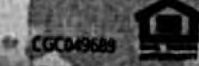

## Sheriff's office seeks suspect in club shooting

The Seminole County Sheriff's Office is seeking a suspect whom is believed responsible for an early Sunday morning shooting at a Sanford area nightclub.

The suspect is identified as 28-year-old James Roosevelt Lee. According to sheriff's office officials, he

lists several home addresses in Central Florida. The shooting occurred just before closing

time, at 1:49 a.m., at Wavies Nightclub, which is located near 18th Street and Southwest Road.

The argument inside the nightclub is believed to be over a cell phone.

Timothy E. Thomas, 33, of Sanford was injured when he was shot in the head with a handgun. Thomas was taken to Orlando Regional Medical Center. The investigator handling the case reports that doctors say Thomas will most likely lose his right eye. At this point, Thomas' injuries do not appear life threatening.

A female patron was also injured with a dislocated shoulder during the rush out of the club, after the shooting occurred.

Anybody with information of James Roosevelt Lee's whereabouts is asked to call Investigator Sara Klein of the Seminole County Sheriff's Office at 407-665-6600, or Crime Line at 1-800-423-TIPS, where one can remain anonymous, and may receive a cash reward for vital information related to this case.

# County bans video-slot machines

SANFORD — The county is the latest local government agency in Seminole to ban video-slot machines, but that still may not stop the rise of the casinolike establishments in the area.

Following in the footsteps of the city of Longwood, which passed a similar ordinance March 1, county commissioners voted unanimously Tuesday on a measure that

would outlaw commercial facilities that house any sort of slot machine. It does not prohibit personal ownership.

Adult-arcade owners in other Central Florida communities skirted state laws prohibiting gambling by conditioning their video machines paid out based on skill — not

chance. A 1997 revision in the state gambling law allowed games of chance at popular children arcades such as Chucky E. Cheese, in which players receive tickets that can be redeemed for candy or small trinkets.

But unlike Skee-Ball and Super Shot, adult arcades

fashioned video-slot machines with images rolling by at more than a 100 per second. Players are expected to push a button to stop each row of rotating figures to match up like images. And instead of cash payouts, the establishments awarded gift certificates, small prizes and

coupons.

An Apopka woman inquiring about Seminole County's ordinance Tuesday said she feels adult arcades are being shortchanged. She is considering opening a video-slot business, but says she will have to look elsewhere — maybe Sanford.

"There are different types of games just like there are many types of Fords," said Jackie Trevathan about the

## Airport hears it from citizens

SANFORD — About 250 people gathered last week at Gate 6 in the domestic terminal of Orlando Sanford International Airport to ask questions about the airport's future expansion.

The meeting was requested by the Seminole County Sustainable Communities Advisory Council (SCAC) to address specific questions the group has regarding the airport's growth. While many of those who attended were able to ask pointed questions of airport president Larry Dale, those who organized the meeting say their questions remain unanswered.

"I don't think our objectives were met because we let the audience take over the meeting," said Deborah Schafer, who is active with SCAC. "Not that that's a bad thing."

Dale had planned a presentation of the airport's expansion and intended to address a list of questions SCAC had submitted prior to the March 15 meeting. Shortly after he began his presentation, however, Dale was peppered with questions from the audience.

"Why are you subsidizing the airlines?" asked one man.

"Why does the Sanford airport continue to grow when there is ample capacity at Melbourne or Daytona?" asked another.

# Task force lobbies for mental-health law reform

SANFORD — Many Seminole County residents will never forget July 8, 1998. Come next year, law enforcement agencies around the state will also know of that tragic day, as a new bill expected to be passed into law is a direct result.

Seminole County Deputy Sheriff Eugene "Stetson" Gregory was shot and killed in a 1998 dispute with Alan Singletary.

Singletary, 43, wounded two other deputies in that 13-hour Geneva standoff before being fatally shot himself. Singletary's family had tried for years to get him help for

his paranoid schizophrenia, but one outdated law stood in their way, said Seminole County Sheriff Don Eslinger.

With the direct help of two family members from that heartbreaking event — widow Linda Gregory and Alan's sister Alice Petree — and countless other supporters, Eslinger is pushing for reform. Once considered a pioneering act, Florida lawmakers created the Baker Act more than three decades ago. It permits treatment facilities to hold patients up to three days if they are deemed an imminent danger to themselves or others.

The problem is after 72 hours, the patients are most often let free without any

stipulation to continue treatment. The cycle can be vicious as patients identified by law enforcement officials can be readmitted under the Baker Act numerous times.

The deaths of Gregory and Singletary are about to break that sometimes never-ending series. Eslinger and others introduced a Baker Act reform bill to state lawmakers in 2002. After some tweaking in 2003, the House almost unanimously passed the bill with a 113-2 margin. The Senate failed to hear the bill before the end of the session and another year went by and possibly five more deaths that could have been averted,

## Idyllwilde principal is retiring

SANFORD — Seminole County Public Schools announced that principals in schools around the county will be moved due to principals that are retiring and the opening of new schools.

The transfer of 10 principals to different schools will require approval by the school board.

The county will also have eight vacancies to fill by July, when new principals in Florida usually begin their jobs.

Idyllwilde Elementary in Sanford is one of the schools that will need a new principal after the retirement of current principal David Scott, who has been there for nine years.

Scott, who has been an educator in the county's school system for 32 years, said he enjoys "being a part of student achievement and providing a system where students get to learn outside the classroom."

Scott received his bachelor's degree from Florida State University and completed his master's degree at the University of Central Florida. He taught at Red Bug Elementary, was assistant principal at Sabal Point Elementary, and was principal at Longwood Elementary and Hamilton Elementary.

"It's been very rewarding. I enjoy a lifestyle that has challenges in it," Scott said.

### 14-year-old girl brings prescription drugs to Lawton Chiles school

The Seminole County Sheriff's Office is looking into a possible felony charge with regard to an incident Tuesday morning at Lawton Chiles Middle School near Oviedo that involved three 8th grade girls, who attend the school.

According to the investigating deputy, it appears a 14-year-old girl brought some prescription medications to school and gave them to her two friends, ages 13 and 14.

One of her friends reported to the school office, at around 10:15 a.m., of not feeling well. School officials pressed her for details and learned about the other two girls possibly ingesting the drugs. Those two girls were brought to the clinic.

School officials became concerned when two of the girls began to exhibit signs of drowsiness. The Oviedo Fire Department was called. According to the public safety communications center, two girls were transported to Winter Park Hospital and one went to Florida Hospital, East.

According to the deputy handling the call, the case will be turned over to the school resource deputy for further investigation. The girl, who brought the medications to school, could face a felony charge. How many and what charges are still being examined.

The school district is also examining the option of expelling the 14 year old, who brought the drugs to school and allegedly gave them to her friends, since this violates the district's zero tolerance policy.

### Wyman executive is arrested, accused of swindling money from Seminole County

Candace Birle, 55, chief executive officer of the Wyman Fields Foundation was arrested Monday and is accused of grand theft.

The investigation began in March 2002, after Seminole County Government requested that the Seminole County Sheriff's Office look into the matter with regard to possible alleged criminal wrongdoing.

The Wyman Fields Foundation had entered into an earlier partnership with Seminole County Government to build affordable housing. The money to pay for the housing came from state and federal grants. In the arrest affidavit, it is alleged that Birle fraudulently submitted billing requests for \$65,000. Copies of cancelled checks, made out to subcontractors, were provided for billing purposes.

Wyman Fields requested, and received, the money to pay subcontractors for work on an affordable housing project called The Hamlet, near Sanford. The contractors were reportedly unaware that Wyman Fields had made the submissions in their name.

Three-of-the-four contractors were eventually paid, but only after the Seminole County Sheriff's Office began its criminal investigation in 2002. The fourth contractor has not been paid to date.

In January of this year, Seminole County Government supplied additional information in the case, which assisted in establishing a paper trail with regard to the cancelled checks.

Last week, two representatives from the State Attorney's Office, and a circuit judge, reviewed the case and an arrest warrant was issued for Birle.

Early Monday morning, Birle was taken into custody by Investigator John Kent of the Seminole County Sheriff's Office Economic & Computer Crimes Unit and by Lake County deputies. The arrest occurred at her Lake County home in Yalaha.

Birle was booked into the Lake County Jail. Her bond was set at \$3,000. She has since posted bond and is out of jail.

skill-based slot machines. "It's just something fun. I'm sorry the bumble bees and cherries come up, but this is not gambling these are just arcade games."

Adult arcades staked claim in about a half dozen Volusia County communities for months before authorities cracked down and charged owners with illegal gambling last year. A circuit judge in January declared the devices found in the Volusia establishments as illegal.

The issue first came to ahead in Seminole County when the city of Sanford passed an emergency ordinance Aug. 29, 2003, to block a proposed adult arcade in its downtown. Longwood received an application for an arcade shortly thereafter and the emergency moratoriums against the casinolike facilities began flying throughout the county and its seven cities.

Similar to Longwood's new law, the county's broadens the definition of slot machines to include all slots no matter if their play is based on skill or chance.

"To an extent we're prohibiting something new in this ordinance," said County Attorney Bob McMillan. "This is based on the argument put forth in Volusia County and other areas that these games do not constitute gambling as they are skill based."

Violation of the county ordinance is punishable by \$500 or six months in jail. McMillan said if adult arcades still found their way into Seminole County, he

believes they would be prosecuted similarly as in Volusia County for illegal gambling in addition to the county's new ordinance.

While Seminole's ordinance applies to the entire county, it does not supercede laws already established by some cities. Sanford and Winter Springs have adopted ordinances that restrict adult arcades to certain areas of the city, similar to adult entertainment establishments.

Trevathan said she would carefully investigate opening an adult arcade in Sanford as well as other cities that haven't banned slot machines.

"You just can't jump into something like this," she said "It is controversial."

Sanford City Manager Al Grieshaber said Monday that the city does not intend to allow gambling in the city.

"There is a strong argument that (slot machines) are prohibited," he said. "Someone would have to prove they are different than gambling machines."

Trevathan said she would have no issues with any city reviewing the video-slot machines because she is confident they are skill based. She might want to hurry if she intends to apply for an arcade in Sanford.

According to Grieshaber, Sanford always has the choice to opt out of their ordinance in favor of the county's law.

"I expect the board of city commissioners may adopt it if it is stricter than what we have now," he said. "The city is strictly against gambling."

**Country western singing Russkies invade Sanford**

SANFORD — On March 26, the Helen Stairs Theatre will host Bering Strait, one of the more unique bands in modern country music.

Comprised of six musicians, the band members hail from Obninsk, Russia, a town shrouded in secrecy during the Cold War due to its nuclear power station and top-level scientific community.

The individuals of the group have been involved in music from very young ages, starting out as classical students. They were exposed to the complexities of American bluegrass by their music teacher, who challenged his best students to form a band. The result is a truly original group that is captivating audiences around the United States.

"The band was formed in 1988 and originally only played bluegrass" said Lydia Salnikova, a vocalist and musician for the group. "It wasn't until the mid-1990s that country music became our primary focus."

In the early years, Bering Strait performed in several countries and became quite well known, especially in their Russian homeland. While some critics hold to the opinion that the novelty of the group is what has propelled them to stardom, Bering Strait's fan base cite their unique blend of musical genres as the primary reason for their enduring success.

"We've been inspired by many types of music styles" said Salnikova, who takes exception to the "cute novelty"

theory. "From our roots in bluegrass, to rock and heavy metal, to jazz, to classical. But country music is our love, and the result of all these styles coming together makes our sound very unique and original."

Fans would likely agree, as there is an indefinable twist to their music that keeps listeners intrigued.

"We've had great responses from our fans, and we actually have many fans in the Central Florida area, who have come to see us when we've played at Universal Studios and the Epcot Center," Salnikova said. "We've played numerous other places in Florida as well, and we love the people and the weather there, so it is always nice to perform there."

When asked how the genuine appreciation from fans makes the group feel, Salnikova said that she personally believes that touching so many people means that the band is "doing something right with our lives." She also said that when the group has moments of wondering whether or not they are on the right path, they look to their fans for inspiration and encouragement.

"It's amazing to see familiar faces in the crowd almost every place we perform," she said.

The band plays to both small and large groups around the United States, and plans to return to Europe in the future for more tours. Their U.S. home base is Nashville.

"So many musicians have believed in us and given us many opportunities to shine," Salnikova said. "We've

us. It really means a lot to us all."

Salnikova also said that living outside their home country has made them richer culturally. All the band members admittedly miss their families, but they value the Western perspective that living state-side has brought them as individuals. The group has also been able to master the English language, and have been somewhat Americanized by living here, though there is no doubt that Russia will always be their first love.

The band recently begun working with a group called "Grammies In Schools," in which artists go into schools to help kids develop a love and passion for music.

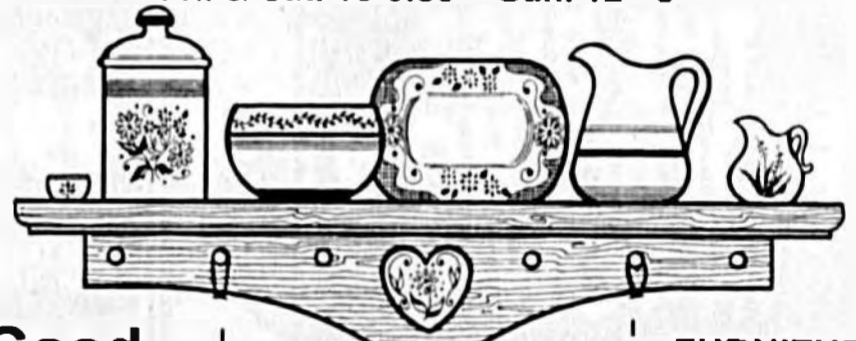

Eslinger said, "It's been distressing to me it's taken so long to make this change," Gregory said. "We've been working on it since my husband's death. Last year, we thought it might get through and we didn't make it. Hopefully this year we will."

According to Eslinger, people with severe mental illnesses are four times more likely to be killed in a confrontation with law enforcement than the general public. More than 80,000 Baker Act cases were initiated in Florida in 2000. But in a 21-month period, more than 1,000 people were "Baker Acted" six or more times, he said.

Baker Act reform is one step in solving the problem, as it identifies repeat patients and treats them accordingly.

"Because of his death so many people have become aware of the seriousness of the situation and because Alice (Petree) and I have decided to come forward and be involved and the sheriff has been so active in it all of these positive things have happened," Gregory said.

Eslinger said 41 other states currently have legislation similar to the proposed Baker Act reform. But while the Florida is considered lagging in its criminal justice mentally ill treatment, Seminole County is leading the way.

Recognized by a national mental health criminal justice project for its efforts, Seminole County's collaborative program began as a result of the two 1998 deaths. With the help of Dr. Larry Chu, of Seminole Community Mental Health, Public Defender James Russo, State Attorney Norm Wolfinger, Eslinger, Gregory and Petree a need was identified and the Seminole County Mental and Substance Abuse Task Force was formed only several months after the Geneva shooting.

"My problem was when I got involved in this I thought that in a few months we would make some changes and I would go on with my life," Gregory said. "The

more I became involved and the more I learned this is a long process and this isn't the answer it's just one step in the process. This is just a long problem that has always been there."

Other changes were implemented locally such as crisis intervention training for deputies. It helps them take a high-risk situation and "possibly help the person instead of someone getting killed like my husband," Gregory said.

With the support of Eslinger as the point man, local supporters are hopeful the bill will pass this year. However, there is always more to do in helping the mentally ill, said Petree and Gregory.

"It's not the answer all," Gregory said. "If it comes to like the night that my husband died it's too late."

Petree said as many as 40 percent of people that suffer bi-polar disorder and paranoid schizophrenia are too sick to know they need treatment.

"And those people are some of the same that cycle in and out of the criminal justice system," she said.

Petree said the Baker Act reform provides a better tool in helping people get treatment, but until the stigma surrounding mental illness is

removed there will be more to accomplish in educating the public.

"The interesting thing to me, if we can bring gays out of the closet and we can talk about AIDS and other things why haven't we come to that point with mental illness," she said. "A lot of reasons why people don't seek treatment if they feel something is wrong is because they're concerned of what other people might think."

Gregory said supporters of the Baker Act reform are helping to educate the public that patients of mental illnesses are not always criminals.

"Mental illness is just that — it's an illness," she said. "People ought not to be treated as criminals or put into jail because they have an illness and this is another step in the process of treating it as an illness not another crime."

"I tell people it was a tragedy when my husband was killed and that will always affect me, but even a greater tragedy is the same thing is still happening around the state. Anything we can do to prevent it. Even if it's one life whether it be a deputy, a person with a mental illness or another innocent person one life is worth what it takes."

At several points during the 2-hour meeting, Dale asked audience members to ask one question at a time.

"I can't hear when four or five people ask a question at the same time," Dale said.

Many of the questions centered on the airport's projected growth, in particular two questions: Does the airport pay airlines to land in Sanford, and will Sanford's airport one day rival Orlando in size?

"We do not subsidize carriers to land in Sanford," Dale said. "We do have an incentive plan where if the airline signs a 12 month contract, we'll waive the next six months landing fees. Almost all airports have a similar arrangement. But we are not subsidizing the airlines and have no intention to subsidize them."

Dale said that while the airport will continue to grow, it will not reach the size of Orlando International Airport.

"Orlando has 16,000 acres of land on four main runways," Dale said. "Sanford has 2,500 acres and one main runway. We'll never come close to the size of Orlando."

But while some were focused on the airport's expansion, others were more concerned with noise.

"We're hear to talk about the noise, not all that other stuff," said one lady.

Several audience mem-

bers asked why aircraft couldn't land and take-off at a steeper incline, which would less some noise pollution.

"We're working on that," Dale said, "but right now there are conflicts with Orlando's airport regarding air sector space. There is not enough room with the way the sectors are allocated right now. We're in the process of working with Orlando to change that."

There were also questions raised about landing large commercial jets on the north-south runway instead of the east-west runway to eliminate noise concerns in Lake Mary and Geneva. Dale said jets must land into the prevailing winds, which in Sanford blows either from the east or west. He also said re-orienting landings and take-offs would only shift the noise problem, not eliminate it.

"If we were to do that — and we aren't — I'd have people from north and south of the airport demanding to

have a meeting just like this to complain about the noise," Dale said.

Schafer said that while her group's objectives were not fully met, she believes the meeting was productive.

"Mr. Dale did fairly well under the circumstances," Schafer said. "I think a lot of people have questions about the airport, so it was good that there was a forum for that. I think a lot of people are not in total objection to everything they're doing at the airport, they just want more information."

Schafer said SCAC would continue to seek more information regarding their concerns about growth at the airport. They also intend to ask airport officials for another public meeting with a moderator so more in-depth questions can be asked.

"We want to keep the lines of communications open," Schafer said. "We just have the normal questions that citizens should ask when they have concerns."

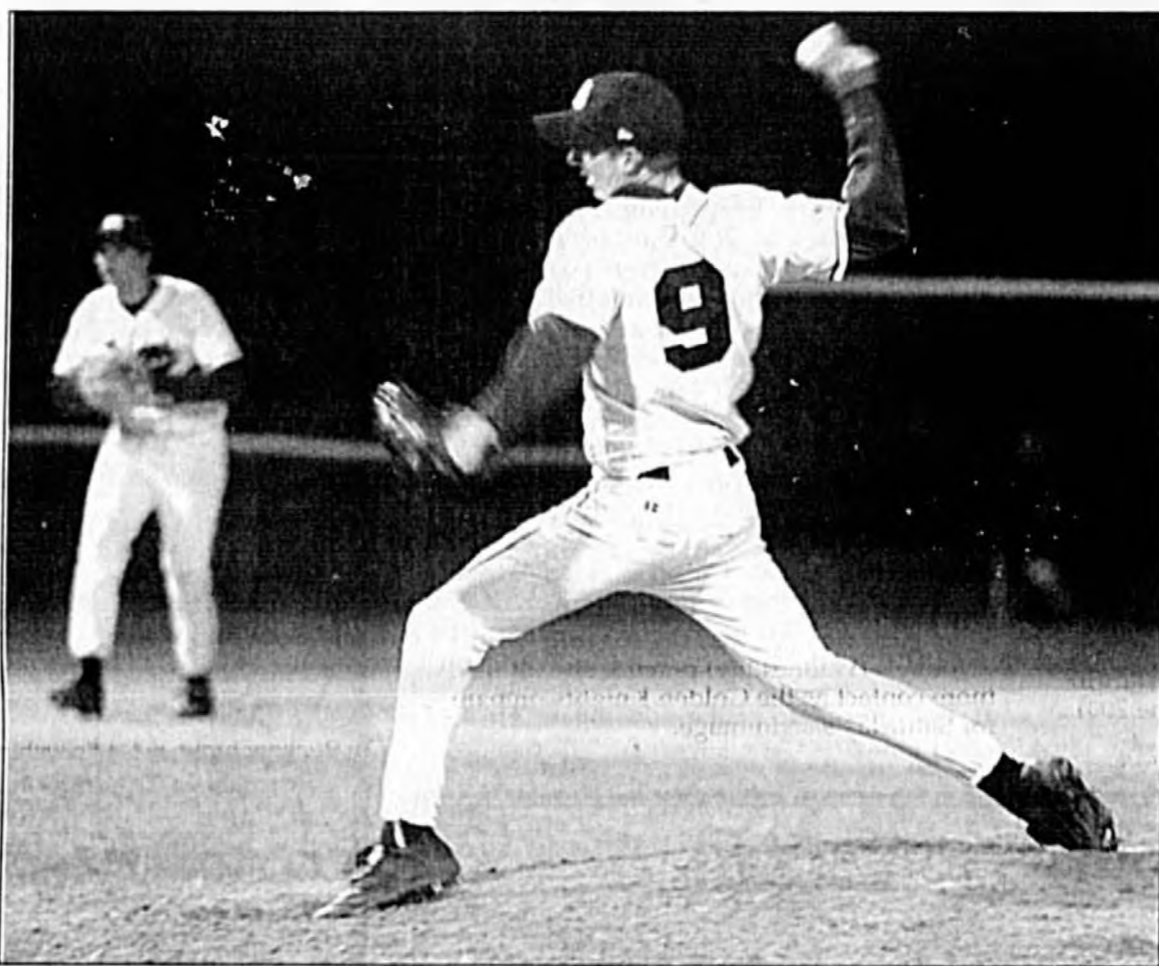

held to a season low 18 points in the first half, erased a five-point deficit in the second half after Rob Ross hit back-to-back triples to put UCF up 32-29 with less than 13 minutes remaining. UCF would maintain the lead for the next seven minutes before a lay-up by Chevon Troutman put Pittsburgh back on top 37-36, a lead it would never relinquish.

UCF opened the game on a 5-0 run, but then fell behind after being outscored 6-0. Lyons capped a second 5-0 spurt hitting a triple to stake the Knights to a 10-6 advantage. Following a tip-in by Chris Taft, Troutman converted a traditional three-point play and Pittsburgh had a 16-12 lead. Morentin scored the Knights final six points of the half and UCF trailed 22-18 at the intermission.

Lyons was the only other UCF player to score in double figures finishing with 12. The Knights shot just 30 percent from the floor (16-52) and made just five of 20 shots from long range. UCF made seven shots from the line in 10 attempts. Gary Johnson finished with a team high five assists.

Pittsburgh, which was held to its third lowest scoring total of the season, had three players finish in double digits led by Krauser's 20. Troutman and Page scored 13 and 10 respectively. Taft led the Panthers, who outrebounded UCF 37-33, with 16 boards. Pittsburgh was held to a season low 29 percent from the floor (13-44) and made just five triples in 16 attempts. The Panthers hit 22 of 31 attempts at the free throw line, led by Krauser who drained nine shots in 10 attempts.

UCF's 25 victories marks the highest win total since beginning play at the Division I level prior to the 1984-85 season. It is the second consecutive year the Knights have recorded at least 20 wins (21-11 in 2002-03) and have posted a combined record of 46-17 the past two seasons.

### UCF BASEBALL STREAK AT TEN

Kyle Bono threw a complete game, three-hit shutout to lead UCF to a 6-0 game one victory over Campbell Saturday (March 20) in Buies Creek, N.C. In the second game of the doubleheader, UCF scored four runs in the final inning to comeback and sweep the Camels 4-3. The Golden Knights have won 10 straight games to raise their record to 20-4 overall and 8-1 in the A-Sun.

UCF's 20-4 record ties for the best start in school history after 24 games with the 2001 and 1975 teams.

Bono (3-0) continued an unbelievable stretch of pitching for the Golden Knights as they recorded their second straight shutout with the 6-0 game one win. For the first time in school history, UCF shutout an A-Sun opponent for the first two games of a series in back-to-back weeks.

It also marked just the second time in school history that the Golden Knights started an A-Sun series with two consecutive shutouts.

Bono yielded just three hits on the day with six strikeouts for his second straight complete game shutout of the season. Over his last 26.1 innings, Bono has not allowed an earned run. Bono also owns a streak of 14 consecutive scoreless innings of work.

In game two, the Golden Knights trailed 3-0 entering the final inning of play before two Campbell errors opened the door for the UCF comeback. With one run in after Dee Brown scored on an error, Drake Wade drilled a bases loaded double to score three runs to give UCF a 4-3 lead.

Matt Rhodes (2-2) pitched the final 1.1 innings without allowing a hit to preserve the comeback win. The Orlando native fanned one batter to even his record at 2-2.

In Friday's opener, junior pitcher Matt Fox fired his first complete game shutout of his career to lead UCF to a 2-0 victory. Fox (6-0) set a new career-high with 15 strikeouts and yielded just four hits as he won his fifth straight start of the season. Fox has not allowed an earned run over his last 33.2 innings and has also tossed 18.2 straight innings of scoreless baseball.

The Golden Knights host A-Sun rival Stetson Friday at 6 p.m. at Jay Bergman Field. The three-game series finishes Saturday with a doubleheader vs. the Hatters. First pitch is set for noon and the doubleheader will be televised by Sunshine Network.

### STETSON ALSO ON A ROLL

Following up his award winning week, Chris Westervelt, who leads the A-Sun in hitting at .475, went 3-for-5 with three runs scored as Stetson avenged a loss the night before that ended its seven-game winning streak by defeating Northern Iowa 7-3 last Wednesday night at Melching Field.

Stetson then got back into conference play and received strong starting performances from Chris Ingoglia and Ryan Heacox en route to a 7-1 and 9-1 doubleheader sweep over Georgia State Saturday afternoon that completed a three-game sweep at Melching Field. The Hatters (16-6, 6-0 A-Sun) remained undefeated in Atlantic Sun Conference play and won for 11th time in their last 12 games. The Panthers fell to 6-15, 3-6.

For the first time since 2002, the UCF baseball team is ranked in the latest top 25 poll according to Baseball America. The Golden Knights (20-4) are ranked No. 23 by Baseball America and are off to their best start in school history following last weekend's three-game sweep at Campbell.

Earlier in the day, Collegiate Baseball News ranked UCF No. 28 in its latest top 30 poll.

**FOX IS A-SUN PITCHER-OF-THE-WEEK**  
UCF junior pitcher Matt Fox was named the

Atlantic Sun Pitcher-of-the-Week by the league office on Monday afternoon. Fox continued to dominate batters, tossing a complete game shutout win over Campbell as a Golden Knight has been named the A-Sun Pitcher-of-the-Week four times already in 2004.

Fox, from Coral Springs, earned his second A-Sun Pitcher-of-the-Week honor of the season after completing the most dominating start of his career. Fox threw the first complete game shutout of his career in a 2-0 victory over Campbell. Fox (6-0) also set a new career-high with 15 strikeouts and yielded just four base hits. He struck out the side in the second, third, fifth and ninth innings. Fox has not allowed an earned run in his last 33.2 innings pitched and lowered his ERA to 0.62 on the season. In the team session of practice, Adam Butcher started with the first team offense at left tackle. Butcher played center and guard last season and started the spring at the No. 2 spot at right tackle.

On the first team defense, James Cook replaced Gerren Bray on the starting unit after Bray left practice early with an apparent knee injury. Bray did stay on the field for the remainder of practice and worked with the strength and conditioning staff on other exercises.

The tempo and intensity of practice was again at a high level throughout the two-hour workout.

"We are starting to have some guys understand the tempo of practice and the sense of urgency of practice," added O'Leary.

Today's (Wednesday) practice should field more contact as the Golden Knights prepare for Saturday's scrimmage.

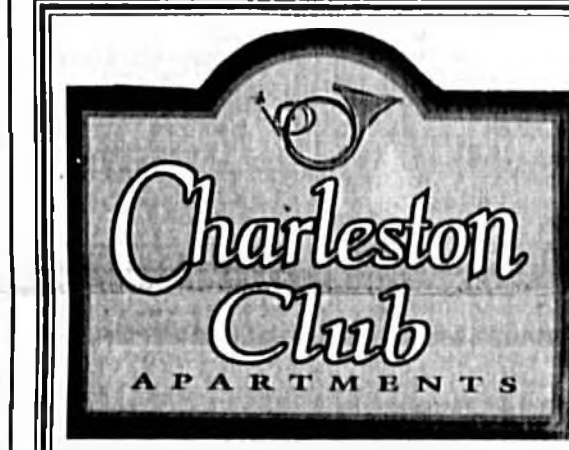

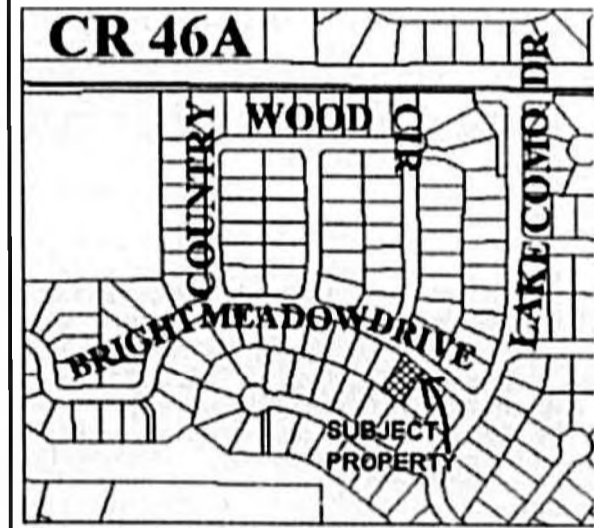

# Sanford eyes beach project

City seeks state funds to rebuild beach on Lake Monroe

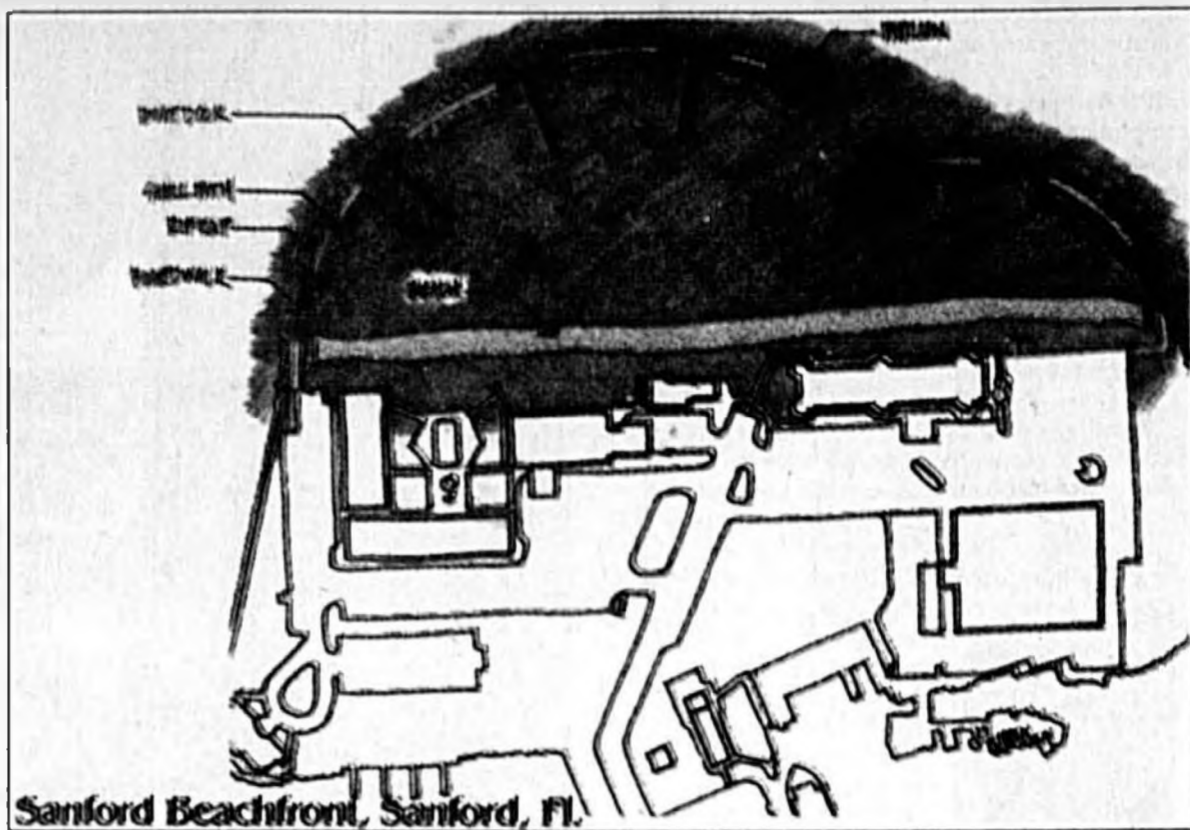
SANFORD — Water enthusiasts may soon be able to enjoy recreational activities on the north shore of the city's Marina Isle.

City officials are proposing a plan to rebuild a beach that could be used to launch small sailboats and other recreational watercraft into Lake Monroe. Such a beach existed, but constant erosion forced the city to abandon the beach in favor of large rocks and concrete in an effort to protect the shoreline.

"They were fighting a losing battle," said Chris Smith, manager of capital projects for the city. "Every time they dumped sand, it would flow north to DeLand."

Smith said the erosion was caused by two factors: constant wave action from Lake Monroe pounding the shore combined with frequent fluctuation of the water level. Smith and city staff, along with experts from CPH Engineers, think they have a solution that could limit erosion.

The plan involves creating a protected shoreline by

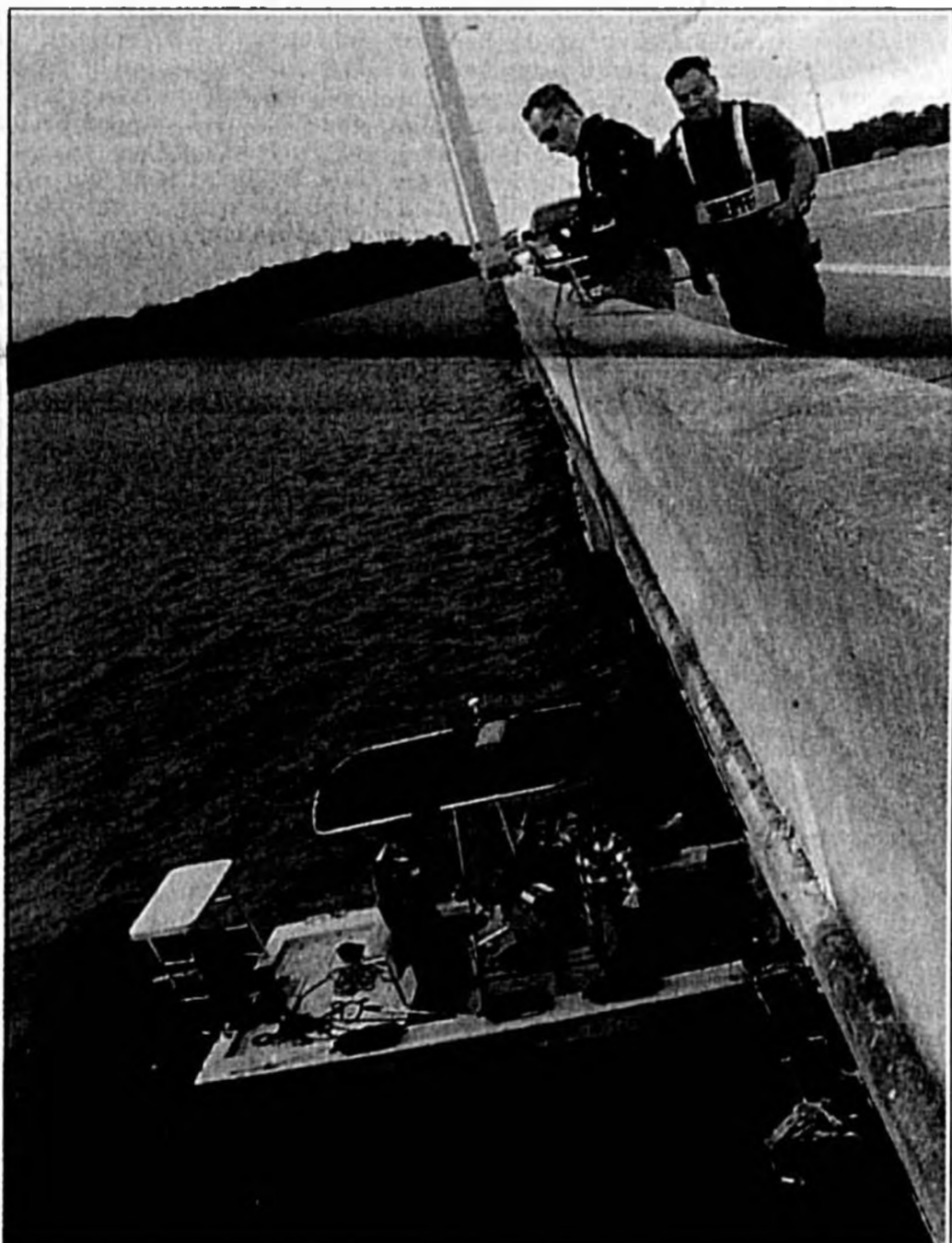

building two breakwaters out into the lake. Rather than constructing a solid breakwater, the city's plan would involve a series of rock structures that would allow some

water to still flow through. A solid breakwater would provide that protection. However, the St. Johns River

## Authorities net stolen frames at bottom of Lake Jesup

LAKE JESUP — With vehicle identification numbers etched on motorcycle frames, they're often the most difficult part for bike thieves to dump.

One Oviedo man had thought he had found the perfect hiding spot for the stolen frames that can be easily tracked to theft records, but that wasn't until when one of his associates snitched about the heap lying at the bottom of Lake Jesup.

For the past week, investigators with the City-County Auto Theft Bureau (CCAT) have gone fishing to recover some of the bikes that Michael Christopher Carr, 26, allegedly threw over the State Road 417 bridge.

Using two boats that dredge the bottom of the lake with ropes and hooks, the bureau has recovered almost two dozen motorcycle frames and parts of a Ford Mustang. Carr was arrested shortly after Valentine's Day for trying to steal a motorcycle. He is currently being held in the Seminole County Jail on

# Family returns to honor early pioneer

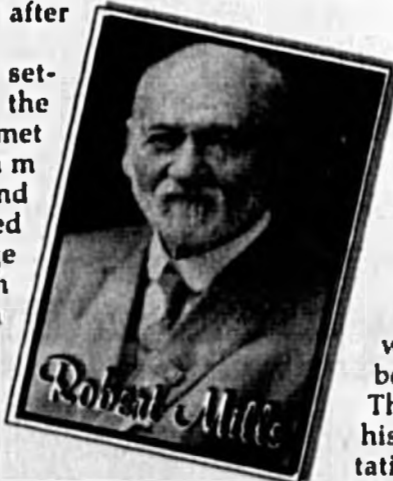

Relatives of the Robert Mills family will be gathering in Seminole County this weekend. They will be flying or driving in from all over the United States. Many of the family members will be meeting for the first time.

Robert A. Mills, or R.A. Mills as he was known, was an Orange County Commissioner in the 1800's. He served on the school board and platted the community of Chuluota in 1886. He donated the property for the cemetery in Chuluota

and Lake Mills is named after him.

Before settling in the area, he met Abraham Lincoln, and once shared a carriage ride with Lincoln the year he ran for office, stopping and checking on election returns along the way.



R.A. Mills name appears on the corner stone that was saved from the old court house in the lobby of the Orange County Regional History Center and he was great friends with Mahlon Gore. He had three wives and lived to be 102 years young. The last 20 years of his life was spent dictating his memories to his granddaughter in California because he

was legally blind.

Larry L. Kolber, one of the family members, has written a book on R.A. Mills, with assistance from the Museum of Seminole County's coordinator Karen Jacobs.

Jacobs is very excited about showing the family members the area where their great grandfather lived and worked. While the group is here, they will be visiting Lake Mills Park, the Chuluota Cemetery, the Museum of Seminole County History and the Orange County History Center.
