CORAL GABLES, Aug. 3. (AP)—Coach Jack Harding yesterday called 31 University of Miami players, 12 of them letter men, to start football practice on Labor Day.

Last year's team won eight of 10 games, but lost five men by graduation and 11 sophomore and junior letter men joined the armed forces. Despite these losses, the varsity squad will have letter men in every position except left end and center.

A nine-game schedule starts in the Orange Bowl stadium Oct. 3 with the Jacksonville Naval Air Station as opponent. The following week the Hurricanes clash here with the University of Tampa. The one game away from home will be against Keesler Field of Mobile, Oct. 17, after which Rollins, Furman, North Carolina State, Florida, South Carolina and West Virginia will be played at Miami.

Initial regulations caused all home games to be scheduled for Saturday afternoons.

NEW YORK, Aug. 3. (WW)—Jack Saltzman, the ball player who made a fortune sitting on the Yankee bench, is having a good year as handy man for the Kansas City Blues.

With the American Association season little more than finished, Jack has accrued quite a reputation as pinch hitter. In his hitting appearances he made 10 hits and drove in 15 runs, most of his hits leading to victories for the Blues.

Jack was a handy man with the Yankees, too. You remember, Jack. He could field like a flash, hit with the chap who could stand to spell Tom Lasorda, Frank Crosetti or Red Rolfe when they were ailing.

But most of the time he was sitting shivers in his pants. He was the first player to make a successful career of bench-sitting, made a fortune in sales and the world series checks, on the seat of his pants than 90 percent of the league's infielders did for regular playing.


During his five years with the Yankees as utility infielder he drew \$55,747.04. Of that \$37,000 was salary and \$18,247.04 was his share of the 1932-36-37 World Series. He didn't get into a single series game but his slice of the melon was just as big as Ruth's or Gehrig's. His last year with the Yanks, in 1937, saw Jack get \$13,911.11 for appearing in 17 games and getting two hits.

During his stretch with the Yankees he got \$340 for every hit he made. Only one man ever made more—statisticians figure that the Babe got \$341.98 for every hit during his career with the Yanks.

Jack was the first utility-man or pitcher to make a financial success of bench-squatting but several others have done right well without quite equalling Saltzman's record.

Two of them were Yankees. Arndt Jorgens, the perennial third string catcher, was with New York for 11 years, did fair cap and got cuts of five world series. He hardly caught as many games during his entire stretch with the Yankees as Bill Dickey does in a single year.

Another is Yankees batting practice pitcher, a chap named Paul Schreiber. He isn't even on the roster but he gets good pay and has been voted a slug of dough out of each of the world series pools shared by the Yan-

Invaders Continue To Surge Ahead On Lower Don And In Caucasus

Soviets Report Nazi Forces Are Cut Off In Battle Of Bend Above Stalingrad

(By Associated Press) Soviet dispatches today declared Marshal Semeon Timoshenko's armies, sweeping around the German flanks, cut off Nazi forces in the battle of the Don bend, 80 miles northwest of Stalingrad, but the invaders continued to surge forward on the lower Don and in the Caucasus.

A Hitler bulletin asserted Nazi occupation troops had been driven to the Kuban River deep in the Caucasus at several points and were captured. Von Mackensen, 180 miles south of Rostov, it says, this means the Germans already have advanced nearly a third of the distance to the great Caucasus oil fields and far beyond sectors noted in Russian communiques.

The Germans said Voroshilov's fall after violent house-to-house fighting. It was disclosed that Mussolini, speaking in northeast Italy recently, advised fighting against "idle dreams" about second front. He said there will be none anywhere in this war.

Wild-riding Don and Kuban Cossacks are credited with beating off two regiments of tanked German infantry, but subsequently were forced to withdraw.

The Soviet newspaper, Izvestia, said the Germans are trying to fly armaments and fuel to units trapped by the Red Army at Stalingrad, 60 miles above Stalingrad, where they are falling.

The Red air force, which has

been bombing the lower Don, the Reds' forces are continuing to pour across the river in the Tsimlyansk sector, 180 miles upstream from Rostov. The Red daylight raids, numbering two English bombers, came after a night-long lull on both sides.

In the area of Kletskaya northwest of Stalingrad the Russian midnight communiques said two Russian units killed more than 1,000 Germans, and added that the Red peasant army still was hurling "counter blows against enemy tanks and motorized infantry."

Southwest of Kletskaya in the Tsimlyanskaya area of the curving Don, the Russians said the Germans still were throwing tanks and men across the river, but the communiques indicated the Soviets were standing firm.

In the Krasnodar-Kuban area, 75 and 50 miles respectively below the Don, the lines apparently were swaying back and forth. The communiques said 400 Germans were killed in the Kuban region, and another 800 in the Krasnodar sector.

"During the day one big population point changed hands again," the communiques said of the Kuban fighting.

This toll of 2,500 dead made a total of 9,500 announced by the Russians in the last 24 hours.

Corbett Bishop's Hunger Strike Still Continues

ELK RIDGE, Md., Aug. 4. (AP) — Leon, hunched, and apparently little weight for his continuing hunger strike of 25 days, Corbett Bishop returned to ditch-digging today at the Avalon Conscientious Objectors camp, still refusing to eat.

Although he lost from 175 to 125 pounds, a doctor said, he was in good condition. He was fasting he said, because he failed to obtain a 60 to 90 day furlough to wind up his affairs. Camp authorities said he had been given 60 days induction notice.
