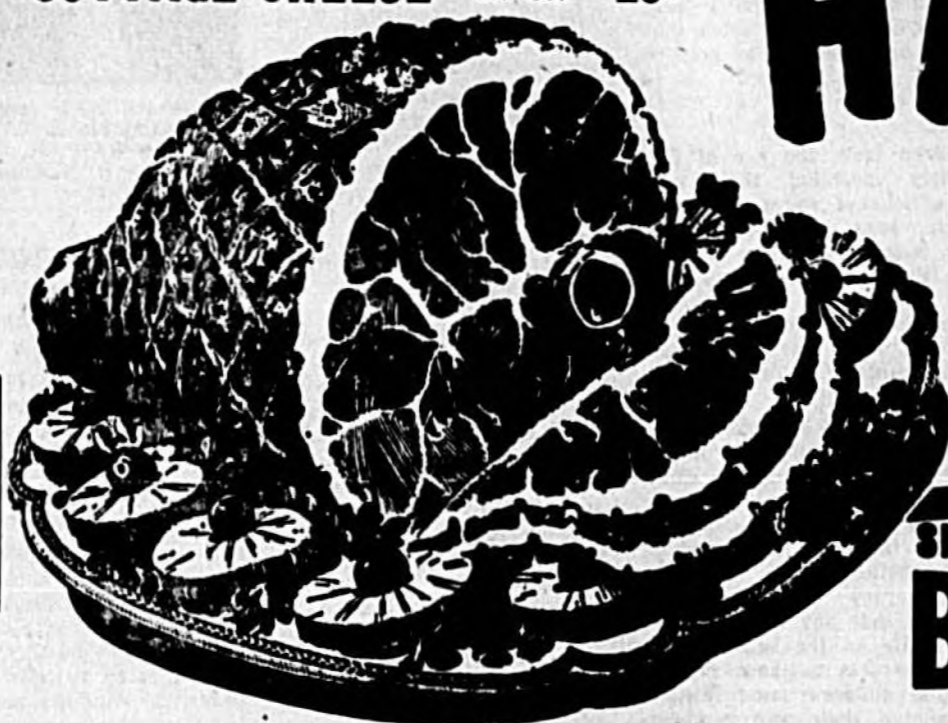

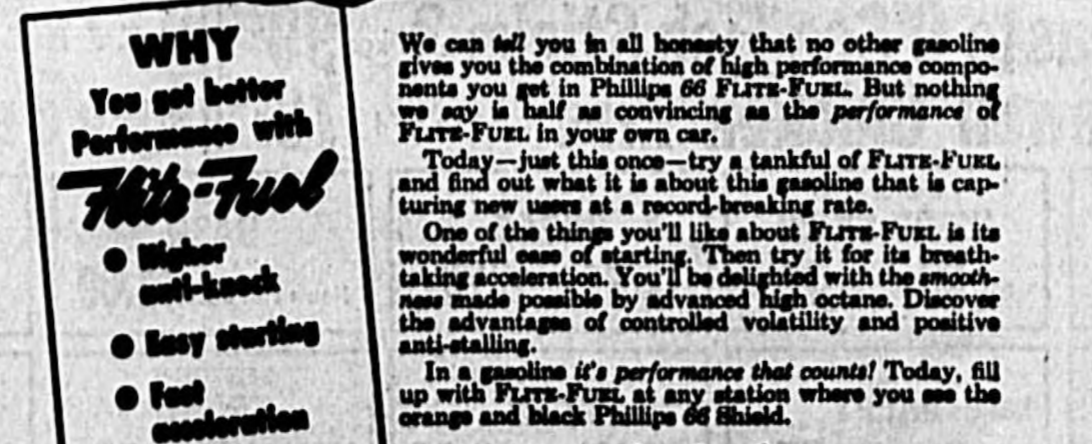

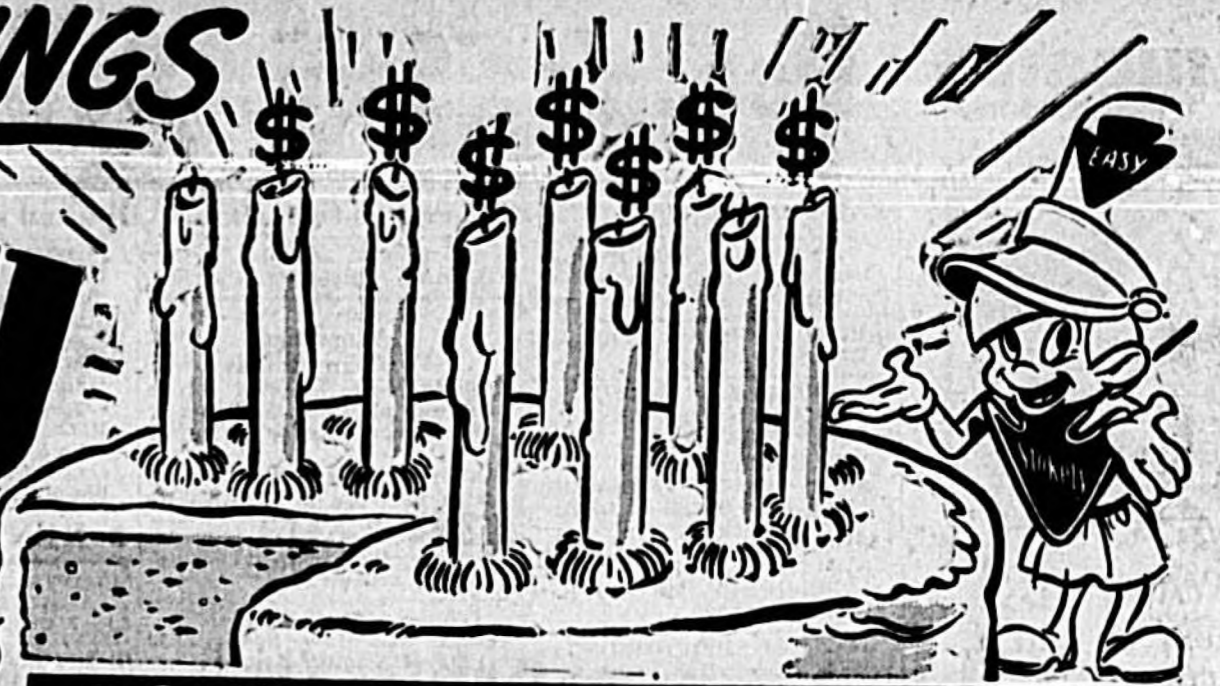

A wild chase through Seminole County roads and palmetto thickets finally ended in the stopping of a car last night and the driver taken into custody following a hit and run incident in Lake Mary. A warrant for the arrest of John Henry Poff has been signed by Mrs. J. A. Chalkley Sr., in the wake of the incident. Charges piled up against the 21-year-old Lake Mary youth as Florida Highway Patrolman Carl Williams filed the complaints at the Seminole County Sheriff's office.

Williams chased the 1948 Chevrolet Station wagon after he had been sighted by members of the family in the car that had been hit. The car, driven by Poff, was sighted near the Movieland Ride-In Theatre. Williams stated that his speed, throughout the chase, was between 75 and 90 miles an hour. Both the Seminole County Sheriff's Department and the Sanford Police Department were alerted and took part in the chase. Deputy Sheriff Bob Carroll's car, at 20th St. and the old Lake Mary road was nearly hit as an attempt to block the road was made. The chase went along the old Lake Mary road from 17-92 into Lake Mary, back through the Lake Mary road to 20th St., out Southwest Road and back again, finally bringing the car to a stop at the city limits on 20th St. Red lights flashing and siren sounding, as well as spot lights, failed to stop the speeding car as the youth, who admitted to Patrolman Carl Williams that he "had a couple of beers", attempted to get away. Patrolman Carl Williams stated that charges of improper tag, reckless driving, willful and wanton, hit and run, and resisting arrest, will be filed against Poff.
