowed in to Seminole. In addition, he said about 598 Seminole residents are employed by SEEDCO, or one of its ventures — corporations set up to provide jobs for the hard-core unemployed. On March 3, Chiles, a Lakeland Democrat, asked the GAO for an audit of SEEDCO records. The GAO responded by sending an eight-man team to Sanford. Orr said he expects the audit report to be critical, especially in the area of management expertise, which Orr predicts will be hardest hit. Orr says he expects the report to rap the agency's "top management decisions." In February, published accounts of the audit showed that Orr attributed to "managerial inefficiency." The "problem firms," Neptune Winch Corp. and Seminole Citrus Products Inc., were blamed for the losses. The agency's books are audited yearly by certified public accountants. But after published reports criticized both Orr and the agency, he asked Chiles to conduct a "Sunshine Audit" of agency records. "I am sure, as well," Orr said, "that the report that emerges will establish SEEDCO's fiscal integrity and social responsibility," Orr said. The \$22,000-a-year director went on to say he has worked closely with the audit team. If any instances of illegality had turned up, Orr said he would know about them. The audit team will go to Atlanta to prepare a report that will be submitted to Chiles and U.S. Rep. Richard Kelly, a Republican. Orr hopes audit results will close the issue. "I am sure, as well," Orr said, "that the report that emerges will establish SEEDCO's fiscal integrity and social responsibility," Orr said.

Free Lunch Okayed For Needy Students

Seminole school children living in a family of four which has an annual income of \$5,700 or less will be eligible to receive free lunches during the 1976-77 academic year, Director of School Food Services Charlotte Whitmore has announced. The county school board granted approval this week for the food service office to implement the new program, which includes several changes in lunch collection procedures. Explanatory letters and application forms for free and reduced-price meals will be sent home with students this fall during the first few days of school. Parents should check the family size-income table to determine their youngsters' eligibility. If a family's income is higher than the applicable figure in the table, its children still may be eligible if the family has unusually high medical bills, disaster or casualty losses, special education expenses resulting from a child's mental or physical condition, or shelter costs which exceed 20 per cent of the household income. Families applying for the program will be notified within 10 days of whether their children qualify. Applications for the program may be submitted any time during the school year, Mrs. Whitmore added. "The ones I'm most concerned about," said, "are the borderline families who are kind of betwixt and between. The families that need a little help. There are a great many children whose families fall in that reduced-price category who do not apply."

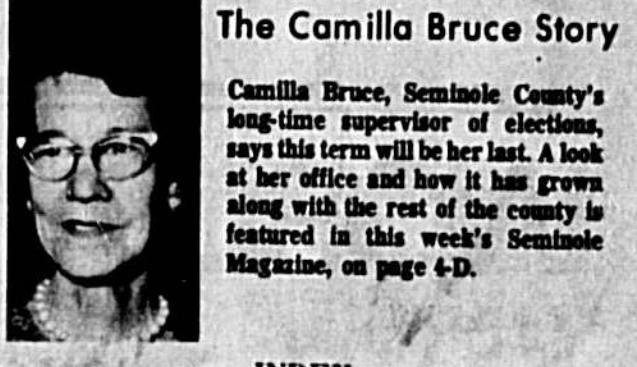

Refinery Tower Blast Kills Eleven Persons

CHALMETTE, La. (AP) — An explosion tore through a 207-foot oil refinery tower late Thursday, killing 11 persons, authorities said. Authorities said they believed the bodies of two other workers were inside the wrecked tower at the Tenneco plant in this New Orleans suburb. The bodies of the 11 victims were brought to the St. Bernard Parish morgue.

Campaigner Gets Job

WASHINGTON (AP) — A real estate developer who serves as a campaign fundraiser for President Ford is being handed a "plum" job on the Postal Service board of governors, five years after politics was supposed to have been eliminated from the Postal Service. Hung Wai Ching, finance chairman for Ford's campaign in Hawaii, is being named to the board at least partly because of his efforts on behalf of the Republican party, according to Sen. Hiram Bong, R-Hawaii, who recommended him for the post job.

Palestinians Threaten To Avenge Fall Of Camp

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) — The Palestinians and their leftist Moslem Lebanese allies threatened today to avenge the fall of the Tal Zatar Palestinian camp and vowed that Lebanon's civil war would continue. Palestinian leader Farouk Kaddoumi said his men would "avenge Tal Zatar elsewhere in Lebanon." Leftist papers said the Moslems might "escalate fighting in Christian-held mountain areas," through which Moslem villages are still scattered.

"Lebanese will have to brace for a protracted war," said Kamal Jumblatt, the Moslem leader of the Lebanese leftists. "We must lead ourselves for more shocks, similar to that of Tal Zatar."

Ministers In Oil Dispute

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (AP) — The Greek and Turkish foreign ministers came face to face today in the United Nations Security Council to vent their dispute over the oil that may lie beneath the Aegean Sea. Turkish Foreign Minister Isnan Sabri Caglayan missed the opening of the debate Thursday. Speaking then, Greek Foreign Minister Dimitrios Biliotis urged the council to probe the "provocative" activities of a research ship probing for evidence of oil.

Exiles Kidnap 2 Cubans

MIAMI (AP) — A Cuban exile group captured the two employees reportedly missing since last Monday from the Cuban embassy in Buenos Aires, Argentina, a Spanish-language radio station was reported. Dr. Salvador Lew, president of station WRHC, said Thursday that reliable sources had told the station that commandos of the United Revolutionary Organizations had seized embassy workers Jesus Cejas Arias, 22, and Crescencio Galanena Hernandez, 26.

Cape Town Riots Subside

CAPE TOWN, South Africa (AP) — Police reported general calm today in three black townships outside Cape Town after two days of rioting in which at least 29 blacks were killed and about 100 injured. Arms and ammunition dealers reported a rush by whites to buy weapons.

1 Killed, 12 Injured As Tornado Rips Trailers

LARGO (AP) — "Our trailer rolled six times. When it was over, I thought my husband was dead," Rexanne Schwadron said hours after a tornado struck a community of mobile homes for retirees, killing one and injuring a dozen others. "Big sheets of metal were coming straight at us," Mrs. Schwadron said. "We just grabbed each other's arms and hid the floor." When the wind stopped, 30 mobile homes lay in soggy ruins and 70 others were damaged in this Florida Gulf Coast city of 55,000.

Women's Bank Effort Fails

TALLAHASSEE (AP) — The first attempt in Florida to establish a bank for women collapsed in a dispute seven months ago and the afterwards are still shaking. Comptroller Gerald Lewis said nearly 1,000 investors.

Lewis attempted Thursday to resolve his part of the controversy by ordering the organizers of the defunct First Women's Bank of Florida to repay the investors by Aug. 31.

Kovachevich Seeks Post

JACKSONVILLE (AP) — Circuit Judge Elizabeth Kovachevich of St. Petersburg is competing with 15 other judges, two U.S. magistrates and a dozen lawyers for a federal judgeship here even though she's been named to another post. Earl Hadlow, chairman of the Judicial Qualifications Commission, gave that breakdown Thursday to the applicants to succeed U.S. District Judge Charles R. Scott when he reaches retirement age in November.

Nuclear Sabotage Plan Aired

JACKSONVILLE (AP) — A man on trial in eight Miami bombings gave up a plan to blow up a nuclear-powered generating station because he couldn't get the explosives. FBI agent Joseph Dawson said secret informers told officials that defendant Rolando Ordo asked a Cuban exile group for explosives to use on the Florida Power and Light Co.'s big Turkey Point nuclear reactor generating station south of Miami.

Barron Threat Denied

PANAMA CITY (AP) — The head of the local Young Democrats has denied a charge that Senate President Donnelly Barron had him threatened with loss of his job if he allowed a rival to address the group. "It was just blown out of proportion," said Charles Goodman, president of the Panama City Young Democrats. "Nothing like that went on."

More Cocaine Seized

JACKSONVILLE (AP) — For the seventh time this year, customs officers report finding cocaine aboard the Panamanian banana boat My Cubahama. Agents who seized the 150-foot vessel Thursday found 19½ pounds of cocaine worth \$4.5 million on the street in the forward hold, a federal spokesman said. Agents had taken 5 pounds of cocaine from a boat in Miami just last week.

Canal Needs Cabinet Okay

JACKSONVILLE (AP) — A crucial factor in the fate of the Cross Florida Barge Canal will be how the Cabinet votes on it, an attorney for a group of canal boosters says. "We need a clear statement of approval from the Cabinet," Ralph Elliott told the Cross Florida Canal Association here Thursday.

Birds Die Mysteriously

ST. PETERSBURG (AP) — University of Florida scientists are trying to find out what happened to the scores of birds found dead and dying on an island here. Ralph Heath, director of a seabird sanctuary at Indian Shores, sent some of the dead knots to the university Thursday.

Arms Sales Aid Stability

How much is enough? The liberal policy which our government has followed in allowing U.S. manufacturers to sell planes, tanks, guns and other military hardware to foreign governments is coming under attack.

It's easy to get the impression that the United States is simply using its defense industries to ease its balance of payments problem. The dilemma of what to do about our foreign expenditures for imported oil would be more acute if a significant amount of that money were not flowing back in the form of arms purchases by Saudi Arabia, Iran and other oil producers.

That economic benefit cannot be denied, but it is no justification for ignoring the implications of the arms buildup in the Middle East and Africa. That arms buildup, we should remember, does not arise from the availability of U.S. weapons but from the determination of certain leaders to turn the economic strength of their countries into military strength.

Arms are flowing into the Middle East and Africa from the Soviet Union and from Western Europe as well as from the United States. King Hussein of Jordan has demonstrated how a leader can try to play one side off against the other in the arms market.

Our arms-sale policy must not be blind to the uses that might be made of U.S. weapons. In the case of Jordan, and the proposed resumption of arms sales to Egypt, we have sought to keep a balance between the military capability of Israel and the Arab states that confront her.

It is the buyers of arms—not the sellers—who will answer the question of how much is enough. The United States and the Soviet Union are trying to answer that question right now in their strategic arms negotiations.

We know from our own experience via-a-vis the Russians that when two countries are both well-armed they search for alternatives to war. The hopes for a negotiated peace between Israel and the Arabs are based on that principle.

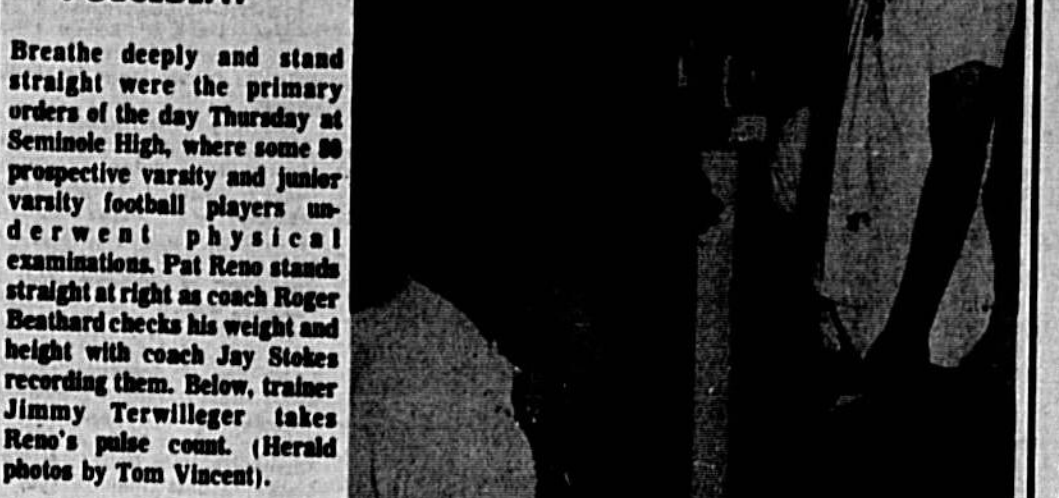

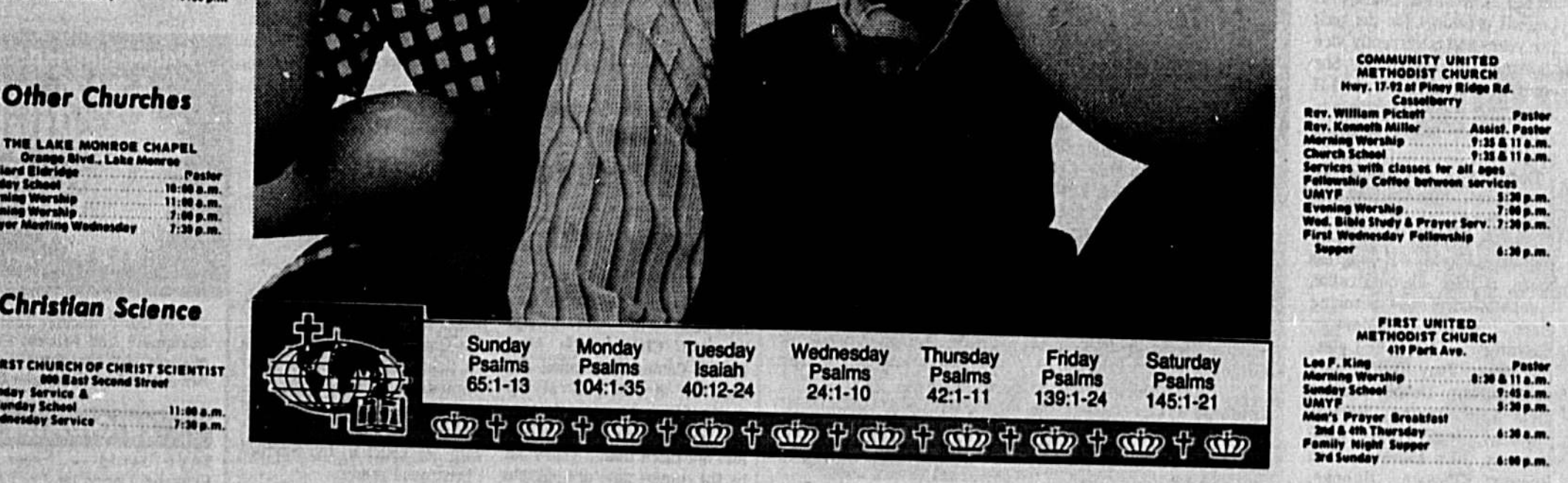
