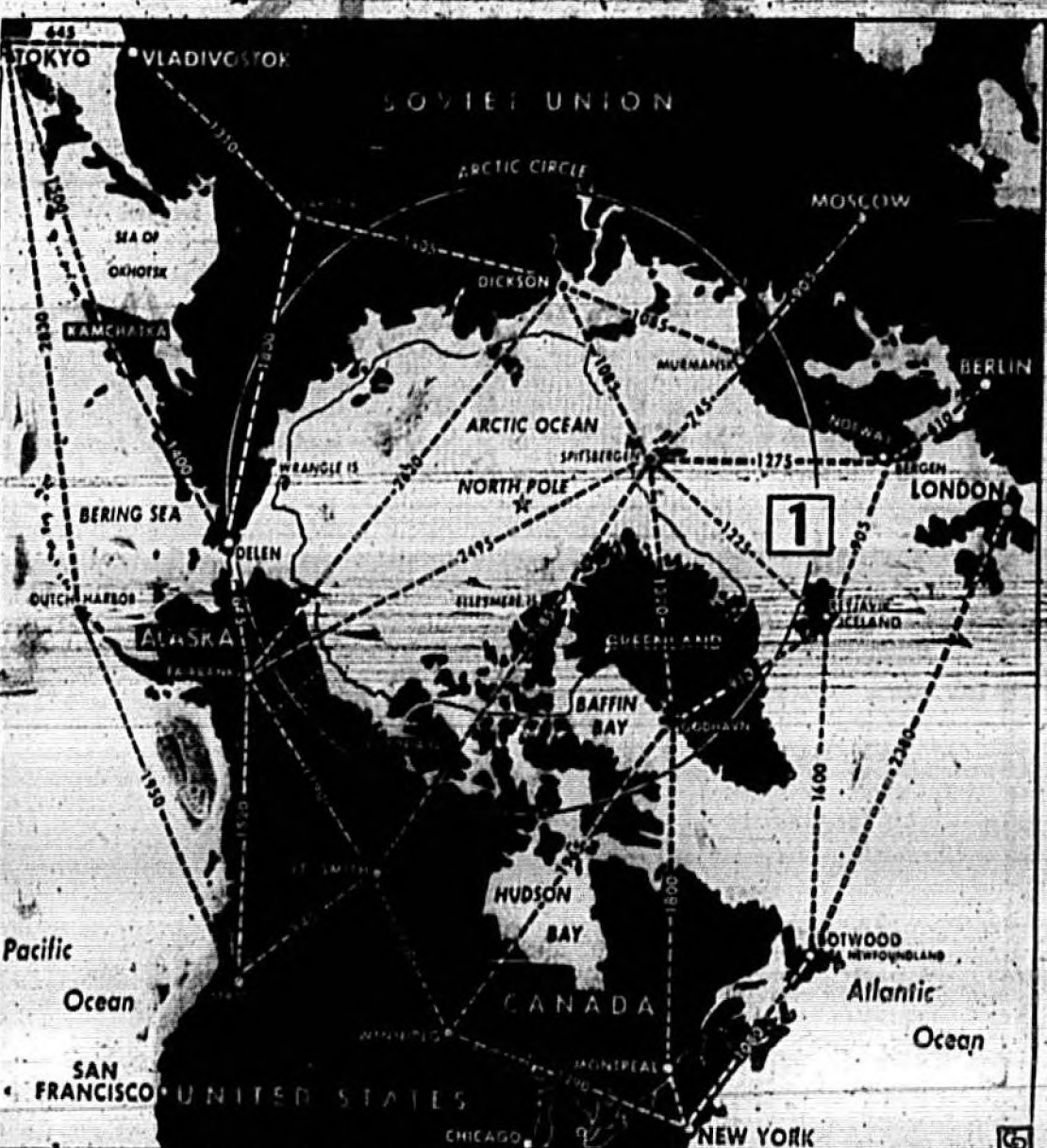

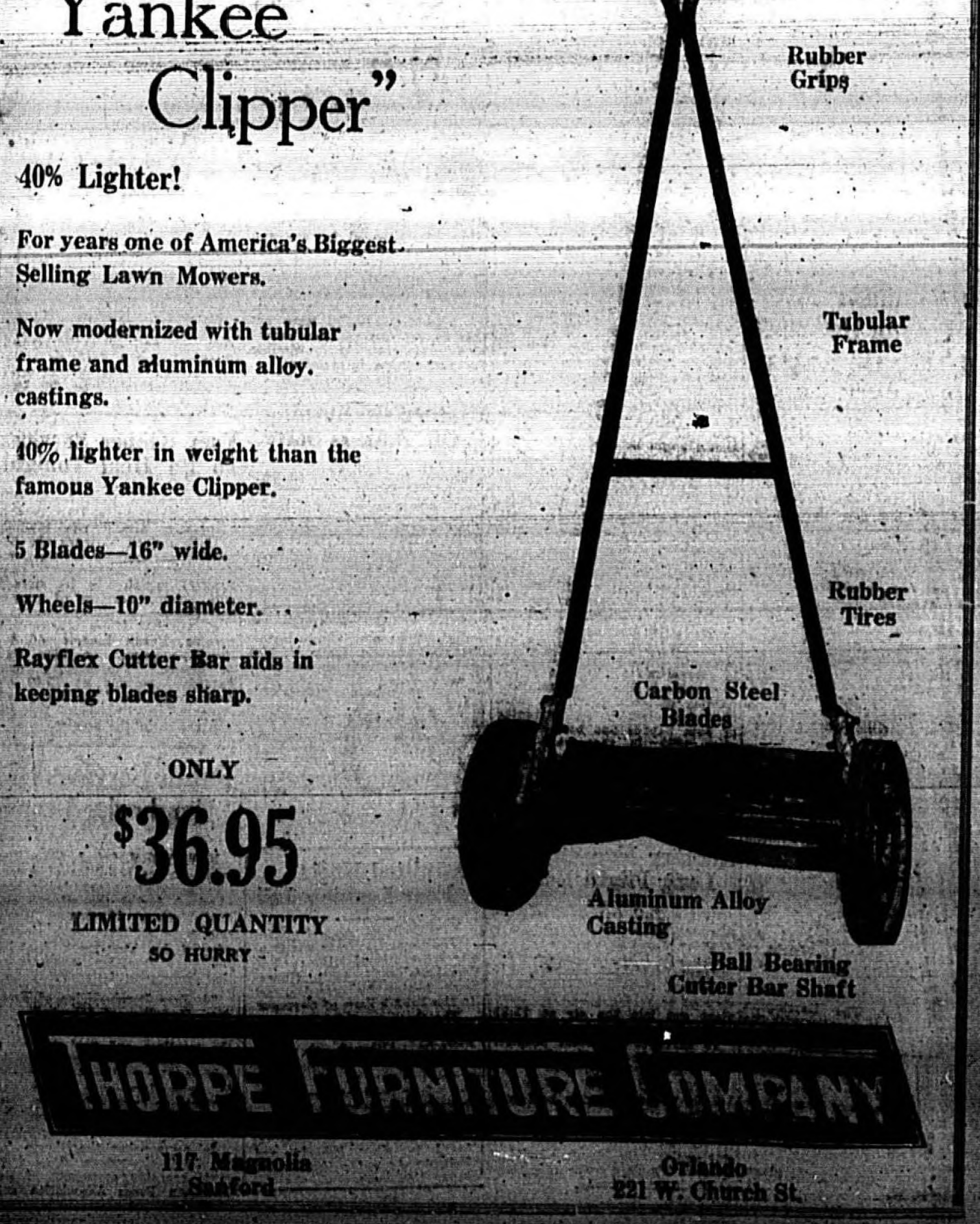

The Fighting Gators
When the University of Florida's fighting Gators meet the Tulane Green Wave in New Orleans Saturday afternoon, the two teams will be meeting for their ninth tilt in a series that began in 1935.

The records show that Florida won the opener by a 14 to 7 margin, were defeated in 1917 by a 52 to 0 count, lost in 1919 and '20, won in 1922, lost both in 1934 and 1935, and tied them last year 6 to 6.

Saturday Bear Wolf's charges will meet an outstanding Green Wave team who held the powerful Alabama to a 6-7 score.

During the first of this week the "B" squad has been running plays similar to those used by the Greys and, according to Wolf, the Florida boys' defensive work looked none too good.

The offensive looked much better than it did prior to the Mississippi tilt and much of the fumbling that occurred in the tilt has been eliminated.

Whitey McMullen, sports editor of the Gainesville Sun, is quite optimistic over the chances of the 1946 edition of the Florida Gators. He has this to say: Florida's 13-7 loss to Mississippi last Saturday has brought about widespread comment and much diversified opinion as to what the Gator boosters can look forward to in the way of future results. Many have, unjustly, turned thumbs down on Coach Bear Wolf and his staff on the one-gam-

showing. Others, more optimistic, look for the Gators to show rapid improvement.

Still others, more far-seeing anticipate a rough season, but with a Gator eleven by the end of the season that will be tough to fudge.

To the remaining group the Gators are as much a question mark as they were before the Mississippi game.

Wolf has long warned against over-optimism and repeatedly stated that the youthful Gator squad was in for a shock when they ran up against an experienced team.

The Spartans received their first shock Saturday night.

More shocks are in store for the boys, but somewhere along the line they will suddenly "catch on" and then they will be in a position to hand out shocks instead of taking them.

Frankly, I expected them to defeat Mississippi.

I believe Wolf expected them to win, and that the athletes themselves expected a victory was no secret to anyone who watched or talked to the gridder.

Ed Danforth, Atlanta Journal writer, referred to the Gator camp as a "Boy Scout camp" and Harry Mohr, former Mississippi coach, commented that Wolf should point for the "1951" season with the goals of youngsters that he has on hand.

All of which adds up to the fact that no matter which after first game group you fell into you must realize the problem facing the Gators is no simple one.

A sensible attitude to assume toward all future games is one of not expecting too much, but at the same time looking for continued improvement with an eye cocked for the explosion that will be heard when the leads catch fire and win a couple of these "impossible ones."

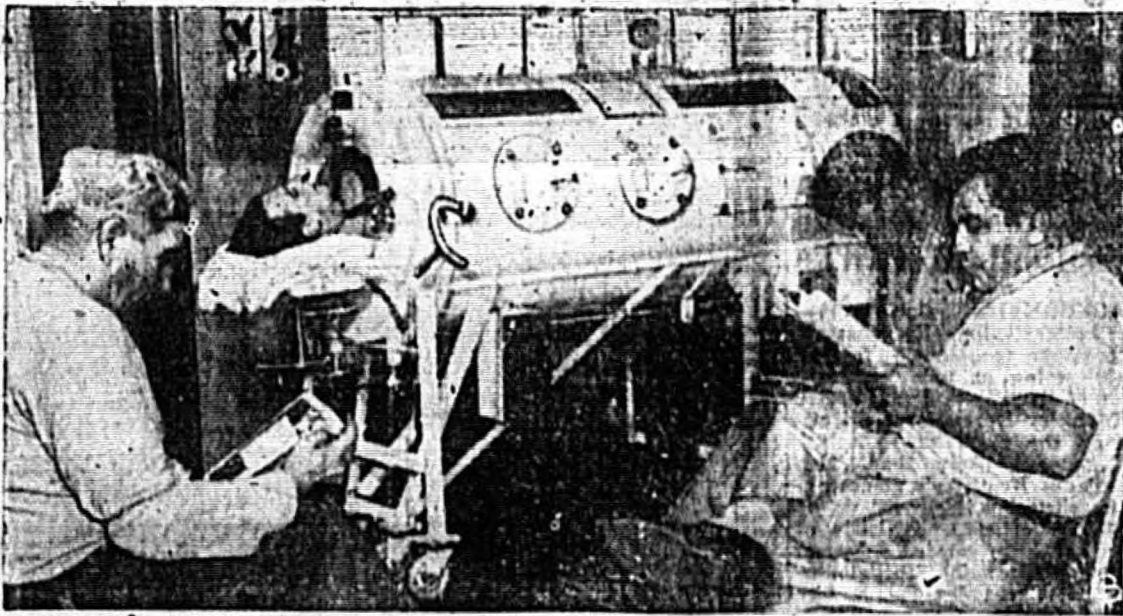

Fire Toll In The United States Is Setting New Records Annually

 NEW YORK—Every year, on the average, 10,000 persons are burned to death in the United States; 350,000 homes are destroyed or damaged; enough timber to build 200,000 five-room houses is wiped out in forest areas equal to the size of Kentucky—and the National Board of Fire Underwriters, in supplying

year is running far above those averages.
 President Truman, proclaiming Fire Prevention Week beginning next Sunday, declared that "fires threaten to exact the greatest toll of lives and the greatest waste of material resources that our nation has ever experienced."
 Within seven months a total of \$8,045,000 in fire losses was run-

up for 1946, the underwriters organization announced, and on the basis of past experience that board foresees an all-time record of some \$600,000,000 in prospect for the calendar year. The first seven months alone, exceeded the total for any entire preceding year from 1935 to 1942.

Yet, fire prevention has been one of the most difficult ideas to promote, and the story of its progress is a story of saving people from their own folly.

"Until recently, there was active opposition at the very mention of fire prevention," says W. E. Mallalieu, general manager of the underwriters' board. "Fire departments sometimes felt that any campaign for fire prevention would cost firemen their jobs, business men thought it was a movement to save money for insurance companies."

"Although man has used fire and studied it since prehistoric times, his thought always had been directed toward controlling its spread once it had started. The concept of preventing fires in order to save life and property dates only from after the Civil War."

At that time, Mallalieu pointed out, the record showed fire losses to have more than doubled in one year. They soared from \$23,000,000 in 1854 to \$49,000,000 in 1865, and "most of those fires were incendiary," he added.

One of the primary purposes in the formation of the National Board of Fire Underwriters in 1866 was to combat arson by offering rewards for the capture of incendiarists.

Then fire insurance rate reductions were used as an inducement and reward for improved fire protection. This was tried for the first time in 1872 when Rochester, N. Y., completed a new water works and an abatement of a 2 percent rate advance.

Building code reforms became the next objective. Three years after Chicago was destroyed, in a great fire, the underwriters found that the city had been rebuilt "as inflammable as before." Their report said: "It would appear that buildings can be erected in any way or style that suits convenience. No effort is being made to enforce the law." They declared that the fire department dominated by politics.

The result was a boycott of Chicago by the fire insurance companies in September 1871. Within two months reforms were achieved by Chicago business men's committees and insurance was restored.

The Baltimore fire of 1904 brought about engineering surveys of all cities over 25,000 in population. Among the first 55 cities surveyed was San Francisco, and the underwriters' engineers reported in October 1905 that hazards were so great that "San Francisco has violated all underwriting traditions by not burning up."

Six months later San Francisco ceased to violate those traditions. Its burning cost the fire insurance companies all their underwriting profits from 1880 to 1905, and nearly \$80,000,000 more. About 20 companies failed, although many soon resumed business. Claims paid totalled \$220,000,000.

The idea of preventing such disasters gained headway slowly. In June 1911 an obscure legislator at a convention of fire marshals in Chicago suggested that October 9, the anniversary of the Chicago fire, be set aside as Fire Prevention Day. Governors of all states were appealed to and by 1912, Fire Prevention Day was proclaimed by 22 of them.

The first national Fire Prevention Day was proclaimed by President Wilson in 1920, and he was followed by the governor general of Canada. President Harding made the observance a national Fire Prevention Week in 1922. Since then each President in turn has issued a Fire Prevention Week proclamation annually, as has the governor general of Canada.

"The attitudes of fire departments and the public have changed markedly since the 19th century's antipathy toward fire prevention," Mallalieu concluded. "No longer is the idea considered of selfish interest to a few corporations. It is recognized that every fire means a permanent and absolute loss of national capital; fire losses being borne in reality by the community with insurance companies merely the medium by which the loss is distributed."

Green Shirt Leader Who Started Fascist Movement In Brazil Has Returned From Exile In Portugal

 RIO DE JANEIRO—The frail, mystical man who developed a fascist movement in Brazil more than a decade ago, returned to his native land in a green shirt, returned from seven years of exile in Portugal.

The impression is that there is a "Green Shirt" movement in Brazil, the man who led it, Salgado, returned from the exile in Portugal, which he fled in 1939.

"Integralism as a doctrine is eternal. As a party, it does not exist. I consider it as a generator of parties," he declared in answer to a reporter's question. A small group including some former Integralists, welcomed him home.

Government Warns Him
 At the same time, General Góes Monteiro, Brazil's bulky, loquacious War Minister, thundered to the press. "If Salgado takes up his arms again he will be considered outside of the democratic scene in this country."

The political party which most closely approaches Integralism, Salgado told the press, is the Popular Representation Party. This group barely had the 50,000 votes necessary to retain legality in the elections of last December.

The party, organized last year with speeches acknowledging the influence of "The Great Absent

On" gave its support to the Social Democratic Party which elected President Dutra and played the small party role congressman Undercover Operations.

The organizer of the Popular Representation Party is Ramundo Padilha, cited as the U. S. State Department's "Blue Book" as effective leader of the Integralists in Salgado's absence. Padilha, however, is a "democratic" politician, according to some observers.

While some observers predict Salgado may become a political candidate, the former Integralist chief said he was not immediately interested in the "democratic" political scene.

Salgado added: "I have organized parties in the Congress. I have named only Godofredo Silva Teles, elected on the Social Democratic ticket for the small Popular Representation Party but claims to be an Integralist, as party leader."

His assertion that he favored legality for the Communist Party was widely noted because one of the first principles of Integralist organization was to combat Communism. Integralism stands against Communist movement but later lost that objective.

Thousands of green-shirted enthusiasts, wearing armbands with the Greek Sigma symbol, joined their arms in the fascist salute in public parades and ceremonies, embraced a mystical creed

and in 1938 fled to Portugal. President Getulio Vargas, who had never openly approved Integralism as he had Communism, eventually defended his palace with a rifle until the army came. He had put down a Communist revolt only three short years before this uprising.

Salgado, who was in hiding in Sao Paulo fled to Portugal. Some Integralists were imprisoned. The central committee decided by Vargas last year pardoned all political criminals.

Integralism, which once claimed to have a million disciples, has few open adherents in Brazil today.

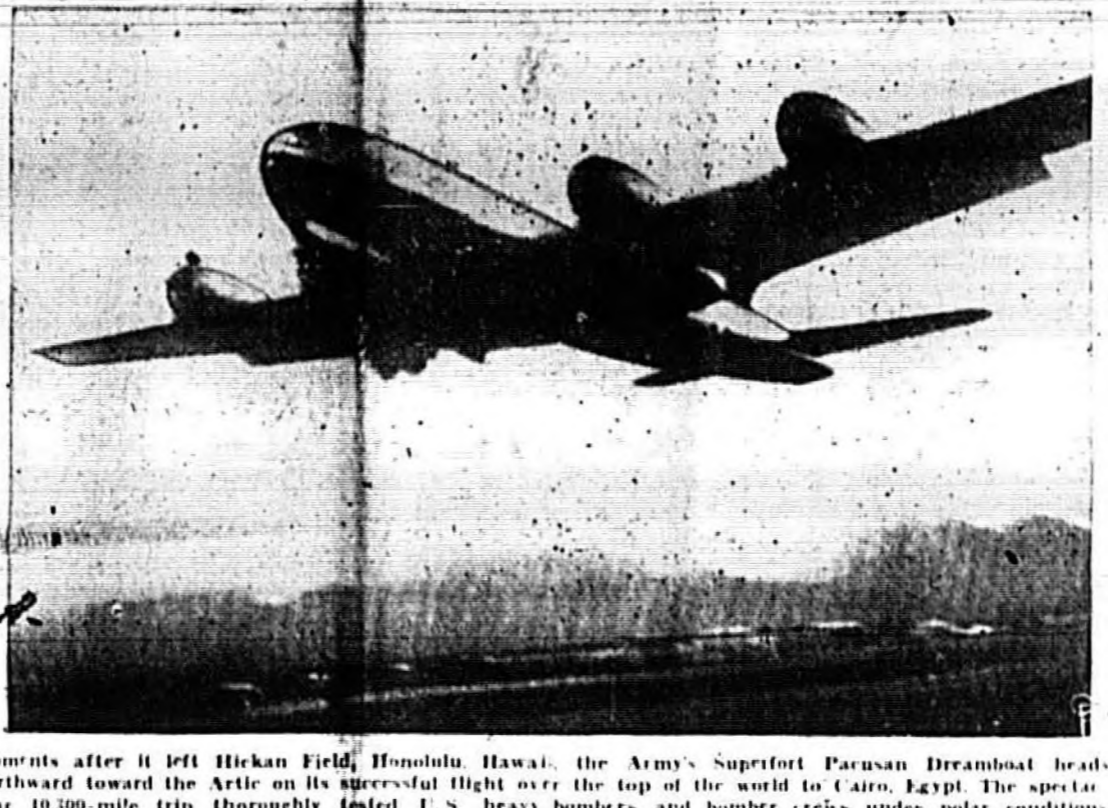
