Seminole Memorial Hospital spokesman Mrs. Becky Giles, reported that figures for December revealed that 53 patients were emitted to the hospital as a result of flu-related illnesses. Of those 36 were from Seminole County and 16 from Volusia County. The flu-like illness seemed to strike an almost equal number of "Thirty-four percent of the people we admitted in December were 13-years old or younger and 41 percent were over \$1." she

Figures for the first three weeks in January indicate a shift to more serious flu-like illness among the older age group. Of those admitted for flu-like illnesses through the first three weeks in January, 65 percent were over 51 years of age and 18 percent were under 12 years of age. 

Few pension systems are as generous as those of the military services.

Retirees can draw half of their base pay after only 20 years of service — two-thirds of the maximum payable after 30 years. They make no direct contribution to the retirement system.

Contemplated revisions would drastically reduce benefits payable short of 30 years service or defer pension payments until age 60 or limit benefits for those who retire before reaching 55. The potential savings under the several proposals amount to anywhere from \$11 billion to \$36 billion by the year 2000.
