Watching the parade with Castro were some 500 Reds from Asia, Africa and Latin America, invited to Havana for a so-called "tri-continental conference" scheduled to open tonight.

of potential shrinkage. Wool fibers, fo example, are extremely sensitive to his temperatures. The weave of a fabric responsible for the greatest shrinkag factor. Most woolens today are pre shrunk. But even so, your cleaner must take great care to determine and maintain as far as possible

a germent's original size and shape. Cropo weaves have a marked tendency to shrink or stretch. The crope effect is formed by tightly twisted threads running in one direction. How much a crope fabric will shrink or stretch depends on whether the fibers have been overstretched during the finishing process. If overstretched the fabric is almost cortain to shrink. If too little stretching has taken place to give a heavy eroped effect, the fabric will most likely stratch from ordinary weer and cleaning.
