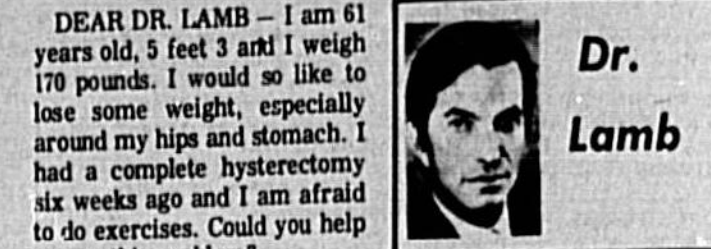

Exercise Smart, Do It Gradually



DEAR DR. LAMB - I am 61 years old, 5 feet 3 and 1/2 inches tall, 170 pounds. I would like to lose some weight, especially around my hips and stomach. I had a complete hysterectomy six weeks ago and I am afraid to do exercises. Could you help me on this problem? I have become very depressed and discouraged. I have high blood pressure and my nerves are all about gone. DEAR READER - It is wise not to do exercises that involve an area where surgery has been done until your doctor tells you it is OK for you. That means you will need to walk on doing six ups and leg lifts. But if you feel fairly good you could start a walking program. Start by walking 15 minutes a day and gradually increase it until you can walk an hour every day. If you have time you may be able to walk even more. The more you can build up your walking program and keep it up the easier it will be for you to lose weight. There is no such thing as spot reducing, despite all the money that is spent on this. If you lose fat you lose it because you are using more calories than you are taking in. Just doing sit ups or leg lifts will not decrease your weight around your hips and stomach unless you are losing fat all over. Such exercises sometimes help lighten up sagging muscles but that is about all. I am sending you my weight losing diet that you can follow in The Health Letter number 4-7. Others who want this issue can send 50 cents with a long, stamped, self-addressed envelope for it. The diet is a balanced 1200 calorie program that works best with doing some regular exercise. DEAR DR. LAMB - I am a man of 69 and have a problem of loss of muscles around my anus pop out after relieving myself and stay out. In order to be comfortable I have to push them back in several times a day. My doctor tells me those are tired muscles and recommends surgery. There are so many drugs and other things to cure some doctor or drug manufacturer would have found a salve or ointment which would make these muscles go back to normal. Please advise me if there is such a salve or ointment so I would not have to have surgery. DEAR READER - You are describing prolapse of the rectum. We all have layers of muscles attached to the large pelvic bones to hold in the abdominal contents. The pelvis is really like a basket with the upper part being the crest of the hip bones, and the bottom being the pubic arch in front and the bony structures you sit on. The bottom from the pubic arch to the areas you sit on are laced with muscles. These go around the rectum and genitalia and also support them. These muscles are also connected to the muscles directly surrounding the rectum. When these muscles get weak a prolapse can occur. There is no medicine for this as it is a mechanical problem. Your doctor is right, the only way the condition can be corrected is by surgery. 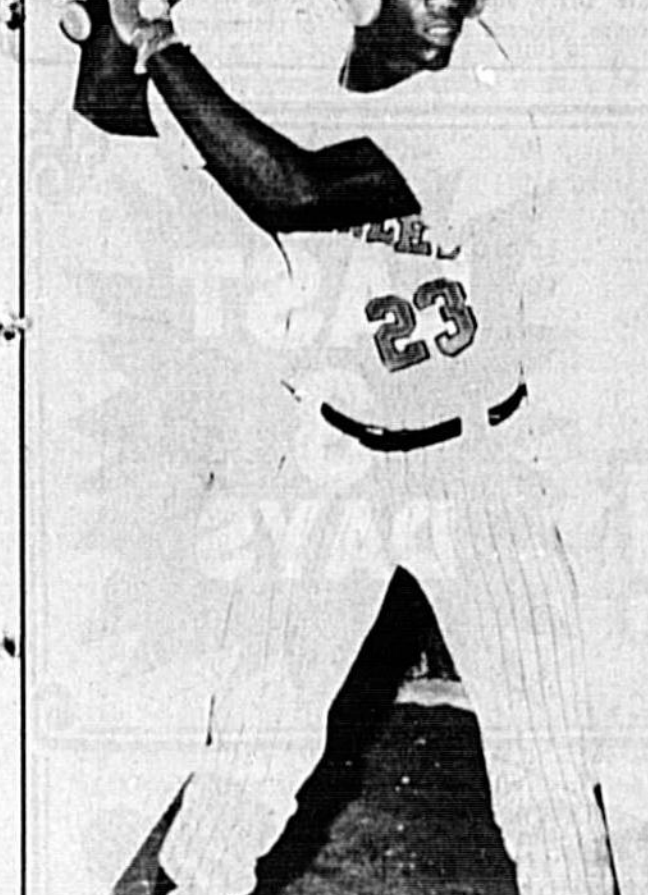

County Approves \$49 Million Project Iron Bridge Sewer Plant Okayed



Orlando City Atty. Egerton van den Berg, in urging approval of the Iron Bridge site, had presented the county commission with a letter pledging Orlando to a 19-point list of concessions to the county, including an annual payment for fire protection, security at the plant and other services the county will provide. The annual payment, which begins at \$50,000 will climb to \$80,000 the fourth year, with increases after that reflecting increases in the federally-compiled consumer price index. DEDER officials testified Tuesday night the plant would improve water quality in the Little Eelockhatchee, which now receives effluent from 11 sewage treatment plants. Those officials and representatives of the federal Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) also testified they would be receptive to alternatives to pouring the effluent into the river. Dr. James Jammal, one of a team of nationally-known environmental experts employed by the City of Orlando, testified the plant would include experimental facilities for studying ways of disposing up to 750,000 gallons of effluent per day into the Little Eelockhatchee. Last Friday French met with representatives of the major agricultural interests in the Orlando area to see if they would be interested in using the effluent on their crops. Their response, said French, was "they'd like to see it done if possible." Another reason French gave for switching his vote was, "If the plant was moved out of Seminole, we'd have no control of it whatsoever." See IRON BRIDGE, Page 3A

Would Offer Home Ownership SHA Eying New Housing Program

The Sanford Housing Authority (SHA) Tuesday discussed what SHA Executive Director Thomas Wilson III termed "additional housing alternatives" in an effort to make home ownership available to low income families. "We will be working on a proposal to provide an alternative solution," said Wilson. "It is a pilot project which would include an application for a federal grant. It will not involve any housing subsidies, but it is a low cost home ownership program," said Wilson, hesitating to further discuss the mechanics of the program at this time. "If we get funded for one year the program can be economically self-sufficient. We will not need further grants from the government," he said, assuring that Sanford residents will benefit from the new units," according to Wilson. "We are not blind to the fact that there are housing needs outside the city, but we cannot continue to address housing needs all over Seminole County," he said, "when citizens who reside within the city of Sanford are in need of housing and are not receiving full benefit of the services provided." The SHA members heard a report by Sanford City Manager W.E. (Pete) Knowles stating that the city has condemned 559 properties in Sanford and several hundred more are occupied despite being dilapidated. Those, he told the group, have not been condemned despite their condition due to the lack of housing. Knowles said that SHA has 2200 applications for housing but city residents are not the ones who are able to benefit due to the fact that about 700 of the applicants reside in the city and the rest throughout the county.

'New' Plan Reaction Mixed

A newly revised version of Seminole County's proposed comprehensive plan development framework received its most positive reception yet from city officials Tuesday night. But officials of three of the county's seven cities expressed objections to the framework. The development framework, a set of policy guidelines which scheduled for preparation this summer, was the subject of a Tuesday night public hearing before the Seminole County Commissioners. The commissioners will conduct another hearing June 21 before voting on the framework. The commissioners intended a May 17 meeting, at which city officials blasted the framework, to be a public hearing, but due to an error in the wording of the newspaper advertisement preceding that meeting, commissioners renamed it a "preliminary" session. Final adoption of the county plan is scheduled for Oct. 1. The framework was revised for the first time by the county's planning staff May 6. Additional staff revisions were prepared Monday. The revisions included a new introduction to the framework, written by Altamonte Springs Mayor Norman Floyd, which replaced the introduction written by the county's planning staff. The staff revisions were intended to provide tighter definitions, remove language objectionable to city officials and make the framework more understandable, said County Planner Bill Kercher. Gay Rights Battle: Was Miami Skirmish Or Waterloo?

'It's Really Lust And Sinfulness'

MIAMI BEACH (AP) - Anita Bryant's smile faded as a leader of the Miami homosexual community appeared on the television screen and claimed a moral victory in coming "out of the closet." "I don't care if you come out of the closet," she snapped at the figure on the screen Tuesday night. "Just don't come into mine." It was a clear warning to communities across the country: efforts to promote laws banning discrimination against homosexuals will be met by Miss Bryant and her organization, Save Our Children, Inc. Miss Bryant helped lead the group to its first victory Tuesday as Dade County residents voted by a 79 per cent margin to repeal an ordinance shielding homosexuals from discrimination in employment and housing. Similar laws exist in about 40 other communities around the nation, and Miss Bryant said they could become targets of campaigns for repeal. She said an initial effort might be mounted in such cities as San Antonio, Tex.; Minneapolis; a number of communities in California, and in Congress, where similar federal legislation is pending. Miss Bryant, 37, was Miss Oklahoma of 1969 and second runner-up Miss America that year. She was a successful pop singer and more recently identified through commercials for Florida citrus products. Her entry into the Dade County campaign helped push the issue to national prominence. She discussed her plans in a victory appearance at a Miami Beach Hotel. Supporters whistled and cheered as she embraced her four children and kissed her husband, Bob Green. Green and Miss Bryant are born-again Christians whose deep belief sometimes gave the Florida campaign the air of an oldtime religious revival. But Miss Bryant said people misconstrued her motivation. "I did not hear an audible voice from God saying 'You are the Joan of Arc.' I stood personally to stop a Dade County ordinance that would affect my personal life," she said. She said repeal of the Dade County ordinance indicates a change of mood in the nation. "Americans have just about had it up to here," she said. "Permissiveness, pornography, abortion, alcohol, drugs—all these things are tearing at the very hearts, minds and lives of our children. Let's all tie in. It's called freedom and love, but it's really lust and sinfulness."

'They Don't Know How To Love'

MIAMI BEACH (AP) - "They hate us for our virtues, not our vices," Leonard Matlovich told 300 homosexual-right supporters Tuesday night. "It's going to take a lot of love to turn this around because they don't know how to love." They were the 202,319 people who voted Tuesday to repeal an ordinance banning housing and job discrimination against homosexuals. The crowd had gathered at the Fontainebleau Hotel to celebrate a victory for homosexual rights. Instead, they held a wake, singing civil rights songs and listening to speeches urging them to keep fighting. They had danced to a rock band and helped themselves to a free buffet while watching election results on three large video projectors. But the mood sobered as the first precincts reported in. "When you walk out of here tonight I want you to go with your head held high and your shoulders back," said Matlovich, who gained national prominence when he fought discharge from the Air Force for being a homosexual. "Be proud you're a gay and don't let anyone put you down because of it," he said as the group joined hands and sang "We Shall Overcome." Jack Campbell, chairman of the campaign to save the ordinance, said the defeat did not signal an end to the fight for homosexual rights in Dade County. "We've unified the gay community and brought national attention to the issue," said Campbell, who mentioned a court challenge as the group's next possible step. But others at the Fontainebleau said they feared a backlash against homosexuals as a result of the vote. "I wouldn't be surprised to see some attempts at reprisals," said Rev. Joseph Gilbert, pastor of the Metropolitan Community Church of Miami. "But liberation takes place in your head so that sort of thing can't hurt us." Campbell, who identified himself as a homosexual, said he didn't think the election was a total defeat. "This campaign has taught the gays that it is possible to function as a community," he said. "I'm here to demonstrate a love and let live attitude to others," said Sarah Compton, who identified herself as a "heterosexual with a great deal of compassion for gays."





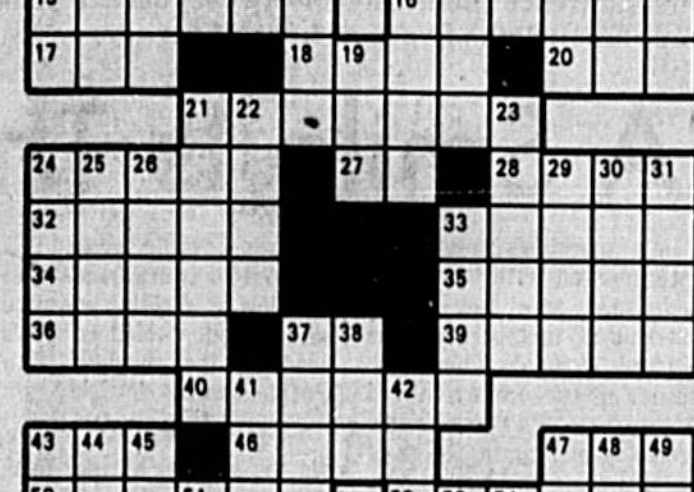

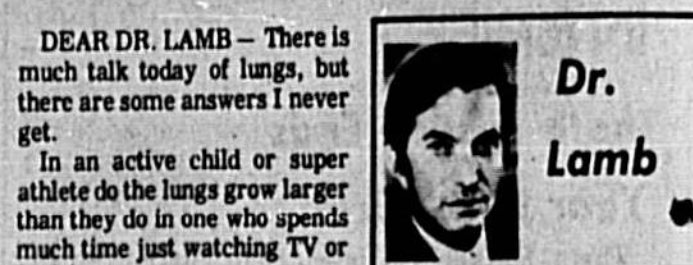

### Lungs Expand With Activity



DEAR DR. LAMB - There is much talk today of lungs, but there are some answers I never get. In an active child or super athlete do the lungs grow larger than they do in one who spends much time just watching TV or reading? If a mature person with large lung capacity leads an inactive life does he or she breathe less deeply? Do parts of the lungs go dead? Does the blood from say the hands, get renewed by going to a certain part of the lungs only? When one lung is removed can the other really do a complete job? We read of over ventilation, what happens with under ventilation? DEAR READER - The lungs have a range of capacity. When you are sitting still you need far less oxygen than when you are jogging. In those circumstances the lungs need ventilate only as much air as needed to provide that small amount of oxygen. When you are exercising or working hard the body needs more oxygen and the lungs exchange more air to provide the increased amount of oxygen. Since the lungs are really storage chambers for air it is true that exercising them to the maximum will help improve their capacity. That is why a vigorous athlete tends to have a greater lung capacity than a sedentary individual. This won't make any difference when they are both sitting still but the guy with unexercised lung may not be able to sustain as much vigorous work for a long period of time as the athlete. However this effect is not noticed with short periods of exertion. No, blood from the hands or any particular part of the body does not go to just one part of
