





Attorneys will tweak offender ordinance

SANFORD — Lonnie Groot from the city attorney's office told commissioners he needs more time to draft the sex offender ordinance restricting where certain offenders live.

The first reading of ordinance 3941 establishing residency rules for sex offenders was scheduled for discussion at the Monday commission meeting.

Groot said the ordinance is strong, defensively, but the city attorney's office needs to make some refinements.

This comes just a week after the city of Oviedo passed a similar ordinance restricting sex offenders whose crimes were against children under the age of 16, and who were convicted of those crimes on or after Oct. 1, 2004, from living within 2,500 feet of locations where children congregate (schools, parks, daycares, playgrounds, churches, and

Groot and his office also represent the city of Oviedo

ments to their week-old ordinance.

One problem, Groot said, is the date restriction. Right now, any sex offender who would normally fit into the category of the ordinance requiring restrictions where they live, but who were convicted before Oct. 1, 2004, are "grand-fathered in", Groot

"We're looking at eliminating that," he said.

The city attorney's office is hoping to have identical ordinances in all cities in Seminole County that pass this. This is with the hopes that Seminole County would follow the lead to make a countywide ordinance, Groot said.

Police Chief Brian Tooley said that the Seminole County Commission is looking into an ordinance, but there is no sense of urgency.

The other concern Groot and the city attorney's office had was concerning contractual agreements with leases and whether they would be infringing on constitutional rights.



Jewel thieves enter through shop's roof

ALTAMONTE SPRINGS - The Seminole County Sheriff's Office is seeking the public's help with information about a burglary, which occurred this weekend at an Altamonte Springs area jewelry store.

The thieves went through the roof, torched through two safes, and made off with nearly \$100,000 worth of jewelry, according to spokesman Steve Olson.

The incident was reported to the Seminole County Sheriff's Office Monday at Aponte's Jewelry Store, at 1160 W. State Road 436, in unincorporated Seminole County.

It appears entry to, and exit from, the business was made through a hole that was cut through the roof. It appeared the suspects also tampered with wires in back of the business, in an attempt to defeat the alarm system.

Gloves were located on the roof and an aluminum ladder was found in a pond behind the business, Olson said. The thieves even left behind a cardboard box they had cut to block the windows, so the public would not see the glow of a blow torch inside. The store did not have video

At this point, Seminole County investigators believe this was a professional job, and will compare notes with other jurisdictions to see if there have been similar cases.

Freedom Schools are a direct service model of the Black Community Crusade for Children (BCCC). Coordinated nationally by CDF, the BCCC is a massive effort to mobilize the African American community on behalf of Black children and families. The BCCC's mission is to ensure that no child is left behind and that every child has a Healthy Start, a Head Start, a Fair Start, a Safe Start and a Moral Start in life. Freedom Schools incorporate elements of each of these five "Starts" into a comprehensive summer program. Freedom Schools work in partnership with parents, young adults, and caring community leaders to create a new education vision for our children.

"Freedom Schools offer children more than a positive environment to spend the summer," said Dr. Gail choice, Project Director. "The children are taught that knowledge is power in an exciting and comprehensive way. They are exposed to young, tangible community role models who work with them every single day. And they also benefit from the program's emphasis on parental

Established as part of the voter registration and community mobilization effort during the Freedom Summer of 1964, Freedom Schools aim to provide summer options for children and to strengthen parent and community involvement in the yearround achievement of Black children. The schools serve children ages 5 to 16 for five weeks and integrate reading, conflict resolution and social action in an activity-based curriculum that promotes social, cultural and histori-

involvement, which is instrumen- cal awareness. Parents and community leaders benefit from worships designed to promote social action and greater awareness of children's needs. Dr. Velma Williams and Mrs. Cynthia Oliver facilitate parent meetings. A key goal of Freedom Schools is leadership development. That is, identifying training linking and nurturing a successor generation of servant-leaders. Freedom Schools are staffed primarily by college aged young adults or servantleaders, who are committed to making life better for children. "I am impressed with the young people who offered to serve as ser-

vant-leaders this year", said site coordinator Dorothea Fogle. This year's servant leaders are Jeremy George (FAMU), Brittany Johnson (Rollins), Morgan Palmer (FAMU), Jeremy Scott (College of Sequoias), Tenesha Wells (UCF), Carron White (Princeton) and Fallon Wilson (Spelman).

She finished her speech asking, just as Sanford Commissioner Art Woodruff has pondered, if our actions will drive sexual offenders underground by imposing greater restrictions. It's a question the Optimist Club expressed an interest in finding an answer, but more importantly, the club wants to act positively to find ways to keep our children safe.



Right now, sex offenders who could be restricted are allowed to finish their leases. And, if they own their home, they are allowed to stay there. If and when the lease is finished or they sell their home, sex offenders would be required to conform with the 2,500 feet boundary between them and the aforementioned places children congregate.

"It would not affect their contractual right," Groot said regarding legal lease renewals.

District 4 Commissioner Kevin Hipes asked whose responsibility it was to make sure affected sex offenders were complying with the ordi-

Chief Tooley said that most of the offenders appear to be registering and are conforming to the Florida law enforcement agency's 1,000-foot buffer.

The Sanford Police will be working in conjunction with the Seminole County Sheriff's Office, Tooley said.

Groot said that the original ordinance their office drafted was tailored after the Miami Beach ordinance, which was passed recently. That ordinance is also being tweaked,

interested in taking a look at the ordinance. But, he wanted to know if there was any research or any information to back this up.

"Is it just a feel good thing? Does it drive them underground? So, then we don't even know where they are...Do we do any checks? I'd like the rest of that information too, before we jump bandwagon,' the

In fact, there are 13 states in the U.S. who have residency restriction laws in place for certain sex offenders who preyed on children. Those states are: Alabama, Arkansas, California, Florida, lowa, Georgia, Illinois, Kentucky, Louisiana, Ohio, Oklahoma, Oregon, and Tennessee.

No information on the local level could be found stating that the state of Washington had restrictions on where certain sex offenders can reside.

There was numerous reports on county and state law enforcement Web sites in Washington, such as the Mason County Sheriff's, Benton County Sheriff's, and the Washington Association of Sheriffs and Police Chiefs' sites that stated: "Once the sentence is finished, neither the Law Enforcement Agency, nor the court has the power to tell the [sex] offender where to live."

Republican State Senator Mike Fasano, representing Pasco County, introduced a Florida bill that was passed in 2004 to include school bus stops in the state level law restricting certain sex offenders residing 1,000 feet from schools, churches and other places children congregate.

Fasana said he isn't sure why 1,000 feet was chosen in the original bill, but he felt the law should include all sexual offenders of children, not just offenders on conditional



Lake Mary athlete headed to CP-ISRA World Championships

Brittany Mulkey of Lake Mary is entered to compete in the 2005 Cerebral Palsy -International Sports and Recreation (CP-ISRA) World Championships at Connecticut College in New London, June 27-July 10.

Through hard work and determination, Mulkey, 17, has made herself an outstanding athlete. She won six gold medals at the National Junior Disability Championships to earn her nomination for the World Championships and is a member of the BlazeSports Tampa Bay sports program and a cheerleader, and she holds a 3.6

Mulkey was recently one of 27 students with disabilities honored by the Council for Exceptional Children and the Yes I Can Foundation for their outstanding accomplishments at the CEC Awards Ceremony at the CEC Convention & Expo.

The CP-ISRA World Championships feature world-class athletic competition in nine sports for people with cerebral palsy-related physical disabilities. Approximately 1,000 athletes from 36 countries, including the United States, are

expected to be on hand.

The Championships will be hosted by the National Disability Sports Alliance (NDSA), the governing body responsible for the conduct and administration of approved sports for athletes with physical disabilities in the United States.

"This will be the largest number of people with cerebral palsy-related disabilities gathered together in one place at any one time in the United States," said World Championships Director Bill Wilkie. "It's sure to be the most exciting event of its kind ever, and we know that the spectators who come to watch and cheer on the athletes will come away from the competition with a new appreciation for the amazing skills these athletes demonstrate."

The world's top athletes with cerebral palsy and other related physical disabilities, such as stroke or brain injury, will come to the Championships to compete in the sports of Bowls, Cross Country, Cycling, Powerlifting, Slalom, Soccer, Swimming, Table Tennis and Track and Field.

"The 2005 CP-ISRA World Championships will be approximately the same size and scope as the 2002 Salt Lake City Winter Olympic Games,"

said NDSA Executive Director Jerry McCole. "We know the Championships will mean so much to hundreds of athletes with disabilities and their families, and wed invite everyone to come see what makes this event so special."

With so many sports being contested at one time, the Championships will utilize multiple venues, including Connecticut College's pool, field house, Dawley Field, Silfen Track, and the 1941 Room. The track events for cycling will be held at the Kissena Velodrome in New York. N.Y., and the Cycling road races and time trials will take place at Harkness Memorial Park in Waterfod, CT. The Bowls events will be held at Elizabeth Park in Hartford, CT.

In addition to exceptional athletes, the 2005 CP-ISRA World Championships is proud to welcome an extraordinary list of dignitaries to its Honorary Advisory Board. 


