Israelis Taking Offensive, Push Egyptians Over Canal

Egypt claimed its tanks punched deeper into the Sinai today under cover from warplanes knocking out vital Israeli defenses. Israel said its forces were on the offensive and had destroyed all bridges across the Suez Canal, trapping Egyptian troops in the desert without

The Israeli state radio's authoritative commentator, Maj. Gen. Haim Herzog, said Israeli tanks were slashing toward the canal with fresh crews and said Israel was near a "dramatic turning point" in the three-day-old war.

But an Egyptian communique broadcast by Cairo radio said the Israeli attempt to destroy

cross-canal pontoon assault bridges had failed and Egyptian jets were blasting Israeli airfields in support of advancing Egyptian armor.

A communique from the Syrian military command also reported heavy fighting on the other major front, the Golan Heights near Israel's northeastern border with Syria.

Middle East At-A-Glance

Calls for a meeting of the U.N. Security Council to try to step the new war in the Middle East, and a meeting is expected this afternoon. But a proposal for a cease-fire appeal from the council falls because the Russians, Chinese and other backer, of the Arabs won't agree unless it demands Israel's withdrawal from the territory occupled in the 1967 war. The United States won't agree to that. Israeli Foreign Minister Abba Eban says his government will not accept a ceasefire until the Arab forces are pushed back behind the 1967 cease-fire lines.

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Nixon cuts short his Columbus Day weekend in Florida and returns to the White House because of the Middle East situation. But the United States is reported to have no firm proposal ready for the Security Council, and U.S. officials says an agreement is unlikely because the council appears to be loaded in favor of the Arabs.

TEL AVIV (AP) - An estimated 30,000 to 35,000 tourists are in Israe', but there was no alarmed rush to get out because of the war. Two air raid alarms were sounded Saturday but no planes were sighted, and there are no alarms on Sunday. The Israeil people and their visitors are generally calm.

BEIRUT (AP) - In a show of solidarity with Syria and Egypt, Iraq nationalize the 23.75 per cent holding of two American oil companies, Enxon and Mobil, in the Basrah Petroleum Co. But oil industry sources say the two firms' interest represents only about 7 per cent of Iraq's estimated production of 1.9 million barrels of crude oil a day, and therefore the effect is not significant.



WASHINGTON - Bomb and booby-trap experts from the Central Intelligence Agency have been quietly training foreign police to make explosive devices at an isolated federal school in Texas. The tutelage is so dubious that the Pentagon has refused to have anything to do with it. The cloak-and-dagger professors are on loan from the CIA to the Agency for International Development, which runs the school at the Border Patrol Academy in Los

The existence of the school was first depicted in the movie "State of Siege" in which foreign police were shown being trained to use bombs and booby traps against political opponents. But because the film was propagandistic, few took seriously the reality of the "terror school."

Dubious but curious, Senator James Abourezk, D.S.D., began a quiet investigation. His confidential findings raise quieting questions about America's police aid to military

In one memo wrung from AID by Abourezk. Assistant Administrator Matthey Harvey concedes that the Defense Department refused to teach the bomb course when it was set up in 1969. Therefore, "the Central Intelligence Agency agreed to provide guest lecturers for this portion of the

At the secret school, he says, demonstrations are given of "the construction, use and counter-measures against homemade bombs and explosive devices used by criminal terriorists," The foreign police also get graphic lectures on booby traps, "incendiaries" and other lethal devices. To defuse and dispose of bombs, explains Harvey, a police officer first has to learn ad about them.

The documents obtained by Abourwzk show that most of the 185 policemen trained at the school come from militarybacked regimes such as those in Brazil, Guatemala, Thailand, Uruguay, Panama and El Salvador. Only a thin blue line of cops is trained for the democracies.

AID officials explained to us that they have had fewer requests for the "Technical Investigations Course" from democracies. The bomb-building course, they add, is only part of the curriculum at the Texas hideaway. The visiting police are also taught bomb squad organization, record keeping and a course called "Press Releases and Press

At the CIA, a spokesman said the decision to help with the anti-bomb courses was associated with terrerist attacks on American personnel and facilities in foreign lands. The courses are now being reviewed.

was killed in an airliner crash. They would have died for him. Then the sordid Watergate story was spread across the front pages. They found out that Hunt had collected tens of thousands of dollars in behalf of the Watergate defendants.


But only a few paltry payments ever reached them. He used most of the money to pay his own legal expenses. He is now prepared to testify against the Cubans, whom

he recruited to break into Ellsberg's psychiatrist's office, in return for unmunity for himself.

Israelis Bomb Damascus, Heavy Damage Reported

DAMASCUS, Syria (AP) — Israeli Phantom jets bombed the Syrian Defense Ministry 2nd radio station in Damascus today, heavily damaging the buildings and inflicting casualties. (Related story on Page 1B)

It was the first reported air raid over the capitals of any of the three countries fighting in the fourth Arab-israeli war. Syria immediately
