

# Dad, Two Kids As Hostages

robber threatening to fire a pistol "into this kid's head and then his father's" and demanding "a car and no tail", early today bartered with police for the lives of two children and a man he is holding hostage in a

The bank robber, known as "Then" took Robert Herrman of Eldorado, Ohio, and his two sons, Rob, 10 and Mike, 6, hostage at a store in Richmond, Ind., following an un-successful bank robbery in which his accomplice, Richard E. Baher, 44, Springfield, Ohio, was shot and wounded.

Baher was arrested and taken to a Richmond, Ind., hospital.

The bank robber, who uses the CB handle "Silver Streak", talked through the night over his citizens band radio to local authorities, Ohio Highway Patrolmen and

FBI agents, from the car. The car has all four tires shot out and i parked on Ohio 35 a short distance from the exit ramp of Interstate 70 near this western Ohio community of 6,000. About 30 law enforcement officers have sealed off all roads to

# 'Police' Telephone Solicitors 'Cause Of Confusion'

Sanford officials want to straighten out what they feel is confusion over the fund-raising efforts of an Orlando-based policemen's group. Telephone solicitors representing Central Police Benevolent Association have been calling Sanfordites to sign them up to buy tickets to a policemen's ball scheduled for May 6 at Exposition Hall in Orlando.

The group is not affiliated with Sanford Police Benevolent

In fact, Central PBA operates under three names, explains the group's president, Orlando policeman Stephen Micciche.

Association, which held its own annual policeman's hall last December, according to Sanford Police Chief Wallace N

"Most people know us as Orange County PBA, but we've changed our name to LEO, which stands for Law Enforcement Officers Inc. LEO does business under the fictitious name Centra PBA," Micciche says. "Professional telephone solicitors hired by As Orange County PBA, the group has been involved in an attempt to unionize Sanford's police department, says Micciche. The group has several members who are Sanford policemen, according to Micciche.

"We'd like to let the people know that this group does not represent Sanford PBA and that there's no policemen's ball scheduled for May at Sanford Civic Center," says City Manager W.E. Knowles. The city manager was notified of possible confusion by the public when he received a call Tuesday from City Commissioner Julian Stenstrom.

Stenstrom is publicity director of Cardinal Industries, whose Sanford plant is located at 3701 S. Sanford Ave. Apparently unaware he was talking to a city commissioner, the telephone olicitor asked Stenstrom if his firm would like to buy tickets to the policemen's ball in May, Stenstrom said.

Stenstrom declined and notified City Manager Knowles, Police Chief LaPeters and Greater Sanford Chamber of Commerce LaPeters said he felt comments from his department are

necessary to put the matter into perspective "I think the public at least needs to know they are being asked to buy tickets to a function put on by a Central Florida

Organization and not by the Sanford Police Department. "We have four or five of our men who apparently are members of the group, but they may or may not be involved in selling tickets. I'm not implying there's anything wrong. I simply feel the public needs to know specifically who is selling the tickets so no one is misled into buying tickets thinking they're doing so in support of the Sanford Police Department."

Micciche said he agrees with the chief's statement but says his group has "at least double the membership in Sanford Police Department the chief says we have."

Police officers aren't selling tickets, Micchehe said. "The telephone solicitors we hire don't represent any police department. They represent members of our organization who are



# Judge Asks Murderer: Why, Why?

LOS ANGELES (UPI) - "Why? Why all the murders?" Many others have pondered that question. Kearney, who police say has confessed 32 "trashbag killings," may be the bloodiest single mass murderer in U.S. history. His guilty plea Tuesday to 18 murder charges brought his second life sentence.

"I have some obligation to the 18 people you silenced," the judge said. "Their families want to know why. Can you "I prefer not to answer, your honor," Kearney replied.

Prosecutors, answering for him, said he told psychiatrists he was motivated by homosexual desires, estering resentments and the idea that "killing someone sounded sexually exciting." The victims were all boys - one only 5 years old and another 6 - and young men up to 28, many of them teen-

age homosexual drifters. Commenting that Kearney's case "illustrates the need for the death penalty," Muncipal Court Judge Dickran Tevrizian Tuesday accepted Kearney's guilty plea to 18 murder charges.

Because a Municipal Court judge cannot impose a prison term, Kearney immediately was taken before Superior C o u r t Judge Paul G. Breckenridge, who sentenced him to life, saying he hoped the record of "ghastly, grisly horrible crimes" will persuade future parole hearings to keep Kearney behind bars until he dies. "It certainly appears the defendant is fully deserving of whatever punishment the court can prescribe," Breckenridge declared.

"He appears to be an insult to humanity."

The 38-year-old former aerospace worker from Redondo Beach, Calif., earlier was sentenced in Riverside, Calif., to life for three killings. Police have said the 32 killings would make him the bloodiest mass murderer in U.S. history, surpassing the 25

victims attributed to Juan Corona in Yuba City, Calif, and the 27 attributed to a homosexual group in Houston. Kearney said he was influenced by the Houston slayings and kept a scrapbookbook on the case, authorities said. The murders were dubbed "the trashbag killings" because his victims, or pieces of their dismembered bodies, were found beside roads throughout a five-county area of Southern California from 1968 to 1977. The bodies of five youths he said he killed have not been found, and probably never will be, detectives said.

Precident Carter is wreetling with his next move in dealing with the prelenged, record-long coal strike by 160,000 miners. He has three options available: binding arbitration, mine seisure or involving of the Taft-Hartley Act, forcing the miners back to work for 80 days as talks continue. Mr. Carter is getting advice from every side.

Even former President Ford is getting into the act.

He is advecating use of Taft-Hartley. United Mine Workers president Arnold Miller shams the suggestion, warning that such a move would result in chaes and bloodshed.

The break this week — the signing of a contract negatiated by coal miners working for Pittsburg and Midway Coal Co. in Kentucky, Kanaas and Missouri — could be the spur to end the whole

It could break the impasse. Thus far, it hasn't, but it would be wise for Mr. Carter to wait a little longer to see what impact it does have before stepping in with anything as drastic as Taft-Hartley or federal mine seizure.

# **Dumping:** Productivity Question

Japanese are "dumping" steel in the United States. "Dumping" is the term used to describe selling in foreign markets at a price below cost, with the exporter's government underwriting the

difference one way or another.

Thus far, the U.S. Government has resist appeals to take retalistory action. Whether or not Japanese steel makers have been dumping in the United States, what alls the American steel industry is more complicated. Take labor costs, for example. In 1976 U.S. steel industry labor costs averaged \$12.22 an hour, compared with Japan's \$6.31. Since then the steel industry here has agreed to a wage contract that will increase years. In 1977, steelworkers averaged \$12.75 an hour compared with workers in all U.S.

manufacturing who got \$7.79. But don't jump on labor as the sole villain. There are other factors in our steel industry's dismal decline. The drop has been in almost direct proportion to the decline in capital investment in U.S. industry. This, in turn, has mean reduced demand for steel. 




# Want to cut down on your electric bill? Check your plumbing.

That's right. Your plumbing. And you can with your hot water heater. Next to airconditioning, it's often the second biggest user of electricity in the home.

But its cost can be substantially reduced. By simply adjusting the setting on your water heater thermostat. To between 120 and 130 degrees. Or, if you have a large family or dishwasher, place the setting at 140. Any higher and you're probably wasting money.

If you insulate your water heater with a blanket of fiberglass, you could save even more. Up to 75¢ a month. It may not sound like much, but every little bit helps. And if you're going on a trip, turn your water heater off until you return. It'll save money. Even if you're away for only

savings could be quite significant. Some other helpful hints? Take showers instead of baths. A bath uses twice as much water as a shower. And when you shave, or rinse the dishes, don't let the hot water run. You could be pouring a lot of water down the drain. What's more, if you have to replace your shower heads, install flow restrictors to reduce the rate of water flow.

Finally, you can recover wasted heat by utilizing the hot refrigerant gas from the airconditioner compressor to heat the water. This new technique could eliminate water heating altogether in the summer. But be sure to consult a licensed air-conditioning contractor.
