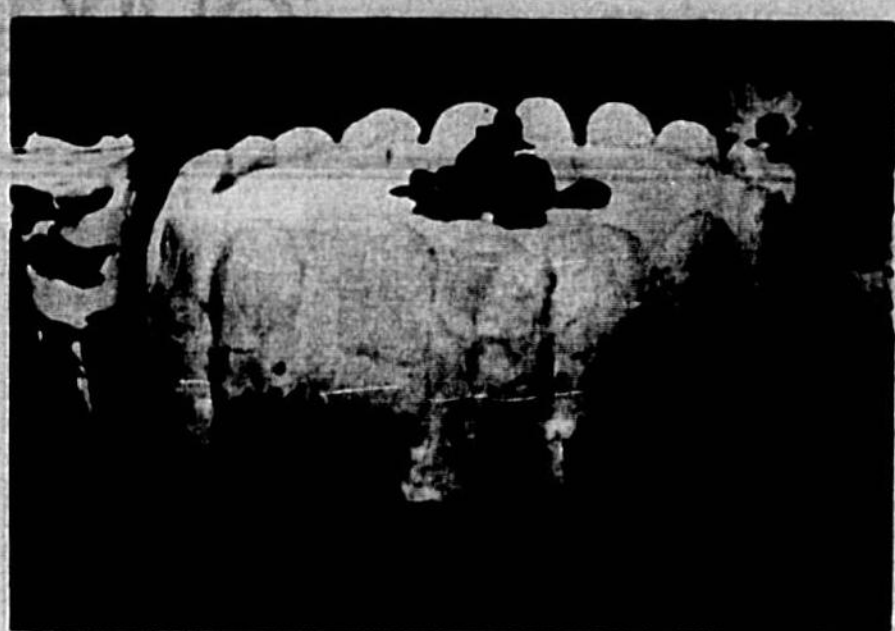

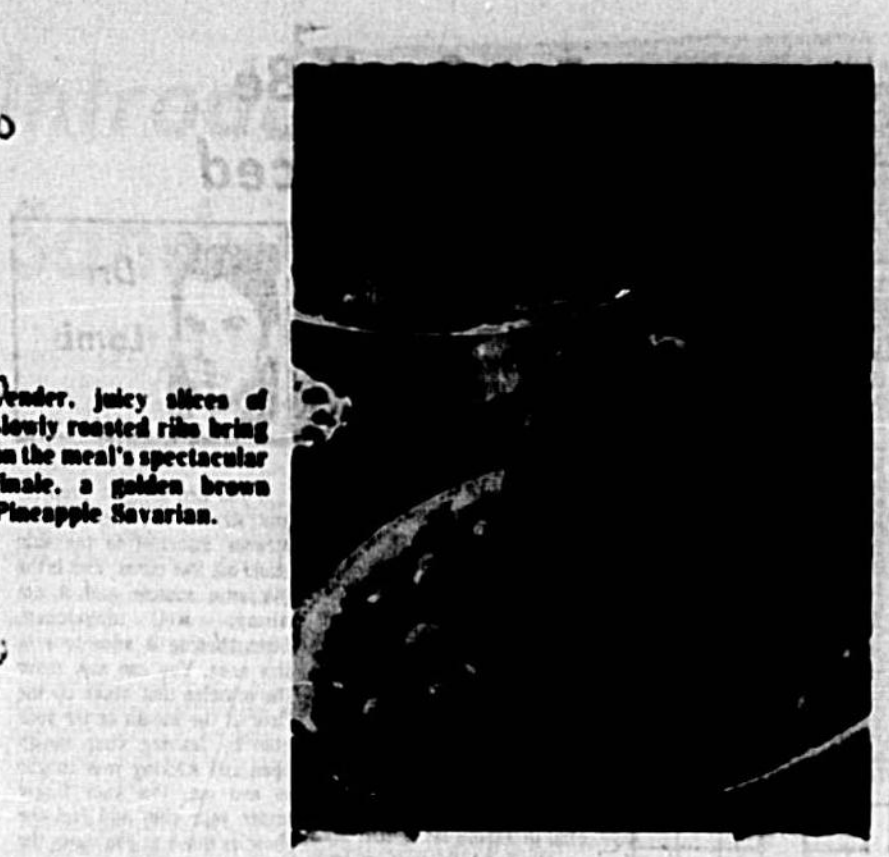
In the spring of 1977, the Senate Select Committee on Nutrition and Human Needs released a staff report entitled "Dietary Goals For The United States." They were prompted by many health statistics, among them being the alarming incidence of coronary heart disease, considered the most serious health problem in the United States today causing nearly 600,000 deaths each year.

The major cause of heart attacks and strokes is atherosclerosis, the accumulation of fatty materials — rich in cholesterol — in the walls of the arteries. And diet is recognized as a major risk factor in coronary heart disease. Diet can also affect the way only three million Americans who have high blood pressure.

These "dietary goals" included six points. Americans should increase carbohydrate consumption to account for 60 to 65 percent of the (caloric) intake and reduce overall fat consumption from approximately 60 to 50 percent of energy intake.

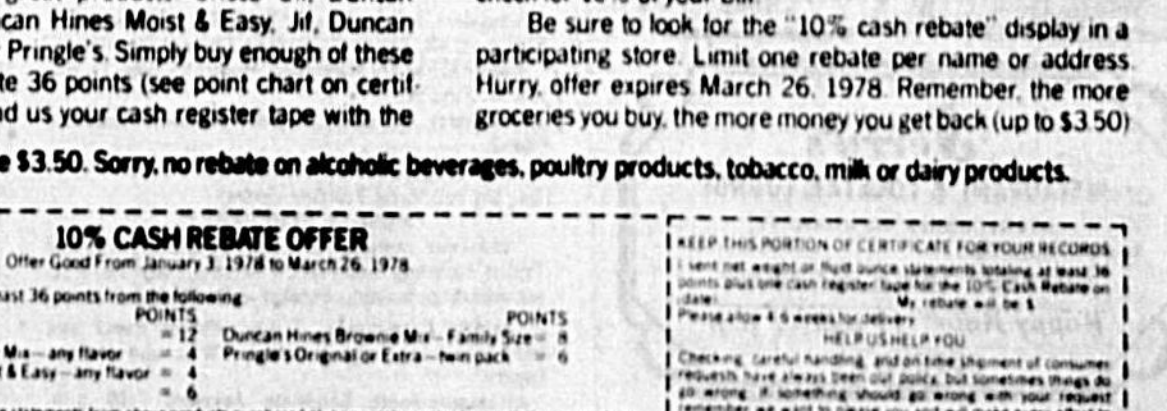

EEOC-Sanford Pact Unfair To Officers, Principals Claiming

Charges of racial discrimination have come back to haunt Sanford officials. Two investigators from the Miami office of the federal Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) who were at Sanford city hall Wednesday indicated there may be problems with a pre-determination settlement signed by the city commission and EEOC last June.

The investigators are John Clure and Dwight Weaver. The city commission will discuss the situation at its Monday night meeting at 7 p.m. at city hall, said City Manager W. E. Knowles. Also to be discussed at the meeting is a city staff draft of an affirmative action plan designed to increase the number of blacks, women and Hispanics working for the city, Knowles said.

At issue, according to Knowles, are new complaints by two black Sanford police officers whose 1976 complaints led to the agreement with EEOC last June. The two are Tony L. Brooks, fired by former Sanford Police Chief Ben Butler last March 15 for failing to report to work on March 5, according to city records, and John C. Moore, who resigned from the police department last May 3.

Both were reinstated as part of the June 1977 agreement between Sanford and the EEOC, with Brooks assigned to the Federal Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) Task Force based in Orlando and Moore assigned to the police department's animal control division.

Moore was terminated after exhausting his sick leave earlier this year, said Knowles.

"I think the charges by the two are more serious than n-kicking," Clure said.

Moore suffered a heart attack sometime before September and hasn't worked since," the city manager said.

Moore was granted additional leave but was still not able to return to work, Knowles said.

These are the officers' new complaints, according to Knowles. Moore has complained that he thought he would be assigned to the canine corps—patrolling the city with police dogs—rather than to the animal control or "dog catcher" division.

Brooks has told EEOC investigators he no longer has a key to the Sanford police station and that he no longer receives police department memoranda and other communications.

"You want to reopen the agreement because John Moore isn't happy," Knowles told the investigators after their meeting.

"I will not comment with reporters present," Weaver answered Knowles. The city manager and Weaver agreed to meet Friday at 8 a.m. in city hall.

Asked by reporters if he and Weaver were here to discuss former policeman Moore's situation, Clure said he had no comment. "I'm retiring from EEOC Friday, and Mr. Weaver is taking over this case," Clure said.

Knowles telephoned Mayor Leo P. Moore after the EEOC investigators left Knowles' office. Brooks and Moore want more added to the agreement, to clarify it. The EEOC people say they thought officer Moore was being assigned to the canine corps—not the animal control division," Knowles told the mayor.

"It seems John Moore didn't understand what he was getting into when he signed the agreement," he said.

In State Unemployment Benefits

Ex-Official May Have To Repay \$3,198

Ralph Fisher, Longwood's public works director for 11 years before he was fired by the majority of the city council in September, 1976, may have to repay to the state the \$3,198 he was paid in unemployment

compensation. In a letter, dated Feb. 16 from the state Department of Commerce, unemployment compensation board of review office in Tallahassee, Fisher was notified that the board had reversed a decision which granted unemployment compensation of \$3 weekly for 30 weeks.

Fisher received the final check from the state last summer. "I don't know what I'm going to do," said Fisher, who has been unemployed since losing his job with the city. "I really can't afford to retain an attorney to fight this for me in the appellate court."

The notice received by Fisher said he has 30 days from Feb. 16 to file an appeal of the board's review decision in the appellate court.

"If he does not appeal, the board of review decision will become final and he will be disqualified based on the board's order," said a spokesman of the appeal division of the Department of Commerce in Tallahassee today.

"That will create an overpayment of unemployment compensation. The overpayment division will receive the case and it will be its determination as to whether or not the claimant will be required to reimburse the fund for overpayment," the spokesman said.

The board of review in reversing the decision claims that Longwood's city attorney, Ned Julian Jr., was not given notice of a second hearing but

Jan. 4 wherein Fisher appealed Longwood's contention that he should not receive the compensation.

At that hearing, City Clerk Onie Shonate carrying city records in hand said that Julian instructed her to appear at the hearing.

In accepting the resignation with deep regret the council agreed that a special meeting will be held either Tuesday or Wednesday to appoint someone to fill the unexpired term.

"Perhaps regret is not the right word," said Mayor Troy Piland. "I hate to see you leave. I hate to see any elected official resign." But, Piland added that Sines may be relieved not to have to spend so much time being con-

cerned by the city. Piland said he will announce the date of the special meeting later this week.

Sines was originally appointed to the city council on July 26, 1976 to fill the unexpired term of John Booth who resigned. In the December, 1976 election he won a full two-year term.

Prior to the resignation announcement, Sines was unable to get approval from the board to proceed with appointment of a charter study commission. A project he has been pushing for the past six weeks.

A resolution to create the committee was tabled indefinitely on a vote of 3-2 with Councilman John Sabatini joining with Sines in opposing the delay.

Councilmen John Daniels, Laurent Pellerin and Bert Logan opposed voting in the resolution which would have given the five-member committee the task of studying a "change in the form of government."

Leffler Pleads Not Guilty

Attorney Jack Bridges of the Sanford Law firm of Cleveland, Mizra and Bridges filed "not guilty" pleas on behalf of Circuit Judge Kenneth Leffler on a variety of charges leveled against the judge by Longwood police Sunday night.

Leffler was arrested by Longwood police Sunday night and given citations charging the judge had violated the city's ordinance banning the dumping of refuse, had an expired license tag on the trailer attached to his car and that he refused to sign a citation.

Bridges' partner, Mack N. Cleveland Jr., said today Bridges filed not guilty pleas "to all pending charges whatever they are. We are going to contest the entire thing," he said.

Under state law, the state attorney's office is in charge of prosecuting all city arrests.

Sadat Vows Counter-Act Will Resound

CAIRO, Egypt (UPI)—President Anwar Sadat says Egypt will seek vengeance for the slaying of an Egyptian editor and 15 commandos, inflicting "10 blows for every single blow" delivered against his nation.

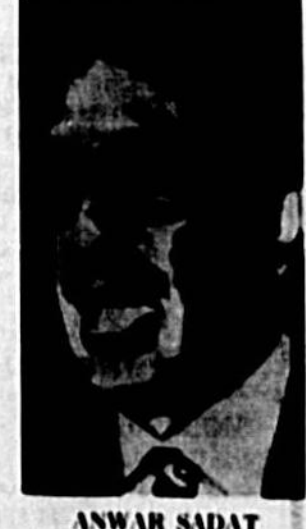
Sadat delivered an angry address Wednesday at the burial of the commandos who were killed by Cypriot National Guardsmen as they attempted to free hostages held by the Palestinian terrorists. The two gunmen on Saturday killed the Egyptian editor.

Sadat broke off all relations with Cyprus charging President Spyros Kyprianou's government, and possibly the Palestine Liberation Organization, were involved in a conspiracy that led to the deaths.

"Egypt will deal 10 blows for every single blow directed at it," Sadat said. "We shall go to the end of the world to punish anyone harming Egypt's dignity or its sons."

The rupture of diplomatic ties was only the first step in a series of measures Egypt would take against the tiny island state, the official newspaper Al-Ahram said today.

Shortly after Sadat announced Cairo was withdrawing its recognition of the Nicosia government, Cypriot Ambassador Antis Sotirides was summoned to the Foreign Ministry and informed of an Egyptian decision to "break off all relations between the two countries."
